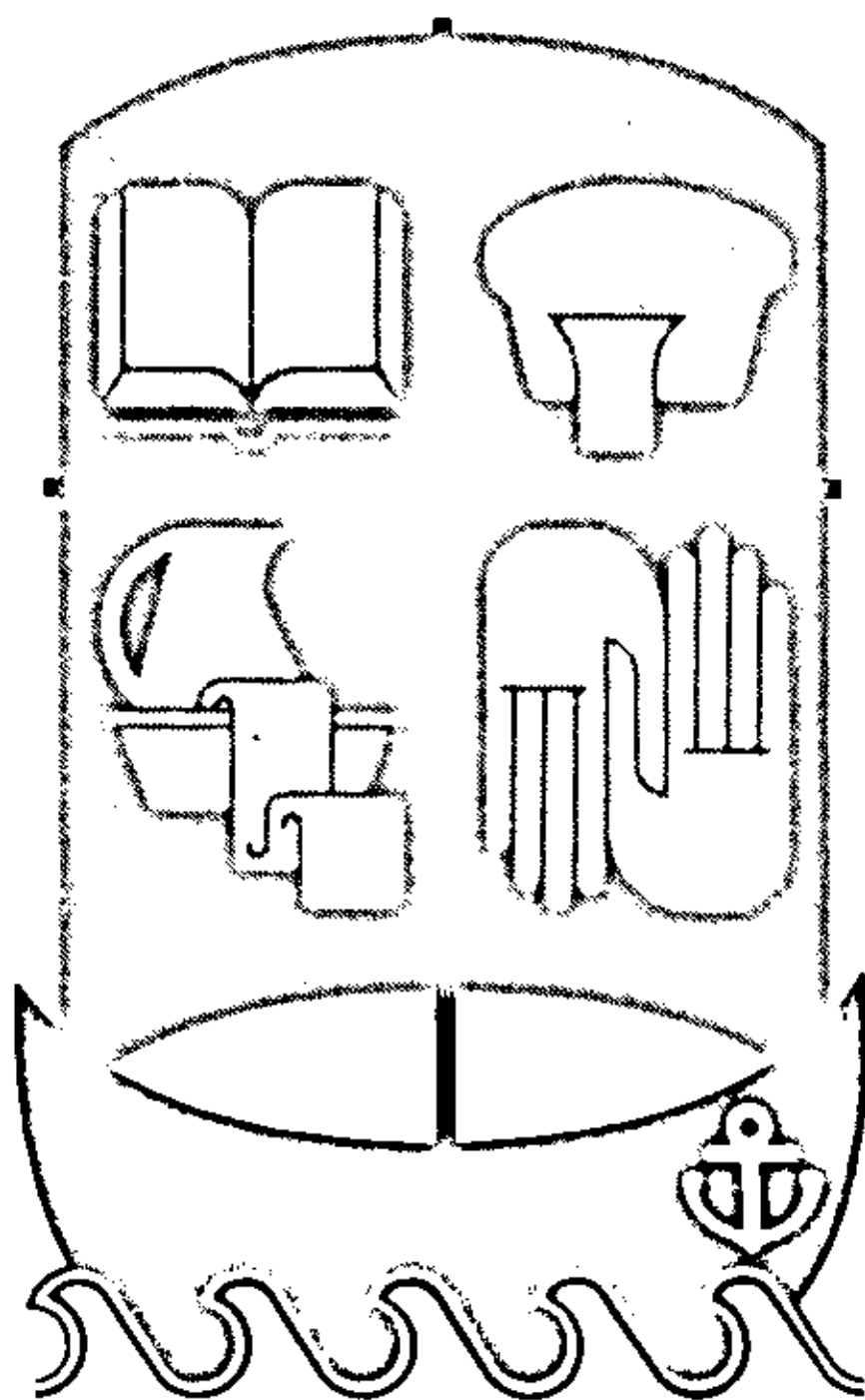

BUSINESS SESSIONS

Wednesday, Oct. 31, 1984, 7:30 p.m.

The service opened with congregational singing led by Jeff Lunsford, pianist, Melissa Lunsford. "Christ Receiveth Sinful Men" and "We've a Story to Tell" were the selected hymns. A welcome was extended by host pastor, Larry Montgomery. As state clerk, he also called the 40th annual meeting of the Florida State Association to order and introduced the moderator, Gene Helton. The moderator gave a welcome and introduced several guests. He then appointed committees as follows:

Special Music was presented by the choir of the Hollywood FWB Church, "The Greatest of These is Love". The offering was received. The song leader led the theme chorus, "Lord, Lay Some Soul upon my Heart". The moderator spoke concerning the association's theme, "God's People Ministering to their Community" and introduced the guest speaker, Jim McAllister of Farmington, Missouri. Brother McAllister spoke from the text, 1 Cor. 13:8, "Charity Never Fails."

Thursday, Nov. 1, 1984, 9:30 a.m.

The morning session was opened in song led by Jeff Lunsford, "Standing on the Promises." Prayer was led by Mark Hollis; congregation sang "Redeemed".

The moderator's message was set aside in favor of Albert Rollins to present information about the bond program to finance the Gainesville building program.

Joshua Lopez presented the work and needs of the FWB churches in Panama, and challenged the churches of Florida to contribute \$150 each to help Panama's building program.

Charles Powell gave the report of the Committee on Committees. MSC to receive the report.

The morning worship time was opened with singing "My Savior's Love" led by Jeff Lunsford. The congregation also sang "Who Is on the Lord's Side?" Special music was by Joy Rice, "To Be Used of God," followed by congregation singing the theme chorus. Jim McAllister brought the message from Matthew 28:19, "Go Ye therefore..." Earnest Owen gave a challenge for involvement of the laymen, after which prayer was offered and we adjourned for lunch.

Thursday, Nov. 1, 1:30 p.m.

The afternoon session opened with singing "I Feel Like Traveling On" and "Faith is the Victory". Prayer was offered by Charles Powell.

The report of the National Foreign Missions Board was given by Dennis Owen. MSC to receive the report.

MSC to receive the report of the Alabama Children's Home as given by Odis Whitehead. Brother Whitehead also supplemented the Youth Board's report by giving a report of Camp Mt. Pleasant.

MSC to receive the Treasurer's Report as presented by state treasurer, Gerald Amerson.

Gerald Fowler gave the Promotional Team's report, and encouraged every church to give \$120 to the convention fund. MSC to receive the report.

MSC to receive the report of the National Executive Office as presented by Melvin Worthington.

MSC to receive the report of the National Sunday School and Church Training Board as presented by Jim McAllister.

MSC to receive the report of Free Will Baptist Bible College as presented by Ronald Creech.

Jim Vallance gave the reports of the National Layman's Board (Master's Men) and the Radio and T.V. Commission. MSC to receive both reports.

MSC to receive as information the report on Contacto as presented by Tom Willey.

MSC to receive the report of the State Executive Committee and adopt item by item. Item 1 was tabled until the next day's session. Item 2 was adopted.

Thursday, Nov. 1, 7:30 p.m.

Jeff Lunsford led the congregation in singing "Saved, Saved" to open the Thursday evening worship time. A solo, "The Holy City", was presented from the Ebenezer FWB Church. The moderator gave a welcome and spoke of the missions emphasis of the service and introduced Ken Walker, secretary of the state missions board. Brother Walker gave information concerning the state home missionaries and introduced the missionaries.

Albert Rollins, missionary to Gainesville, gave greetings and introduced one of the laymen, Drew Hopkins, who gave testimony about the Gainesville work.

Elmer Turnbough, missionary to St. Petersburg, gave greetings and a challenge for the mission work.

The special offering was received for the Florida home missions works. Offertory music was played by Melissa Lunsford. The choir of Ebenezer FWB Church sang in Spanish, "Thanks to God" and "Jubilee". The congregation sang the theme chorus, and Jim McAllister brought the message from Luke 5:1-11, "A Vision for Growth." The invitation hymn was "Have Thine Own Way."

Friday, Nov. 2, 9:30 a.m.

Jeff Lunsford opened the morning session with choruses, "Do Lord", "Joy, Joy, Joy" and "We'll Work 'til Jesus Comes." He then sang solo "His Grace Reaches Me." The morning devotion was brought by Benito Rodriguez from John 21:15-22.

MSC to receive the Placement Committee's recommendation to accept the invitation of the Auburndale FWB Church to host the state association on Oct. 30 through Nov. 1, 1985.

MSC to receive the final report of the Credentials Committee.

MSC to receive the report of the Appreciation Committee and give a rising vote of thanks to the Hollywood FWB Church and the South Florida district.

MSC to receive the report of the Nominating Committee and elect their nominations to office.

Delegates to the National Association were appointed by the moderator: Bob Hager, Wallace Bach, Mrs. Bill George, Drew Hopkins, Linda Glass, and alternate, Louise Owen.

After a number of testimonies and prayer requests, we were adjourned with prayer.

YOUTH BOARD REPORT

The Florida State Youth Board met in conjunction with the State Youth Competition held at the Camp Grounds in Marianna, Florida on May 18 & 19, 1984. All members were present except Louise Walker. Brother Helton opened the meeting with prayer. Programs, registration and leaders for competition were considered. Scoring sheets were revised so that competitors would receive total scores and remarks by judge.

It was approved to give the Bible Contestant winners \$125 each and Music & Arts winners \$100 each for expenses to the National Youth Conference in Little Rock, Arkansas. It was approved to pay \$175 rental on the camp grounds.

The Florida State Youth Board met November 1, 1984 at the Hollywood Free Will Baptist Church. The following board members were present: Gene Helton, Louise Walker and Charles Powell. We accepted the invitation of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Seffner to host our Florida State Youth Competition on May 17 and 18, 1985.

Camp Mt. Pleasant reports Teen Camp was held in June with 62 campers and 12 workers. There were 4 saved, numerous rededications and 2 announced calls to preach. The evangelist was Nate Ange; directors were Carlie Lloyd and Odis Whitehead.

Camp VAIRA reports 143 campers and 31 workers at their June, 1984 camp at Leesburg. Elmer Turnbough was the evangelist, Larry Montgomery was the director.

HOME MISSION BOARD REPORT

The Home Mission program in Florida consists of two "Joint Projects" with the National Association with one in Gainesville and one in the St. Petersburg area. We want to thank our Florida churches for the wonderful cooperation we have received from you this past year.

Gainesville: The old property was resold in January, and the last service in the old building was Jan. 8, 1984. Since then they have been meeting in a large garage. The Sunday School averages 25, morning worship 27, evening service 22 and prayer Meeting 19. Approval of the bond program is expected soon, and construction of the new building will begin when 60% of the bonds have been sold. Rev. Albert Rollins and his wife, Irene deserve our sincere thanks and prayers for their consistent faithfulness in this work.

St. Petersburg: Missionary Elmer Turnbough and his wife, Gladys, have worked untiringly to establish this new church. They have visited almost 1200 homes and made Over 700 other contacts this year. Over \$11,000 in offerings have been received in their mission church, with over \$700 sent to the Home Missions office to apply to the pastor's salary. They have contributed well to other phases of the denominations work. Attendance in all services averages about 35.

PLACEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the placement committee, have received no invitations for the next associational meeting from the district letters. However, we have received an oral invitation from the delegation of the Auburndale FWB Church for the next meeting of the state association on Oct. 30 through Nov. 1, 1985. If there are no other invitations from the body, we recommend the invitation from Auburndale be accepted.

BUDGET COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that \$60,000 be set as the goal for the State Cooperative Plan of support in 1985.
2. We recommend the following distribution of Co-op money: National - 35%; State - 65% to be disbursed: 63% - Home Missions; 10% - Promotion; 12% Youth Fund; 10% General Fund; 5% Children's Home.
3. We recommend our treasurer be paid \$40 per month from the general fund.
4. We recommend the moderator and clerk be paid \$200 each from the general fund.
5. We recommend that \$100 per quarter be given to CONTACTO magazine from the general fund.
6. We recommend that the treasurer sit in with the Budget Committee as an advisor.

We would like to express our thanks for the food, fellowship and the many hospitalities to us during this 40th session of the Florida State Association. We recommend that a rising vote of thanks be given to the Hollywood Church and the South Florida Association.

**CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION
OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS**

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpose; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE I—NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "The Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists."

ARTICLE II—REPRESENTATION

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate for each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III—OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2. Boards : The standing boards of this association shall be Home Missions, Christian Education and Youth Board.

Section 3. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, the chairman of each standing board, and one elected member from each affiliated district association. District associations shall recommend their representative on the Executive Board annually. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum. Other committees shall be appointed as needed.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death, removal from office, or by resignation, the general officers shall appoint a temporary replacement until the next regular session of this body, at which time the body shall elect a permanent replacement. A proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any

absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 5. General officers of this Association shall serve for the term of two (2) years.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of five (5) members which shall be elected to five (5) year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have the right to discipline any officer or board member who does not conduct his office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the New Testament.

ARTICLE IV—MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session by the moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V—FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations in this body shall pay a representation fee annually. The amount of this fee for an association is \$15.00 per member church. The fee for local churches is \$10.00 per delegate.

Section 2. All Cooperative Plan funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session, and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 3. Mileage for the Executive Committee members and the Florida board member to the Children's Home shall be paid at twelve (12¢) cents per mile from the General Fund. If a called meeting requires a member to stay over-night, his room and board will be paid from the General Fund. Mileage and expenses shall be paid for the moderator to attend the denomination's annual leadership conference.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

Section 2. The Assistant Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds, pay all bills, and submit records when leaving office. The Treasurer must give bond while filling this office.

Section 5. Each officer and board member must be a member in good standing of a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this body. He must be in good standing with his local association, and must live within the boundaries of this Association. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 6. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session.

Section 7. Amendments to this Constitution and By-Laws must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

**CONSTITUTION
and
BY-LAWS
of the
FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSION BOARD
OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS
CONSTITUTION**

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Florida State Home Mission Board of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the state of Florida.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis: one member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association.

**ARTICLE IV—OFFICERS
AND COMMITTEES**

Officers of this board shall be Chairman, and Secretary-Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board. Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE V—MEETINGS

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary-treasurer.

ARTICLE VI—FINANCES

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special officers received through promoting missions. Mileage for board members' expenses shall be paid from the general fund, limited to 10¢ per mile.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to their respective offices. The Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the board's activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2. A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of a quorum before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the board.

Section 3. All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the State Association.

Section 4. A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Associational meeting.

Section 5. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section 6. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section 7. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section 8. Any work receiving financial support as a loan must accept such on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

Section 9. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however, no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1,000.00 loaned.

Section 10. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 11. An Agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be final.

Section 12. Contracts shall be considered delinquent when 3 successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

Section 13. The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potential for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board.

Section 14. Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1,000.00 without joint approval of the mission board and the state executive committee or association.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE II—DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. The duties of this board shall be to promote Youth Camps, Youth Rallies, and to be a co-ordinating agency between District, State and National Offices.

Section 2. To set up and direct C.T.S. Competitive activities.

Section 3. This board shall give a report of its activities to the Florida State Association's annual meeting.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of office—The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only *one* member's term expires annually.

Section 3. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 4. Meetings—This board will meet semi-annually. As need arises called meetings may be held.

Section 5. Organization—The board shall elect a chairman and a secretary.

ARTICLE IV—TRAVEL EXPENSES

Ten cents per mile shall be paid board members for all meetings, except the board meeting in connection with the State Association.

ARTICLE V

This constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of the State Association.

CONSTITUTION of the CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD of the FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Christian Education Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists, among these, Statewide Bible Institutes, Teacher Training Programs, Sunday School, C.T.S., Free Will Baptist Colleges and any other training methods that will help in the growth of our churches.

ARTICLE III—THE BOARD

Section 1. Composition—This Board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of Office—The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The Board shall elect a Chairman, Assistant Chairman and Secretary-Treasurer, which shall be elected annually.

Section 4. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this Board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 5. The Board shall meet at least once a year and/or whenever a meeting is deemed necessary.

ARTICLE IV—DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. To create a statewide Bible Institute program that will assist and encourage the development of regional extensions in each local association.

Section 2. To assist and encourage the growth of Sunday Schools through Sunday School Conventions, workshops, etc.

Section 3. To promote the organizing of new C.T.S. groups and to assist in the training portion of existing C.T.S. groups.

Section 4. To encourage the young people of our churches to further their education in our denomination's institutions.

ARTICLE V—TRAVEL EXPENSES

Ten cents per mile per vehicle shall be paid board members for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. If a called meeting requires members to stay overnight the room and board of each member will be paid.

ARTICLE VI—COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE VII—REPORTS

A complete report of the board meetings and activities, and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association meeting.

ARTICLE VIII—AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the State Association.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE FLORIDA STATE PROMOTION COMMITTEE

ARTICLE 1 - NAME

This standing committee shall be called the Promotional Team of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE 11 - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This standing committee shall be composed of five men representing five districts. The districts are 1) West Florida, composed of the West Florida and West Florida Liberty Associations, 2) North Florida, composed of the Salem and North Florida Associations, 3) Northeast, composed of the Greater St. John's Association, 4) Central, composed of the Indian River and Central Associations, 5) South Florida, composed of the South Florida and Hispanic Associations.

Section 2. The members of this Team shall be elected for a term of five (5) years and arranged whereby only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The committee shall elect a chairman, assistant chairman, and secretary-treasurer. These officers shall be elected annually. The chairman shall chair the meetings of the Team, coordinate all the activities, and call special meetings. The assistant chairman shall help the chairman with these responsibilities and supply as chairman in his absence. The secretary-treasurer shall maintain permanent records of the committee's activities and financial transactions.

Section 4. The Florida State Association shall fill any irregular vacancies during its annual meeting. The Executive Board may make temporary appointments until the State Association convenes.

Section 5. This Team shall meet semi-annually, and annually at the Florida State Association Meeting.

ARTICLE 111 - PURPOSE

It is the general responsibility of this Team to encourage the participation and financial support of our churches and pastors in our Free Will Baptist programs

(local, state, and national) with the intended purpose of producing larger and stronger existing churches and new churches.

ARTICLE IV - DUTIES

Section 1. This Team shall have the freedom to pursue different avenues in order to comply with the Team's general purpose. All avenues shall be in accordance with the Bible and the Florida State Constitution.

Section 2. This Team shall develop a communications network whereby information from the National Departments and the State Boards and the State Meeting can be dispersed to the local pastors and churches.

Section 3. Each district representative shall encourage participation from the churches in his district through the use of Associational Meetings, special meetings with the churches, individual contact with pastors and the use of letters or news-letters.

Section 4. This Team shall be in charge of the state-sponsored paper, The Coordinator. This Team shall be vested with the authority to hire and dismiss an editor, disbursement of all monies for its expense, and the general oversight of its publication.

ARTICLE V - TRAVEL EXPENSE

Section 1. Ten (10) cents per mile, per vehicle, shall be paid Team members for all meetings except the meeting in connection with the State Association. If a meeting requires members to stay overnight, the room and meals of each will be paid.

Section 2. Each district representative shall be reimbursed for his actual (true) expenses for fulfilling his obligations described in Article IV, Section 3. The chairman, assistant chairman and secretary-treasurer shall be reimbursed for their actual expense for meeting their duties described in Article 11, Section 3.

ARTICLE VI - REPORTS

This Team shall give a report of its activities, functions, programs, and finances at the Annual State Meeting.
