ANNUAL REPORT FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSION BOARD

This has been a year of great accomplishment for Florida Free Will Baptists. With Home Missions we have much to report.

We presently have four Home Missions works in the state. Our newest work is Gainesville. Rev. Robert Smith has recently completed his itinerary. We need more support for this work, however, and ask you to help. Pray for him and his family as they work to build a church on the shores of Lake

Newnan. They have been running about 40 in Sunday School.

Rev. Norlin Jones is our missionary in Daytona Beach. Bro. Jones has done a wonderful job with property given by a local civic association. Many have faithfully supported the effort to turn the community house facility into a church. More is needed. There is an outstanding debt of nearly \$4,000.00 for furniture and other necessities. The Daytona Beach church is averaging 18 in Sunday School. Bro. Jones has been hindered in his work by a recurring back problem. Pray for him and his work. This mission as well as the mission in Gainesville are Joint Projects with the National Home Missions Board.

Our church in Tallahassee is a National Home Missions project built by Rev. J. D. Norris. The Lake Jackson Free Will Baptist church averaged 100 for the month of September and needs to expand their facility soon. They are hindered by a \$38,000.00 debt for their land. This work needs help to pay off

this amount so the growth they are displaying can continue.

West Palm Beach is our senior mission work in the State. Rev. Harley Brown is the Pastor. Averaging 27 in Sunday School, they have been hindered by a recent rapid turnover rate, losing several members and good supporters. They have an outstanding facility and location but need our prayer and support to grow.

Three of our members, Rev. Ken Walker, Rev. Harvey Hill and Rev. Gary Fry took a tour of three of our four works in April. This type tour is being considered for an annual project as a fact-finding and good will trip for the

board.

It has been our joy to serve the Lord and the State of Florida Free Will Baptists this year on the Home Missions Board.

MSC that after having surveyed the work at Gainesville, we feel a dire urgency to secure a worker as soon as possible. Two reasons prompting this are:

1. The intent of a letter mailed to Mr. O. W. Sams dated 7-26-78.

2. We have met with the people and have seen their burden for the work and the potential that actually exists for a good church.

MSC that the chairman of this Board be in close contact with Bro. Wingate Hansley as to the progress of coming to a workable solution in the situation in Gainesville.

MSC that the chairman send a letter to Norlin Jones in Daytona Beach as to the following:

1. We really appreciate his labor of love.

2. He has our prayers for his physical and spiritual health.

3. We suggest:

a. that a sign be erected as soon as possible.

b. that the building and property be cleaned.

4. We will promote his work whenever we can.

MSC that the chairman send a letter to Harley Brown at West Palm Beach as to the following:

- 1. We appreciate his work and the sweet spirit and response of the church.
 - 2. We want you to pray seriously about a percentage change before November and the state meeting.

3. We feel it better if you suggest the percentage of change than us.

4. We feel that the people understand our position better, but we want you to keep that position before them.

MSC that the Board sponsor a Home Missions Walk-A-Thon Boost from September 1-15, 1979. The participants are to choose their own Saturday within that time span. Our goal will be \$8,000.00 to be divided equally between Tallahassee, West Palm Beach, Daytona Beach, and Gainesville. This special giving is to be above our regular missions giving. A letter is to accompany the money to each church advising its use.

MINUTES October 17, 1979

The Florida State Home Mission Board met at Gainesville, Fla. Members present were Ken Walker, Harvey Hill, and Gary Fry. The immediate purpose of the meeting was to explain the contractual arrangements with Rev. Robert Smith and express what the board expected of the church as support for Bro. Smith. Those requests were:

1. \$100.00 monthly car allowance.

2. Housing equal to \$150.00 monthly.

3. \$50.00 monthly for utilities.

4. That the church designate in their records that \$300.00 of the Pastor's

monthly salary is housing allowance for tax purposes.

5. That the church support the Cooperative Program in accord with Article 9, Section 3 of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Florida State Home Mission Board.

These articles were to be voted upon in a special called business meeting at the church.

MSC to recommend as a course of action at West Palm Beach the following:

- 1. Support shall continue at the present rate of 50% for six (6) months until April 30, 1980.
- 2. Support shall continue from May 1, 1980 until October 31, 1980 at the rate of 25%.
- 3. On October 31, 1980, support by the State Home Missions Department shall cease.
- 4. That the missionary-pastor be free to work to supplement his income.
- 5. Recommendation: That the Florida State Home Mission Board mileage be adjusted to be in line with the Executive Committee allowance (see Art. 5).

Discussion was made concerning our Walk-A-Thon. It was not as successful as hoped.

The Board discussed the necessity of all members receiving a monthly

report from all our missionaries in the state.

MSC that the Secretary/Treasurer send monthly Financial Reports to all board members as well.

WOMAN'S AUXILIARY November 1, 1979

I am proud to be able to report to the Florida State Association on behalf

of the State Woman's Auxiliary.

Our state auxiliary met in Auburndale on June 2 with our theme being "Knowing and Growing." We had 49 in attendance. During our fiscal year for 1978-79 our state collected and disbursed a total of \$4,048.65, \$1,394.14 of which was for our state projects, which included Daytona Beach Mission, Contacto Magazine, WNAC, Tom Willey, Jr., Tallahassee Mission, and Mabel Willey. Other gifts included youth camps, various missionaries, and Foreign and Home Missions. The only money kept in our treasury from the monies received is 25¢ from each \$1.50 dues received from our district and local members.

Already this year our state treasurer has received \$1,118.03, \$692.02 of which has been properly credited to our state project accounts, which consist this year of *Daytona Beach* and *Tallahassee* Missions, *WNAC*, *Tom Willey*, *Jr.* personal account, and *Jim Combs*. Our state goal for these five accounts is \$275.00 each or a total of \$1,375.00. Divided equally among our members it would come to \$6.75 per member for the entire year.

The Auburndale church has sent a check by me for the last three months collections in the amount of \$104.00 to bring our total collected for state

projects along in the state to \$796.02.

We were privileged to have two guest speakers at our convention in June. Mrs. Lorene Miley was our keynote speaker and Mrs. Cleo Pursell told us about our national work. Though we were small in number our blessings were multiplied through the message delivered by these ladies.

We now have three districts and three locals reporting to our state. If your church has an auxiliary and you are not sure how you should report, see me during the day and I'll try to help you. Maybe you have funds which you have not sent, why not mail them on to the treasurer so our missions projects can benefit from them now.

I have noticed last year when the state association prepared *its budget* everyone was included in their plan of work except the woman's auxiliary. I hope that you will consider our auxiliary work important enough this year to at least remember us with some small amount in the state budget.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpose; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE I—NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS."

ARTICLE II—REPRESENTATION

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association, which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate from each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III—OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2. Boards: The standing boards of this association shall be

Planning, Missions, Christian Education and Youth Board.

Section 3. The Executive committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, and one elected member from each affiliated association or Quarterly meeting. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum. Other committees shall be appointed as needed.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death or removal from office, or by resignation, the body shall fill vacancy by election of officer to the

vacancy at regular session of the body and a proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 5. General officers of this Association shall serve for the term of

two (2) years.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of 5 members which shall be elected for 5 year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member

shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with any officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the teachings of the New Testament. Thus the right to discipline in this body is confined to this body, but a charge against a member of this body and the members of local churches shall constitute a charge against said member in this body and the body shall abide accordingly thereby.

ARTICLE IV—MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session

by the moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V—FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations represented in this body shall pay entrace fee annually. The amount of this fee shall be determined by the body while in session and may be changed by a two-thirds vote in any session.

Section 2. Fees for an association are based on \$3.00 per member church,

and fees for churches are \$5.00 per delegate.

Section 3. All funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session and no funds

may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 4. Mileage for Executive Committee members and representatives of Children's Home, to be paid 10¢ a mile from the General Fund, and if a called meeting requires members to stay over night, the room and board of each member will be paid from the General Fund.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session.

Section 2. The Moderator shall have the power to rule measures out of order providing this ruling is sustained by two-thirds of the delegates present.

Section 3. The Vice-Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 4. The Vice-Moderator shall be ex-officio member of all standing boards and committees.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds, pay all

bills, and submit records when leaving office.

Section 7. All officers and board members must be Free Will Baptists who are in good standing in their respective churches and associations, must belong to this body and must, when elected, live within bounds of this Association. The Treasurer must give bond. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 8. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to recommend the budget to this body.

Section 9. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the association when the association is not in session.

Section 10. It shall be the duty of the Mission Board to make plans of church extension and operate any state mission work and also work in the interest of the foreign mission program of the National Association. It shall be the duty of the Mission Board to help make our people missionary minded.

Section 11. Amendments to this Constitution must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSION BOARD OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Florida State Home Mission Board of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the state of Florida.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis: one member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association.

ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS

Secretary-Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board.

ARTICLE V—MEETINGS

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary-treasurer. Mileage for board members' expenses shall be paid from the general fund limited to 10¢ per mile.

ARTICLE VI—COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE VII—REPORTS

A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Associational meeting.

ARTICLE VIII—FINANCES

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special offerings received through promoting missions.

ARTICLE IX—MISCELLANEOUS

Section 1. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section 2. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section 3. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section 4. Any work receiving financial support must accept such as a loan on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

Section 5. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however, no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1,000.00 loaned.

Section 6. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 7. An agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be final.

Section 8. Contracts shall be considered delinquent when 3 successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

Section 9. The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potential for organizing a Free Will Baptist church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board.

Section 10. Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1,000.00 without joint approval of the mission board and the state executive committee or association.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I—DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties perculiar to their respective offices. The Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the board's activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Secretary-Treasurer.

ARTICLE II—VOTING AND QUORUM

A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and beduly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of board members before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the board.

ARTICLE III—DUTIES OF MEMBERS

All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the State Association.

ARTICLE IV—AMENDMENTS, ARTICLE IV—AMENDMENTS, ARTICLE IV—IVANTE IVANTE I

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE II—DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. The duties of this board shall be to promote Youth Camps, Youth Rallies, and to be a co-ordinating agency between District, State and National Offices.

Section 2. To set up and direct C.T.S. Competitive activities.

Section 3. This board shall give a report of its activities to the Florida State Association's annual meeting.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of office—The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this

board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 4. Meetings—This board will meet semi-annually. As need arises called meetings may be held.

Section 5. Organization—The board shall elect a chairman and a secretary.

ARTICLE IV—TRAVEL EXPENSES

Ten cents per mile shall be paid board members for all meetings, except the board meeting in connection with the State Association.

ARTICLE V

This constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of the State Association.

constitution of the CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD of the FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Christian Education Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists, among these, Statewide Bible Institutes, Teacher Training Programs, Sunday School, C.T.S., Free Will Baptist Colleges and any other training methods that will help in the growth of our churches.

ARTICLE III—THE BOARD

Section 1. Composition—This Board shall be composed of five members. Section 2. Tenure of Office—The members of this Board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The Board shall elect a Chairman, Assistant Chairman and

Secretary-Treasurer, which shall be elected annually.

Section 4. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this Board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 5. The Board shall meet at least once a year and/or whenever a meeting is deemed necessary.

ARTICLE IV—DUTIES OF THE BOARD

ARTICLE VI—COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE VII—REPORTS

A complete report of the board meetings and activities, and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association meeting.

ARTICLE VIII—AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the State Association.
