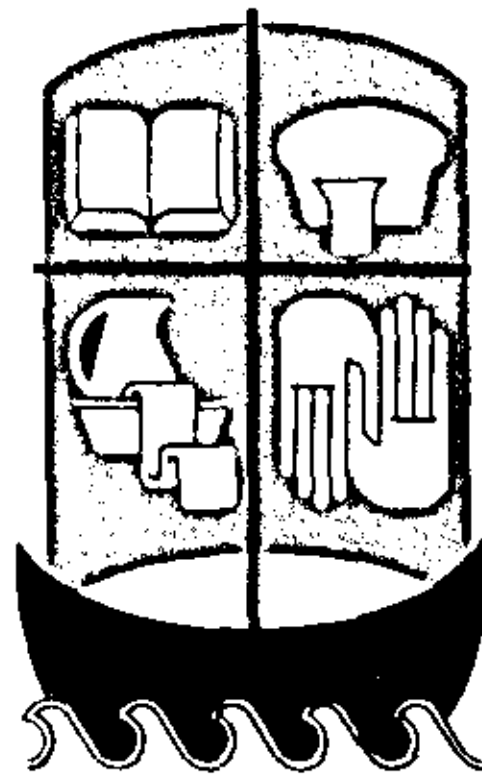

BUSINESS SESSIONS

Wednesday, Nov. 2, 1983, 7:30 p.m.

The service opened with congregational singing led by Jeff Lunsford, "Saved by the Blood." Prayer by Robert Owen, followed by chorus, "I Have Decided to Follow Jesus." The session was called to order by Larry Montgomery, state clerk, who introduced the moderator, Gene Helton. The moderator gave a welcome, introduced the program, and also introduced his father, who is visiting in the service.

The host pastor, Charles Powell, gave a welcome in behalf of the Marvin Chapel Church and the Salem Association. The moderator introduced the Youth Board members, who have planned and directed this evening's service. A plaque of appreciation was presented by the moderator to Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Owen, who served as our state treasurer for 26 years.

After singing the chorus, "Do Lord", an offering in the amount of \$138.00 was received. Offertory music was played by Melissa Lunsford. Special music was provided by the Whitehead sisters. The moderator introduced the speaker, Dr. Ken Riggs, from Free Will Baptist Bible College. Brother Riggs brought his message emphasizing youth training from Psalm 127 and Judges 13:8,12.

Norris, Tallahassee; John Rhodes, Daytona Beach; Elmer Turnbough, St. Petersburg.

The Home Missions Board members were introduced and each of them gave brief greetings. Ken Walker introduced the speaker, Elmer Turnbough, state missionary to St. Petersburg, who gave a report on the mission work and preached from Matt. 16:13-19 and Acts 2:41-47, "This is the Hour for a Growing Church."

As invitation hymn, "I Surrender All" was sung, several came forward for dedication. Prayer by J.D. Norris. A special missions offering for the St. Petersburg work was received. A commissioning service for Rev. and Mrs. Turnbough was held. Ken Walker gave the charge, and as the missionary couple knelt, all the ordained laid hands on them in prayer as John Gibbs led in prayer. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

The Executive Committee recommends to the State Association the following items:

1. That we give official status as a District Association to the Hispanic Association of Florida Free Will Baptists.
2. That we give official status as a District Association to the South Florida District Association.
3. That we give official status as a District Association to the Central Florida District Association.
4. Recommend a constitution change in Article III, Sec. 3 to read as follows (new portion underlined): The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, the Chairman of each standing board, and one elected member from each affiliated district association. District associations shall recommend their representative on the Executive Board annually. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum. Other committees shall be appointed as needed
5. That the Executive Committee, in planning the state association program, annually designate a portion of a service (preferably Thursday evening) for missions promotion.

6. That we pay \$25 to the typist during the state association, and \$25 to the host church for paper, supplies, etc.

The Youth Board met on Nov. 2, 1983 during the State Association. all members were present. The secretary gave out history of past competition and advised that whe was disposing of old score sheets, files, etc.

MSC that we pay the \$264 for plane fare plus a personal honorium of \$100 for our speaker from the Youth Board funds.

MSC to hold our State Youth Competition on May 18 and 19, 1984 at the camp grounds in Marianna, Florida. Records show that we had approximately 125 participants in the over-all competition and about 550 attendance at the state competition.

STATE HOME MISSIONS BOARD REPORT

The home Mission Program in Florida consists of one state project in Daytona Beach, two joint projects: one in Gainesville and one in St. Petersburg, and one national project in Tallahassee in which we are also helping jointly.

It is with pleasure we report to our Florida State Association while in session with the Marvin Chapel FWB Church the progress, blessings, accomplishments and needs of each work. We desire your prayers.

Gainesville - The Gainesville church was able to pay down the \$15,000 needed to secure the new property on which they plan to build a new sanctuary. The Sunday School is averaging 30 or more, with morning worship averaging over 40. The offering has increased about \$500 per month. Their land payments are \$431.55 per month, which they are meeting without difficulty. The old property has been sold, but may have to be taken back and resold. Pray for missionary Albert Rollins and his wife as they labor in Gainesville.

Tallahassee - J.D. Norris and wife Beverly are our national missionaries to Tallahassee and they are still doing an outstanding job. In their 6th year there, they now have a jail ministry, and the Christian Academy has 120 students enrolled in day care through 12th grade. They have three graduates attending FWBBC this year. Their Sunday School averages in the 80's with morning worship over 100. They are in a building program, and hope to be in their new chapel before much longer. They plan to be self supporting by Jan., 1984. Praise God for this, and continue to pray for this good work.

St. Petersburg - We have hired Rev. Elmer Turnbough and his wife, Gladys, as our new missionaries to St. Petersburg. They have traveled about 17,000 miles on itinerate since June 1, and have conducted about 100 services, with faith promises exceeding \$2500 plus several thousand dollars in their account. The Turnbough's have already moved to St. Petersburg, and will begin holding services following this state association. Your Home Mission Board wishes to thank all of you for your splendid cooperation these past months for St. Petersburg.

Daytona Beach - Our missionaries, Rev. John Rhodes and his wife Gail are serving in Daytona Beach, where they have worked untiringly. The mission effort is to be phased out in Jan., 1984. Continue to pray for the progress of this work. More workers are needed. Their average attendance is about 30.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpose; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE I—NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "The Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists."

ARTICLE II—REPRESENTATION

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate for each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III—OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2. Boards : The standing boards of this association shall be Home Missions, Christian Education and Youth Board.

Section 3. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, the chairman of each standing board, and one elected member from each affiliated district association. District associations shall recommend their representative on the Executive Board annually. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum. Other committees shall be appointed as needed.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death, removal from office, or by resignation, the general officers shall appoint a temporary replacement until the next regular session of this body, at which time the body shall elect a permanent replacement. A proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any

absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 5. General officers of this Association shall serve for the term of two (2) years.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of five (5) members which shall be elected to five (5) year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have the right to discipline any officer or board member who does not conduct his office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the New Testament.

ARTICLE IV—MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session by the moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V—FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations in this body shall pay a representation fee annually. The amount of this fee for an association is \$15.00 per member church. The fee for local churches is \$10.00 per delegate.

Section 2. All Cooperative Plan funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session, and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 3. Mileage for the Executive Committee members and the Florida board member to the Children's Home shall be paid at twelve (12¢) cents per mile from the General Fund. If a called meeting requires a member to stay over-night, his room and board will be paid from the General Fund. Mileage and expenses shall be paid for the moderator to attend the denomination's annual leadership conference.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

Section 2. The Assistant Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds, pay all bills, and submit records when leaving office. The Treasurer must give bond while filling this office.

Section 5. Each officer and board member must be a member in good standing of a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this body. He must be in good standing with his local association, and must live within the boundaries of this Association. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 6. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session.

Section 7. Amendments to this Constitution and By-Laws must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

CONSTITUTION**

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Florida State Home Mission Board of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the state of Florida.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis: one member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association.

**ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS
AND COMMITTEES**

Officers of this board shall be Chairman, and Secretary-Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board. Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE V—MEETINGS

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary-treasurer.

ARTICLE VI—FINANCES

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special officers received through promoting missions. Mileage for board members' expenses shall be paid from the general fund, limited to 10¢ per mile.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to their respective offices. The Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the board's activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2. A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of a quorum before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the board.

Section 3. All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the State Association.

Section 4. A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Associational meeting.

Section 5. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section 6. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section 7. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section 8. Any work receiving financial support as a loan must accept such on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

Section 9. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however, no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1,000.00 loaned.

Section 10. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 11. An Agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be final.

Section 12. Contracts shall be considered delinquent when 3 successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

Section 13. The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potential for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board.

Section 14. Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1,000.00 without joint approval of the mission board and the state executive committee or association.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE II—DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. The duties of this board shall be to promote Youth Camps, Youth Rallies, and to be a co-ordaining agency between District, State and National Offices.

Section 2. To set up and direct C.T.S. Competitive activities.

Section 3. This board shall give a report of its activities to the Florida State Association's annual meeting.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of office—The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only *one* member's term expires annually.

Section 3. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 4. Meetings—This board will meet semi-annually. As need arises called meetings may be held.

Section 5. Organization—The board shall elect a chairman and a secretary.

ARTICLE IV—TRAVEL EXPENSES

Ten cents per mile shall be paid board members for all meetings, except the board meeting in connection with the State Association.

ARTICLE V

This constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of the State Association.

CONSTITUTION of the CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD of the FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Christian Education Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists, among these, Statewide Bible Institutes, Teacher Training Programs, Sunday School, C.T.S., Free Will Baptist Colleges and any other training methods that will help in the growth of our churches.

ARTICLE III—THE BOARD

Section 1. Composition—This Board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of Office—The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The Board shall elect a Chairman, Assistant Chairman and Secretary-Treasurer, which shall be elected annually.

Section 4. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this Board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 5. The Board shall meet at least once a year and/or whenever a meeting is deemed necessary.

ARTICLE IV—DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. To create a statewide Bible Institute program that will assist and encourage the development of regional extensions in each local association.

Section 2. To assist and encourage the growth of Sunday Schools through Sunday School Conventions, workshops, etc.

Section 3. To promote the organizing of new C.T.S. groups and to assist in the training portion of existing C.T.S. groups.

Section 4. To encourage the young people of our churches to further their education in our denomination's institutions.

ARTICLE V—TRAVEL EXPENSES

Ten cents per mile per vehicle shall be paid board members for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. If a called meeting requires members to stay overnight the room and board of each member will be paid.

ARTICLE VI—COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE VII—REPORTS

A complete report of the board meetings and activities, and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association meeting.

ARTICLE VIII—AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the State Association.
