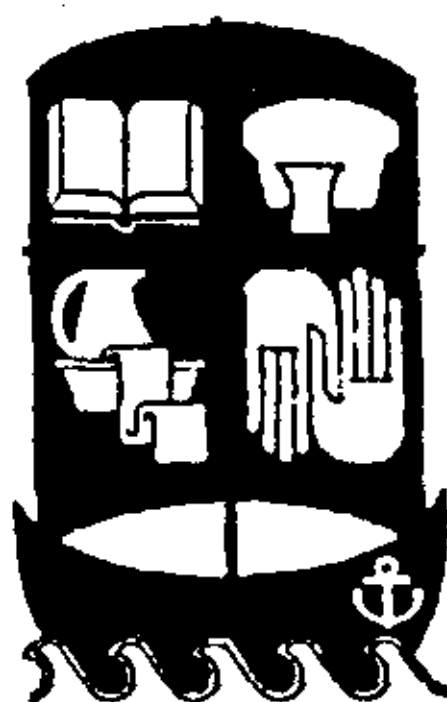
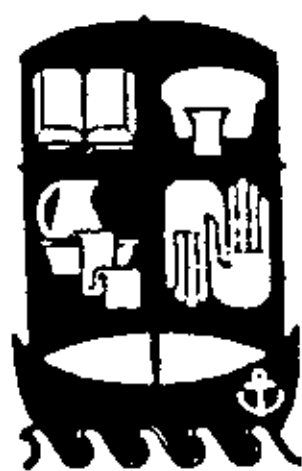

Functions of Committees

Planning Committee: The Planning Committee consists of the Moderator, Treasurer, and Chairman of each Board, and Executive Secretary reports to the Executive Committee. The responsibilities of the Planning Committee are to make intermediate and long-ranged plans for State ministries; coordinate the efforts of the Missions, Youth, and Christian Education ministries; to plan the State Association theme and speakers; and to handle any items of review given by the Executive committee or the State Body.

Steering Committee: The Steering Committee consists of the Moderator, Clerk, Chairman of the Youth Board, and the President of Florida Women Active for Christ. Others may be appointed by the Moderator on a special need basis. It exists for the purpose of coordinating our annual State Meeting. The responsibilities for this committee shall be: to negotiate with the various locations concerning rates and arrangements and to recommend locations to the State body; to work with the various Convention Bureaus to secure sites; to make site inspections when necessary; to set and approve the catering contracts for meeting rooms and meal functions with the host hotel; to coordinate the meeting times and room specifications for each session; to set the schedule for the State Meeting; to coordinate the registration process for the State Meeting; and to be the on-site liaison for hotel staff.

Budget Committee: The Budget Committee consists of three members of the Executive Committee appointed by the Moderator, one year in advance. The State Treasurer serves as an ex-officio member. The responsibility of this committee is to analyze and compile the State's General Fund budget. Budget requests will be submitted in writing. A representative will be available from Florida standing boards and commissions to provide information to the committee. The Executive Secretary will present his

operating expenses and the Coordinator expense. Direction from the State Moderator concerning administrative items will be provided. The Budget Committee has the authority to request additional information in compiling the budget. This budget will be presented to the Executive Committee for approval and recommendation to the State Body for final approval.

Auditing Committee: The Auditing Committee is composed of three members which shall be elected for three year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected annually. Members of the auditing committee may not be members of any standing board or committee. They are to review financial documents to determine that the Treasurer's reports of each board and the State Association clearly reflects the financial activity for the year.

Promotional Team Concept:

The Executive Secretary - He is tasked with being the point man, representing the state ministries, not necessarily the office, to our associations and churches. He also co-ordinates the other positions. This part time position requiring two dates a month to be traveling.

The Bookstore Manager - He is tasked with maintaining and promoting the state library and promoting and handling Sunday School orders and relating items.

The Editor of the Coordinator - He is tasked with delegating articles to be written and compiling the content of the state newsletter in whatever time period and manner published. He may or may not be tasked with actual layout and printing. This could lead to a fourth area which would become the Media Coordinator for all three of these positions (to handle their perspective promotions and graphic design and printing) or he may consider delegating this to the Media Commission.

**Minutes of the Fifty-Eighth Annual Session
of the
Florida State Association of Free will Baptists**

The fifty-eighth annual session of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists convened at the Jacksonville Marriott in Jacksonville, Florida. The joint meeting of the State Association, the Florida Women Active for Christ, and the Florida Youth Conference met on May 8-11, 2002. The theme of the meeting was "Solid Ground in a Shaky World".

Wednesday, May 8 7:30 p.m.

Executive Secretary's Report



Several years ago we adopted a mission statement that defined who we are, why we exist, and what we are to accomplish. Let me remind you that we are a *fellowship* that has voluntarily bonded together. Our churches are autonomous, and can affiliate or remove themselves from our fellowship as they choose. Our *purpose* is to provide avenues for our churches to work together cooperatively so they can accomplish together more than they can

individually. Our *task* as churches and as a state, is to obey the Great Commandment, and fulfill the Great Commission.

Too often in our local churches there is a "me" mentality. We think in terms of how we are affected by programs, how ministries will benefit *us*, how things we can do will enhance *us*, how someone can help *us*. There is no problem with building and strengthening ourselves, as long as we remember that our ultimate goal is to use what God does for us to reach others for Him. We have to remind ourselves that there are a lot of "others" in our communities, our state, and our world. We will never be the local churches God intends for us to be until we see beyond ourselves to the "others" in our community, city, state, and world that do not yet know Him.

The task of the Executive Secretary is to help enhance our fellowship and facilitate our churches as they seek to fulfill their God-given tasks. One of the primary ways this is accomplished is by visiting our churches and association meetings to keep them informed of opportunities our State Ministries provide to help them accomplish their tasks, and by challenging those who are not actively working with us to become a part of something beyond themselves. I am totally convinced that Free Will Baptist Churches in Florida can see their ministries enhanced by participation in our Florida State Ministries.

Our emphasis is on the local church. We realize that the primary extension of the Kingdom will be through the effort and ministries of the local church. Denominational boards and ministries are not entities unto themselves, but

they are extensions of our local church. When the Florida Mission Shares plan allows missionaries to be placed on a field, they are an extension of my local church. When the State Youth Board offers opportunities for the youth of our state, they are an extension of our local ministries. This is true of all the boards and committees of our State Association.

Our ministry to local churches and believers is only as effective as individuals and churches allow it to be. Let me urge you to take advantage of training and fellowship opportunities provided for you on all levels of our denominational fellowship, but let me especially encourage you to let us help you from the state level. We have the ability to offer some things to our churches and associations that local fellowships cannot offer. I urge you to take advantage of what we have to offer.

It is my privilege to serve Florida Free Will Baptists as Executive Secretary. I am grateful for the kindness of our pastors and association moderators who give me time in their churches and meetings to share what God is doing and wants to do among us. If you are not an active participant in our ministries, I urge you to get involved. There is much we have to offer you. There is much you can offer us.

The other members of our ministry team need to be commended. Randy Bryant does a fine job managing our Resource Center and serving as an order house for your literature and ministry needs. Danny Conn does an excellent job as editor of *The Coordinator*, and Ron Hunter enhance the appeal of our paper with his design and

layout skills. In addition, Daniel Perez serves as the translator of our Spanish Coordinator. We want to send our paper to every Free Will Baptist home in our state, so if you are not receiving it in the mail, please sign up today.

Finally, let me close by saying a word of thanks to the First Free Will Baptist Church of Chipley. They are a kind, gracious, and generous people. For two years they have allowed me the freedom to serve in this ministry among our Florida Churches. Their commitment to the cause of Christ and the strengthening of our state work is real. I will forever owe them a debt of gratitude for allowing me the freedom to work among the people of our state.

State Youth Ministries Report



2001 has been the setting of futuristic science-fiction movies. That far off year has come and gone. We did not achieve a utopian society, nor did we reduce the earth to a nuclear wasteland. We have, however, witnessed more evidence of the reliability of the Word of God - false prophets have deceived many, iniquity abounds, and the love of many has grown cold. But we have God's assurance that those who endure shall be saved. We also have a responsibility to help spread the gospel to all nations.

In an effort to train and strengthen believers to endure, the Youth Board promotes the State Youth Conference. Over 100 youth and youth workers participated in the 2001 SYC, with 33 Florida youth advancing to the National Conference in Detroit. We co-sponsored the Christian Workers

Conference, which has expanded into regional meetings, minimizing the travel time for all, while bringing quality Christian training to local youth workers and Sunday School teachers. We continue to offer scholarships for Florida FWB's to attend the National Youth Workers' Retreat and the Truth and Peace Conferences.

As part of our duty to evangelize, the Youth Board has helped contribute \$22,656.53 to Florida Shares in the past three years through our Mission Control project. We encourage every church to promote youth participation in Missions giving. Developing a heart for missions should start at an early age.

The members of the Youth Board are grateful for the opportunity to serve our state and its youth. We trust God will continue to bless our efforts to train workers and help challenge youth to be faithful servants of Jesus Christ.

Mission Board Report

He was offered the position as full time missionary for the city of Gainesville. It was during our state meeting last year that Bro. Don accepted the position. He came on board August 1st and has worked very diligently in learning the city and meeting many people. There was hope of having the first service before the first of the year but because of delays in the renovation of the

property it could not happen. The delay gave Bro. Don and Dede the opportunity to visit many of the churches in the area and more importantly he was able to visit many of the surrounding neighborhoods and share Christ and plans for a new church in the community. The board is looking forward to a strong Free Will Baptist Church in Gainesville.

NOTE: The first meeting was held on February 17th and 27 were in attendance.

It is with regret that the board has discontinued a contract with Bro. Omar Alfaro as missionary to Homestead.

Bro. Omar refused to follow the policy and direction of the Florida Free Will Baptist Mission Board. After much prayer, many miles traveled and meetings held, the board felt it would be better for Florida Free Will Baptists, Florida Free Will Baptist Mission Board, and Bro. Omar Alfaro that mission support be discontinued. The board prays for God's best for him as he continues in His service.

State Executive Committee Report



The State Executive Committee met on May 8, 2002 at the Jacksonville Marriott. The members present were: Tim Owen, Tom Collins, Norm Hansen, Jimmy Aldridge, R.C.

Wiggins, David Williford, Sam Lucky, David Thomas, David Womack, Jose Rodriguez, Danny Conn, Jim Christian, and Randy Bryant. The Following were seated as proxies: John Herl for South Florida, Kenny Thompkins for Citrus Association, and Donnie Hussey for Salem and Howard McNeal from Greater St. John's.

1. We have heard the reports from the State Treasurer, The Executive Office, which includes "The Coordinator" and Resource Manager, the Youth Board, the Christian Education Board, the Mission Board, Mission Shares, the Steering Committee, and the Planning Committee. We recommend the acceptance of their reports and the adoption of their budgets.
2. We recommend the adoption of the following policy for space at the State Meeting.
 - a) A charge of \$100 be set for display space for groups other than our State Office, State Boards, State Auxiliaries, and informational booths from local districts or church ministries.
 - b) Our policy concerning displays at our State to read, "Display space will be limited to organizations which do not promote a philosophy contrary to our Christian faith".
3. We recommend the description of our committees approved in our 2000 Meeting be included in our annual Minutes.
4. We recommend that we have a joint project between

the Youth Board and the Mission Board to promote an annual fund-raising project for Mission Shares in honor of "Mom" and "Pop" Willey.

5. We recommend that the Planning Committee be given the task of restructuring the OASIS ministry during the transition.
6. In considering David Williford's resignation as Executive Secretary and with several matters on the table for the Executive Secretary to handle, there was discussion as to how to proceed. 1) Appoint an acting Executive Secretary and solicit resumes from those interested in the position. 2) Select an interim Secretary. 3) Elect a new Secretary to fulfill the role on a permanent basis.

The Executive Committee recommends:

- a. That in the light of our present Executive Secretary's resignation that an interim Secretary be appointed for the period of 3 to 6 months. The compensation package should remain constant.
- b. Furthermore, that the Planning Committee be given the responsibility of interviewing potential candidates on Thursday evening and recommending that individual to the Executive Committee on Friday morning for their approval.
- c. That a Search Committee of 3 members be elected from the Executive Committee with the Moderator as an ex officio member. The Search Committee will be responsible for soliciting resumes from interested

individuals and shall be responsible for presenting no more than three applicants to the full Executive Committee. The Executive Committee will meet at a time and place specified by the Moderator and will interview the applicants and select an Executive Secretary from those recommended.

The Search Committee will be Dave Thomas, Danny Conn, and Howard McNeal.

7. We recommend that the Moderator be given the authority to appoint a Steering Committee for the 2003 National Association.
8. We recommend the adoption of the 2003 Budget.

Executive Committee Recommendations

The Executive Committee met on May 9, 2002 to reconsider the process of selecting a new Executive Secretary. The following recommendations were approved:

1. We recommend that a point man be appointed to serve as an acting Executive Secretary. This point man is to be our Moderator and he will be assisted by the members of the Planning Committee.
2. To compensate our acting Executive Secretary with \$400 per month and the use of the State-owned car while serving in this capacity.

1. Be it resolved that the Marriott of Jacksonville has met the needs of the Florida State Association and exceeded our expectations, we issue a letter of gratitude for their hospitality.
2. Whereas the Church of Jesus Christ faces new difficulties and pressures through legal challenges, And whereas the Christian Law Association has provided a ministry of legal defense for the church, and provided invaluable resources to the Florida State Association and its members,
Be it resolved that we encourage our people to support it's ministry, and a letter of appreciation be issued to express our gratitude for their work.
3. Whereas David Gibbs III has presented to us the Word of God and the information that will assist us in the defense of the faith,
Be it resolved that we issue a letter of gratitude to him and his family for their support.
4. Whereas David Williford has provided outstanding service and leadership to the State of Florida,
Be it resolved that we express our gratitude of his work among us and our continued support of him and his new ministry with a standing ovation.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

ARTICLE I - NAME OF ASSEMBLY

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as "The Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists."

ARTICLE II - REPRESENTATION

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2. All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3. The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

Section 4. The delegates shall be elected as follows: one (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate for each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of fifteen (15) churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. These additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS, BOARDS, AND COMMITTEES

Section 1. Officers: the officers of this association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer, to be elected by this body while in regular session..

Section 2. Boards: The standing boards of this association shall be Florida Missions, Christian Education, and Youth Boards.

Section 3. When the State Association deems it wise, committees or commissions may be established to perform a specific service in a restricted area on a more or less permanent basis. The number of members and their terms of office of any committee or commission shall be decided by vote of the State Association, and the members shall be elected by the Association.

Section 4. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, the chairman of each standing board, and one elected member from each affiliated District Association. District Association shall recommend their representatives on the Executive Board annually. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5. When vacancies occur either by death, removal from office, or by resignation, the general officers shall appoint a temporary replacement until the next regular session of this body, at which time the body shall elect a permanent replacement. A proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Session 6. General officers of the Association shall serve for the term of two (2) years.

Section 7. Each standing board and the Historical Commission shall be composed of five members which shall be elected for five year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected annually.

The auditing committee shall be composed of three members which shall be elected for three year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected annually. Members of the auditing committee may not be members of any standing board or committee.

The Budget Committee will be appointed by the Moderator a year in advance. The committee will consist of three members from the Executive Committee and the State Treasurer will serve as an ex-officio member.

Section 8. This body shall have the right to discipline any officer or board member who does not conduct his office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the New Testament.

Section 9. The Executive Committee is to hire an Executive Secretary and to direct his office. The Executive Secretary is to be a non-voting member of all boards and committees.

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular: This association shall convene annually in a joint meeting with the Florida Women Active for Christ and the Youth Conference on a Wednesday evening, Thursday, Friday and Saturday as close to the first Sunday in May as possible.

Section 2. Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session by the Moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3. Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE V - FINANCES

Section 1. All churches and associations in this body shall pay a representation fee annually. The amount of this fee for an association is \$100.00 per member church. The fee for local churches is \$10.00 per delegate.

Section 2. All Cooperative Plan funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session, and no funds may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 3. Mileage for the Executive Committee members and standing Board members shall be paid at the IRS rate for that fiscal year. Expenses are to be paid from each Board member's account. If a called meeting requires a member to stay overnight, his room and board will be paid from the General Fund or his Board's account. Mileage and expenses shall be paid for the Moderator to attend the denomination's annual Leadership Conference.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

Section 2. The Assistant Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of the body.

Section 4. (1) It shall be the duty of the State Association treasurer, or someone designated by the State body, to receive all funds, pay all appropriate bills, disburse co-operative and designated funds in a timely manner according to the State Association's budget. (2) It shall be the duty of each State Board treasurer to receive all funds for the board he serves, pay all appropriate bills, and disburse appropriate funds in a timely manner. (3) The State Association treasurer and all State Board treasurers shall use the same accounting system. (4) Each treasurer of the State Association shall submit his/her records to the State Association's Audit Committee annually for audit.

Section 5. It shall be the duty of the auditing committee to conduct a financial audit of each treasurer's books annually. The audit shall take place after the fiscal year and before the State Association convenes. The date for the audit will be agreed upon by the audit committee and the various treasurers who shall be present at the time their books are audited.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the Budget Committee to make recommendations to the State Association concerning the total State Association Budget and the allocations of State Cooperative receipts.

Section 7. Each officer, board member, and standing committee or commission member must be in good standing with a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this Body. He must be in good standing with his local association, and must live within the boundaries of this Association. No person shall serve on more than one board at the same time.

Section 8. The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session and shall make a general report of all their actions to this body annually.

Section 9. Amendments to this Constitution and By-Laws must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by two-thirds of the delegates present.

**CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
FLORIDA FREE WILL BAPTIST MISSION BOARD**

ARTICLE I - NAME

This Board shall be known as the Florida Free Will Baptist Mission Board, Inc.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the State of Florida, beginning new mission works in the state of Florida, and overseeing the missionary and the mission work until the mission is able to assume full self supporting status.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis. One member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES

Officers of this board shall be Chairman and Vice Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer. The same person may hold the office of Secretary and Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the board. Committees may be appointed by the chairman elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or any three members.

ARTICLE VI - FINANCES

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special offerings received through promoting missions. Mileage for board member expenses shall be paid from the general fund at the IRS rate for that fiscal year. All other Board travel expenses shall be reimbursed at members cost.

BY - LAWS

Section 1. Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to the respective offices. The Secretary shall maintain a permanent record of the Board's activities. The Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the Board's financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Secretary.

Section 2. A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of a quorum before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the Board.

Section 3. All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the Board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the Board, be replaced by the State Association.

Section 4. A complete report of the Board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association Meeting.

Section 5. Missions and churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor who is in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 6. The board shall have the right, by majority vote, to purchase property where there is good possibility for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. Full title must be acquired, and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of the real property. Missionaries and mission works receiving funding from the Mission Board will be under the direct supervision of the mission board. Missionaries serve mission works at the discretion of the board. Missions and churches with Pastors employed by the board shall be under the authority of this board for any non routine purchases or financial obligations.

Section 7. The mission board will be responsible for administering the Mission Shares Program under the guidelines set by the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Section 8. Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section 9. The Board shall have the right by majority vote to sell any personal or real property it deems is not necessary for continued religious use.

Section 10. Nominal grants by the Board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1000 without joint approval of the Mission Board and the State Executive Committee or Association.

Section 11. The Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by majority vote of the Board members with the approval of the State Body.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FLORIDA STATE YOUTH BOARD

ARTICLE I - NAME

The Board shall be known as the Youth Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

ARTICLE II - DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. The duties of this board shall be to: (1) Promote youth camps, youth rallies, and to be a coordinating agency between District, State, and National officers (2) Coordinate and direct CTS competitive activities

(3) Encourage and equip church leaders in their ministry to youth

Section 2. This board shall give a report of its activities, board meetings and financial status to the Florida State Association at its annual meeting.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This board shall be composed of five members who shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually. In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board, they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 2. Officers of this board shall be a Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Members of the board shall elect the officers of the Board. Committees may be appointed by the Chairman as the need arises. The Secretary shall maintain a permanent record of all the Board's activities. The Treasurer shall keep a complete record of all financial activities of this board. All records and financial transactions are property of the Youth Board and shall be surrendered to new officers.

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

This board will meet semi-annually. Meetings may be called by the Chairman or the Secretary as the need arises.

ARTICLE V - FINANCES

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, and special offerings received through promoting youth. Mileage, room and board shall be paid from the general fund of the Youth Board for all meetings. Mileage shall be paid at the current IRS rate.

ARTICLE VI - AMENDMENTS

This constitution and by-laws may be amended by a majority vote of the state.

CONSTITUTION OF THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD OF THE FLORIDA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

ARTICLE I - NAME

This board shall be known as the Christian Education Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of this board shall be to promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists among these: statewide Bible Institutes, Teacher training programs, Sunday School, CTS, Free Will Baptist Bible Colleges and any other training methods that will help in the growth of our churches.

ARTICLE III - THE BOARD

Section 1. Composition - this Board shall be composed of five members.

Section 2. Tenure of Office - The members of this board shall be elected for a term of five years and arranged whereby that only one member's term expires annually.

Section 3. The Board shall elect a Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and Secretary/Treasurer, which shall be elected annually.

Section 4. Vacancies - In the event irregular vacancies occur on this board, they will be filled by the Florida State Association.

Section 5. The Board shall meet at least once a year and/or whenever a meeting is deemed necessary.

ARTICLE IV - DUTIES OF THE BOARD

Section 1. To create a statewide Bible Institute program that will assist and encourage the development of regional extensions in each local association.

Section 2. To assist and encourage the growth of Sunday Schools through Sunday School conventions, workshops, etc.

Section 3. To promote the organizing of new CTS groups and to assist in the training portion of existing CTS groups.

Section 4. To encourage the young people of our churches to further their education in our denomination's institutions.

ARTICLE V - TRAVEL EXPENSES

Mileage shall be paid at the current IRS rate for the fiscal year for all meetings except the board meeting in connection with the State Association. If a called meeting requires members to stay overnight the room and board of each member will be paid.

ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES

Committees may be appointed by the chairman or elected by the board as the need arises.

ARTICLE VII - REPORTS

A complete report of the Board meetings and activities, and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association Meeting.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the Board Members and final approval of the State Association.
