

FROM THE FLORIDA FREE WILL BAPTIST HOME MISSION BOARD, INC. TO RECOMMEND CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAW CHANGES:

We recommend the following changes in our Constitution and By-Laws:

- 1) Constitution Article 1 to read: This board shall be known as the Florida Free Will Baptist Home Mission Board, Inc. instead of as presently reads: Florida State Home Mission Board of Free Will Baptists. (This change is legally necessary to bring our name into conformity with our incorporation papers.)
- 2) That we add By-Law Section 14: The board shall have the right by majority vote to sell any personal or real property it deems is not necessary for continued religious use. (this change is necessary since Section 13 gives the authority to purchase property, with an implied right to sell; however, this section 14, for legal purposes, gives explicitly the right to sell.)
- 3) The previous Section 14 becomes Section 15.

FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

In May of 1989, the Board met in an informal manner to make a decision about the amount of money that should be given to our winners to get to Tampa for the National Youth Conference. It was the decision of the Board to give the Bible Winners \$125.00 and the Music and Arts winners \$75.00

Approximately 450 attended our State competition in Marianna, Florida in 1989.

The Florida State Youth Board met on Monday, July 17, 1989 in Tampa during the National Association. All members of the board were present.

We discussed some of the problems encountered at the State Youth Rally held in Marianna in May. We realize that the sound system was ineffective, there was a problem with the piano and time limitations could have been planned better. We as a board want to apologize to our youth over the State and we want to put that meeting behind us and begin to plan and work together

for a better state meeting next year. The problems were not the fault of any one individual and could not have been solved with the limited time there.

With this in mind, we made the following decisions:

- 1) We will begin right away and try to locate a centralized place, hopefull in Jacksonville. We may have to rent a place that would be big enough to accomodate all of the activities.
- 1) We plan to devise a plan to break up our individual catagories and have them perform in different rooms, so that we can judge the number of entries we have in a shorter period of time. This will also include the Bible portion of Competition on Saturday morning. We will work on a schedule when the Board meets at the State Meeting in November.
- 3) We want to encourage our districts to judge more closely in our districts and not just send everyone on to the State Competition. Sometimes the Districts are sending individuals on to the State because they have no one competing against them in a category.



- 4) The Board will be asking a representative in each District to assist the board in recommendations of how or what we can do to insure the funding that our youth will need to get to Arizona in 1990. When we come up with a plan, then we will need help to execute that plan.
- 5) The most important thing discussed was the fact that we must have our Pastors to support our Bible Competition in their individual churches. We feel that more and more of our youth are participating in music and arts and not participating in the Bible category. Our pastors must support this aspect of the competition. We need their help.

The Youth Board is ready for new direction and we plan to work together to improve our Competition on a State Level. If you have suggestions, please let us know.

The Florida State Youth Board met in conjunction with the Florida State Association meeting in Miami, Nov. 1, 1989. The following items were confirmed:

 The State Competition will be held May 18 and 19, 1990.
We will try and locate a place that will meet the requirements of the Board. Bro. Jimmy Aldridge will visit the Jacksonville area and report back to the board. We have been contacted by Bro. Neil Thomsen that we can meet at the Wesconnett FWB Church if need be.

- We are asking that each Moderator suggest a member of his association to give us a name of a person who can act as a liason to the Board so that when we make plans they can be passed on effectively to all the churches. We also need help in raising money to help our winners get to Arizona.
 The Board respectfully asks our clerk to correct our By-Laws to correspond with the decision that was passed last year in regards to mileage - Article 4.
- All members of the Board were present.

STATE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY REPORT



We do commend the many churches who are presently giving substantial amounts through their local churches or other channels.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION

OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpuse; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind , do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-laws.

ARTICLE I - NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "The Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists."

ARTICLE II - REPRESENTATION

<u>Section 1</u>. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

<u>Section 2</u>. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association which are members of this body are standing delegates. <u>Section 3</u>. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

<u>Section 4</u>. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one(1) delegate for each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: the officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and Treasurer. Section 2. Boards: The standing boards of this association shall be Home Missions, Christian Education, and Youth Boards



Section 3. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, the chairman of each standing board,, and one elected member from each affiliated district association. District associations shall recommend their representative on the Executive Board annually. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death, removal from ofice, or by resignation, the general officers shall appoint a temporary replacement until the next regualr session of this body, at which time the body shall elect a permanent replacement. A proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any absentee's place who does not attend the session. Section 5. General officers of this Association shall serve for the term of two (2) years.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of five (5) members which shall be elected for five (5) year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have the right to discipline any officer or board member who does not conduct his office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of christian conduct laid down in the New Testament.

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session by the moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V - FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations in this body shall pay a representation fee annually. The amount of this fee for an association is \$15.00 per member church. The fee for local churches is \$10 per delegate. Section 2. All Cooperative Plan funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session, and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted.



Section 3. Mileage for the Executive Committee members and standing Board members shall be paid at the I.R.S. rate for that fiscal year. Expenses are to be paid from each Board member's account. If a called meeting requires a member to stay overnight, his room and board will be paid from the General Fund or his Board's account. Mileage and expenses shall be paid for the Moderator to attend the denomination's annual leadership conference.

BY - LAWS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order. Section 2. The Assistant Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence. Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds, pay all bills, and submit records when leaving office. The Treasurer must give bond while filling this office.

Section 5. Each officer and board member must be a member in

- good standing of a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this body. He must be in good standing with his local association, and must live within the boundaries of this Association. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.
 - Section 6. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session.
 - Section 7. Amendments to this Constitution and By-laws must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE

FLORIDA FREE WILL BAPTIST HOME MISSION BOARD

Article I - Name

This Board shall be known as the Florida Free Will Baptist Home Mission Board, Inc.

Article II - Purpose

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the state of Florida.

Article III - Membership

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotaional basis. One member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association.

Article IV - Officers and Committees

Officers of this board shall be Chairman and Secretary -Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board. Committees may be appointed by the chairman elected by the board as the need arises.

Article V - Meetings

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary treasurer.

Article VI - Finances

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special offerings received through promoting missions. Mileage for board members expenses shall be paid from the general fund at he IRS rate for that fiscal year.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to the respective offices. The Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the Board's activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendured to the succeeding Secretary-Treasurer.



Section 2. A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of a quorum before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the Board.

<u>Section 3.</u> All members shall endeavor to support mission work though cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the State Association.

Section 4. A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Associational Meeting

Section 5. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

<u>Section 6.</u> Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section 7. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

<u>Section 8.</u> Any work receiving financial support as a loan must accept such on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

Section 9. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however, no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1000.00 loaned.

Section 10. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 11. An agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be final.

<u>Section 12.</u> Contracts shall be considered delinquent when three (3) successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

<u>Section 13.</u> The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potential for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board. Sectoin 14. The board shall have the right by majority vote

to sell any personal or real property it deems is not necessary for continued religious use.

Section 15. Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1000.00 without joint approval of the mission board and the state executive committee or association.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE

FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

Article I - Name

This board shall be known as the Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II - Duties of the Baord Section 1. The duties of this board shall be to promote Youth Camps, Youth Rallies, and to be a coordinating agency between District, State, and National offices.

Section 2. To set up and direct CTS competitive activities.



Section 3. This board shall give a report of its activities to the Florida State Association's annual meeting.

Article III - Membership

Section 1. This board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Fenure of office - The members of his board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. Vacancies - In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board, they will be filled by the Florida State Associatino.

Section 4. Meetings - This board will meet semi-annually. As need arises called meetings may be held.

Section 5. Organization - The board shall elect a chairman and a secretary.

Article IV - Travel Expenses

Mileage shall be paid at the current IRS rate for that fiscal year for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. Any called meeting tht requires a member to stay overnight - his

room and board shall be paid from the Youth Fund account.

Article V

This constitution and By-Laws may be ammended by a majority vote of the State Association.

CONSTITUTION OF THE

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD

Article I - Name

This board shall be known as the Christian Education Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II - Purpose

The purpose of this board shall be to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists among these: statewide Bible Institutes, Teacher Training programs, Sunday School, CTS, Free Will Baptist Colleges and any other training methods that will help in the growth of our churches.

Article III - The Board

Section 1. Composition - This Board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of Office - The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The Board shall elect a Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and Secretary-Treasurer, which shall be elected annaully.

Section 4. Vacancies - In the event irregular vacancies occur on this Board, they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 5. The Board shall mec. at least once a year and/or whenever a meeting is deemed necessary.

Article IV - Duties of the Board

Section 1. To create a statewide Bible Institute program that will assist and encourage the development of regional extensions in each local associatoin.

Section 2. To assist and encourage the growth of Sunday Schools through Sunday School conventions, workshops, etc.

<u>Section 3.</u> To promote the organizing of new CTS groups and to assist in the training portion of existing CTS groups. <u>Section 4.</u> To encourage the young people of our churches to further their educaiton in our denomination's institutions.

Article V - Travel Expenses

Mileage shall be paid at the current IRS rate for the fiscal year for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. If a called meeting requires members to stay overnight the room and board of each member will be paid.

Article VI - Committees

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

Article VII - Reports

A complete report of the board meetings and activities, and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association meeting.

Article VIII - Amendments

This constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the State Association.
