The annual meeting for the Florida State Woman's Auxiliary Convention convened with the First Free Will Baptist Church of Auburndale, Florida, June 3, 1967.

Mrs. Mabel Wiley was our morning speaker and  
while waiting for her arrival, Mrs. Edith  
Hansley gave a short devotional.

Mrs. Wiley introduced two of the ladies from  
the Miami Church that were formerly from Cuba.  
Each of these ladies, Araselia Iagueido and  
Carmen Rodriguez in their testimonies expressed  
a desire to see us doing more for the Lord.  
These ladies are trying to assist with the  
Cuban refugees that come to the mission in  
Miami.

Mrs. Wiley gave a plea for each auxiliary to  
return clothing which could be used for the  
refugees coming into Miami daily. These  
garments will be sent to the Mission Head-  
quarters in Miami: 232 S/W 8th Street, The  
Free Will Baptist Refugee Center....with the  
packages marked "DELIVER IN THE MORNING."

A very inspiring morning message was brought by Mrs. Wiley with her scripture John 17: 15 - 19 (verse 18 was main verse). Her message was entitled:

"Three Roads on Which Jesus Traveled."

- 1- Road of Humanity
- 2- Road of Prayer
- 3- Road of Self-Consecration.

As usual Mrs. Wiley's talk was a challenge to each listener.

An offering of \$27.82 was taken.

A delicious lunch was served by the churches in the Central Woman's Auxiliary District.

Convention singing of "To the Regions Beyond." The afternoon devotional was given by Mrs. Edith Hansley. Her subject "So Send I You," using Iasiah 6:8,: "Here am I, send me." She spoke to all mothers, pointing out again the responsibility of mothers in training up their children. It was a very good talk.

The convention was privileged to hear two of the Declamation Contestants: Miss Malla Carr and Miss Carolyn Culler of Bethel Free Will Baptist Church, Pensacola.

## Plan of Work:

1. We recommend that the Florida State Woman's Auxiliary Convention take as a State project \$200 to be sent to the Foreign Missions General Fund to be distributed to the accounts of missionaries who are in need.



2. We recommend \$50 be sent to the Free Will Baptist Bible College for the building fund.
3. We recommend that \$50 be sent to the Student Loan Fund at the FWB Bible College to help support Christian Students.
4. We suggest that the local auxiliaries send clothing to the FWB Cuban Refugee Center, 232 S/W 8th Street, Miami, Fla.

These amounts are to be equally divided among the Districts. We encourage each district to send their part and be diligent concerning this part of the work.
