RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

1. Whereas a task force of the National Council of Churches is proposing the substitution of neuter and/or feminine designations for many masculine words and phrases in the Bible, and

Whereas we as Christians have a responsibility to teach the truth and defend the truth as found in the Bible—The Word of God.

Be it resolved that we oppose the use of any version of the Bible that would take the gender away from any scriptural reference to God and man—such changes as suggested by the feminists who contend that the Bible in its present form is biased against women.

2. Whereas there is a real crisis in the world refugee situation, and

Whereas these refugees are souls for whom Christ died and to whom the Church is commissioned to preach the gospel, and

Whereas, the Scriptures command Christians to express God's love by meeting human needs (1 John 3:17),

Be it resolved that the Churches of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptist commend, pray for, and support financially those organizations like World Vision or World Relief Corporation who minister to both the spiritual and practical needs of the refugees.

FLORIDA HOME MISSION BOARD REPORT

The State Missions Program consists of two Joint Projects and one National Project.

Gainesville: Rev. Robert Smith left the work in August, 1980. Rev. Albert Rollins has been hired as missionary and is presently on itinerate across the state. He completed two weeks itinerate in North Carolina before moving to Florida.

Daytona Beach: Rev. Norlin Jones left the work in June 1980 for health reasons. Rev. John Rhodes had been serving as assistant to Rev. Jones for some two years when Rev. Jones resigned. Rev. Rhodes has been under contract to the Board as interim missionary since Rev. Jones' departure. A review of the work in Daytona Beach is scheduled for the State Meeting. If Rev. Rhodes is retained as missionary it will be necessary for the work to be a state work instead of Joint. Rev. Rhodes does not have the two years Pastoral experience required by the National Home Mission Board for approval as missionary.

Tallahassee: Rev. J. D. Norris is our missionary in the National work in Tallahassee. The work is progressing well, but there is great need for funds for the Building and Land funds. The church is presently engaged in the Christian school ministry using the Accelerated Christian Education program. Their initial fall enrollment was 92 in grades k-12.

West Palm Beach: The work in West Palm Beach will no longer be under the State Board as of October 31, 1980. This by the vote of the body as the 1979 State Meeting. Rev. Harley Brown remains as pastor and is currently working part time.

It was necessary for the Board to meet numerous times this year to accomplish the hiring of two new missionaries. The minutes of those meetings are lengthy and therefore not included in this report. They are open to those interested.

WOMAN'S AUXILIARY REPORT

The Florida State Woman's Auxiliary Convention met in Jacksonville at the Wesconnett Church on Saturday, June 7th. There were 32 present.

We were blessed to have Mrs. Amy Robinson, wife of Paul Robinson and Missionary to Uruguay as our speaker. She shared with us some of the highlights of her eighteen years in Uruguay and helped us to realize anew the joy of serving Christ.

During the fiscal year for 1979-1980 a total of \$4,685.00 passed through the hands of our state treasurer for missions work. \$1,830 of this was for our state project which included Daytona Beach Mission; Tallahassee Mission, WNAC, Tom Willey, Jr., & Jim & Shirley Combs. We are pleased that we exceeded our goal and adopted a project for the coming year to include WNAC, Florida State Home Missions, National Foreign Missions & CONTACTO Magazine. No dollar amount has been set, however, we feel to give less than \$4,000 would not be good since we gave over that amount last year. When sending in your monies for Home or Foreign Missions each local auxiliary or district may designate the missionary account that they wish to receive their monies, if no designation is made the treasurer will send the monies received to the missionary account which needs it the most. No money will be sent to the National Office just marked "Foreign Missions" but will be sent to a deficit account. Mrs. Robinson told our ladies how much they had profited by this publication of CONTACTO so we feel the need to keep this magazine in print is really great.

So far this year our treasurer reports gifts to Foreign Missions in the amount of \$407.24; Home Missions, \$235.94; WNAC, \$338.05; CONTACTO, \$80.00 and the Bible College (for various projects) \$105.33.

For the information of those treasurers of the locals or districts sending funds to our state treasurer with amounts designated—please do not write on the back or bottom of your checks the person to whom the money is designated. Please make your checks out to the WSAC and attach a small piece of paper to the check with your designations on it—not on the check. This has something to do with the Internal Revenue. There seems to have been a question in some of

the organizations when the specified amounts appeared on the check.

It was recommended by the state that each local auxiliary send a \$10.00 donation annually to help defray the expenses of our missionary speaker for our conventions.

Our next convention is to be combined with a prayer retreat which is to be held at the Camp Rotary Camp Grounds, Auburndale, Florida, providing the necessary repairs are made, Friday night and Saturday, June 5th and 6th. This is something new for the State of Florida but most of the ladies present felt it would be good. It is hoped to be able to begin our retreat at 6:00 P.M. on Friday afternoon. All those who are interested in coming may register by sending a \$15.00 fee which will include a nights lodging, breakfast, and lunch on Saturday. You may bring your own sheet and pillow. We felt this would be a considerable savings to our ladies over the motel and restaurant costs.

At least one new auxiliary has been organized since June. We welcome Daytona Beach into our work. Although they organized at a time it was not convenient for me to be present Helen Allen took care of everything, and I wish to thank her for that.

All officers of the auxiliary are asked to meet directly after lunch for a short planning meeting. Officers include all those elected and the presidents of all districts or locals where no district is held. Any suggestions you may have to help us with our state meetings or retreat would be appreciated.

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CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpose; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE I—NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS."

ARTICLE II—REPRESENTATION

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association, which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates. Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate from each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III—OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2. Boards: The standing boards of this association shall be

Planning, Missions, Christian Education and Youth Board.

Section 3. The Executive committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, and one elected member from each affiliated association or Quarterly meeting. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum. Other committees shall be appointed as needed.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death or removal from office, or by resignation, the body shall fill vacancy by election of officer to the

vacancy at regular session of the body and a proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 5. General officers of this Association shall serve for the term of

two (2) years.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of 5 members which shall be elected for 5 year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member

shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with any officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the teachings of the New Testament. Thus the right to discipline in this body is confined to this body, but a charge against a member of this body and the members of local churches shall constitute a charge against said member in this body and the body shall abide accordingly thereby.

ARTICLE IV—MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session

by the moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V—FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations represented in this body shall pay entrace fee annually. The amount of this fee shall be determined by the body while in session and may be changed by a two-thirds vote in any session.

Section 2. Fees for an association are based on \$3.00 per member church,

and fees for churches are \$5.00 per delegate.

Section 3. All funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session and no funds

may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 4. Mileage for Executive Committee members and representatives of Children's Home, to be paid 10¢ a mile from the General Fund, and if a called meeting requires members to stay over night, the room and board of each member will be paid from the General Fund.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session.

Section 2. The Moderator shall have the power to rule measures out of order providing this ruling is sustained by two-thirds of the delegates present.

Section 3. The Vice-Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 4. The Vice-Moderator shall be ex-officio member of all standing boards and committees.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all

the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds, pay all

bills, and submit records when leaving office.

Section 7. All officers and board members must be Free Will Baptists who are in good standing in their respective churches and associations, must belong to this body and must, when elected, live within bounds of this Association. The Treasurer must give bond. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 8. It shall be the duty of the Planning Board to recommend the

budget to this body.

Section 9. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the association when the association is not in session.

Section 10. It shall be the duty of the Mission Board to make plans of church extension and operate any state mission work and also work in the interest of the foreign mission program of the National Association. It shall be the duty of the Mission Board to help make our people missionary minded.

Section 11. Amendments to this Constitution must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSION BOARD OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Florida State Home Mission Board of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the state of Florida.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis: one member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association.

ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS

Secretary-Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board.

ARTICLE V-MEETINGS

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary-treasurer. Mileage for board members' expenses shall be paid from the general fund limited to 10¢ per mile.

ARTICLE VI—COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE VII—REPORTS

A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Associational meeting.

ARTICLE VIII—FINANCES

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special offerings received through promoting missions.

ARTICLE IX—MISCELLANEOUS

Section 1. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section 2. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section 3. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section 4. Any work receiving financial support must accept such as a loan on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

Section 5. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however, no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1,000.00 loaned.

Section 6. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 7. An agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be final.

Section 8. Contracts shall be considered delinquent when 3 successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

Section 9. The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potential for organizing a Free Will Baptist church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board.

Section 10. Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1,000.00 without joint approval of the mission board and the state executive committee or association.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I—DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties perculiar to their respective offices. The Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the board's activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Secretary-Treasurer.

ARTICLE II—VOTING AND QUORUM

A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of board members before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the board.

ARTICLE III—DUTIES OF MEMBERS

All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the State Association.

ARTICLE IV—AMENDMENTS

This Constitution and By-laws may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the State Association.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE II—DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. The duties of this board shall be to promote Youth Camps, Youth Rallies, and to be a co-ordinating agency between District, State and National Offices.

Section 2. To set up and direct C.T.S. Competitive activities.

Section 3. This board shall give a report of its activities to the Florida State Association's annual meeting.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of office—The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 4. Meetings—This board will meet semi-annually. As need arises called meetings may be held.

Section 5. Organization—The board shall elect a chairman and a secretary.

ARTICLE IV—TRAVEL EXPENSES

Ten cents per mile shall be paid board members for all meetings, except the board meeting in connection with the State Association.

ARTICLE V

This constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of the State Association.

CONSTITUTION of the CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD of the FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Christian Education Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists, among these, Statewide Bible Institutes, Teacher Training Programs, Sunday School, C.T.S., Free Will Baptist Colleges and any other training methods that will help in the growth of our churches.

ARTICLE III—THE BOARD

Section 1. Composition—This Board shall be composed of five members. Section 2. Tenure of Office—The members of this Board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The Board shall elect a Chairman, Assistant Chairman and

Secretary-Treasurer, which shall be elected annually.

Section 4. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this Board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 5. The Board shall meet at least once a year and/or whenever a meeting is deemed necessary.

ARTICLE IV—DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. To create a statewide Bible Institute program that will assist and encourage the development of regional extensions in each local association.

Section 2. To assist and encourage the growth of Sunday Schools through Sunday School Conventions, workshops, etc.

Section 3. To promote the organizing of new C.T.S. groups and to assist

in the training portion of existing C.T.S. groups.

Section 4. To encourage the young people of our churches to further their education in our denomination's institutions.

ARTICLE V—TRAVEL EXPENSES

Ten cents per mile per vehicle shall be paid board members for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association.

If a called meeting requires members to stay overnight the room and board of each member will be paid.

ARTICLE VI—COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE VII—REPORTS

A complete report of the board meetings and activities, and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association meeting.

ARTICLE VIII—AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the State Association.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Jesus Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His Grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peace," to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the Salvation of the World. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
