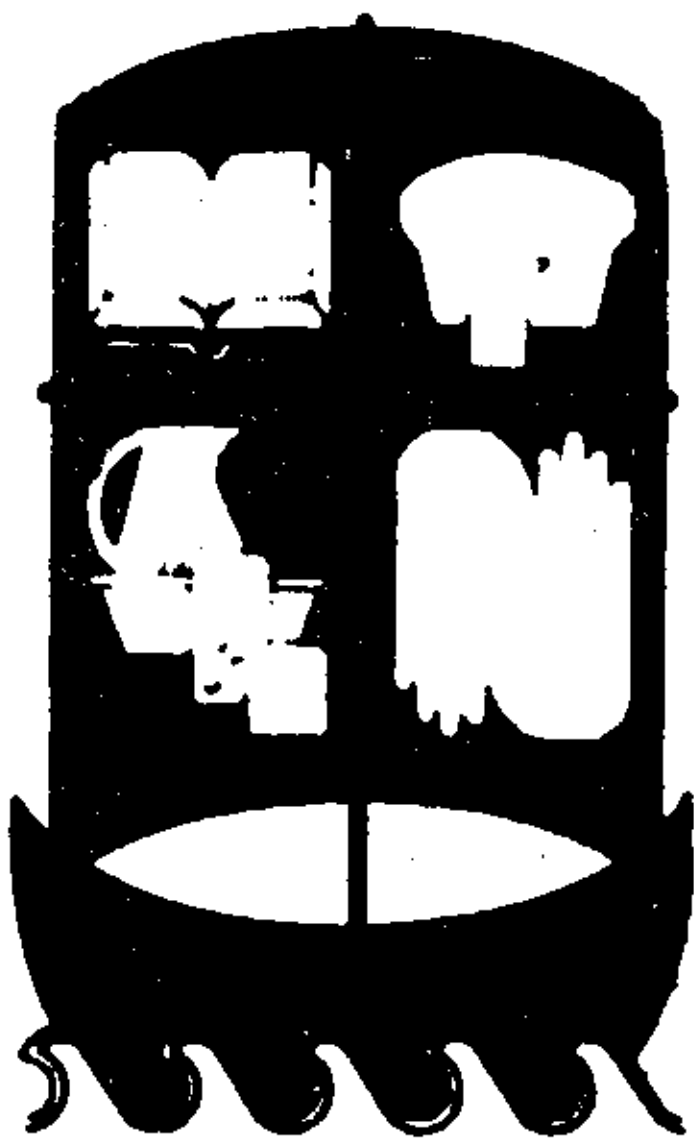

BUSINESS SESSIONS

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 31, 1990

HOME MISSION BOARD REPORT

The Mission Board continues to oversee the work of three Florida mission churches:

1. St. Petersburg: Bro Elmer Turnbough resigned as mission pastor, leaving in May to become pastor of a FWB Church in Delaware. We appreciate Bro and Sis. Turnbough's ministry and faithful service in establishing this mission work.

We are pleased to introduce Bro. Curtis Alligood and his wife, Laverne, as the new mission pastor of the Bayshore Mission Church. The Lord gave him a burden for this work and he left a good pastorate in Booneville, MS to take up the St. Petersburg work when Bro. Turnbough left. While he found fewer people involved in the work than he expected, he and his wife are laboring faithfully to build up the congregation. They have been well received by the mission congregation. Pray that God will give them a fruitful labor. The Alligood's most immediate need is to have their missions account completely underwritten so they can discontinue itinerate

and concentrate their time and energy on the mission work. Will your church help?

2. Gainesville: Bro. Bobby Clyatt and his wife, Gloria, continue working for the Lord in this beautiful university city. While they have seen some significant progress in the church, the great need is for more souls to be won and others brought in to join in this work for the Lord. Pray for the Clyatts and the folks at the Gainesville mission for a real harvest of souls this coming year.

3. Southside Jacksonville: Bro. Odis Whitehead and his wife, Mary Nell, continue their ministry at our newest Florida mission work, Faith Chapel FWB Mission. They have made a good start, and are working to win souls and gain folks into the church. They are meeting in rented facilities, and as soon as funds and circumstances make it possible, they need to purchase land or facilities more conducive for church ministry and growth. We encourage your support of their building fund to expedite this matter.

We greatly appreciate those of you who have faithfully prayed and financially supported our Florida mission works. We believe the establishing of new Bible-preaching, Christ-honoring churches, with its resultant winning of souls, is a ministry worthy of all our support. Every Free Will Baptist Church in Florida should be vitally involved, both praying and giving, so that the work may grow.

As you can see on the financial report, our home missions expenses were \$4700 more than receipts this year. At this rate, without significant changes, we can operate for only another 3 to 5 years. Then what?

As your Home Missions Board, we urgently request that every pastor and every FWB Church in Florida join with us in this ministry. You can contribute in any of 3 ways: 1) Gifts to Coop, of which 65% goes to Home Missions, 2) Gifts to the Home Missions general fund, used for non-salary support ministry, 3) Support of the individual missionary's account. We are managing the finances as wisely and frugally as possible, and yet proceeding with the work, trusting the Lord to use His people to supply the need.

We have lost a valued board member in Bro. J.D. Norris, who has left the state to pastor in Florence, AL. We wish him much success in his new ministry, and express our appreciation for his years of service in Florida as founder and missions pastor of the Lake Jackson FWB Church in Tallahassee, and as member and recent chairman of the Home Missions Board. We now ask the body to prayerfully elect a new board member who will, with wisdom and faithfulness, help us in this part of our state's ministry.

FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

The Youth Board met in conjunction with the State Youth Competition at the Wesconnett Free Will Baptist Church on May 18, 1990. Members present were: Randy Jackson, Jimmy Aldridge, Pam Stewart, Jim Christian, and Ruby Amerson.

The Board went over the registration forms and found everything in order. Sis. Ruby gave a report on the fact that the Bible Bowl and Bible Tic-Tac-Toe teams did not have any state competition and was given permission not to travel to the State Meeting in order to save their money to help on travel to Phoenix. Sis. Ruby had contacted the National Youth Headquarters to be sure this was not in violation of National Guidelines. The Board approved.

The Board met again on Saturday morning to decide about the monies that they would give to the winners to help in their expense to the NYC. It was agreed that the Bible winners would get \$200.00 and the Music and Art winners would get \$100.00. There were approximately 400 people in attendance with 80 young people participating in the competition.

The Youth Board met at Tampa FWB Church on October 31, 1990 at 5:00 pm. Members present were: Jimmy Aldridge, Ruby Amerson, Randy Jackson, Pam Stewart, and Jim Christian.

The dates for the 1991 State Competition were set for May 17 and 18, 1991. There was a lot of discussion about the location for the competition. Shiloh FWB Church has asked for the group to come. Sis. Pam explained to the board that we realize that it is a long way, but we have always traveled and many years the distance has been 8 hours away. We also expressed that we wanted to plan some things for our youth at that time. We discussed the motels, which are 6 to 7 miles from the church. We decided we would talk with the people during the State Meeting and make a decision then.

Bro. Jimmy Aldridge suggested a project that he wanted the board to consider. He would like to purchase T-shirts pre-printed with a FWB logo and if the individual wanted their church name on it it could be done. All churches

could be involved in the project and the proceeds would help us with funding for our winners to go to the National. Bro. Jimmy is going to check into it and get back to us.

It was reported to the board that Piney Grove Church had sent their monies back to the treasurer because they felt like it was not the right thing for them to accept monies from a fund they had not contributed to.

STATE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY REPORT

I regret that I am unable to give my report in person due to recent surgery .

The Auxiliary had another good year. At our meeting held June 1 and 2 in Gainesville, we reported 21 Auxiliaries and 5 districts for a total membership of 187. This was a decrease of 8 in membership from last year but we feel it can be explained in the reporting change. Our fiscal year now runs from January to December and some of our Auxiliaries haven't gotten used to the new method. Perhaps each lady here could pass along to her Auxiliary the need to report the yearly numbers at December 31.

There were 40 delegates seated representing 4 districts and 2 locals to transact our business. We agreed to give our monies in a three part offering for 1990-91. One-third will go to the Dennis Owen family, one third to the Ron Moore family, and one-third for WNAC's general fund. We also agreed to reimburse Billie Sexton her plane fare and give a love offering of \$191.00, and give a love offering of \$20.00 to each of our state officers to help defray their costs during the previous year. We also gave

\$100 to the WNAC general fund.

Total monies given through our treasurer from January 1989 to December 1989 totaled \$10,840.71. These monies went to various missionary accounts.

The minutes are being printed and will be mailed very soon to districts who should be sure they are distributed to the local Auxiliaries.

Jere Herl resigned as treasurer and though we commend her for a job well done, we also honored her resignation. We elected Thelma Wiggins as our Treasurer. We invite all of you to attend the 41st meeting in Auburndale on June 7 and 8, 1991.

2. The C.E. Board sincerely hopes that the churches, pastors, and congregations have been challenged by our articles that have appeared in the Coordinator this past year. We continue to appeal to our pastors to seriously consider beginning a local Bible Institute for the edification and maturing of our people.
3. This coming year, we plan to compile additional articles to appear in the Coordinator that will promote growth, interest, and be spiritually uplifting to our churches. These articles will consist of "how to" ideas, good inspirational and helpful book suggestions, video reviews, and other helpful items that we feel to be beneficial to the local church.
4. This past year, we have been instrumental in assisting four students from our state that have decided to attend one of our Free Will Baptist colleges by giving

a \$100 scholarship from Florida Free Will Baptists. Those students were: Sharon Gilliard, Leatha Norris, Rachel Toole, and Anthony Williams.

In closing, we stay committed to the purpose and goal of our state board, which is to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists. We want to be the extended arm of encouragement to our pastors and people across the state. Pastor we want you to know that we stand with you to help hold up your hands and encourage you. We extend to each and every pastor and layman to leave this associational meeting with a broader, deeper, and greater desire to see your local church become a more effective outreach and ministry in your respective community. We can, IF each of us commit to God the boldness to pray, "Let it begin with us!" (1 Peter 4:17b)

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

The State Executive Committee met on May 18, 1990 and on October 31, 1990. We would like to present these items to the Body:

1. We recommend that we change the name "General Fund" to the Florida State Association's Executive Office of Free Will Baptists. This is to include the Treasurer, The Coordinator, and the State Promotional Secretary.
2. We recommend that we adopt a budget of \$60,000 for our Cooperative Plan of support.
3. We recommend that the remaining undesignated funds from Co-Op, after the Executive Office is covered, be distributed on the percentage adopted by the State Association.
4. We recommend the following distribution:
60% to remain in the state, 40% to be sent to the National Co-Op.

Of that 60%, we recommend the following distribution:

Home Missions	71%
Youth Board	20%
Children's Home	7%
Christian Education	2%

5. The Promotional Secretary's budget to be set at \$3,250.00. His funds for the fiscal year will cease when he reaches his budget allocation.

6. The budget for the COORDINATOR be approved by the State Association. This was presented to the Executive Committee at \$3,780.00

7. We recommend that we continue to give the Treasurer \$40 a month.

8. We recommend that we continue to give \$200 per year to the Moderator and Clerk.

PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY REPORT

It has been my pleasure to represent the State Association in the following local associations this year: Greater St. John's, Salem, Hispanic, and Central. I also made two mailings this past year. One was for Rev. Wayne Hicks who had a heart transplant, and the other for Rev. Curtis Alligood, our new missionary to St. Petersburg.

As a result of the budget discussion during the last State Association Meeting, and the Executive Meeting during the year, I felt responsible to curtail all unnecessary travel until further instruction from the State Association.

We continue to receive calls throughout the year for pastors looking for churches and churches looking for pastors. I have had the privilege of filling the pulpits of a few churches while they were looking for a pastor. At the present time I know of only two churches looking for a pastor here in our state.

I remain committed to this office and with the direction of the State Association look forward to a greater ministry in the coming year. I remain open for your suggestions as to how we can improve the communication of information to our people. Let us keep going on for our Lord.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION
OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, the Free Will Baptists of Florida, for the sake of power that comes of unity and oneness of purpose; for the advancement of the cause of Christ; for the glory of God and the good of mankind, do ordain and establish this Constitution and By-laws.

ARTICLE I - NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "The Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists."

ARTICLE II - REPRESENTATION

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: One (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate for each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of 15 churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. The additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: the officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section 2. Boards: The standing boards of this association shall be Home Missions, Christian Education, and Youth Boards.

Section 3. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Treasurer, the chairman of each standing board,, and one elected member from each affiliated district association. District associations shall recommend their representative on the Executive Board annually. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 4. When vacancies occur either by death, removal from office, or by resignation, the general officers shall appoint a temporary replacement until the next regular session of this body, at which time the body shall elect a permanent replacement. A proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 5. General officers of this Association shall serve for the term of two (2) years.

Section 6. Each standing board shall be composed of five (5) members which shall be elected for five (5) year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected yearly.

Section 7. This body shall have the right to discipline any officer or board member who does not conduct his office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of christian conduct laid down in the New Testament.

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually on Wednesday evening, Thursday, and Friday before the first Sunday in November.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session by the moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V - FINANCE

Section 1. All churches and associations in this body shall pay a representation fee annually. The amount of this fee for an association is \$15.00 per member church. The fee for local churches is \$10 per delegate.

Section 2. All Cooperative Plan funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session, and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 3. Mileage for the Executive Committee members and standing Board members shall be paid at the I.R.S. rate for that fiscal year. Expenses are to be paid from each Board member's account. If a called meeting requires a member to stay overnight, his room and board will be paid from the General Fund or his Board's account. Mileage and expenses shall be paid for the Moderator to attend the denomination's annual leadership conference.

BY - LAWS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

Section 2. The Assistant Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds, pay all bills, and submit records when leaving office. The Treasurer must give bond while filling this office.

Section 5. Each officer and board member must be a member in good standing of a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this body. He must be in good standing with his local association, and must live within the boundaries of this Association. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 6. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session.

Section 7. Amendments to this Constitution and By-laws must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE
FLORIDA FREE WILL BAPTIST HOME MISSION BOARD

Article I - Name

This Board shall be known as the Florida Free Will Baptist Home Mission Board, Inc.

Article II - Purpose

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the state of Florida.

Article III - Membership

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis. One member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association.

Article IV - Officers and Committees

Officers of this board shall be Chairman and Secretary - Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board. Committees may be appointed by the chairman elected by the board as the need arises.

Article V - Meetings

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary - treasurer.

Article VI - Finances

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special offerings received through promoting missions. Mileage for board members expenses shall be paid from the general fund at the IRS rate for that fiscal year.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to the respective offices. The Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the Board's activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2. A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of a quorum before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the Board.

Section 3. All members shall endeavor to support mission work though cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the State Association.

Section 4. A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Associational Meeting.

Section 5. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section 6. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section 7. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section 8. Any work receiving financial support as a loan must accept such on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

Section 9. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however, no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1000.00 loaned.

Section 10. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 11. An agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be final.

Section 12. Contracts shall be considered delinquent when three (3) successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

Section 13. The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potential for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board.

Section 14. The board shall have the right by majority vote to sell any personal or real property it deems is not necessary for continued religious use.

Section 15. Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1000.00 without joint approval of the mission board and the state executive committee or association.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

Article I - Name

This board shall be known as the Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II - Duties of the Board

Section 1. The duties of this board shall be to promote Youth Camps, Youth Rallies, and to be a coordinating agency between District, State, and National offices.

Section 2. To set up and direct CTS competitive activities.

Section 3. This board shall give a report of its activities to the Florida State Association's annual meeting.

Article III - Membership

Section 1. This board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of office - The members of his board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. Vacancies - In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board, they will be filled by the Florida State Associatino.

Section 4. Meetings - This board will meet semi-annually. As need arises called meetings may be held.

Section 5. Organization - The board shall elect a chairman and a secretary.

Article IV - Travel Expenses

Mileage shall be paid at the current IRS rate for that fiscal year for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. Any called meeting tht requires a member to stay overnight - his room and board shall be paid from the Youth Fund account.

Article V

This constitution and By-Laws may be ammended by a majority vote of the State Association.

CONSTITUTION OF THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD

Article I - Name

This board shall be known as the Christian Education Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II - Purpose

The purpose of this board shall be to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists among these: statewide Bible Institutes, Teacher Training programs, Sunday School, CTS, Free Will Baptist Colleges and any other training methods that will help in the growth of our churches.

Article III - The Board

Section 1. Composition - This Board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of Office - The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The Board shall elect a Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and Secretary-Treasurer, which shall be elected annually.

Section 4. Vacancies - In the event irregular vacancies occur on this Board, they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 5. The Board shall meet at least once a year and/or whenever a meeting is deemed necessary.

Article IV - Duties of the Board

Section 1. To create a statewide Bible Institute program that will assist and encourage the development of regional extensions in each local associatoin.

Section 2. To assist and encourage the growth of Sunday Schools through Sunday School conventions, workshops, etc.

Section 3. To promote the organizing of new CTS groups and to assist in the training portion of existing CTS groups.

Section 4. To encourage the young people of our churches to further their educaiton in our denomination's institutions.

Article V - Travel Expenses

Mileage shall be paid at the current IRS rate for the fiscal year for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. If a called meeting requires members to stay overnight the room and board of each member will be paid.

Article VI - Committees

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

Article VII - Reports

A complete report of the board meetings and activities, and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association meeting.

Article VIII - Amendments

This constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the State Association.
