

YOUTH BOARD REPORT

FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSION BOARD REPORT

The Home Mission program in Florida consists of one state project in Daytona Beach, one joint project in Gainesville, and one national project in Tallahassee. It is with pleasure we report to our State Association while in session November 3-5, in Jacksonville, Florida the progress, blessings, accomplishments and needs of each work as we begin a new year.

Daytona Beach - The Rev. John Rhodes and his wife, Gail are serving in Daytona Beach and have done a good work during this past year. This church property was given to us two or three years ago, with the understanding which hundreds of other Free Will Baptist Churches in our denomination have in their deeds and that is, should Daytona Beach Free Will Baptist Church ever cease to exist as a church it will revert back to the original owners. They are

averaging in the 20's for Sunday School and a little more in the evening services, many improvements have been made on the property this past year such as the completion of their baptistry, a new fiberglass church steeple, plus painting and redecorating both inside and outside. They had a VBS this year, with an average of 34. They have a Woman's Aux., CTS, Visitation Outreach and a Youth Group. Several have been saved and baptized with several rededications. Several things are in the planning for the coming year. Please pray for the Rhodes Family and Daytona Church.

Gainesville - The Rev. Albert Rollins and his wife, Irene are serving as our missionaries in Gainesville, Florida and are doing a great job working in this area. During this past year their attendance in Sunday School has averaged about 35 and about 45 for church on Sunday mornings with about 30 in the evening. They have a Home Bible study each Tuesday evening. In the past few weeks there has been several saved and a few adults to take membership with the church. Offerings have increased about \$150.00 per month. The church has now an option on a choice piece of property, just off I-75. The fastest growing part of Gainesville. The price of the land is \$50,000.00 with an option for 90 days at \$1,000.00 renewable each 90 days for one year at \$1,000.00 each time. They can close the deal with \$15,000.00 down and the balance at $12\frac{1}{2}$ percent for 12 years or cash. The church is asking \$73,500.00 for their property which would net the church about \$65,000.00 after all closing costs are deducted. Two prospects are now interested in the property and if proper zoning can be changed to R2 it could be sold immediately. This they are working with the city on. A missions conference and a five night revival was held in July plus a Vacation Bible School with good attendance in all. Please pray for this work that God will send a buyer for their present property and pray for the Rollins Family as they lead these people during this time of testing.

Tallahassee - The Rev. J. D. Norris and wife, Beverly are our national missionaries in Tallahassee and doing an outstanding job as they build a church in Tallahassee for the Glory of God. God has blessed this work tremendously since the Norris Family began this work five years ago. They now average in the 80's in Sunday School with over 100 in Sunday morning worship service and in the 60's on Sunday evening and Wednesday evening. On August 15, 1982 on their 5th anniversary in Tallahassee they had 102 in Sunday School and 140 plus for the worship service. Their outreach also includes the Lake Jackson Christian Academy with 125 students. Three of these will be entering our Bible College next fall. Also a radio program each Sunday morning over radio station W.C.V.C. entitled, "Joy in the Morning". They have also an active bus ministry. Several have been saved and baptized this past year. Their needs in which we can help is they are badly in need of a bigger building. They have \$10,000.00 in their building fund but need at least \$25,000.00 to get it under roof. They hope God will soon send them a few more tithers so that they can go self supporting. You can help in all these matters by giving to these needs of your financial means. Please also pray for this great mission field.

PRAISE ITEMS FROM THE FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSIONS BOARD

We wish to express our gratitude to the following brethren of the Lake Wales, Florida Free Will Baptist Church for the gift of \$6,000.00 plus interest from the sale of their property. We will receive this money at approximately \$100.00 per month each month for seven (7) years.

Also, we wish to express our appreciation to the brethren in the panhandle area of Florida who designated \$4,000.00 to State Home Mission Board from the sale of their property at Crestview, \$2,000.00 of this to be used in the Tallahassee work and \$2,000.00 for the work in Gainesville, Florida.

We also wish to thank all of our people here in Florida who have

contributed to our Home Mission work this past year.

Our Board also wishes to inform our people here in Florida that the property situation in Jacksonville of the Church located at the S.E. corner of Commonwealth and Palm Streets in which our board was deeded the property. Because of the refusal by the two only remaining members of the church, the property has not been sold but our board is working to get a soon settlement and have met and discussed terms for a settlement. We are awaiting an answer from the two members when we expect cooperation on their part in this matter.

Your Boards desire is to begin a new work in St. Petersburg, Florida where there is a group of people already working and meeting in the home of Brother Laron Dye. If we can phase out one of our present works and more of our people and churches support us we could possibly send a man to St. Petersburg within a year. However your help is necessary. Please help us pray

about this matter.

The slight increase in our financial report in the general fund is because of these large gifts listed above, if we had not received these gifts from the sale of these churches, it would not have been so. We do not want to see our finances grow due to sale of churches; we want to establish more churches. Will you help us by giving liberally this year?

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpose; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE I—NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "The Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists."

ARTICLE II—REPRESENTATION

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association which are members of this

body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates. Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate for each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III—OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2. Boards: The standing boards of this association shall be Home

Missions, Christian Education and Youth Board.

Section 3. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, and one elected member from each affiliated association or Quarterly Meeting. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum. Other committees shall be appointed as needed.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death, removal from office, or by resignation, the general officers shall appoint a temporary replacement until the next regular session of this body, at which time the body shall elect a permanent replacement. A proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any

absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 5. General officers of this Association shall serve for the term of

two (2) years.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of five (5) members which shall be elected to five (5) year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have the right to discipline any officer or board member who does not conduct his office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the New Testament.

ARTICLE IV—MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session

by the moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V—FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations in this body shall pay a representation fee annually. The amount of this fee for an association is \$15.00 per member church. The fee for local churches is \$10.00 per delegate.

Section 2. All Cooperative Plan funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in

session, and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 3. Mileage for the Executive Committee members and the Florida board member to the Children's Home shall be paid at twelve (12¢) cents per mile from the General Fund. If a called meeting requires a member to stay over-night, his room and board will be paid from the General Fund. Mileage and expenses shall be paid for the moderator to attend the denomination's annual leadership conference.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

Section 2. The Assistant Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all

the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds, pay all bills, and submit records when leaving office. The Treasurer must give bond while filling this office.

Section 5. Each officer and board member must be a member in good standing of a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this body. He must be in good standing with his local association, and must live within the boundaries of this Association. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 6. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session.

Section 7. Amendments to this Constitution and By-Laws must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSION BOARD OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Florida State Home Mission Board of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the state of Florida.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis: one member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association.

ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES

Officers of this board shall be Chairman, and Secretary-Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board. Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE V—MEETINGS

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary-treasurer.

ARTICLE VI—FINANCES

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special officers received through promoting missions. Mileage for board members' expenses shall be paid from the general fund, limited to 10¢ per mile.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to their respective offices. The Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the board's activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2. A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of a quorum before it is considered final. All members not present in

meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the board.

Section 3. All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the State Association.

Section 4. A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Associational

meeting.

Section 5. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section 6. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the

selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section 7. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support

the denominational cooperative program.

Section 8. Any work receiving financial support as a loan must accept such on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

Section 9. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however, no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1,000.00 loaned.

Section 10. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 11. An Agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be

final.

Section 12. Contracts shall be considered delinquent when 3 successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts

may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

Section 13. The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potenital for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board.

Section 14. Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1,000.00 without joint approval of the mission board and the state executive committee or association.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE II—DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. The duties of this board shall be to promote Youth Camps, Youth Rallies, and to be a co-ordaining agency between District, State and National Offices.

Section 2. To set up and direct C.T.S. Competitive activities.

Section 3. This board shall give a report of its activities to the Florida State Association's annual meeting.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of office—The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only *one* member's term expires annually.

Section 3. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this

board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 4. Meetings—This board will meet semi-annually. As need arises

called meetings may be held.

Section 5. Organization—The board shall elect a chairman and a secretary.

ARTICLE IV—TRAVEL EXPENSES

Ten cents per mile shall be paid board members for all meetings, except the board meeting in connection with the State Association.

ARTICLE V

This constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of the State Association.

CONSTITUTION of the CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD of the FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Christian Education Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists, among these, Statewide Bible Institutes, Teacher Training Programs, Sunday School, C.T.S., Free Will Baptist Colleges and any other training methods that will help in the growth of our churches.

ARTICLE III—THE BOARD

Section 1. Composition—This Board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of Office—The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The Board shall elect a Chairman, Assistant Chairman and

Secretary-Treasurer, which shall be elected annually.

Section 4. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this

Board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 5. The Board shall meet at least once a year and/or whenever a meeting is deemed necessary.

ARTICLE IV-DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. To create a statewide Bible Institute program that will assist and encourage the development of regional extensions in each local association.

Section 2. To assist and encourage the growth of Sunday Schools through

Sunday School Conventions, workshops, etc.

Section 3. To promote the organizing of new C.T.S. groups and to assist

in the training portion of existing C.T.S. groups.

Section 4. To encourage the young people of our churches to further their education in our denomination's institutions.

ARTICLE V—TRAVEL EXPENSES

Ten cents per mile per vehicle shall be paid board members for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. If a called meeting requires members to stay overnight the room and board of each member will be paid.

ARTICLE VI—COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE VII—REPORTS

A complete report of the board meetings and activities, and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association meeting.

ARTICLE VIII—AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the State Association.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Jesus Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His Grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating

beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of

its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peace," to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.
