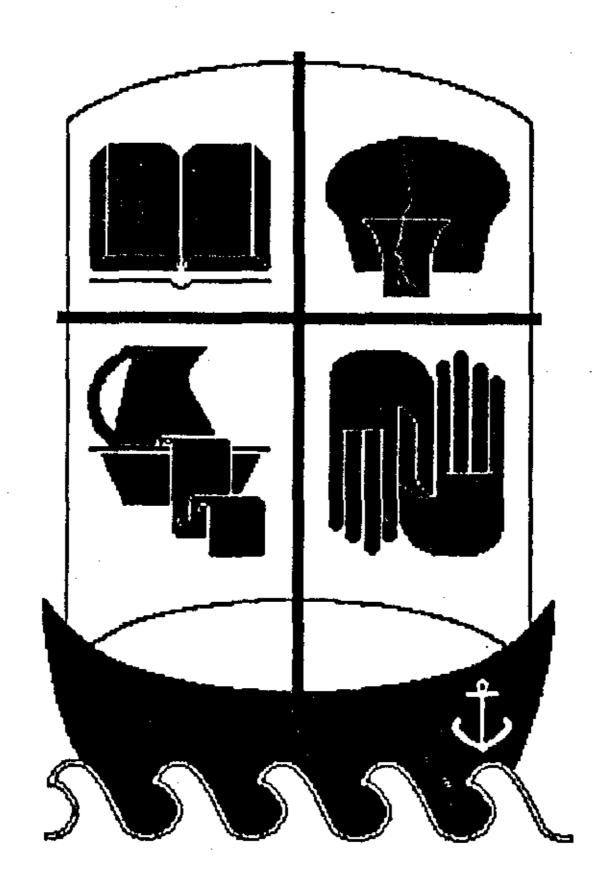

Functions of Committees

Planning Committee: The Planning Committee consists of the Moderator, Treasurer, the Chairman of each Board and the Executive Secretary and reports to the Executive Committee. The responsibilities of the Planning Committee are to make intermediate and long-ranged plans for State Ministries; coordinate the efforts of the Mission Board and Christian Ministries Board; to plan the State Association theme and speakers; and to handle any items of review by the Executive Committee or the State Body.

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Steering Committee: The Steering Committee consists of the Moderator, Clerk, the Chairman of the Christian Ministries Board and the President of the Florida Women Active for Christ. Others may be appointed by the Moderator on a special need basis. It exists for the purpose of coordinating our annual State Meeting. The responsibilities for this committee shall be: to negotiate with the various locations concerning rates and arrangements and to recommend locations to the State Body; to work with the various Convention Bureaus to secure sites; to make site inspections when necessary; to set and approve the catering contracts for meeting rooms and meal functions with the host hotel; to coordinate the meeting times and room specifications for each session; to set the schedule for the State Meeting; to coordinate the registration process for the State Meeting; and to be the on-site liaison for hotel staff.

Budget Committee: The Budget Committee consists of three members of the Executive Committee appointed by the Moderator one year in advance. The State Treasurer serves as an ex-officio member. The responsibility of this committee is to analyze and compile the State's General Fund Budget. Budget requests will be submitted in writing. A representative will be available from Florida standing boards and commissions to provide information to the committee. The Executive Secretary will present his operating expenses and the Coordinator expense. Direction from the State Moderator concerning administrative items will be provided. The

Budget Committee has the authority to request additional information in compiling the budget. This budget will be presented to the Executive Committee for approval and recommendation to the State Body for final approval.

Auditing Committee: The Auditing Committee is composed of three members which shall be elected for three year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected annually. Members of the auditing committee may not be members of any standing board or committee. They are to review financial documents to determine that the Treasurer's report of each board and the State Association clearly reflects the financial activity for the year.

Promotional Team Concept:

The Executive Secretary – He is tasked with being the point man, representing the state ministries, not necessarily the office, to our associations and churches. He also co-ordinates the other positions. This is a part-time position requiring two dates a month to be traveling.

The Bookstore Manager – He is tasked with maintaining and promoting the state library and promoting and handling Sunday School orders and related items.

The Editor of the Coordinator – He is tasked with delegating articles to be written and compiling the content of the state newsletter in whatever time period and manner published. He may or may not be tasked with actual layout and printing. This could lead to a fourth area, which would become the Media Coordinator for all three of these positions (to handle their perspective promotions and graphic design and printing) or he may consider delegating this to the Media Commission.

Executive Secretary's Report

It is my distinct privilege to be able to represent the people, pastors, boards and churches of the Florida State Association. I count it an honor to be allowed to serve in the capacity of the Executive Secretary of the Florida State Association. I am humbled by your confidence in me and by your kind expressions since being elected to this position. I have been to every Association at least once, except for 2. This has been due to scheduling conflicts. With those I have met with the Moderator and some pastors to discuss our mutual ministries. I have preached in several Associations and churches and shared the State Work in all of them. I have been well received and am thankful for your gracious hospitality.

The landscape for Florida Free Will Baptists resembles many of our yards. There are beautiful flowers, green sod, lush shrubs, and solid hedges, but then as you get closer you see the flowerbeds contain a few weeds. From a distance everything looks great but close examination reveals that more work is required. Although I was in the position of Executive Secretary for only one month in 2002, it was clear that this past year had many positives about it but also some negatives. As a whole our State remained in good condition. Our ministries continued to carry out their programs and serve the people and churches of our State. We are thankful to the past Executive Secretary, the interim Executive Secretary, and the Planning Committee for what was accomplished for our Lord during the past year.

The closer look reveals that our State had some problems, too. This past year revealed that several of our churches faced some major crisis. Since everything we do as a State Association is tied to the local churches, you know that our State Association faced some major concerns as well. Our Co-operative program for 2002 fell short of its budget by approximately \$4500 and our Florida Shares Program missed its budget by better than one-third of the total needed.

These facts remind us of some vital realities. First, if our State is to meet its budget and continue its ministries and programs for our churches, we must have greater participation from our churches. The familiar statement is "Together We Can." The truth is unless we do it together, it will not be done! This is something that many of our people comprehend but others still need to understand. Second, we are reminded that the local church is the backbone of everything we do in our Free Will Baptist denomination. Our State or National Associations are nothing without our churches. We are dependent on our churches and we desire to serve each of them, not have the church serve us. Our programs and ministries are designed to enhance and encourage what the church does on the local level.

As the Executive Secretary, I realize my task is to coordinate the ministries of our State and to support the purposes of our churches. It is a distinct privilege to serve in this position and I count it an honor to follow those men who laid the foundation for this ministry. It is my desire to build on that foundation and move our State forward in order to accomplish more for God's kingdom.

Our State owes a great deal of gratitude to the team that produces "The Coordinator." Florida has one of the best State Newsletters in our entire denomination. Special thanks goes to Danny Conn for the superb job he is doing as Editor of "The Coordinator"; to Ron Hunter for continuing to do the layout work in spite of his heavy schedule; to Daniel Perez who serves as translator for our Spanish edition; and to Jose' Rodriguez, the editor of our Spanish edition. These men are performing a great service to the people of our State.

As for the Resource Office, our Sunday School sales have increased significantly over the past year. We exceeded our projected income from commissions by \$1310. We have increased the number of churches that are ordering their literature through our office. However, we do have some churches that continue to order directly through Randall House. However, Randall House will be discontinuing this program at the end of this year. We will have two more quarters for which we will receive commission. After the Winter Quarter, churches will need to order directly from Randall House. We want to express our thanks to Randall House for their support of our State ministries through this pilot program. The State Office can still order Evangelical Training Association

materials for you as well. This is fine material in training Christian workers in various subjects of interest. For the present time, the Resource Office has been combined with the responsibilities of the Executive Secretary. This has enabled us to reduce the budget in salary and supplies. We continue to have some materials available for churches to borrow. A list of these items will be printed at the end of this report.

Two particular opportunities I would like to present to our State for 2003 and into 2004 would be some Seminars for Clerks and a Seniors' Summit. Since record keeping has long been a problem in our churches, Districts, and State, I would like to set-up some seminars in regions or Districts for local church clerks and district clerks. These can be set up by the district officers and offered to clerks and pastors. The second thing I hope we can consider is to put together a Seniors Summit for our seasoned saints. This could offer fellowship, encouragement, and instruction for the seniors in our State. With a higher percentage of seniors in Florida than any other State, we are missing a great opportunity to minister particularly to these individuals. This is the greatest untapped resource we have in the State of Florida.

Finally, let me close by expressing my thanks to the folks at Ryanwood Fellowship Free Will Baptist Church for allowing me the privilege of serving as the State Executive Secretary and continuing to serve as their pastor. This church is truly concerned about extending the Kingdom of God and promoting His work through our State Association. Thanks to Diana and to Betsy Lucky for their tremendous help in getting the Digest of Reports out. They spend countless hours typing and laying out the book for us.

Then meet us in Tampa for the national this July.

The Missions Control project has raised \$23,756.53 for Florida Shares since 1999. We encourage all youth to participate in missions fundraising. We challenge every church to train your youth to support world missions. Participate in the "Mom & Pop" Willey March for Missions campaign by scheduling an annual fundraising event in the month of March. In an effort to promote youth involvement in missions, the Youth Board also helped sponsor France E-Team member Jerod McNeal, and made a donation to the Beulah FWB Mission Trip to Spain.

The CE & Youth Board co-sponsor the annual Christian Workers Conference. About 200 Florida FWB's attended last fall in either the South/Central session in Cape Canaveral or the Panhandle session in Ft. Walton, to hear Bro. Carl Cheshier and Bro. Bruce Bennett speak about Church Growth and Children's Ministry. These regional conferences provide top-quality training and encouragement for the church staff, teachers, church leaders, and other workers in your church. Twenty-two of our churches were represented at the 2002 Conferences. We are pleased these were present and hope that more of our churches will make use of this opportunity to teach and encourage their church workers.

Our goal is to help you accomplish your ministry more effectively. We thank you for the opportunity to share in the training of the youth and youth workers of our state.

Bruce dealt with the areas of youth ministry, with emphasis on youth of all ages and also dealing with Children's Church ministry. He was well received and was very beneficial for those working in these areas.

Carl dealt with Church growth. His material is being presented and used throughout our denomination. We were fortunate to have him with us.

Minister's Retreat

We continued with the format of having a time of relaxation, encouragement and fellowship with this year's retreat. We also invited the Pastor's wife to attend. We met in Gainesville and had supper together on Monday night. Rev. Milton Worthington was our guest speaker for the retreat. He brought a message of encouragement for us at the restaurant. After dinner we traveled to the mission church with pastor Don Walker. The next day we traveled to Lakeland and watched a ballgame. - 5. We recommend the following changes in our Constitution and By-Laws:
 - a. Article III, Section 1. Delete the officers of "Assistant Secretary" and "Assistant Treasurer" and change "Secretary" to "Clerk."

Section 1. Officers: The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk,

and Treasurer to be elected by this Body while in regular session.

b. Article III. Section 4. - Delete the offices of "Assistant Secretary" and "Assistant Treasurer" and change "Secretary" to "Clerk."

Section 4. "The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, the chairman of each Standing Board, and one elected member from each affiliated District Association. District Associations shall recommend their representatives on the Executive Board annually. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum."

- c. Article III, Section 2. Change to read:

 "The standing boards of this Association shall be the Florida Mission Board and the Christian Ministries Board."
- d. By-Laws. Section 2. Change to read:

 "The Assistant Moderator shall assume the duties, rights, and privileges of the Moderator or Clerk in the absence of either."
- 6. We recommend the adoption of the Budget Committee Report.

Constitution and By-Laws of the

Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists

Preamble

Article 1 - Name of Assembly

Section 1: This assembly shall be known as "The Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists."

Article II - Representation

<u>Section 1:</u> This Association shall be composed of delegates elected from the local associations belonging to this body and delegates elected from the local churches embraced by the various associations.

Section 2: All deacons and ministers who are members of, and in good standing with, a local church and local association which are members of this body are standing delegates.

Section 3: The general officers of this body shall be standing delegates.

Section 4: The delegates shall be elected as follows: one (1) delegate for each local church composed of 100 members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate for each additional 100 members or fraction thereof; five (5) delegates from each local association composed of fifteen (15) churches or fraction thereof, and one (1) additional delegate for each additional four (4) churches or fraction thereof. These additional delegates cannot be used unless the churches are active and are represented in the session in which they are appointed.

Article III - Officers, Boards and Committees

Section 1: Officers: the officers of this association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer to be elected by this Body while in regular session.

Section 2: The standing boards of this Association shall be the Florida Mission Board and the Christian Ministries Board.

Section 3: When the State Association deems is wise, committees or commissions may be established to perform a specific service in

restricted area on more or less permanent basis. The number of members and their terms of office of any committee or commission shall be decided by vote of the State Association and the members shall be elected by the Association

Section 4: The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, the Chairman of each Standing Board, and one elected member from each affiliated District Association. District Associations shall recommend their representatives on the Executive Board annually. A majority of members shall constitute a quorum.

Section 5: When vacancies occur either by death, removal from office or by resignation, the general officers shall appoint a temporary replacement until the next regular session of this body, at which time the body shall elect a permanent replacement. A proxy may be appointed by the body to fill any absentee's place who does not attend the session.

Section 6: General officers of the Association shall serve for the term of two (2) years.

Section 7: Each standing board and the Historical Commission shall be composed of five members which shall be elected for five year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected annually.

The auditing committee shall be composed of three members which shall be elected for three year terms on a rotating basis, so that one new member shall be elected annually. Members of the auditing committee may not be members of any standing board or committee.

The Budget committee will be appointed by the Moderator a year in advance. The committee will consist of three members from the Executive Committee and the State Treasurer will serve as an ex-officio member.

Section 8: This body shall have the right to discipline any officer or board member who does not conduct his office in a Christian and business-like manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the New Testament.

Section 9: The executive Committee is to hire an Executive Secretary and to direct his office. The Executive Secretary is to be a non-voting member of all boards and committees.

Article IV - Meetings

Section 1: Regular: This association shall convene annually in a joint meeting with the Florida Women Active for Christ and the Youth Conference on a Wednesday evening, Thursday, Friday and Saturday as close to the first Sunday in May as possible.

Section 2: Special: The Executive Committee may be called into session by the Moderator, or by a majority of its members.

Section 3: Quorum: Fifty (50) percent of the delegates shall constitute a quorum.

Article V - Finances

Section 1: All churches and associations in this body shall pay a representation fee annually. The amount of this for an association is \$100.00 per member church. The fee for local churches is \$10.00 per delegate.

Section 2: All Cooperative Plan funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in session, and no fund may be used in any way except as budgeted.

Section 3: Mileage for the Executive Committee members and standing Board members shall be paid at the IRS rate for that fiscal year. Expenses are to be paid from each Board member's account. If a called meeting requires a member to stay overnight, his room and board will be paid from the General Fund or his Board's account. Mileage and expenses shall be paid for the Moderator to attend the denomination's annual Leadership Conference.

By-Laws

Section 1: It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all deliberations of this body while in session. All meetings shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

Section 2: The Assistant Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator or Clerk in the absence of either.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of the Clerk to make and keep records of all the business proceedings and activities of this body.

Section 4: (1) It shall be the duty of the State Association Treasurer, or someone designated by the State Body, to receive all funds, pay all appropriate bills, disburse co-operative and

designated funds in a timely manner according to the State Association's budget; (2) It shall be the duty of each State Board Treasurer to receive all funds for the board he serves, pay all appropriate bills, and disburse appropriate funds in a timely manner. (3) The State Association Treasurer and all State Board Treasurers shall use the same accounting system. (4) Each treasurer of the State Association shall submit his/her records to the State Association's Audit Committee annually for audit.

Section 5: It shall be the duty of the auditing committee to conduct a financial audit of each treasurer's books annually. The audit shall take place after the fiscal year and before the State Association convenes. The date for the audit will be agreed upon by the audit committee and the various treasurers who shall be present at the time their books are audited.

Section 6: It shall be the duty of the Budget Committee to make recommendations to the State Association concerning the total State Association Budget and the allocations of State Cooperative receipts.

Section 7: Each officer, board member and standing committee or commission member must be in good standing with a Free Will Baptist Church which is a member of this body. He must be in good standing with his local association and must live within the boundaries of this Association. No person shall serve on more than on board at the same time.

Section 8: The Executive Committee shall have full authority to do all acts for and in the name of the Association when the Association is not in session and shall make a general report of all their actions to the body annually.

Section 9: Amendments to this Constitution and By-Laws must be put before the body while in session one day before voted on, and must be read at least twice and passed by a two-thirds of the delegates present.

Constitution and By-Laws

of the

Florida State Free Will Baptist Mission Board

Article I - Name

This Board shall be known as the Florida Free Will Baptist Mission Board, Inc.

Article II - Purpose

This purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the State of Florida, beginning new mission works in the state of Florida, and overseeing the missionary and the mission work until the mission is able to assume full self-supporting status.

Article III - Membership

This board shall be composed of members elected by the State Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis. One member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association

Article IV - Officers and Committees

Officers of this board shall be Chairman and Secretary / Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. The board members have the option of securing a treasurer who is not a board member. Members of the board shall elect the officers and/or secure the treasurer of the board. Committees may be appointed by the chairman elected by the board as the need arises.

Article V - Meetings

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the chairman or any three members.

Article VI – Finances

This board shall receive its finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special offerings received through promoting missions. Mileage for board member expenses shall be paid from the general fund at the IRS rate for that fiscal year. All other Board travel expenses shall be reimbursed at members cost.

By-Laws

Section 1: Officers of the board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the Constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to the respective offices. The Secretary shall maintain a permanent record of the Board's activities. The Treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the Board's financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding Secretary.

Section 2: A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of a quorum before it is considered final. All members not present in meetings shall be notified of decisions made by the Board.

Section 3: All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the Board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the Board, be replaced by the State Association.

Section 4: A complete report of the Board Meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual State Association Meeting.

Section 5: Missions and Churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with an association or quarterly meeting affiliated with the state or national association and must have a pastor in good standing with the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Section 6: The board shall have the right, by majority vote, to purchase property where there is good possibility for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. Full title must be acquired, and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of the real property. Missionaries and mission works receiving funding from the

Mission Board will be under the direct supervision of the mission board. Missionaries serve mission works at the discretion of the board. Missions and churches with Pastors employed by the board shall be under the authority of this board shall be under the authority of this board for any no routine purchases or financial obligations.

Section 7: The mission board will be responsible for administering the Mission Shares Program un the guidelines set by the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Section 8: Any work receiving financial support must agree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section 9: The Board shall have the right by majority vote to sell any personal or real property it deems is not necessary for continued religious use.

Section 10: Nominal grants by the Board to worthwhile churches or missions may be made when it is in the interest of the denominational cause in which benefits are certain. Grants of this nature shall be subject to money being immediately available and shall not exceed \$1000.00 without joint approval of the Mission Board and the State Executive Committee or Association.

Section 11: The Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a majority vote of the Board members with the approval of the State Body.

Constitution of the Christian Ministries Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists

Article I - Name

This board shall be known as the Christian Ministries Board of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II - Duties

Section 1. The board shall (1) Promote the educational aims of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists; (2) Coordinate & direct youth training and competitive activities; (3) Encourage and equip Christian leaders and workers for effective ministry through the local Church.

Section 2. The board shall give a report of its activities, financial statement, and property inventory, and present a budget request to the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists at its annual meeting.

Article III - Membership

Section 1. The board shall be composed of five members who shall be elected for a term of five years, arranged whereby only one member's term expires annually. Unexpired terms will be filled by the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Section 2. Officers of this board shall be (1) Chairman, (2) Secretary, (3) Treasurer. Officers shall be elected by the board for one year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms.

Article IV - Meetings

Section 1. Meetings shall be held annually with additional meetings called by the chairman, or by any three members, as necessary.

Article V - Finances

Section 1. This board shall receive its finances from (1) Cooperative program allocation, (2) Fund raising projects, (3) Registration fees, and (4) Designated giving.

Section 2. Appropriate expenses incurred on official board business shall be paid or reimbursed from the general fund of the Christian Ministries Board. Mileage shall be paid at the current IRS rate.

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Article VI - Amendments

This constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the Florida State Association of Free Will Baptists.
