



BUSINESS SESSIONS

Wednesday, October 30, 1985, 7:30 P.M.

Congregational singing, "Power in the Blood" and "Redeemed" was followed by the offering; offertory played by Melissa Lunsford. The moderator appointed the committee on committees and the credentials committee. He gave instructions to the body concerning business, reports, etc.

Special music was sung by Bob Chaffin, followed by the message by Williard Wilcox, whose text was Rom. 1:16. The dismissal prayer was led by Odis Whitehead.

MSC to lay on the table the recommendation to increase Home Missions board mileage to

12¢ per mile (constitutional change).

Elmer Turnbough gave the report of the National Home Missions board. MSC to receive as information.

MSC to receive the state Youth Board report presented by Ruby Amerson. Sister Ruby presented to the Lake Jackson Free Will Baptist Church a special financial gift in memory of her late husband, Jerald Amerson. MSC to lay on the table the recommendation to change Youth Board mileage to 12¢ per mile (constitutional change).

MSC to receive the State Woman's Auxiliary report as given by Helen Allen.

MSC to receive the Alabama Children's Home report given by Carlton Lambert, who also reported his resignation as children's home director after 28 years of service.

MSC to receive the State Treasurers Report presented by Ruby Amerson.

MSC to receive the report of the State Promotional Team presented by Gerald Fowler.

MSC to form the Florida Free Will Baptist Historical Committee. Information and explanation was given by J.D. Norris. Three committee members are to be chosen by the general officers of state association.

MSC to receive the Christian Education Committee report given by J.D. Norris.

Business recessed for the morning worship service. Congregation sang "Jesus Is All the World to Me" and Darrell Gwenn led in prayer. Special music was provided by Lisa Christian, and a duet by Alberta and Ruby Amerson. Brother Williard Wilcox brought the message. Dismissed by prayer.



Thursday, October 31, 1985, 1:30 P.M.

The afternoon session opened with congregational singing and prayer led by Steve Hughes. Willard Wilcox brought the message from 1 Peter 4:17,18.

The business session resumed with the National Sunday School and C.T.S. Department report given by Harold Harrison. MSC to receive as information.

Melvin Worthington brought the reports of the National Executive Office and the Layman's Board. MSC to receive as information.

Charles Linn gave the Florida Master's Men report and gave his resignation as Secretary/treasurer of the state Master's Men organization.

Jimmy Aldridge gave the National Foreign Missions report and gave a challenge for the Advance program. MSC to receive as information.

Paul Ketteman gave the report from Free Will Baptist Bible College. MSC to receive as information.

Herman Hersey gave the Retirement and Insurance department and FWB Foundation reports. MSC

The Budget Report was given by Howard Bass. MSC to receive the report and adopt item by item. MSC to adopt each item, 1 through 6.


MSC to pay the typist \$25, and also \$25 to host church for printing and supplies.

HOME MISSIONS BOARD REPORT :

This year has been very active with two on-going projects, the Gainsville work and the St. Petersburg work. We can be rightfully proud of the accomplishments during this year at these mission churches sponsored by you as joint projects with the National Home Mission Board.

The turnboughs are at capacity in their present building which is being leased from an oil company. Their greatest need is property of their own. Elmer and Gladys are making a good mark for Free Will Baptists in the Pinellas Park FWB mission church. Their average attendance for the year was 41 in morning worship. They

received \$17,438.91 in offerings for the year.

The Rollins are still meeting in a motel on Sundays and Wednesdays. Their church property is located in a nice residential area of Gainsville. Their building plans have been approved and the lot is almost cleared. The only hinderance now is the sale of the bonds. They need to sell \$75,000 in bonds, enough to build the building. We will be asking for volunteer labor from the people of Florida to assist Brother Howard Gwartney, our National Home Missionary builder.

The Board met in Fort Myers for the semi-annual meeting in May and surveyed the area for the potential of beginning a new work there. We discovered that property is extremely high in price. This area will be kept in focus for the future.

One of our board members, Harvey Hill, had open heart surgery this year and is doing fine. We thank you for your prayers in his behalf.

YOUTH BOARD REPORT

The Florida State Youth Board met in conjunction with the State Competition in Tampa, Florida May 17 and 18, 1985. All members were present. Brother Powell led in prayer. Programs, registration and leaders for each phase of competition were considered. Boxes of materials were opened. A meeting with all the judges, scorekeepers and leaders was held to answer any guestions.

The board met again on Saturday morning and decided to give each Bible winner \$175 and each talent winner \$125 to assist in expenses to the National.

The youth board met at Cocoa FWB Church Oct 30, 1985 preceeding the state association. All members were present except Charles Powell, who has left our state. MSC to hold the 1986 youth competition May 16 & 17 at Wesconnett FWB Church in Jacksonville.

The decision was made to use five judges in each music and arts category. The high and low score will be discarded, and the other three averaged. Pastor's must be encouraged to send names of those attending to help in this phase of the competition. A suggestion to use people other than Free Will Baptists to judge was rejected, because we have tried it before and it did not work. Some of our people felt strongly about using our FWB people to judge our FWB youth.

Sis. Helton suggested we encourage our quiz leaders and pastors to be sure that the Bible Teams know all their regular questions, so those teams we send to the national can represent Florida with dedication and sincereness.

It was decided to hold a short meeting at the end of the association so that our two new board members could be included in electing a chairman of our board.



WOMAN'S AUXILIARY REPORT

The State Woman's Auxiliary enjoyed a good year in 1984-85. During the fiscal year we had a total income of \$7,992.96 and a total expenditure of \$7,704.93. These monies were sent to different missionary accounts, the Bible College in Nashville and the WNAC offices. We feel this was a good year for us.

We report 243 members for the state with six (6) districts and one (1) local reporting.

The auxiliary adopted as our state project for 1985-86 the lvory Coast hospital and Dr. Eagleton. Since Mrs. Eagleton does not have a home state, we also voted to adopt her as a "Florida missionary". We voted to ask each local to send \$5.00 per month to an account to help defray the expenses of the National Association which will meet in Tampa in 1989.

To help with our 1989 National Association, the auxiliary has compiled a cookbook of 325 recipes which we will be offering for sale for \$5.00 each after January 15. To help with our table favors we ask ladies with small children to save small baby food jars for sand sculptured table favors. Bring them with you in June to the Auxiliary meeting in Ocala, June 6-& 7.

APPRECIATION COMMITTEE REPORT

The appreciation committee expresses our thanks to the Cocoa FWB Church and Indian River Association for the delicious meals and warm hospitality. We want to express to Bob Chaffin and all the musicians appreciation for the uplifting music. We express our appreciation to Gene Helton for 10 years of outstanding service as moderator of the state association. We recommend a rising vote of thanks be expressed for all of the above.

HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Motion is made for the formation of the Florida Free Will Baptist Historical Society.

Reasons: 1. Much of our heritage has been or is presently in danger of being lost. 2. 1985 is the Semi-Centenniel of the reorganization of our denomination into the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

Functions:

1. To collect bicgraphical information, pictures, sermons and Bibles of men who are significant to Free Will Baptist history in the state of Florida.

2. To collect and preserve church histories and associational histories.

3. To establish a depository (archives) whose curator would seek a collection of complete minutes from every district association and their histories.

4. Act as a depository for historical books written about the movemnt, booklets, newsletters and other information. The curator or member of the Historical Society could contact families of deceased pastors to offer to preserve their ministerial records and papers.

5. To present semi-annually an historical research paper. One of these meetings should coincide with the annual state association. This is not to restrict the number of papers presented at the meeting to just one.

6. To correspond with other individuals and historical societies.

7. To encourage membership participation and authorize dues.

8. To publish a booklet entitles <u>Perspectives</u> which shall contain the research papers presented at the meetings.



CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD REPORT

There are more of our churches showing a great deal of interest in Christian Education. We had several calls this year about Christian Day Schools and what a church must do to meet the requirements of the state.

There is a great deal of information available on Christian Education, even a new program for home study. Several of our colleges are now offering correspondence courses for those who have not had the privilege to go off to college or if they want to further their education.

• There are several good Teacher Training Programs available through our national offices that we would like to see each of our churches use. Not only would this encourage our teachers, but our students as well.

The Christian Education Board would like to encourage you to pray and work for better education to help build

a stronger and better church.

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

Met May 25, 1985, Ocala, Florida. No recommendations were made which require associational approval.

Met Oct. 30, 1985, Cocoa Florida. We recommend the following:

5. Missionary Jimmy Aldridge presented information and challenge for the Free Will Baptist Foreign Missions Advance Celebration. MSC to recommend to the state association:

a. that we endorse and participate in the Advance Celebration program,

b. that the general officers appoint the state chairman for the program,

c. that his expenses be paid out of the general fund,

d. that we set a goal for our state of \$50,000 for the 3 year period.



6. Jeff Lunsford gave a report of the investigating committee concerning the Central District/ Auburndale Church situation. We agreed to meet later to gain additional information from the district officers.

7. Since the stated reason for the Auburndale Church's exclusion from the Central District has been rectified, we recommend that the District expedite the matter of restoring the church into official fellowship. The state clerk is to address a letter to the Central District concerning this recommendation.

8. The expenses of our speaker for this associational meeting are to be paid, plus an honorarium of \$400.

9. We recommend a). our state's involvement in the denomination's enlargement program, "Target 90". b). Larry Montgomery is to be appointed our state coordinatio for this program, c). the coordinator's expenses to the denominational leadership conference are to be paid from the general fund.

10. Recommend that we transfer \$3000 from the general fund C.D. to the Convention Fund.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

1. Be it resolved that this body give a moment of silent prayer in honor and memory of Brother Gerald Amerson, for his labor of love for his Lord and for his beloved denomination.

2. Be it resolved that this body stand in honor of our Brother Carlton Lambert and his wife for years of service to the Alabama Children's Home and that this State Association bestow upon them the title of Faithful Servants.

PLACEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

We recommend that the 1986 State Association meet Oct. 29-31 at Lake Jackson FWB Church in Tallahassee.



BUDGET COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that \$60,000 be set as the goal for the State Cooperative Plan of support in 1986.

2. We recommend the following distribution of Co-op money: National-40%; State-60% to be disbursed as follows: Home Missions - 65%; Youth Board - 12%; General Board - 8%; Promotion - 8%; Children's Home-5%; Historical Society - 1%; Convention Fund - 1%.

3. We recommend our treasurer be paid \$40 per month from the general fund.

4. We recomment the moderator and clerk be paid \$200 each from the general fund.

5. We recommend that \$100 per quarter be given to CONTACTO magazine from the general fund.

6. We recommend that the treasurer sit in with the Budget Committee as an advisor.



CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpose; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE I—NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "The Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists."

ARTICLE II—REPRESENTATION

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates. Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate for each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III-OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2. Boards : The standing boards of this association shall be Home Missions, Christian Education and Youth Board.

Section 3. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, the chairman of each standing board, and one elected member from each affiliated district association. District associations shall recommend their representative on the Executive Board annually. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum.

The Promotional Team is a standing committee of this association. Other committees may be appointed as needed.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death, removal from office, or by resignation, the general officers shall appoint a temporary replacement until the next regular session of this body, at which time the body shall elect a permanent replacement. A proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any



absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 5. General officers of this Association shall serve for the term of two (2) years.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of five (5) members which shall be elected to five (5) year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have the right to discipline any officer or board member who does not conduct his office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the New Testament.

ARTICLE IV—MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session by the moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V—FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations in this body shall pay a representation fee annually. The amount of this fee for an association is \$15.00 per member church. The fee for local churches is \$10.00 per delegate.

Section 2. All Cooperative Plan funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session, and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 3. Mileage for the Executive Committee members and the Florida board member to the Children's Home shall be paid at twelve (12°) cents per mile from the General Fund. If a called meeting requires a member to stay over-night, his room and board will be paid from the General Fund. Mileage and expenses shall be paid for the moderator to attend the denomination's annual leadership conference.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

Section 2. The Assistant Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds, pay all bills, and submit records when leaving office. The Treasurer must give bond while filling this office.



Section 5. Each officer and board member must be a member in good standing of a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this body. He must be in good standing with his local association, and must live within the boundaries of this Association. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 6. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session.

Section 7. Amendments to this Constitution and By-Laws must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSION BOARD OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I–NAME

This board shall be known as the Florida State Home Mission Board of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the state of Florida.

ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis: one member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association.

ARTICLE IV-OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES

Officers of this board shall be Chairman, and Secretary-Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board. Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE V—MEETINGS

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary-treasurer.

ARTICLE VI—FINANCES

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special officers received through promoting missions. Mileage for board members' expenses shall be paid from the general fund, limited to 12¢ per mile.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to their respective offices. The Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the board's activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2. A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of a quorum before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the board.

Section 3. All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the State Association.

Section 4. A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Associational meeting.

Section 5. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section 6. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section 7. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section 8. Any work receiving financial support as a loan must accept such on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

Section 9. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however, no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1,000.00 loaned.



Section 10. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 11. An Agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be final.

Section 12. Contracts shall be considered delinquent when 3 successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

Section 13. The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potenital for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board.

Section 14. Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1,000.00 without joint approval of the mission board and the state executive committee or association.

CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

ARTICLE I-NAME


This board shall be known as the Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE II—DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. The duties of this board shall be to promote Youth Camps, Youth Rallies, and to be a co-ordaining agency between District, State and National Offices.

Section 2. To set up and direct C.T.S. Competitive activities.

Section 3. This board shall give a report of its activities to the Florida State Association's annual meeting.



ARTICLE III—MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of office—The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only *one* member's term expires annually.

Section 3. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 4. Meetings—This board will meet semi-annually. As need arises called meetings may be held.

Section 5. Organization—The board shall elect a chairman and a secretary.

ARTICLE IV—TRAVEL EXPENSES

Twelve cents per mile shall be paid board members for all meetings, except the board meeting in connection with the State Association.

ARTICLE V

This constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of the State Association.

CONSTITUTION of the CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD of the FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

ARTICLE I—NAME

This board shall be known as the Christian Education Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II—PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists, among these, Statewide Bible Institutes, Teacher Training Programs, Sunday School, C.T.S., Free Will Baptist Colleges and any other training methods that will help in the growth of our churches.

ARTICLE III—THE BOARD

Section 1. Composition—This Board shall be composed of five members. Section 2. Tenure of Office—The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The Board shall elect a Chairman. Assistant Chairman and Secretary-Treasurer, which shall be elected annually.

Section 4. Vacancies—In the event irregular vacancies occur on this Board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 5. The Board shall meet at least once a year and/or whenever a meeting is deemed necessary.

ARTICLE IV-DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. To create a statewide Bible Institute program that will assist and encourage the development of regional extensions in each local association. Section 2. To assist and encourage the growth of Sunday Schools through Sunday School Conventions, workshops, etc.

Section 3. To promote the organizing of new C.T.S. groups and to assist in the training portion of existing C.T.S. groups.

Section 4. To encourage the young people of our churches to further their education in our denomination's institutions.

ARTICLE V-TRAVEL EXPENSES

Ten cents per mile per vehicle shall be paid board members for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. If a called meeting requires members to stay overnight the room and board of each member will be paid.

ARTICLE VI-COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE VII-REPORTS

A complete report of the board meetings and activities, and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association meeting.

ARTICLE VIII—AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the State Association.



CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE FLORIDA STATE PROMOTION COMMITTEE

ARTICLE 1 - NAME

This standing committee shall be called the Promotional Team of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE 11 - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This standing committee shall be composed of five men representing five districts. The districts are 1) West Florida, composed of the West Florida and West Florida Liberty Associations, 2) North Florida, composed of the Salem and North Florida Associations, 3) Northeast, composed of the Greater St. John's Association, 4) Central, composed of the Indian River and Central Associations, 5) South Florida, composed of the South Florida and Hispanic Associations.

Section 2. The members of this Team shall be elected for a term of five (5) years and arranged whereby only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The committee shall elect a chairman, assistant chairman, and secretary-treasurer. These officers shall be elected annually. The chairman shall chair the meetings of the Team, coordinate all the activities, and call special meetings. The assistant chairman shall help the chairman with these responsibilities and supply as chairman in his absence. The secretary-treasurer shall maintain permanent records of the committee's activities and financial transactions.

Section 4. The Florida State Association shall fill any irregular vacancies during its annual meeting. The Executive Board may make temporary appointments until the State Association convenes.

Section 5. This Team shall meet semi-annually, and annually at the Florida State Association Meeting.

ARTICLE 111 - PURPOSE

It is the general responsibility of this Team to encourage the participation and financial support of our churches and pastors in our Free Will Baptist programs

(local, state, and national) with the intended purpose of producing larger and stronger existing churches and new churches.

ARTICLE IV - DUTIES

Section 1. This Team shall have the freedom to pursue different avenues in order to comply with the Team's general purpose. All avenues shall be in accordance with the Bible and the Florida State Constitution.

Section 2. This Team shall develop a communications network whereby information from the National Departments and the State Boards and the State Meeting can be dispersed to the local pastors and churches.

Section 3. Each district representative shall encourage participation from the churches in his district through the use of Associational Meetings, special meetings with the churches, individual contact with pastors and the use of letters or news-letters.

Section 4. This Team shall be in charge of the state-sponsored paper, <u>The Coordinator</u>. This Team shall be vested with the authority to hire and dismiss an editor, disbursement of all monies for its expense, and the general oversight of its publication.

ARTICLE V - TRAVEL EXPENSE

Section 1. Ten (10) cents per mile, per vehicle, shall be paid Team members for all meetings except the meeting in connection with the State Association. If a meeting requires members to stay overnight, the room and meals of each will be paid.

Section 2. Each district representative shall be reimbursed for his actual (true) expenses for fulfilling his obligations described in Article IV, Section 3. The chairman, assistant chairman and secretary-treasurer shall be reimbursed for their actual expense for meeting their duties described in Article 11, Section 3.

ARTICLE VI - REPORTS

This Team shall give a report of its activities, functions, programs, and finances at the Annual State Meeting.






