up to \$25.00 per week, as personal expense for editing the paper.

2. After careful consideration, that it not be wise to assume control and responsibility of Salem Bible College. We do not feel the state is financially able to assume this responsibility. We also feel it would be unfair to the college for the state to take complete control and yet not bear the burden of the support. We feel this could limit the school's ability to draw needed support from other areas. Therefore, we recommend that Salem Bible College be affiliated with the State Association to advance the cause of Christ on this basis. The state will elect three members of the nine-member board to act in behalf of the state.

We should adopt this with the understanding that as our support grows, changes in the board structure should be made to give the state more control.

3. That at least the same amount Co-op be given to the Salem Bible College this year.

We, your Florida State Home Mission Board, make the following recommendations:

- 1. That we cut the salary of our missionary in W.P.B. 10% 1-1-78 and 15% more 4-1-78 making the church responsible for 50% of his salary and the state 50%.
- 2. That Tom Willy Jr. be recognized as a missionary at large to the Spanish speaking people of Florida, and be affiliated with the F.S.H.M.B. and that we allow his support to be channeled through our Mission Board Treasure.
- 3. That any association, or church, having a Missionary Conference use one of our own State Missionaries: Tom Willy Jr., Norlin Jones, Harley Brown, or J.D. Norris Jr.

Item No. 1 Ammend to change dates: (to) April 1st and June the 1st defeated.

We, the Planning Board, offer these recommendations for consideration.

- 1. We recommend 50,000 for a goal for the State Cooperative Plan.
- 2. We recommend that our treasurer be paid \$15.00 per month from the General Fund.
- 3. We recommend that our Moderator and Clerk be paid \$75.00 each from the General Fund.
 - 4. We recommend these percentages for dividing the Cooperative money:

20% Executive Department

23% Home Missions Department

23% Foreign Missions Department

23% Bible College

9% C.T.S.

2% Retirement Board

For State projects divided thus: (no charge)

50% Home Mission Board

10% Promotional Board

16% Youth Board

5% General Fund

5% Children's Home

14% Salem Bible College

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

Whereas, the proponents of present day humanistic ideologies have used the basic American ideals of equal rights for all men to promote laws that tend to appear on the surface to re-enforce our freedoms, but in fact weaken the moral fibers of our nation. We recommend that each Free Will Baptist believer, as a citizen of this state, be alert to the dangers of such movements as Gay Rights legislation, the Equal Rights Amendment, the Childrens Bill of Rights, and abortion on demand legislation. Although all of these are based on areas of legitimate abuse which as Christians we should avoid, we feel that the above porposed legislation entails dangers for our Christian life-style.

Whereas, dealers in pornographic materials are flooding our communities and the Supreme Court has ruled that the definition of obscenity is to be dictated by the local community. We recommend that each Free Will Baptist take an active part in his or her community by expressing his personal convictions in opposition to this type of immorality.

Whereas, pornographic dealers will go out of business if no one buys their wares, we recommend that as Christians we refrain from purchasing or in anyway backing anyone who is in anyway involved with the distribution of these

materials.

A short meeting held after church services to call the moderator's attention to the fact that the Education Youth Board had been left off of the list of groups to have their mileage raised from 10¢ to 15¢ per mile one way.

Adjourned.

Rally and competition in Jacksonville, May 20th, 1977. The meeting was attended by Rev. G. Helton, Rev. D. Owen, Rev. Charles Powell Sis. Karen Freeman and Sis. Ruby Amerson.

Programs for the youth competition were given out. We discussed last minute plans for dividing into groups for the teams to have their preliminary games. We also decided that we would not have any teams in competition on Friday night. The leader in Bible Bowl competition was to make a decision as to when he felt that it would be necessary for him to begin Bible Bowl in order for us to finish on schedule.

Rev. Norlin Jones had asked for the Board to hear him regarding a plan to involve the Youth Board in a fund raising project for the (Mission) in Daytona Beach. We agreed that we would wait until the morning meeting to make any decision on this request.

The new books of rules were passed out and generally accepted. Bro. Dennis Owen moved that we eliminate the clause that would allow a church to send their contestants to the State Competition if they did not belong to an association. This was carried.

The secretary was to print up the booklet and send out to the churches involved in competition.

Saturday morning, May 21st, 1977. The Board met again (all members present). It was agreed that we would tell Bro. Jones that we could not as a Board support his project with fund raising but if he wanted to approach the youth in the state on an individual basis we would each help all we could.

CONSTITUTION

and
BY-LAWS
of the

FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpose; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE I-NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS."

ARTICLE II—REPRESENTATION

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association, which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate from each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof, and one, (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III—OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2. Boards: The standing boards of this association shall be Planning Missions, and Christian Education-Youth Board.

Section 3. The Executive committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, and one elected member from each affiliated association or Quarterly meeting. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum. Other committees shall be appointed as needed.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death or removal from office, or by resignation, the body shall fill vacancy by election of officer to the vacancy at regular session of the body and a proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 5. General officers of this Association shall serve for the term of

two (2) years.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of 5 members which shall be elected for 5 year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with any officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the teachings of the New Testament. Thus the right to discipline in this body is confined to this body, but a charge against a member of this body and the members of local churches shall constitute a charge against said member in this body and the body shall abide accordingly thereby.

ARTICLE IV—MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The executive committee may be called into session by the moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V-FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations represented in this body shall pay entrance fee annually. The amount of this fee shall be determined by the body while in session and may be changed by a two-thirds vote in any session.

Section 2. Fees for an association are based on \$3.00 per member church,

and fees for churches are \$5.00 per delegate.

Section 3. All funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 4. Mileage for Executive Committee members, representatives of Childrens Home, Christian Education Youth Board and Home Mission Board, to be paid 15¢ a mile one way, from the General Fund.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session.

Section 2. The Moderator shall have the power to rule measures out of order providing this ruling is sustained by two-thirds of the delegates present.

Section 3. The Vice-Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 4. The Vice-Moderator shall be ex-officio member of all standing boards and committees.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds, pay all bills, and submit records when leaving office.

Section 7. All officers and board members must be Free Will Baptists who are in good standing in their respective churches and associations, must belong to this body and must, when elected, live within bounds of this Association. The

Treasurer must give bond. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 8. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to recommend the budget to this body.

Section 9. The executive committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the association when the association is not in session.

Section 10. It shall be the duty of the Mission Board to make plans for church extension and operate any state mission work and also work in the interest of the foreign mission program of the National Association. It shall be the duty of the Mission Board to help make our people missionary minded.

Section 11. Amendments to this Constitution must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSION BOARD OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

CONSTITUTION ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Florida State Home Mission Board of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the state of Florida.

ARTICLE III-MEMBERSHIP

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis: one member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-laws of the State Association.

ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS

Secretary-Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board.

ARTICLE V—MEETINGS

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary-treasurer. Mileage for board members' expenses shall be paid from the general fund limited to 10¢ per mile one way.

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ARTICLE VI—COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE VII—REPORTS

A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Associational meeting.

ARTICLE VIII—FINANCES

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special offerings received through promoting missions.

ARTICLE IX-MISCELLANEOUS

Section 1. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section 2. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section 3. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section 4. Any work receiving financial support must accept such as a loan on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

Section 5. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however, no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1,000.00 loaned.

Section 6. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 7. An agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be final.

Section 8. Contracts shall be considered delinquent when 3 successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

Section 9. The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potential for organizing a Free Will Baptist church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of

funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board.

Section 10. Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1,000.00 without joint approval of the mission board and the state executive committee or association.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I-DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to their respective offices. The Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the board's activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Secretary-Treasurer.

ARTICLE II—VOTING AND QUORUM

A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of board members before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the board.

ARTICLE III—DUTIES OF MEMBERS

All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the State Association.

ARTICLE IV—AMENDMENTS

This Constitution and By-laws may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the State Association.

CONSTITUTION
and
BY-LAWS
of the
CHRISTIAN EDUCATION—YOUTH BOARD

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Christian Education-Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be to promote Sunday School, Church Training Service, Free Will Baptist Bible College, Youth Camps, Youth Rallies, Vacation Bible Schools, and Teacher Training Programs, and to be a coordinating agency between National, State, and District offices.

ARTICLE III—THE BOARD

Section 1. Composition—This board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of Office—The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 4. Time of Meeting—This board will meet semi-annually. As need arises called meetings may be held.

Section 5. Organization—The board shall elect a Chairman and Secretary.

ARTICLE IV-DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. To set up and direct CTS competitive activities.

Section 2. To promote and encourage Teacher Training courses that have been approved by the National Sunday School Department of the local and district group meetings.

Section 3. The board shall give a report of its activities at the Florida State Association annual meeting.

ARTICLE V-TRAVEL EXPENSES

Ten cents per mile one way shall be paid board members for all meetings except the board meetings in connection with the State Association.

ARTICLE VI—AMENDMENTS

This Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of the State Association.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Jesus Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His Grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peace," to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the Salvation of the World. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
