FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSION BOARD ANNUAL REPORT 1970 – 1971

The board has not met since the last state meeting. The West Palm Beach Project is doing fine; therefore, we have been able to conduct our business by mail or telephone.

Your Mission Board agreed unanimously to loan \$7,000.00 to the West Palm Beach Church for the purchase of the building in which they are meeting. September 1971.

The Orange Park Project was completed with a financial surplus of \$820.12. This amount was transferred to the West Palm Beach Project, and the account was closed. February 1971.

The account of the West Palm Beach Project, (Bro. Ed Cook) presently stands in the red by \$358.49. September 1971.

All the churches to which the board has made loans have their accounts paid up to date. The Lakeland Church paid off their account of \$1,530.72 last December. Titusville Church is paid up thru January 1972.

We, the Board, wish to thank the churches and individuals who through their prayers, love, dedication and sacrifice to God have made our Home Mission work in the State of Florida successful.

REPORT OF THE HOME MISSION PROJECT

IN

WEST PALM BEACH, FLORIDA

TO THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST CONVENING AT MARIANNA, FLORIDA: NOVEMBER 3rd THROUGH 5th, 1971

FROM THE WEST PALM BEACH HOME MISSION PROJECT, COVERING THE PERIOD OF JANUARY 1, 1971 TO NOVEMBER 1, 1971

ORGANIZED INTO CHURCH

In January of 1971 the West Palm Beach Mission organized into a Free Will Baptist Church. Brother Jim Puckett preached the dedication message and Brother Bob King presented the charge to the people. Brother W.C. Combs attended the service representing the State Executive Board and Brother W.E. Cathey attended representing the Home Mission Board. We had a fine service with special singing and a time of fellowship and refreshments after the meeting.

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

In the past few months we have seen our Sunday School average pick up, for this we thank the Lord. For the period of January 1 to November 1 we have averaged 49 in Sunday School and 56 in the morning worship service. We set a new record on October 31, 1971 of 67 in Sunday School and 70 in worship service.

OTHER SERVICES

Our evening services have improved considerably with approximate averages of: 20-25 for C.T.S. and 25-30 for preaching. Our mid-week

services has held strong with an average of 20-30 with an all time high of 43 in one service.

PROPERTY PURCHASES

As you recall from our report in the "Crier" we have been attempting to purchase a parsonage and a building to worship in. We were told 1-95 would soon take the house we were using as a parsonage and the people we were renting the church from were anxious to liquidate their organization and sell the building. This would leave us out on the street in both areas. It took six months for the deal to go through on the parsonage. We just could not understand this kind of a delay. However, God was working, the interest rate dropped to 7%, the lowest in some time for F.H.A. We were able to borrow \$7,000 and buy the 4121 Garden Ave. property for our church building. We plan to use this for a temporary location until God opens a choice piece of property for us. We have been forced to build a new room for a Sunday School class room. We partitioned off a portion of the auditorium for this much needed space.

ASSUMES PERCENT OF SALARY

As of September 1, 1971, the church has been able to assume from the Mission Board \$108 per month of the Cook's salary. Help us pray that the Lord will continue to supply the need.

NORTH FLORIDA FREE WILL BAPTIST YOUTH CAMP CAMP BETHLEHEM

The Bethlehem Youth Camp experienced another wonderful year of success this year. The camp was held June 20-25, 1971.

There were 180 campers who registered for camp (79 boys and 101 girls). There were also 22 staff and workers making a total of 202 persons. The Spirit of Christ was evident among all workers and many campers. All staff showed a real sense of dedication and a concern for the spiritual welfare of each camper. I believe this to be a major reason for the many spiritual decisions made during the week.

Ninety-three persons made public decisions at the altar. Many other private decisions were evidenced among the campers. There were 30 first time decisions for salvation, 54 rededications, and 9 who came for special prayer.

Reverend Jerry Banks, our camp evangelist, from Colquitt, Georgia, brought some very inspiring and challenging messages. He was God's man for the hour. His messages showed a deep concern and compassion for each and every camper.

Morning classes were held for each age group on Christian Growth, Vocation, and Bible Study. Spiritual decisions were reported in many of the classes. Reverend Eddie Riddick was camp director and Reverend Robert Crawford was the assistant.

Plans are already being made for a better and more exciting camp in 1972. The dates will be June 18-23.

CONSTITUTION

AND

BY-LAWS

OF THE

FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpose; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE 1 - NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS".

ARTICLE II - REPRESENTATION

Section i. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association, which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate from each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate from each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, and Promotional Secretary.

Section 2. Boards: The standing boards of this association shall be Planning, Missions, and Christian Education-Youth Board.

Section 3. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, Promotional

Secretary, and one elected member from each affiliated association. A majority members shall constitute a quorum. Other committees shall be appointed as needed.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death or removal from office, or by resignation, the body shall fill vacancy either by proxy or by election of officer to the vacancy at any regular session of the body and the proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 5. The regular election shall take place each year.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of 5 members which shall be elected for 5 year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with any officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the teachings of the New Testament. Thus the right to discipline in this body is confined to this body, but a charge against a member of this body and the members of local churches shall constitute a charge against said member in this body and the body shall abide accordingly thereby.

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

Section I. Regular: This Association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session by the Moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V - FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations represented in this body shall pay entrance fee annually. The amount of this fee shall be determined by the body while in session and may be changed by a two-thirds vote in any session.

Section 2. Fees for an association are based on \$3.00 per member church, and fees for churches are \$5.00 per delegate.

Section 3. All funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session.

Section 2. The Moderator shall have the power to rule measures out of order providing this ruling is sustained by two-thirds of the delegates present.

Section 3. The Vice-Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 4. The Vice-Moderator shall be ex-officio member of all standing boards and committees.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds, pay all bills, and submit records when leaving office.

Section 7. All officers and board members must be Free Will Baptists who are in good standing in their respective churches and associations, must belong to this body and must, when elected, live within bounds of this Association. The Treasurer must give bond. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 8. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to provide general plans for this Association, make the budget and regulate fees.

Section 9. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session.

Section 10. It shall be the duty of the Mission Board to make plans for church extension and operate any state mission work and also work in the interest of the foreign mission program of the National Association. It shall be the duty of the Mission Board to help make our people missionary minded.

Section 11. Amendments to this Constitution must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

CONSTITUTION

AND

BY-LAWS

OF THE

FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSION BOARD OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

CONSTITUTION

Article 1. NAME:

This board shall be known as the Florida State Home Mission Board of Free Will Baptists.

Article 2. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the State of Florida.

Article 3. MEMBERSHIP:

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis: one members term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the constitution and by-laws of the state association.

Article 4. OFFICERS:

Officers of the Board shall be: A Chairman, a Vice Chairman and a Secretary-Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board.

Article 5. MEETINGS:

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary-treasurer. Mileage for board members expenses shall be paid from the general fund limited to 10¢ per mile one way.

Article 6. COMMITTEES:

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

Article 7. REPORTS:

A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual state associational meeting.

Article 8. FINANCES:

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special offerings received through promoting missions. Article 9. MISCELLANEOUS:

Section 1. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section 2. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section 3. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section 4. Any work receiving financial support must accept such as a loan on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

Section 5. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1000.00 loaned.

Section 6. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptists denomination.

Section 7. An agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the mission board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be final.

Section 8. Contracts shall be considered delinquent when 3 successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

Section 9. The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potential for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the mission board.

Section 10. Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1000.00 without joint approval of the mission board and the state executive committee or association.

Article 1. DUTIES OF OFFICERS:

Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to their respective offices. The secretary-treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the boards activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding secretary-treasurer.

Article 2. VOTING AND QUORUM:

A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of board members before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the board.

Article 3. DUTIES OF MEMBERS:

All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the state association.

Article 4. AMENDMENTS:

This constitution and by-laws may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the state association.

CONSTITUTION

AND

BY-LAWS

OF THE

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION-YOUTH BOARD

Article 1. NAME:

This board shall be known as the Christian Education-Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptist.

Article 2. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this board shall be to promote Sunday School, Church Training Service, Free Will Baptist Bible College, Youth Camps, Youth Rallys, Vacation Bible Schools, and Teacher Training Programs, and to be a co-ordinating agency between National, State, and District offices.

Article 3. THE BOARD:

- Section 1. Composition This board shall be composed of five members.
- Section 2. Tenure of Office The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.
- Section 3. Vacancies In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board they will be filled bt the Florida State Association.
- Section 4. Time of Meeting This board will meet semi-annually. As need arises called meetings may be held.
- Section 5. Organization The board shall elect a Chairman and Secretary.

Article 4. DUTIES OF THE BOARD:

- Section 1. To set up and direct CTS competitive activities.
- Section 2. To promote and encourage Teacher Training Courses that have been approved by the National Sunday School Department of the local and district group meetings.
- Section 3. The board shall give a report of its activities at the Florida State Association annual meeting.

Article 5. TRAVEL EXPENSES:

Ten cents per mile one way shall be paid board members for all meetings except the board meetings in connection with the State Association.

Article 6. AMENDMENTS:

This Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of the State Association.

CHURCH COVENANT

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the World. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

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
