



We believe this arrangement has and will be beneficial for both Randall House and the Florida State Association. It creates additional revenue for the Florida State Association, and it has helped on more than one

◆COOPERATIVE GIVING◆ The Together Way Plan (cooperative giving and designated giving) is of course the means through which we support the various ministries of our Florida State Association and the National Association ministries. Please note the following items relating to the Together Way Plan in Florida:

 We use both aspects of the Together Way Plan in our local churches, e.g. tithes and offerings for the general operating expenses of the church, and designated gifts for special projects of the church and denominational ministries.
 Both designated giving and cooperative giving are necessary for the successful operation of Florida Free Will Baptist Ministries.

3. Every church in our State Association can actively support every phase of Free Will Baptist Ministries through the Together Way Plan.

4. The lion's portion of our state ministries is supported through cooperative giving. Various parts of the State ministries receive some of their support from designated giving, but the most of it comes from cooperative giving.

5. If you give only designated giving there are worthy ministries of our State Association and denomination that are neglected.

6. A very small percentage of our cooperative giving in Florida goes to support the State Association ministries.

In Florida our local churches give to their local associations. The local association retains a percentage of the cooperative dollar received from their churches to fund their associational ministries. The percentage of the cooperative dollar kept by the various associations is as follows:

It should be understood that all designated funds are given in full to the ministry to which they are designated.

There are several important facts to note from the above report:

1. The cooperative giving represents only the amount that has gone to the State Association Treasurer. It does not include the amount retained by each association.

2. The designated giving represents only the amount sent to or through the State Treasurer. It does not include any amount sent directly to other ministries, e.g. the National Departments.

 This means that Florida Free Will Baptist churches have given far more to Christ's Kingdom work than is reflected in these figures. Unless you send your designated dollars through the State Treasurer, we have no way of knowing how much Florida Free Will Baptists give to the total denominational ministries.
 the amount presented above reflects only the giving to the Together Way Plan through our State Treasurer January 1 - April 30, 1995.

5. On the down side of these records, if your church is not named above it means that your church has contributed nothing to the ministries of the Florida State Association in 1995, or that there is an oversight in our typing. If your church is not listed above, but you have contributed to the Florida State Association Ministries during 1995, please let me know so that we can correct it publicly.

It is with grateful heart that we report the income from our churches for Christ's Kingdom through Florida Free Will Baptists. Let your imagination take a trip through our potential as a State Association if all of our pastors and churches would catch the dream that God has for us a Florida Free Will Baptists. Let your imagination take a stroll through the garden of our potential if Florida Free Will Baptists will begin thinking the same thoughts about and toward other Florida Free Will Baptists that God thinks about us. Just think of our potential in new churches, church growth, salvation of souls, youth, senior adults, education, and missionaries, if only pastors and churches will trust each other to Christ, and our resources to His Kingdom through our ministries.

Recently the comment was made that an individual did not have the correct form with which to mail in the Cooperative money to the State Treasurer. I asked around and indeed two forms are needed. They are called (1) a check, and (2) a stamp. These are the only two forms ever needed to get your Together Way funds to their appropriate place.

I thank you for your acceptance of myself and the ministry God has given us together here in our great state. Please do not sell Florida Free Will Baptists short. Through the length and breadth of this state Free Will Baptist Pastors are preaching the same message, offering the same

hope, and desiring that the same Christ will be lifted up among us so that the world may see Him. Please join me in praying that God will renew our vision, revisit us with His presence, and revive us in His Kingdom work. I would like to especially like to say "thank you" to the State Home Mission Board for their generous support to the Promotional Fund.

Due to our move and the various issues relating to the move the Executive Secretary began publishing *The Coordinator* with the September/October issue. I would like to express my sincere appreciation to Sister Diana Bryant for her immeasurable assistance with the publication throughout the beginning period as the new editor.

Future Plans for Publication:

5. *The Financial Page* - publication of income and expenditures of the State Association for each month

There are some concerns which need to be addressed concerning the publication of *the Coordinator*. They are:

1. Frequency of Publication: Much of the information we receive to publish is outdated by the time we publish the next issue. It is conceivable that an article or news release will be four months old before it can be published.

2. The amount of space available for news and events: Approximately one page is taken up with necessary information regarding the name, publication information, and addresses. This leaves three pages for publishing materials. It is important to publish Florida news and events. It is also necessary to publish important events of national departments.

3. The means of paying for *The Coordinator*: All of our churches are treated equally with regards to receiving the paper. All of our churches do not receive the same number of papers. But all of our churches for which we have deliverable addresses receive the paper. The publishing and mailing expenses of the paper come from the Promotional Fund which is funded by Cooperative giving. The result is that the 37 churches which support the State Association through the Together Way Plan is carrying the other 33 that provide no support for the ministries of the State Association. It appears to me that we have a problem of inequity that we as Free Will Baptists must address.

4. The problem of unread papers. Often when I go into churches, I find *The Coordinator* laying on a table in an out of the way place. We would get far better support and participation from our people if the paper were mailed directly into their homes. They would more likely read it. It may cost a little more to mail but it would certainly reap more benefits for our churches and State Association.

I do not have answers to these concerns (I do have ideas about them). I see them as opportunities to work through and thus improve our State work. I also need to know how much authority I may have in addressing these concerns and making changes relating to them.

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#### ♦RECOMMENDATIONS FOR CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGES◆

1. Our State Association financial structure is in the process of change to better accommodate the needs of our boards. If the Executive Committee's recommendations are passed by the state body, each board will have its own treasurer and become accountable for how it spends the money entrusted to the board. It is therefore expedient that the State Association establish a unified bookkeeping system to be used by all within the association who are entrusted to handle state association funds. An internal audit needs to be made annually of all state association finances and the results should be reported to the state body.

Since the Historical Committee/Commission receives co-op funds annually, gives annual reports, and has an ongoing designated task, I suggest that it be named in the Constitution. In addition it is my opinion that a Budget Committee needs to be a standing committee of the State Association. Therefore I recommend that Article III of the Constitution be amended as follows:

Section 3: When the State Association deems it wise,

committees or commissions may be established to perform a specific service in a restricted area on a more or less permanent basis. The number of members and their terms of office of any committee or commission shall be decided by vote of the State Association, and the members shall be elected by the Association.

The present Section 3 of Article III would be changed to Section 4, etc.

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> The present Section 6 of Article III may be amended to read, "Each standing board and the Historical commission shall be composed of five members . . ." The auditing committee shall be composed of three members which shall be elected for three year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected annually. Members of the auditing committee may not be members of any standing board or committee. The Budget Committee shall be composed of the Executive Secretary, Moderator, and the chairmen of each standing board.

2. This will necessitate changes in the By-Laws section of the Constitution. I therefore recommend the following:

a. Section 4 may be amended to read: (1) It shall be the duty of the state association treasurer to receive all funds, pay all appropriate bills, disburse cooperative and designated funds in a timely manner according to the State Association budget. (2) It shall be the duty of each state board treasurer to receive all funds for the board he serves, pay all appropriate bills and disburse appropriate funds in a timely manner. (3) The state association treasurer and all state board treasurers shall use the same accounting system. (4) Each treasurer of the state association shall submit his/her financial records to the state association audit committee annually for audit (5) When vacating office each treasurer shall submit his/her financial records to the state association audit committee for a final audit.

b. Section 5: It may be the duty of the audit committee to conduct a financial audit of each treasurer's books annually. The audit shall take place after the end of the fiscal year and before the State Association convenes. The date for the audit will be agreed upon by the audit committee and the various treasurers who shall be present at the time their books are audited.

c. Section 6: It shall be the duty of the Budget Committee to make recommendations to the State Association concerning the total State Association budget and the allocations of State Cooperative receipts.

d. The present Section 5 would become Section 7 and be amended to read: "Each officer, board member, and standing committee or commission member must be . . ."

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Note: I suggest that a training seminar be provided annually for the board treasurers, the state association treasurer, and the audit committee some time during the State Association for the purpose of insuring that each treasurer is informed about the standard bookkeeping system used by the association. This will insure that new treasurers will be able to follow the process correctly from the beginning. It will also provide an annual opportunity for treasurers to learn any changes in government regulations regarding charitable funds. Local association and church treasurers could be invited to these annual seminars as well.



#### ◆STATE ASSOCIATION SITE REPORT◆

In keeping with the vote of the State Association in May, 1994, I have been looking for possible locations where the State Association may be held in the future. I submit the following report:

Four different sites have been visited and our needs discussed with appropriate personnel of the sites.

1. Advent Christian Village in Dowling Park: While this place has a very cordial Christian atmosphere it is not sufficient to meet the needs of the Association. a) The village lodge has 20 rooms available with 2 double beds in each room. b) Camp Suwannee, a youth camp facility of Advent Christian Village, has a sleeping capacity of 162 in bunk beds. It is a dormitory style arrangement. Accomodations for meeting places is equally limited.

2. Camp Weed Conference Center: Camp Weed is located approximately 5 miles southeast of Live Oak. At the present time Camp

Weed does not have the facilities necessary to accommodate the State Association. Meeting rooms are well equipped, but insufficient to handle our size groups. A limited number of motel type rooms are available on the campus, but there are not enough to house the state association body. Motels are available in Live Oak at reasonable prices. Meals could be managed by Camp Weed. They are in the process of building a new worship Center along with other facilities. While Camp Weed will not meet our needs at the present time, if interest warrants it this site may be considered in the future. Camp Weed is owned and operated by the Episcopal Diocese of Florida.

3. Christian Conference Center in Ocala: The Christian Conference Center in Ocala is a possibility to be considered with certain limitations. There are sufficient locations for our various activities. The buildings are equipped for meetings such as ours. The conference grounds and facilities have a rustic look from the outside, but are air-conditioned, have a P.A. system, and piano and organ. Sleeping facilities are insufficient for our needs. Motels are available close by in Silver Springs and Ocala. Meals can be provided by the Center. There are several restaurants close by in Silver Springs and Ocala. The Christian



Conference Center is owned and operated by the Christian Church Disciples of Christ.

4. Word Of Life Bible Conference Center: Located near Hudson, Florida, it is located off I-75. Take I-75 to exit 59 (Route 52) and go west. Word Of Life is located about 1 1/2 hours southwest of Ocala. Word Of Life can accommodate all our State Association meeting needs. Motel rooms are comparable to those here at the Hilton. Meeting rooms are available for all of our activities, including State Association, Woman's Auxiliary, and Youth. Meals are served on campus by the Word Of Life staff. Recreation facilities are available for those who have time and interest. They hold to a very high standard of conduct and Christian ethics. A thoroughly Christian atmosphere will be experienced. A statement of faith and Christian conduct must be signed by those using the facilities. Accommodations for those with special needs are available also. Word Of Life normally books one year in advance. In case of an overflow, Word Of Life books with local motels (about 18 miles away on Hwy 19)

Of the four sites I have investigated, Word Of Life is the most accommodating one. It seems to have all that our people are looking for, plus additional features than many would enjoy.

RECOMMENDATION: In as much as we have one more year on our contract with the Ocala Hilton, I suggest that the planning committee meet and go to the sites you may wish to consider. This should be done before the Board Meeting in the Fall. A report with recommendations can then be made to the Executive Committee. If a decision is to be made at this session, based on the information I presently have, my recommendation is to book the Word Of Life Conference Center. We will have to book quickly for 1996.

Millard Sasser, Executive Secretary

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This has been a good year and an eventful one for Florida Home Missions. Thank you for your support. We appreciate your giving, both designated and Co-op gifts, which enable us to establish and maintain these Free Will Baptist Mission Churches. We are also very aware of the significant contribution the income from three different church properties make.

Because of your special offerings at last year's State Association and a generous estate gift, the Bayshore FWB Mission at St. Petersburg was able to reduce its mortgage to about \$50,000. Missionary gifts for the salary support of Pastor Curtis Alligood remain good and the church is able to provide for all its other local expenses. Pray for this church as it begins moving toward a totally self-supporting basis. We appreciate the faithfulness of the Alligoods.

The Faith Chapel Mission Church of Jacksonville was able to relocate to its very fine church facility last year. A sizable mortgage is a real challenge to this young group, but they are doing well. Pray for them as they attempt to reach people for Jesus and build up the congregation. Missionary Pastor Odis Whitehead has gone on designated only salary support, and so is working some to provide a livelihood. We appreciate the good work he and his wife, Mary Nell, are doing.

We are excited about the newest Florida mission work - the Renacer (Rebirth) FWB Mission of Miami. When we adopted them as an official Florida Mission project, they were a group of Cuban Free Will Baptists, some newly arrived from Cuba, meeting in a Karate studio with no pastor, yet carrying out a full church program and reaching people. With a loan from the National Home Missions CELF and in anticipation of a generous offering at this associational meeting, we helped with the purchase of the old Ebenezer Church property. Since moving into these facilities the Mission Church has experienced growth, is seeing people saved regularly, operates a child care center, and well represents Christ

Christian Education Board

We are happy to report to you that the ministry of the C.E. Board has been very successful this year. We are pleased to announce to you that we have received more statewide support this year than ever before. We want to thank you for your prayers and support. We attribute this success directly to you.

Our 1995 Minister's Retreat, held in January, far exceeded our expectations. The main speaker, Tom Collins, provided great insight in the areas of both church and personal finances. In the evening services, Executive Secretary Millard Sasser challenged and ministered to our pastors. Rev. Benito Rodriguez educated the pastors about cross-cultural ministries and Rev. Bill George shared his insight on the job of a pastor. Next year's retreat is scheduled for January 29 - 31.

In keeping with our purpose statement, this year we have sanctioned a local Bible Institute. We have approved funds and resources for this endeavor. We would like to provide this service once a year to any church or association that meets board approval.

In order to communicate more effectively with our local churches, the C.E. Board will provide a column in our state paper, *The Coordinator*. In this column, we will seek to provide tools and ideas for your church workers.

In an effort to better serve your church, we want to provide these services. We do seek your constant thoughts and suggestions as this board is here to serve you.



When the State Association deems it wise, committees or commissions may be established to perform a specific service in a restricted area on a more or less permanent basis. The number of members and their terms of office of any commitee or commission shall be decided by vote of the State Association, and the members shall be elected by the Association. (Present section 3 becomes 4 and follow in succession)

#### 2) Article III, Section 6 (will be section 7)

Each standing board and the Histroical Commission shall be composed of five members which shall be elected for five year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected annually.

The auditing committee shall be composed of three members which shall be elected for three year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected annually. Members of the auditing committee may not be members of any standing board or committee. 31

The Budget Committee shall be composed of the Executive Secretary, Moderator, and chairman of each standing board.

#### 3) By-Laws, Section 4

(1) It shall be the duty of the State Association treasurer to receive all funds, pay all appropriate bills, disburse co-operative and designated funds in a timely manner according to the State Association's budget.
(2) It shall be the duty of each State board treasurer to receive all funds for the board he serves, pay all appropriate bills and disburse appropriate funds in a timely manner.
(3) The State Association treasurer and all State Board treasurers shall use the same accounting system.
(4) Each treasurer of the State Association shall submit his/her records to the State Association's Audit Committee annually for audit.
(4) By-Laws, Section 5

It shall be the duty of the audit committee to conduct a financial audit of each treasurer's books annually. The audit shall take place after the fiscal year and before the State Association convenes. The date for the audit will be agreed upon by the audit committee and the various treasurers who shall be present at the time their books are audited.

(5) By-Laws, Section 6

It shall be the duty of the Budget Committee to make recommendations to the State Association concerning the total State Association Budget and the allocations of State Cooperative receipts. (6) By-Laws, Section 5 (Section 5 presently, to become Section 7)

Each officer, board member, and standing committee or commission member must be in good standing with a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this Body. He must be in good standing with his local association, and must live within the boundaries of this Association. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

11. We recommend that our Executive Secretary be allowed to open a checking account in Ocala as an operating fund. \$1000 from the Executive Fund is to be allotted for this.

12. We recommend that we give our local speakers \$75 as an honorarium.

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13. We recommend that we give Dr. Alton Loveless \$300 as an honorarium.

14. We recommend that we give Mike Taggart \$100 as an honorarium for operating our sound system.

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

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# **CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE** FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

### PREAMBLE

### **ARTICLE I - NAME OF ASSEMBLY**

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "The Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

### **ARTICLE II - REPRESENTATION**

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: one (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate for each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of fifteen (15) churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. These additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

### **ARTICLE III - OFFICERS, BOARDS, AND COMMITTEES**

Section 1. Officers: the officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and Treasurer, to be elected by this body while in regular session.

Section 2. Boards: The standing boards of this association shall be Home Missions, Christian Education, and Youth Boards.

Section 3. When the State Association deems it wise, committees or commissions may be established to perform a specific service in a restricted area on a more or less permanent basis. The number of members and their terms of office of any committee or commission shall be decided by vote of the State Association, and the members shall be elected by the Association.

Section 4. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, the chairman of each standing board, and one elected member from each affiliated District Association. District Association shall recommend their representatives on the Executive Board annually. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. When vacancies occur either by death, removal from office, or by resignation, the general officers shall appoint a temporary replacement until the next regular session of this body, at which time the body shall elect a permanent replacement. A proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any absentee's place who does not

attend the session.

Session 6, General officers of the Association shall serve for the term of two (2) years.

Section 7. Each standing board and the Historical Commission shall be composed of five members which shall be elected for five year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected annually.

The auditing committee shall be composed of three members which shall be elected for three year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected annually. Members of the auditing committee may not be members of any standing board or committee.

The Budget Committee shall be composed of the Executive Secretary, Moderator, and chairman of each standing board.

Section 8. This body shall have the right to discipline any officer or board member who does not conduct his office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the New Testament.

Section 9. The Executive Committee is to hire an Executive Secretary and to direct his office. The Executive Secretary is to be a non-voting member of all boards and committees.

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### **ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS**

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually in a joint meeting with the State Woman's Auxiliary and the youth Competition on Wednesday evening, Thursday, Friday and Saturday after the first Sunday in May.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session by the Moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

### **ARTICLE V - FINANCES**

<u>Section 1.</u> All churches and associations in this body shall pay a representation fee annually. The amount of this fee for an association is \$30.00 per member church. The fee for local churches is \$10.00 per delegate. <u>Section 2.</u> All Cooperative Plan funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session, and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted. <u>Section 3.</u> Mileage for the Executive Committee members and standing Board members shall be paid at the IRS. rate for that fiscal year. Expenses are to be paid from each Board member's account. If a called meeting requires a a member to stay overnight, his room and board will be paid from the General Fund or his Board's account. Mileage and expenses shall be paid for the Moderator to attend the denomination's annual leadership conference.

### **BY-LAWS**

<u>Section 1...</u> It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

Section 2. The Assistant Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of the body.

<u>Section 4.</u> (1) It shall be the duty of the State Association treasurer to receive all funds, pay all appropriate bills, disburse co-operative and designated funds in a timely manner according to the State Association's budget. (2) It shall be the duty of each State Board treasurer to receive all funds for the board he serves, pay all appropriate bills, and disburse appropriate funds in a timely manner. (3) The State Association treasurer and all State Board treasurers shall use the same accounting system. (4) Each treasurer of the State Association shall submit his/her records to the State Association's Audit Committee annually for audit. <u>Section 5.</u> It shall be the duty of the audit committee to conduct a financial audit of each treasurer's books annually. The audit shall take place after the fiscal year and before the State Association convenes. The date for the audit will be agreed upon by the audit committee and the various treasurers who shall be present at the time their books are audited.

<u>Section 6.</u> It shall be the duty of the Budget Committee to make recommendations to the State Association concerning the total State Association Budget and the allocations of State Cooperative receipts.

<u>Section 7.</u> Each officer, board member, and standing committee or commission member must be in good standing with a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this Body. He must be in good standing with his local association, and must live within the boundaries of this Association. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 8. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session and shall make a general report of all their actions to this body annually.

Section 9. Amendments to this Constitution and By-Laws must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.



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## CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE FLORIDA FREE WILL BAPTIST HOME MISSION BOARD

#### **ARTICLE I - NAME**

This Board shall be known as the Florida Free Will Baptist Home Mission Board, Inc.

#### **ARTICLE II - PURPOSE**

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the State of Florida.

#### **ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP**

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis. One member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association.

#### **ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES**

Officers of this board shall be Chairman and Secretary/Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board. Committees may be appointed by the chairman elected by the board as the need arises.

#### **ARTICLE V - MEETINGS**

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or the secretary/treasurer.

#### **ARTICLE VI - FINANCES**

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special offerings received through promoting missions. Mileage for board member expenses shall be paid from the general fund at the IRS rate for that fiscal year.

#### BY - LAWS

<u>Section 1.</u> Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to the respective offices. The Secretary/Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the Board's activities and financial transactions. Al records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Secretary/Treasurer.

Section 2. A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of a quorum before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the Board.

Section 3. All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the Board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the Board, be replaced by the State Association.

Section 4. A complete report of the Board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association Meeting.

Section 5. Missions and Churches receiving financial support from this Board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section 6. Missions and Churches receiving financial support from this Board shall consider this Board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

<u>Section 7.</u> Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

<u>Section 8.</u> Any work receiving financial support as a loan must accept such on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the Board as set forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support.

<u>Section 9.</u> Proper security must be granted the Board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however, no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1000.00 loaned.

<u>Section 10.</u> Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 11. An agreement must be understood between the borrower and the Board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met and rights to the property must be relinquished that said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the Board in regards to the property shall be final.

<u>Section 12.</u> Contracts shall be considered delinquent when three (3) successive payments have not been made. It shall be determined by the Board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time. <u>Section 13.</u> The Board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potential for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board.

Section 14. The Board shall have the right by majority vote to sell any personal or real property it deems is not necessary for continued religious use.

<u>Section 15.</u> Nominal grants by the board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1000.00 without joint approval of the Mission Board and the State Executive Committee or Association.

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# CONSTITUTION OF THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD OF THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

#### ARTICLE I - NAME

This board shall be known as the Christian Education Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

#### **ARTICLE II - PURPOSE**

The purpose of this board shall be to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists among these: statewide Bible Institutes, Teacher training programs, Sunday School, CTS, Free Will Baptist Bible Colleges and any other training methods that will help in the growth of our churches.

#### **ARTICLE III - THE BOARD**

Section 1. Composition - this Board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of Office - The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The Board shall elect a Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and Secretary/Treasurer, which shall be elected annually.

Section 4. Vacancies - In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board, they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 5. The Board shall meet at least once a year and/or whenever a meeting is deemed necessary.

#### **ARTICLE IV - DUTIES OF THE BOARD**

Section 1. To create a statewide Bible Institute program that will assist and encourage the development of regional extensions in each local association.

Section 2. To assist and encourage the growth of Sunday Schools through Sunday School conventions, workshops, etc.

Section 3. To promote the organizing of new CTS groups and to assist in the training portion of existing CTS groups.

Section 4. To encourage the young people of our churches to further their education in our denomination's institutions.

#### **ARTICLE V - TRAVEL EXPENSES**

Mileage shall be paid at the current IRS rate for the fiscal year for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. If a called meeting requires members to stay overnight the room and board of each member will be paid.

#### **ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES**

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

### **ARTICLE VII - REPORTS**

A complete report of the Board meetings and activities, and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association Meeting.

#### **ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS**

This constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the Board Members and final approval of the State Association.

# CONSTITUTION OF THE FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

#### ARTICLE 1 - NAME

The Board shall be known as the Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

#### **ARTICLE II - DUTIES OF THE BOARD**

<u>Section 1.</u> The duties of this board shall be to: (1) Promote youth camps, youth rallies, and to be a coordinating agency between District, State, and National officers (2) Coordinate and direct CTS competitive activities (3) Encourage and equip church leaders in their ministry to youth <u>Section 2.</u> This board shall give a report of its activities, board meetings and financial status to the Florida State

Association at its annual meeting.

#### **ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP**

<u>Section 1.</u> This board shall be composed of five members who shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually. In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board, they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

<u>Section 2.</u> Officers of this board shall be a Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the Board. Committees may be appointed by the Chairman as the need arises. The Secretary shall maintain a permanent record of all the Board's activities. The Treasurer shall keep a complete record of all financial activities of this board. All records and financial transactions are property of the Youth Board and shall be surrendered to new officers.

#### **ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS**

This board will meet semi-annually. Meetings may be called by the Chairman or the Secretary as the need arises.


