

RULES OF ORDER

I. At every sitting business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whoever he may request.

2. That all ministers, ministers wives, deacons, deacons wives, ckerks and asst. clerks be standing delegate.

- 3. Those who speak shall rise and address the Moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates
 - 4. No motion shall be discussed without being seconded
- 5. When a motion has been made and seconded and a member opposes it's discussion, the Moderator shall put the question "Shall it be discussed"? If negative the question shall be dismissed.
- 6. If any proposition as motion under debate contain two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken.
 - 7. Motiom made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on any subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. All questions shall be decided by a majority of the delegates voting.
- IO. No member shall absent himself without special leave of the Moderator.
- II. Minutes shall be leisurly read and corrected before the close of the Association if necessary.
- I2. In the future meetings of the Association, arrangements shall be made to insure 2 or more sermons each day or other equivalent devotional exercises.
- 13. The Rules of Order shall be distinctly read from the chair immediately after the organization of the Assn.
- I4. Alterations may be made in these rules at any regular session of the Association.
- 15. The Moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a christian spirit; or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and ad opted the word of God as our rule of faith and practice we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements, and unholy conformity to the world from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide all things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer family devotions, and social worship; and by self denial, faith and good works endeavor ."to grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for thu rch conference, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the spirit"in the bonds of peace. To be careful of one anothers happiness and reputation, to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the aff licted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the gospel. We will everywhere hold Christian principal sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our cheif business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the Salvation of the world.

And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming og our Lord Jesus Christ.

- I. The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior ministers in years shall call the Association into conference, and if a quorum is present the Moderator, or in his absence, the assistant Moderator shall take charge; if neither of them is present the senior minister in years shall act as Moderator.
- 2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the Delegates to the Association, who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein. In the case of questionable representation, however, the cases under question shall be refered to the Credential Committee.
- 3. It shall be the duty of every church belonging to this Association to send a letter to every Annual Sess ion of this Association, reporting in the same it's spiritual condition, benevolent work, and it's statistics Any church belonging to this Association, which shall fail to report itself for two successive sessions may be dismissed from the Association by a two-thirds vote of all members present.
- 4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer, and it shall be closed with prayer.
- 5. By a two-thirds vote of all members present a ruling of the Moderator can be over-ruled.
- 6. This Association may correspond by delegate or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 7. This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a Committee of the whole.
 8. Any person not a member of this Association may be
- allowed to take part in it's discussions by obtaining permission from the Moderator.

Constitution

PREAMBLE: From experience, we the members of the churches of God and Christ commonly known as Free Will Baptists. realize the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group that desires to promote every phase of our State and National enterprise do hereby ordain this Constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better Associational government.

ARTICLE T

NAME: This organization shall be known as the Gaines Creek Association of Free Will Baptists in Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE: The purpose of this Association shall be to bring into a union such churches in Southeastern Oklahoma as desires to promote the enterprise of the State and National Association, Section 2. It shall not be the purpose of this Assn.

to usurp authority over the churches but to recommendsuch measures as would promote unity of action among the churches to nacmouse the efforts of individual churches among each other in their efforts to accomplish good and make each other more proficient in their undertakings to advance the cause of Chtist.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: This association shall be composed of church es commonly known as Free Will Baptists, who maintain gospel order and shall subscribe to the Constitution and By-Laws and Articles of Faith as adopted by this said Association.

Section 2. All duly constituted churches may be received in this Association by their presenting a petitionary

in this Association by their presenting a petitionary letter from their respective churches if they shall be found orderly and orthodox such a reception shall be manifested by the Moderator or his assistant giving the right hand as a token of fellowship.

ARTICLE IV

REPRESENTATION: The members of this Association shall be the church clerks, ordained ministers and ministers wives deacons and deacons wives in good standing belonging to any church of this Association, also three(3) delegates from each local church, chosen during church conference and bearing credentials from said church to this body.

ARTICLE V

FINANCE: Each church shall send the sum of not less than \$15.00 annually, and all expenses above the stated amount shall be at the direction of the body.

APTICLE VI

DISCIPLINE: This Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline doctrine or practice that may properly some refore it from any of the churches; or act upon any appeal that may be added any of meetings.

ARTICLE -VII

PARLIMENTARY PROCEEDURE: The questions of deliberations shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

ARTICLE VIII

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, and Assi stant Clerk, each of which will be elected at the close of the Yearly meeting.

Section 2. Committees or boards shall be appointed by the Moderator unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until their work is completed, or until the ir successors are elected.

Section 3. There shall be a Credential Board elected by the Association, to inquire into, and examine each applicant for ordination of license to preach the gospel of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and make recommendations to the Association concerning the same. The council shall be composed of three ministers and two deacons.

Section 4. The duyies of Boards and Committees shall be such as are common among Free Will Baptists when not in conflict with the State and National Associations

ARTICLE IX

ALTERATIONS AND REMISSIONS: This Constitution may be am ended at any yearly session by two-thirds vote of members present, provided the proposed amendment or alteration be presented to the body in writing to read one (I day in advance.

ARTICLE X

CHURCH COVENANT AND BY-LAWS: The church covenant and by laws are prescribed by the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of National Association of the Free Will Baptists as adopted in 1950.

Ordinances Of The Gospel

#I. CHRISTIAN BAPTISM: This is the immersion of believers in water, in the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit, (2) in which are represented the burial and the resurrection of Christ, the death of christians to the world, the washing of their souls from the pollution of sin, their rising to the newness of life, their engagement to serve God and their resurrection at the last day.

(2)Matt.28:19, Baptising (Greek, Immersing) them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Chost. Col.2:12, Buried with Him in baptism, wherein also ye are risen with Him. Acts 8:36,39, Matt.3:16, Mark I:5

Gal.3:27. Ist. Cor. 15:29.

#2. THE LORDS SUPPER: This is a commercation of the death of Christ for our sins, in the use of bread which He made the emblem of His broken body, and the cup, the emb lem of His shed blood, (2) and by it the believer expres ses his love for Christ, his faith and hope in Him, and pledges to Him perprtual fidelity. (3) It is the privilige and duty of all who have spirit ual union with Christ to commercite His death, and no man has a right to forbid these tokens to the least of His diciples. Ist. Cor. II:23-26. For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you that the Lord Jesus the same night in which He was betrayed took bread, and when He had given thanks, He brake it and said "Take, eat, this is my body, which is broken for you, this do in rememberance of me"After the same manner He took the cup when He had supped, saying "This cup is the New Testament in my blood, this do ye, as oft as ye drink it in rememberance of me, for as oft as ye eat this bread and drink this cup, ye do show the Lords' death till he come. Matt. 26:26-28. Romans 6:4. Therefore we are buried with Him in baptismunto death; like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. Col. 3:3,2:12, Titus 3:5, Gal. 3:27, Ist. Cor. 15:29.

Ist.Cor. IO:16, The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ? Ist. Cor. IO:12, II: 27-29.

(I) Ist. Cor. IO:16, For we being many are one bread and one body, for we are all partakers of that one bread, Matt. 26:27. Drink ye all of it. Romans I4: I, IO, Ist. Cor. I2: I2-27, Acts 2:42, #3. Washing the Saints Feet: This is a sacred ordinance which teaches humility, and reminds the believer of the necessity of a daily cleansing from all sin. It was instituted by the Lord Jesus Christ, and called an "examp le"on the night of His betrayal, and in connection with the institution of the Lords! Supper. It is the duty and perrogative of every believer to observe this sacred ordinance. John I3:4-8, Ist. Tim. 5:I-IO
