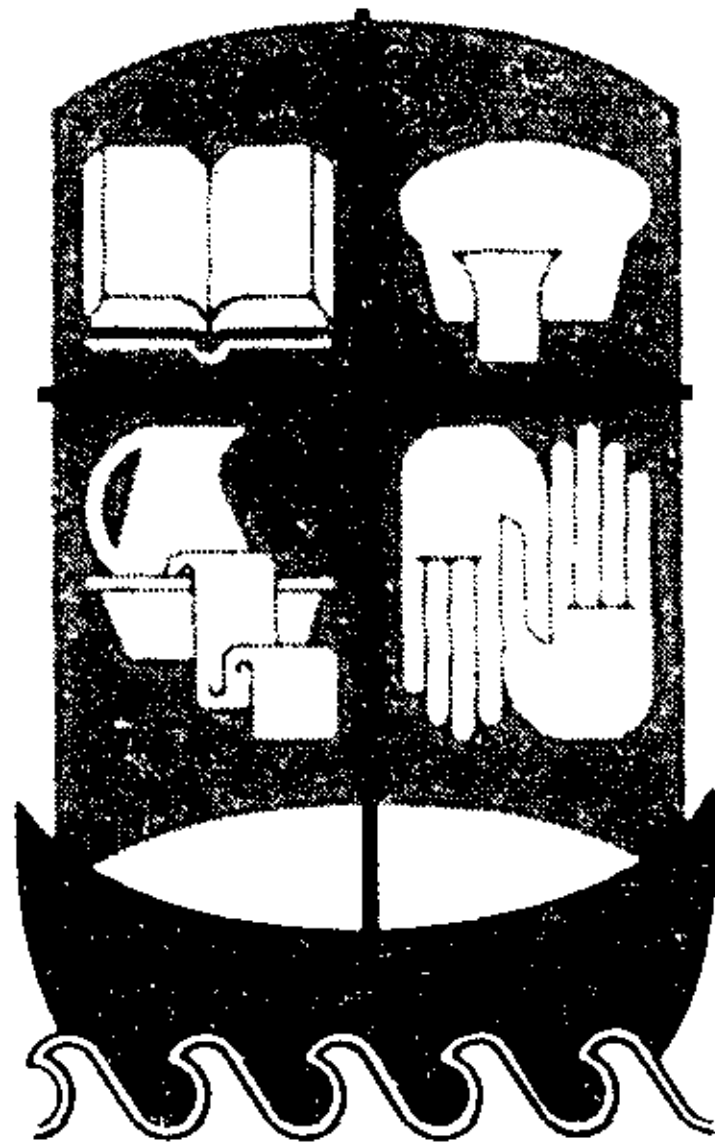

BUSINESS SESSIONS

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 2, 1988

The service was opened with "Witness" singing.

Odis Whitehead was introduced as the new missionary to Jacksonville's Southside. Bro. Larry Montgomery introduced a new program for Home Missions support entitled, "Let George Do It". The Mission Board's Treasurer's Report was given. A report was given by Rev Elmer Turnbough for both the National Home Missions Department and the work in St. Petersburg.

MSC to receive the Alabama Children's Home report given by Odis Whitehead and Levy Corey. This was an oral report.

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 1:30 p.m.

He used the covenant between Jonathan and David as a type of our covenant with Christ. "Witness" then presented another special in song.

HOME MISSION BOARD REPORT

The Lord has blessed our state mission projects and our people are responding to our needs. We are also seeing a new excitement about the future.

The Board met in Tallahassee, on August 16-17, 1988 at the Lake Jackson Free Will Baptist Church. Each of our missionaries were able to share with us God's blessing concerning their works.

Rev. Elmer Turnbough reported the work in St. Petersburg is still moving forward with souls being saved. We have had some difficulty with a tax problem, but it has been resolved. We are thankful for Rev. and Mrs. Turnbough and their faithfulness to the task of building a strong Free Will Baptist Church in St. Petersburg, FL.

Bro. Albert Rollins has served faithfully since 1980 in Gainesville, FL, and has done an outstanding job of relocating and building a beautiful new church in this growing college town. Rev. Rollins has resigned as our missionary to Gainesville, FL. Rev. and Mrs. Rollins are to be commended for their tireless effort in helping to establish a church in this growing city.

The Florida State Home Mission Board along with the National Home Mission Board has employed Rev. Bobby Clyatt as a National Home Missionary to replace Rev. Rollins as of

November 1, 1988. Bro. Clyatt and his wife, Gloria, are excited about the work and are looking forward to completing this joint project in Gainesville.

We ask that you continue to support this mission work until it becomes self-supporting.

Rev. Odis Whitehead has been employed by the two mission boards to serve as a joint project worker to Jacksonville, FL, and will begin a new work in that large city. Bro. Whitehead and family will begin the work in January 1989 and are trusting God for their support and a good work in this growing city.

On September 7, 1988, the board, at the church's request, met with the First Free Will Baptist Church of West Palm Beach and was able to make some sound suggestions to help with their indebtedness and for future growth. This Church is one of our former Home Mission works.

The Florida Home Mission Board is excited about starting other new works in our growing state. We are looking at several key locations and praying that God will send the right men for the job.

As Chairman of the Board, I met with the Pastor of the Palm Bay mission. This church is sponsored by the Indian River Association and is worthy of your prayer and support. They have land with a mobile unit and are moving forward in reaching souls.

Rev. Larry Montgomery will be presenting a new program at this meeting to help raise needed support and to maintain our mission program.

On behalf of our Board, let me say it is a pleasure to serve you as we strive to build new works for our Lord here in the Sunshine State.

FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

The Florida State Youth Board met at the Tampa First Free Will Baptist Church on May 20 and 21, 1988 in conjunction with the State Youth Competition.

Members of the Board present: Ruby Amerson, Pamela Stewart, Rev. D. Gwinn, Rev. Jim Christian, and Jimmy Aldridge.

Sister Ruby went over all registration forms with the board, and everything seemed to be in order. Questions and competition materials were given out to each board

member in charge. We discussed finances for our winners to travel on to Kansas City. It was decided that we would meet again on Saturday morning after we found out how many winners we would have.

The board met with all judges, quizleaders and scorekeepers at 6:00 p.m. We went over all rules and regulations. We also encouraged each leader to be sure they knew what the rules were and to keep updated as they changed.

The Board met on Saturday morning with a report of the winners from the night before. With these facts, it was decided that we would give each winner in Bible Division \$150.00 and each winner in Music and Arts \$100.00 to help them with their expenses. It was also decided that we would hold our 1989 Youth Competition at the Marianna Camp Grounds in Marianna, Florida. This was tentative and would be confirmed at the State Meeting.

After the morning of competition, a couple of parents and quiz leaders asked to meet with the board about questions they had about the competition. The board met with these individuals and answered to the best of our ability the questions they had.

Adjourned, next meeting will be in conjunction with State Association Meeting in Chipley, FL on November 2, 1988.

Approximately 400 people attended the Youth Competition.

STATE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY REPORT

The Florida State Auxiliary held it's 38th Annual Meeting at the First FWB Church of Auburndale on June 3 and 4, 1988.

There were 55 persons registered during the two day period. Delegates from Indian River, Greater St. John's, and South Florida districts were seated. New Auxiliaries from the Victory Church in Auburndale and the Bayshore Church in St. Petersburg petitioned to join our body and were accepted. Reporting to this year's meeting were 16 auxiliaries from 4 districts. The enrollment at the beginning of this year was 199.

Total monies disbursed through our state treasurer this year was \$6,333.54. During the convention, the

following disbursements were made: \$550 offering to be used toward the purchase of a washing machine for Ron and Linda Moore, \$200 to the Dennis and Trena Owen account \$20 Love Offering for Dr. Wisehart, and \$150 toward the expenses of our State President to the National Association in Kansas City.

We were privileged to have Dr. Wisehart from Nashville visiting with our ladies this year. During the day we discussed the plans for the 1989 meeting in Tampa at length. Dr. Wisehart seemed pleased with the progress that our ladies had made toward this meeting. Most of our arrangements have been completed with the exception of a few things which have to be done at the last minute. Our ladies have worked hard and in unity toward this project for which we are most grateful. We are in need of ladies who will be willing to serve in the registration booth during Sunday, Monday, and until noon on Tuesday for two to three hour intervals.

Our cookbook project for financing our part of the National Association has been quite successful. However, we still have several books left.

At our meeting last June, we decided to change our fiscal year from June to December. This year we are asking that you begin in December to abide by this new year. Please send in your yearly report (which will be for only 6 months) by the first of January. Dues for this year have increased to \$2.50.

We adopted the Ron and Linda Moore family and the Dennis and Trena Owens as our State Project for the year. The next annual meeting will be held on June 2 and 3, 1989 at the Immanuel FWB Church in Jacksonville.

The types of videos and tapes that we will have available will be those not readily available at your local bookstore. We hope to offer things that will encourage growth among our churches through FWB materials, etc. We decided to make these materials free of charge to people with the idea of free-will offerings and postage being taken into consideration. We encourage each church to purchase items from our FWB sources that will promote church growth. Also we hope to have some of these items available through our Lending Library.

In the year to come we'll be seriously looking into establishing, for a recommendation to our churches, a "State-Wide Bible Institute Program". We hope to have this information available in the next several months. Our goal is to promote church growth through our Sunday Schools, CTS programs, Evangelism Conferences, Teacher Training Courses, etc. Our Board will also seek to promote through it's members such things as: Minister's Retreats, Sunday School Workshops, and Christian Workers Conferences. Likewise, we will use videos to promote these programs throughout the state.

Also, we will have an article each month in the COORDINATOR concerning materials that we feel would be of benefit to the layman as well as to pastors and church workers. Please look for these in coming issues.

We want to thank the State of Florida FWBs for giving us the opportunity to serve our porple in this capacity and trust that you will continue to pray and support the work of the C.E. Board. We would like to make the Nominating Committee aware that we will need two replacements Randy Tipton - 1988 coming off this year, and Steve Hughes - 1991.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that Bro. Don Hanna serve as State Promotional Secretary, in the light of Bro. Hill's poor health. We would also like to commend Bro. Hill for his work over the past year and give him an honorarium of \$500, as a token of our appreciation. We further recommend that Bro. Hill continue to serve on the Steering Committee for the '89 National.
2. We recommend the following change in Article V, Section 3 under Finance: Mileage for the Executive Committee members and Standing Board members shall be paid at the I.R.S. rate for that fiscal year. Expenses are

to be paid from each Board member's account. If a called meeting requires a member to stay overnight, his room and board will be paid from the General Fund or his Board's account. Mileage and expenses shall be paid for the Moderator to attend the denomination's annual leadership conference. We recommend that each Board change their Consitution. to conform to this change.

3. We recommend that we set aside the Promotional Committee since we now have someone as our Promotional Secretary. THE COORDINATOR and the Promotional Secretary shall fall under the direction of the Executive Committee.
4. We recommend this Constitutional change under Article III - Officers, Boards, and Committees:

Section 3 - Delete the sentance: "The Promotional Team is a standing committee of this association.

CHURCH CLOSING COMMITTEE REPORT

This report is not a personal judgement by the appointed committee, but an observation taken from questionnaires sent to each moderator and other helpful individuals. We wish to thank those who took time to answer and return these questionnaires. It is hopeful that these observations will be helpful to understanding why our Free Will Baptist Churches are closing, becoming independent, or uniting with other denominations. Here are some things those reporting had in common:

1. LOYALTY: There seems to be in most cases, a loyalty to Free Will Baptists. They used Free Will Baptist literature, song books, and FWB ministers.

2. SPIRITUAL SERVICES: There seemed to be a strong desire toward emotional expression in worship, which is important to each of our needs (although this was not consistent in each report). Some seemed to be lured away by charismatic promises of instant success.
3. OUTREACH: Because of a lack of varied programming such as music, youth, and children, each church seemed to have an inability to reach and retain new members.
4. PASTOR: Small churches of necessity must have a bi-vocational pastor. Free Will Baptist pastors willing to serve a part-time church are in short supply. Consequently, many pastors are chosen who hold conflicting views to Free Will Baptists.
5. CONGREGATION: In some cases, the church seemed to be controlled by a few. (Whether of necessity or not, God knows.)
6. ASSOCIATION: In some instances there was the church/association conflict of interest.
 1. Some felt the association was too demanding.
 2. Some felt the association was too insensitive to their diminishing numbers and internal problems. They felt the association would more quickly assert its authority than provide help in time of need.
 3. Some felt the association and other churches were too lenient in recommending transfer pastors, thus creating larger problems for them.

We must be aware that there are many under-surface, invisible problems which are threatening to Free Will Baptist work.

These are but a few which seem to appear in these reports.

May we realize that this report is not a judgement. It is no more than a compilation of incomplete knowledge.

We thank you for not asking this committee for solutions.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

To resolve to do something apart from a heartfelt conviction will accomplish very little. Each year we resolve to stand against pornographic material, abortion, and filth on TV. We resolve to write letters to stores protesting the selling of pornographic material, write to senators asking them to oppose abortion, and write major networks about filth on TV. Many times we leave it there because it is not a conviction of the heart. As it is a matter of the heart that produces action:

1. WE RESOLVE to live a life of purity, to teach our children and others by word and example to live pure, to choose carefully the books they read, the music they listen to, only that which enriches their lives.
2. WE RESOLVE that we believe that God gives life and we commit ourselves to teach others to respect life that God has given.
3. WE RESOLVE that we will not watch filth on TV or from any other source (magazines, books, etc.) and by this example teach others.

BUDGET COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that the budget for this next year by \$70,000.00 from the Cooperative Plan of support.
2. We recommend that the following distribution of Co-op money be the same as last year - 60% to remain in the state, 40% to the National Association.
3. We recommend that the following distribution of Co-op funds of the State Association be disbursed as follows:

4. We recommend that our treasurer be paid \$40.00 per month from the general fund.
5. We recommend that the moderator and clerk be paid \$200.00 each from the general fund.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION
OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpose; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind, do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-laws.

ARTICLE I - NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "The Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists."

ARTICLE II - REPRESENTATION

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate for each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: the officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 2. Boards: The standing boards of this association shall be Home Missions, Christian Education, and Youth Boards

Section 3. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, the chairman of each standing board,, and one elected member from each affiliated district association. District associations shall recommend their representative on the Executive Board annually. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death, removal from office, or by resignation, the general officers shall appoint a temporary replacement until the next regular session of this body, at which time the body shall elect a permanent replacement. A proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 5. General officers of this Association shall serve for the term of two (2) years.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of five (5) members which shall be elected for five (5) year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have the right to discipline any officer or board member who does not conduct his office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of christian conduct laid down in the New Testament.

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session by the moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V - FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations in this body shall pay a representation fee annually. The amount of this fee for an association is \$15.00 per member church. The fee for local churches is \$10 per delegate.

Section 2. All Cooperative Plan funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session, and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 3. Mileage for the Executive Committee members and standing Board members shall be paid at the I.R.S. rate for that fiscal year. Expenses are to be paid from each Board member's account. If a called meeting requires a member to stay overnight, his room and board will be paid from the General Fund or his Board's account. Mileage and expenses shall be paid for the Moderator to attend the denomination's annual leadership conference.

BY - LAWS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

Section 2. The Assistant Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds, pay all bills, and submit records when leaving office. The Treasurer must give bond while filling this office.

Section 5. Each officer and board member must be a member in good standing of a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this body. He must be in good standing with his local association, and must live within the boundaries of this Association. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 6. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session.

Section 7. Amendments to this Constitution and By-laws must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
FLORIDA STATE HOME MISSION BOARD
OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I - NAME

This board shall be known as the Florida State Home Mission Board of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the state of Florida.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis. One member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and by-Laws of the State Association.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES

Officers of this board shall be Chairman and Secretary-Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board. Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary-treasurer.

ARTICLE VI - FINANCES

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special offerings received through promoting missions. Mileage for board members expenses shall be paid from the general fund, limited to 12¢ per mile.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to their respective offices. The Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the board's activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Sec.-Treasurer.

Section 2. A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of a quorum before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the board.

Section 3. All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the State Association.

Section 4. A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Associational meeting.

Section 5. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section 6. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section 7. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section 8. Any work receiving financial support as a loan must accept such on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

Section 9. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however, no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1,000.00 loaned.

Section 10. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 11. An agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be final.

Section 12. Contracts shall be considered delinquent when 3 successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

Section 13. The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potential for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board.

Section 14. Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1,000.00 without joint approval of the mission board and the state executive committee or association.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

ARTICLE I - NAME

This board shall be known as the Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II - DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. The duties of this board shall be to promote Youth Camps, Youth Rallies, and to be a coordinating agency between District, State and National Offices.

Section 2. To set up and direct C.T.S. competitive activities.

Section 3. This board shall give a report of its activities to the Florida State Association's annual meeting.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of office - The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. Vacancies - In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board, they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 4. Meetings - This board will meet semi-annually. As need arises called meetings may be held.

Section 5. Organization - The board shall elect a chairman and a secretary.

ARTICLE IV - TRAVEL EXPENSES

Twelve (12) cents per mile shall be paid board members for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. Any called meeting that requires a member to stay overnight, his room and board shall be paid from the Youth Fund account.

ARTICLE V

This constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of the State Association.

CONSTITUTION OF THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD

ARTICLE I - NAME

This board shall be known as the Christian Education Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists among these: statewide Bible Institutes, Teacher Training programs, Sunday School, C.T.S., Free Will Baptist Colleges and any other training methods that will help in the growth of our churches.

ARTICLE III - THE BOARD

Section 1. Composition - This Board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of Office - The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The Board shall elect a Chairman, Assistant Chairman and Secretary-Treasurer, which shall be elected annually.

Section 4. Vacancies - In the event irregular vacancies occur on this Board they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 5. The Board shall meet at least once a year and/or whenever a meeting is deemed necessary.

ARTICLE IV - DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. To create a statewide Bible Institute program that will assist and encourage the development of regional extensions in each local association.

Section 2. To assist and encourage the growth of Sunday Schools through Sunday School conventions, workshops, etc.

Section 3. To promote the organizing of new C.T.S. groups and to assist in the training portion of existing C.T.S. groups.

Section 4. To encourage the young people of our churches to further their education in our denomination's institutions.

ARTICLE V - TRAVEL EXPENSES

Twelve (12) cents per mile per vehicle shall be paid board members for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. If a called meeting requires members to stay overnight the room and board of each member will be paid.

ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE VII - REPORTS

A complete report of the board meetings and activities, and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association meeting.

ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the State Association.
