Wednesday Evening, November 2, 1966

Rev. Benito Rodriguz, Cuban Pastor from Miami, Fla. was introduced to bring the morning devotion. An inspiring Devotion was given. His text was 11 Kings 7:9.

Our National Magazine, "Contact", the work of the Executive Department, and the National Convention which is to be held in Jacksonville, Fla., July, 1967.

Mrs. A. B. Cook gave testimony of God's great blessings upon herduring her recovery from an automobile accident she was in when going to the State Association in 1965.

Rev. H. D. Shuemake, Editor of "Co-Ordinator" gave a report on the magazine including a financial report. Motion, seconded and carried to accept the report.

Rev. Bill George gave a report from the Children's Home in Eldridge, Ala. Motion, seconded and carried to receive this report as given.

Rev. Harvey Hill gave a report from Camp Alafai (Southern Florida's Youth Camp). Motion, seconded and carried to accept this report.

Bro. Ernest Owen gave a report for the Board of Trustees from the Florida Free Will Baptist Bible Institute. This property is in the process of being sold, but is having to be cleared through court. Motion, seconded and carried to accept this report.

Motion presented by Rev. Milton Gann that the State Association go on record as favoring the action taken by the Board of Trustees of the Florida Free Will Baptist Bible Institute. The motion was seconded and carried.

Bro. Roger Reed, National Sunday School Director, gave a report from the Sunday School Department.

A report was given by the Placement Committee. Motion made, seconded and carried that this report be accepted.

Motion made, seconded and carried to adjourn. Rev. Wendell Walley dismissed in prayer.

Thursday Night

The Choir Director from the local church directed the congregation in, "The Lily of the Valley" and other hymns of worship.

Bro. Penton led in the opening prayer.

A special number, "Go into the Field", was presented by the church choir. They presented also "There is Power in the Blood".

The Moderator directed the congregation in a testimony service. Many gave testimonies of thanksgiving and praise for God's bountiful blessings.

The State Mission Board met one time during this past year. This meeting was in conjunction with the State Executive Board. The meeting was held at Faith Free Will Baptist Church in Marianna, Florida.

Both Boards voted for and agreed to ask the National Home Mission Board to help the State with a "Project 30" program. Brother Harvey Hill had volunteered his service as Florida's State Missionary. The National Home Mission Board was contacted and agreed to work with the State on a "Project 30" program.

The Winter Haven Church valued at \$50,000 was on the verge of losing its property because it could not get a Pastor nor pay its obligations. The Mission Board agreed to send Rev. Hill to the Winter Haven Church.

This is Florida's First Home Missionary, the beginning of a great work in Florida.

We recommend that the State Association allocate \$25.00 for Advertising Literature for our State Home Mission Program. This money would be used by the Mission Board to advertise and promote our Missionary Program.

CHRISTIAN BOARD OF EDUCATION REPORT

In addition to retaining all items now recorded, we recommend the following:

- 1. We recommend churches consider paying their pastor's expenses to the summer session at the Bible College.
- 2. We recommend two Youth Camps be active again this year, with parents encouraging their children to attend.
- 3. We recommend that the amount of \$250.00 be reconsidered and granted to the Christian Board of Education, for the use of promotion.
- 4. We recommend (urge) the churches and Associations of the State of Fla. to allow members of the Board of Christian Education a service on their program with the understanding that they assume responsibility for travel expenses.
- 5. We recommend Free Will Baptist parents remain loyal to Free Will Baptist heritage in sending their children to the Free Will Baptist Bible College for their higher education.

The following recommendations are items already recorded:

- 1. We recommend and urge each Association to sponsor a Sunday School Teachers Workshop during this Associational year using the services of personnel from our National Sunday School Department. It was also recommended that the church nearest the center of the Association act as the host church.
- 2. We recommend and urge each church or churches that are close to each other and who desire to come together for this endeavor to have a Church Training Service Workshop using the services of personnel from our National C.T.S. Department.
- 3. We recommend and urge each church in Florida to use Sunday School C.T.S. or any other literature put out by our National Association and to patronize our bookstore.

- 4. We recommend and urge every church to subscribe to "Contact" on the Family Plan.
- 5. We recommend and urge young people from our state to attend Free Will Baptist Bible College.
- 6. We recommend and urge our pastors to encourage our Young People to take advantage of the opportunity offered by the Free Will Baptist Bible College to attend the Bible Conference in April of each year, and the Missionary Conference in October.
- 7. We recommend and urge each church to sponsor a Daily Vacation Bible School.

CONSTITUTION

AND

BY-LAWS

OF THE

FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION

OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpose; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE I — NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS."

ARTICLE II - REPRESENTATION

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association, which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate from each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof and one (1) delegate from each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates can not be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III — OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: The officers of this association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, secretary and a treasurer.

Section 2. Boards: The standing boards of this Association shall be Planning, Missions, Education, Superannuation, Youth Camp Trustees, and Trustees of Florida Free Will Baptist Bible Institute.

Section 3. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, secretary, and treasurer. Other committees may be appointed as needed.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death or removal from office, or by resignation, the body shall fill vacancy either by proxy or by election of officer to the vacancy at any regular session of the body and the proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 5. The regular election shall take place each year.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of 5 members which shall be elected for 5 year terms on a rotating basis, so, that one new member shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with any officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the teachings of the New Testament. Thus the right to discipline in this body is confined to this body, but a charge against a member of this body and the members of local churches shall constitute a charge against said member in this body and the body shall abide accordingly thereby.

ARTICLE IV — MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This Association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The executive committee may be called into session by the Moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V — FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations represented in this body shall pay entrance fee annually. The amount of this fee shall be determined by the Body while in session and may be changed by a two-thirds vote in any session.

Section 2. Fees are \$10.00 for an association, with five (5) churches. Associations with more than five (5) churches, fees are \$20.00, and for churches \$4.00 per delegate. Fees are \$2.00 for deacons and ministers.

Section 3. All funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted.

BY-LAWS

- Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all the deliberations of this body while in session.
- Section 2. The Moderator shall have the power to rule measures out of order providing this ruling is sustained by two-thirds of the delegates present.
- Section 3. The Vice-Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.
- Section 4. The Vice-Moderator shall be ex-officio member of all standing boards and committees.
- Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of this body.
- Section 6. It shall be the duty of the treasurer to receive all funds, pay all bills, and submit records when leaving office.
- Section 7. All officers and board members must be Free Will Baptists who are in good standing in their respective churches and associations, must belong to this body and must, when elected, live within bounds of this Association. The Treasurer must give bond.
- Section 8. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to provide general plans for this Association, make the budget and regulate fees.
- Section 9. The Executive committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session.
- Section 10. It shall be the duty of the Mission Board to make plans for church extension and operate any state mission work and also work in the interest of the foreign mission program of the National Association. It shall be the duty of the Mission Board to help make our people missionary minded.
- Section 11. It shall be the duty of the Superannuation Board to make general plans for Superannuation for aged ministers, and to cooperate with the National Association in providing insurance protection for our younger ministers.
- Section 12. Amendments to this Constitution must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.
