

RULES OF ORDER

I. At every sitting business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whoever he may request.

2. That all ministers, ministers wives, deacons, deacons wives, clerks and ass't clerks be as standing delegates.

3. Those who speak shall rise and address the Moderator, Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.

4. No motion shall be discussed without

being seconded.

- 5. When a motion has been made and second ed and a member opposes it's discussion, the Moderator shall put the question "Shall it be discussed?" If negative the question shall be dismissed.
- 6. If any proposition as motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken.

7. Motion made and lost shall not be recorded.

8. No one shall speak more than twice on any subject without special leave of the Mod.

9. All questions shall be decided by a majority of the delegates voting.

10. No member shall absent himself without

special leave of the Moderator,

II. Minutes shall be leasurly read and cor rected before the close of the Association if necessary.

12. In the future meetings of the Association, arrangement shall be made to insure two or more sermons each day or other equivalent devotional exercises.

13. The Rules of Order shall be distinctly read from the chair immediately after the or-

ganization of the Association.

I4. Alterations may be made in these rules at any reguler session of the Association.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intox icating beverages, and to provide things honest in the

sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret pray er, family devotions, and social worship; and by selfdenial faith and good works endeavor to grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conference, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work. We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit"in the bonds of peace. To be careful of one anothers happines and reputation to seek to strengthen the weak encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principal sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our cheif business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His

will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our LordJesus Christ.

By-Laws

I.The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the Association into conference, and if a quorum is present the Moderator, or in his absence the assistant Moderator shall take charge; and if neither of them is present, the senior minister in years shall act as Moderator.

2.It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the delegates to the Association, who shall p esent themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein. In the case of questionable representation, however, the cases under question shall be refered to the Cred-

entials Committee.

3.It shall be the duty of every church belonging to this Association to send a letter to
every Annual session of this Association, reorting in the same it's spiritual condition,
benovelent work, and it's statistics. Any church belonging to this Association, which shall
fail to report itself for two successive sessions may be dismissed from the Association
by a two-thirds vote of all members present.

4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a

9. It shall be the duty of all the members of the Association to be present at the time app ointed for each meeting, and anyone wishing to reture shall first obtain leave of the Moderator. 18 IO. No member shall absent himself from the Association during it's meetings without first obtaining permission from the Moderator.

II. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee, provided the person nominated be elected.

12. The Moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a christian spirit, or when he thinks it will cause discord or divistion.

13. Any one desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the Moderator by the appellation "Brother Moderator", but shall not speak further until recognized by the Moderator. 14. The "Yeas" and "Nays" may be counted on any question by request of one of the members present.

I5. No member of this Association shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes on the
same subject without permission of the Mod.
I6. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to
seat delegates in a body in a designated section of the assembly room at the beginning of
each business session.

17. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

Articles of Faith

live, but man volentarily disobeyed the commandments of God, transgressed the Law and fell under just condemnation of the same, whereby all mankind are sinners, not by constraint but by choice, being partakers of the sinful nature attained by the fall, and that man is unable to save himself with his own power, but we see Jesus for the suffering of death crowned with glory, that He by the grace of God should taste death for every man. Gen. 3:17 Heb. 2:9

4.We believe Christ by His death, suffering and resurrection purchased our pardon and off ered it freely to all mankind upon principals of repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. He now commands all men everywhere to repent, therefore He sayeth "Look unto Me and be saved, all ends of the earth for I am God and there is none else. Matt. 4:17, Isa. 45:22, Acts 20:20-21

5.We believe adult persons must be regenerated and born of the spirit of God. Jonah 4:II, Mark 10-I4, Deut. I:39

6.We believe all christians must persevere in grace and be faithful to the end if they inherit eternal life, for blessed are they that do His commandments that they may have the right to the tree of life and enter thru the gates into the city, Rev. 22:14, Matt. 24:13
7.We believe that baptism by immersion is the apostolic mode, even the burial of a believer in water, and that Christ who is our life, showed His humble example to His children and bids us walk therein. John 3:22, Romans 6:34, Matt. 28:19-20, Matt. 3:16
8.We believe God in His goodness displays His

power of grace in great degree in calling and qualifying His servants by the teaching of the Holy Ghost and by the instruction of His word to go forth and proclaim life and salvat ion without price He bigs us freely come and nothing prevents the salvation of any but

their stubborn rebellion and sinful refusal to some.IstCor.I2:I3,Eph.3:7,Rev.22:I7 9.We believe that Baptism, the Lord's Supper and Jashing the Saints Feet are ditine ordinances and should be observed by all His children.Mark24:22-23,JohnI3:4-I4,Matt.28:I9-20 Ist Tim.5:I0

IO.We believe that none have a right to baptism, only those who have a living home in the
Lord Jesus Christ. And none have the right to
administer the same only those who have come
under the hands of the presbytery of elders.
II. Each church ought to have a pastor, deacons
and clerks chosen by the church, to hold office during the good pleasure of same.
I2. In dealing with disorderly members:

(a) Reference should be had to the 16th ch. of Matt. and other scriptures relative to deal with disorderly members.

(b) In all cases a majority shall rule.

(c) Except in receiving members, and then it must be unanimous. Titus I:5, Acts I4:23, 2ndCor 6:6.

I3.We believe it is the duty of each church to assemble themselves together once a month and that it is the duty of the pastor of the church when setting forth the Lord's Supper and Washing the Saints Feet to let a man "exemine himself and so let him eat" Ist. Cor. II:28. John I3:14

I4. We believe that the sanctification and holiness is a Bible doctrine, that immortality is God'sdwelling in the light, so when this corruptable shall have put on incorruption and this mortal shall have put on immortality the shall it be brought to pass the saying that is written "Death swallowed up in victory "That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another and to study the happiness of the people of God in general and to be singly engaged to promote the honor and glory of God Gal. :10. Ist John. 2:9

15.We believe in the resurrection of the dead of both the just and the unjust, the resurrection of the just to glory and immortality in the presence of God, the unjust to the everlating shame and banishment from the presence of God.Matt.25:31, IstCor.15:42-45, Thess.I:10 Rev.20:12-13

Gaines Creek Association Constitution

PREAMBLE: From experience, we the members of the churches of God and Christ, commonly known as FreeWill Baptists, realize the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group which desires to promote every phase of our state and national enterprise, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better associational government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This organization shall be known as the Gaines Creek Association of Free Will Baptists in Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE: The purpose of this Association shall be to bring into a union such churches in southeastern Oklahoma as desires to promote the enterprise of the State and National Assn. Section 2: It shall not be the purpose of this Association to usurp authority over the churches but to recommend such measures as would promote unity of action among the churches to harmonize the efforts of individual churches among each other in their effort to accomplish good and make each other more proficient in their undertakings to advance the cause of Christ.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: This Association shall be composed of churches commonly known as Free Will Baptists, who maintain gospel order and shall subscribe to the Constitution and By-Laws and Articles of Faith as adopted by this said Association.

Section 2:All duly constituted churches may be received in this Association by their presenting a petitionary letter from their respective churches if they shall be found orderly and orthodox. Such a reception shall be manifested by the Moderator or his assistant giving the right hand as a token of fellowshi

ARTICLE IV

REPRESENTATION: The members of this Association shall be the church clerks, ordained ministers and ministers wives, deacons and deacons wives in good standing belonging to any church of this Association; also three delegates from each local church, chosen during church conference and bearing credentials from said church to this body.

ARTICLE V

FINANCE: Each church shall send the sum of not less than \$15.00 annually. All expenses above the stated amount shall be at the direction of the body.

ARTICLE VI

DISCIPLINE: This Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine or practice that may properly come before it from any of the churches: or act upon any appeal that may be made at any of it's meetings.

ARTICLE VII

PARLIMENTARY PROCEEDURE: The questions of del-

iberations shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

ARTICLE VIII

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be moderator, ass't. moderator, clerk-tre asurer and ass't, clerk, each of which will be elected at the close of the yearly meeting. Section 2. Committees or boards shall be appointed by the moderator unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until their work is completed or until their successors are elected.

Section3. There shall be a Credential board elected by the Association, to inquire into, and examine each applicant for ordination of license to preach the gospel of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and make recommendations to the Association concerning the same. The council shall be composed of three ministers and two deacons.

Section4. The duties of boards and committees shall be such as are common among FreeWill Baptists when not in conflict with the State and National Associations.

ARTICLE IX

ALTERATIONS AND REMISSIONS: This Constitution may be amended at any yearly session bu two-thirds vote of members present, provided the proposed amendment or alteration be presented to the body in writing to read one day in advance.

ARTICLE X

CHURCH COVENANT AND BY-LAWS: The church covenant and by-laws are prescribed by the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of National Association of the Free Will Baptists as adopted in 1950.

Ordinances of the Gospel

#I.CHRISTIAN BAPTISM: This is the immersion of believers in later, in the name of the Father, son and the Holy Spirit, (2) in which are represented the burial and resurrection of Christ, the death of christians to the worl the washing of their souls from the pollution of sin, their rising to newness of life, their engagement to serve God, and their resurrection at the last day. (1)
(2) Matt. 28: 19, Baptising (Greek, Immersing) them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost. Col. 2: 12, Buried with Fim in baptism, wherein also ye are risen with Him. Acts 8: 36-39, Matt. 3: 16, Mark I: 5, Gal. 3: 27,

Ist Cor. 15:29.

#2. THE LORD'S SUPPER: This is a commercation of the death of Christ for our sins, in the use of bread which He made the emblem of His broken body, and the cup, the emblem of His shed blood, (2) and by it the believer expresses his love for Christ, his faith and hope in Him, and pledges to Him perpetual fidelity. (3) It is the privilige and duty of all who have spiritual union with Christ to commerate Fis death, and no man has a right to forbid these tokens to the least of His diciples. (I) (2) Ist Cor, II: 23-26, For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you That the Lord Jesus the same night in which He was betrayed took bread, and when He had given thanks, He brake it, and said "Take, eat, this is my body, which is broken for you, this do in rememberance of me! After the same manner also Le took the cup, when He had supped. saying"This cup is the new Testament in my blood, this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in rememberance of me.for as often as ye eat

this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till de come. Matt. 26:26-28.

(I) Romans 6:4, Therefore we are buried with Him by baptism into death; like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. Col. 3:3, 2:12, Titus 3:5, Gal. 3:27, Ist. Cor. 15:29.

(3) Ist Cor. IO: 16. The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ? Ist Cor. IO: 12, II: 27-29.

#3 WASHING THE SAINTS FEET: This is a sacred ordinance, which teaches humility, and reminds the believer of the necessity of a daily cleansing from all sin. It was instituted by the Lord Jesus Christ, and called an "example" on the night of His betrayal, and in connection with the institution of the Lord's Supper. It is the duty and happy prerogative of every believer to observe this sacred ordinance. (2) St. John 13:4-8. Ist Tim. 5:1-10
