The Law of the Spirit Life

God has given us a law for both physical and spiritual life, what we shall and what we shall not do, and when we violate His laws we stand condemned at the bar of God. In the beginning God gave Adam the Law of Eternal life. Gen. 2:16-1 "And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, of every tree of the garden, thou mayest freely eat, but of the tree of knowledge of good and evil, thou shall not eat of it; for in the day thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die," You can see how one violated law separated man from God, it is the same now, as it was in the beginning. I John 3:4, "Whosoever committeth sin transgresseth also the law: for sin is the transgression of the law." God has given us a law of spiritual life, and it is to the saved. Lust is sin, and the natural man is full of it. Phil. 3: 20-21, "For our conversation is in heaven; from whence also we look for the Saviour. the Lord Jesus Christ. Who shall change our vile body, that it may be fashioned like unto his glorious body, according to the working whereby he is able even to subdue all things unto himself." The lust of the flesh does not condemn any one, if it is not conceived in the soul, but when it is conceived in the spiritual man it brings forth sin, and sin when finished brings forth death. James 1:5.

Oh, well, you may say the body may sin, but the spirit does not again. James 2:26. "As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also." Hon-

estly, do you see any dead people committing sin? We are not trying to tell you that a backslider is fallen from Grace, he is only a sin sick soul, however sickness results in death unless a remedy is applied. Jesus is the only remedy for a sinsick soul. Although Jude wrote that some were twice dead plucked up by the roots. v. 12 first dead in sin, second repentance and the washing of regeneration, and the renewing of the Holy Ghost. Titus 3:5. Third, practice sin, sinsick, no repentance, no remedy applied. Fourth committing the sin unto death, 1 John 5:16, "If any man see his brother sin a sin which is not unto death he shall ask, and he shall give him life, for them that sin not unto death there is a sin unto death. I do not say that you shall pray for it." Twice dead. The inspired word of God written by the Apostle Paul. Heb. 6:4 "For it is impossible for those who were once enlightened, and have tasted of the heavenly gift, and were made partakers of the Holy Ghost, v. 5, and have tasted the good word of God, and the power of the world to come v. 6 If they shall fall away, to renew them again unto repentance, seeing they crucify to themselves the Son of God afresh, and put him to an open shame." Any sin not repented of is unto death, yes the next article will be on this subject in it we will deal with the texts supposed to teach an unconditional salvation to the believer. Jesus said, Matt. 6:24 "No man can serve two masters." Paul wrote, Rom. 6:16, "Know ye not, that to whom ye may yield yourselves servants to obey." His servants ye are to whom ye obey, whether of sin unto death, or chedience unto righteousness."

But through it all David encouraged himself in the Lord his God. To be able to spread cheer and courage is a wonderful asset to any person. You can not do things for others unless you are convinced of the thing you are doing. To meet some people, to shake hands with them, is refreshing as water to the thirsty or food to the hungry. Coutage is a necessity not a lxuary in the great business of living. Courage to a degree we must have to live at all. Courage is essential to our usofulness. However gifted we may be, if we have lost our courage, if we have made up our minds that the crocked can never Le made straight, then our days of usefulness are over. There are those like Elijah who are all colowing the r church, community, and denomination to suffer

because they think there is no use to try. The Lord will use those who will stay in the fight and keep from under the jumper tree. When men are under the jumper tree, they are hinder ances instead of kelps toward the great poal. Courage is contagous, but so is converdice.

My subject and text concerns Davi &s encouragement of himself. Not others entire couraging him. When he encouraged himself, he did encourage others. When we are short on courage, we must become self starters and keep working, thereby giving the other fellow what he needs. We can not give what we do not have. Why shout courage, when one's own knees are shaking. If I am steady and unafraid, I can share with others. This has been proven many times during World War number two.

Why did David encourage himself? He had much to dicourage him, that, we can see if we look at his situation. David had failed in war to keep his city from the enemy. One day he returns and knows his people have gone captive to a place

worse than death. He failed— a kindred experience comes to all sooner or later in some degree so we need courage when facing seemingly failure. Next David needed to encourage himself because of what his failure had cost him. He lost his popularity. David had a capacity to win the hearts of the people. What he did pleased the people. But now the hurrals of his fellows had turned to hisses. The cost of failure was the loss of his goods and the loss of his loved ones. David was not sure he would ever see them again. It was Samuel 30:4 that they "wept until they had no more tears to weep." I am thankful that David did not get bitter and angry. There were those who blamed him, but he encouraged himself. We may take hope. Whatever may be our circumstances, this door stands open to us. If the situation in which we find ourselves refuses to encourage us, if lips utter no word of commendations, if they utter the opposite, we still have the privilege of encouraging ourselves.

How did David encourage himself? He did not encourage himself by getting his feelings hurt and washing his hands of the whole business. He was tempted, as you have been, to say, "Why should I carry on when nobody seems to care?" If it is your task—do something about it. If it is the Lord's will—go ahead. David did not encourage himself by shutting his eyes to the ugly facts that were making courage difficult. He knew he had lost the fight, his family, his friends, his fighters. He would have been a coward to say I do not face rebellion and danger. Also he would have been foolish. Jesus never gloss-

ed over unpleasant facts. He spoke plain as to the price to be paid to follow Him on every occasion to an individual or to a group.

Then David must have, (1) counted what he had left. I will get the next train. We must not look simply at losses (1910) and our failures but also the possibilities that are still ours. A great college-a great mission work home and foreign, etc. (2) Even though he made a failure that failure need not be final. I will get my eye sight, I will be healed of this issue of blood if I can only get to Him. If you win you must not let the past failure as final finish you. (3) Best of all David brought his conditions to the Lord. "David encouraged himself in the Lord his God." That source for David was never closed, the presence of the Lord. So many have been encouraged to fight on in the presence of One who loves, cares, and directs. Take courage and say "I have set the Lord always before me: because He is at my right hand, I shall not be moved." Now stop reading and turn to Acts 27 and read the chapter. Paul encouraged himself in the Lord: he encouraged others: He helped the Lord to save and they all escaped safe to land. As Christians and Free Will Baptist will you make applications from your local church to the National Association concerning present conditions. You are called upon to encourage and enrich the lives of others. You may do so if you will find the secret. "David encouraged himself in the Lord his God." Salvation is not in meats and drinks nor in keeping of the law. The law was fulfilled in Christ. "By grace are ye saved through faith." Salvation today is through faith in the Son of God. Jesus declared to the Pharisees, "The Son of Man is Lord even to the Sabbath day." He had a right to set aside the old Sabbath and establish a new day, and He did so. It was not the

pore nor the church that did it, but Jesus Himself.

The day Christ arose from the dead was the most wonderful day the world ever saw. It is the day of all days to His people. That glorious morning when the Savicur stepped from the tomb brought a new day to this dark world, are we keeping that sacred day holy unto the Lord.

"The first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulchre." (John 20:1).

That same day as two of His disciples were on the way to Emmaus, "Jesus Himself draw near and went with them." (Luke 24:15).

"That same day as two of His disciples were on the way to Emmaus, "Jesus Himself drew near and went with them." (Luke 24:15).

"Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, came Jesus and stood in the midst, and sayeth unto them, Peace be unto you." (John 20:19.

"And after eight days again His disciples were within, and Thomas with them; then came Jesus, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, Peace be u-n to you." (John 20:26). Here we have proof that on the first two Sundays Jesus appeared to His disciples. Why was it, if not to establish that day as a day of worship?

"The diciples kept that day." "And upon the first day of the week, when the diciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them." (Acts 20:7).

Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him, that there be no gatherings when I come." (1 Cor. 16:2).

Christ's Revelation to the churches was given on that day. John said "I was in the Spirit on the Lord's Day, and heard behind me a great voice, as of a trumpet, saying, I am Alpha and Omega" (Rev. 1: 10-11). The Sabbath was never spoken of as "The Lord's Day" until after the resurrection. It was on that day the most wonderful book of the Bible was given to John. The Bible begins and ends with the first day of the week.

The Martyrs Kept the first Day

There is proof that the whole church kept the first day. History records that when the first christian martyrs were tried for their faith as they came before the Roman rulers they were asked the question, "Keepest thou the Sabbath?" They answered, I am a Christian. I must keep the Lord's Day." That answer condemned them to

death, and a million of them gave up their lives for the truth. No one can take that day out of the Christian's heart.

There is overwhelming proof in the following Scriptures that that part of the law which was "a shadow of things to come" was done away, and that it includes the Sabbath of the law.

"For the priesthood being changed, there is made of necessity a change also of the law" (Heb. 7:12). Jesus is our High Priest today.

"The ministration of death, written and engraven in stones," was done away (II Cor. 3:7).

"Blotting out the handwriting of ord-"Blotting out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us, which was nailing it to His cross" (Col. 2:14).

"Let no man therefore judge you in meat, or in drink, or in respect of an holiday, or of the new moon, or of the Sabbath days: which are a shadow of things to come: but the body is of Christ." (Col. 2: 16-17).

The moral law of God is as binding upon all men today as it was when God thundered the commandments from Sinai. "For the wrath of Gcd is revealed from Heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men" (Rom. 1:18).

Their conscience also bearing witness" (Rom. 2:15). The commandments. "Thou shalt not kill; thou shalt not commit adultery; thou shalt not bear false witness" what part of the law was a shadow applied

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to the Jews only, and what laws are binding on all mankind. Their conscience also bears witness.

The New Testament does not condemn the eating of pork and other meats that were ceremonially unclean to the Jews, and were forbidden; but the Word of God has declared under the Christian era that "every creature of God is good, and nothing to be refused, if it be received with thanksgiving" (I Tim. 4:4). These are the words of the Apostle Paul; yet the "seventh-day Adventists" are trying to bind a burden upon Christians to keep the old law which was done away nearly two thousand years ago.

"Old Testament Proof Passages." The first day was God's plan from the beginning for His Church. It was the day when light was first shed on this dark earth, when God saith, "Let there be light" (Gen. 1:3). The day on which the "sheaf of the first-fruits" was offered—'the morrow after the Sabbath" (Lev. 23:10-11). Pointing in type to the day when Christ arose and became the "first-fruits of them that slept"; the day on which "two wave loaves" were offered (Lev. 23:15-17), pointing to the great outpouring of the Spirit that should come on the first day of the week (Acts 2:1).

Pentecost was the first day of the week. "And when the day of pentecost was fully comp, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from Heaven as of a rushing wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting . . . And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost." (Acts 2:1-4.) God set His marvelous seal of approval upon that day. In the saving of more souls on that day than on any other day of the week. and in spreading the Gospel over the world. and cany souls have been saved, as on' the day of pentecost, and many people healed of incurable diseases. The power of God rest today on the lives of those who keep the whole word of God, including the Lord's Pay. This ought to convince any honest soul.

The commandment, "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy," clearly refers to the first day of the week in the Christian dispensation, the present looseness regarding the Sabbath, the descration of the Lord's Day, is appalling. We, as the

children of God, have no right to lower the standard. Some will buy and sell, claiming that all days are alike. They should know better than to do this Their conscience always condemns them. We should keep the Sabbath as a day of worship and do no work therein, such as buying, selling, sewing, washing, ironing, planting or Luilding. It is a day to be wholly set apart for worship and for the winning of souls; yet we may build fires, cook necessary food, leave homes and go to a place of worship in our cars or other conveyances, carry the gospel, perform deeds of mercy such as caring for children and for the sick. We are not under the law engraven on stones, but we are under the law of love to God and man, and it is a holy law and takes every consecrated power of our being to keep it.

· Some people are zealous in keeping the seventh day in violating the first day. They seem to delight in working out in the field where they can be seen when people are going to church. They will argue in a bitter spirit. Contending for the old law, and using their influence in trying to do away with all Sunday law in our land. Like the Pharisees, they are zealous in out side forms, but devoid of the Spirit of Christ. They will reject the teaching of Jesus Christ on eternal punishment, and substitute in its place their own doctrines of soul-sleeping and the annihilation of the wicked. The essentials of salvation they leave out-being born again by the Spirit, but they lay great stress on keeping the Jewish Sabbath and abstaining from pork.

If the early Christians kept the seventh day, why did they break, bread on the first day of the week? (Acts 20:7).

If Christians are required to keep the seventh day, how are we to account for the open violation of the law by Jesus Christ, who is our example, unless by saying that He who made the law can change it, and that He did so? (Matt. 12:1-8; John 5:9-12). Here we find that He permitted the disciples to gather the ears of corn on the Sabbath and also told a man to carry his bed. Both these things were contrary to the law.

If Christians are required to keep the seventh day, wby do you depart from your dwelling on that day, when those whom the law was given were plainly commanded

not to do so? (Ex. 16:29).

If Christians are required to keep the Sabbath of the law, how are they to live in cold climates, seeing the law commanded that no fire should be kindled on that day and no work done? (Ex. 35:-3 and 20:8-1). Do you not see that the law was minde for one people (the Jews) one country, and one age (the Jew age)? Is it the duty of Christians to put to death those who desecrate the seventh day? A man for picking up sticks on the Sabbath was put to death, (Num. 15:32-36). If the penalties are abolished, then the law is also abolished.

If Christians are to keep the law of Moses, the seventh day Sabbath, why did the apostles and elders who met at Jerusalem leave it out of their address to the early churches? (Acts 15:1-29). Some had gone forth teaching that they should keep the law of Moses or they could not be saved. The apostle said, "We gave no such commandment.

If Christians are to keep the seventh day, why was it that the apostles preached the Gospel in Jerusalem, Samaria, to Cornelius, and to the Gentiles, without commanding any to keep it? Did they, under the inspiration of the Holy Ghost fail properly to instruct their converts?

Paul says the ministration of death,

written and engraven on stones, was done away (II Cor. 3). By whom was it brought back into force? If we are still under the law, the great apostle of the Gentiles stands convicted of a mistake.

Where did God ever, through any prophet or apostle, command the Gentiles to keep the law of Moses? Why did Jesus declare that all law and prophecy hang on LOVE instead of on the Sabbath on which seventh-day Adventist hang their all.

If you keep the Sabbath day because you think it was kept before the law of Moses, why do you not practice circumcision, seeing it was plainly commanded in those ages? (Gen. 17:1-14; Gal. 5:1-6).

Do you keep the Sabbath day? Do you not eat food on that day, prepared by work, cooked by fire kindled in violation of the law? (Ex. 35:1-3). Do you remain in your house during the day? (Ex. 16:29). If you do not keep the day according to the law, you do not keep it at all, if any part of the Sabbath law be done away, it is all done away. If you deny any part is done away, you condemn yourself, for you do not keep it. Great God! Saint's of God let us get our eyes off of man and begin to study our Bibles and see what the Word say's about it. Some people are apt to come to the Judgement and hear the WORD DEPART.

Now this is the word of God and God meant just what he said, if there is a never ending heaven then there is a never ending hell. For Christ said there was a Heaven and he said there was a hell.

The Doping of Conscience

A terrible phrase in one of the Epistles finds illustration in more than one direction in the circumstances of our time: "having their conscience seared with a hot iron." The marks of this condition vary in different ages and under different influences; the phrase is wide enough to cover them all. An equally terrible expression of somewhat similar import is found in another Epistle: "being past feeling" (I Tim. 4:2 and Eph. 4:19). In the homely language of our common speech, the cause of this condition might be described as the doping of conscience.

It is an appalling loss of moral sensitiveness which is suggested by these expressions. Some of its manifestations in Others are more subtle, and insufficiently recognized.

We begin with the most obvious of them all—the effect upon German mentality of a systematic hardening of the moral sense in a whole generation, in support of anti-Christian doctrines, following a loose and presumptuous handling of the Word of God and its inspired revelations.

The exact interpretation of the passage first quoted above has been the subject of some d'scussion; but the idea conveyed by our version is very generally adopted. Conscience grows utterly callous through persistent violation. Even the heathen can recognize the voice of conscience (Rom. 2:15). A "seared" conscience, "past feeling," denotes a lower spiritual condition than that of heathenism.

Another startling but suggestive interpretation is that a branded conscience is there described, as of men bearing the devil's mark of ownership on their consciences, in horrid contrast to "the marks of the Lord Jesus" which Paul bore in his body as the Lord's "bondservant"—the "scal" of the spirit of evil, in opposition to the scal of the Lord, described in II Timothy 2.29

Of the second passage, a striking rendering, which exactly represents the meaning of the Greek work used, "having got beyond the pain" of doing iniquity. How exactly this answers to the revelations regarding the officials of the monstrous concentration camps, and the unmoved de-

meanor of their instigators, and also—it is to be feared—of so many who were aware of them. They had "got beyond the pain" of such abominations; because their consciences were "seared," "doped" with Nazi doctrine, there was no reaction of horror.

Such is the extreme development of moral insensibility, the deadness of conscience which supervenes when its promptings are stifled. Such is the fearful example before the eyes of all the world, of the possibility of becoming lost to the very first principles of virtue and morality.

There can be little doubt that what has appeared in all the horror of full development in Germany is the natural fruit of all totalitarianism. Tyrannous cruelty is the characteristic sequel to the suppression of justice and liberty in human relations. If the world does not take effective warning from the extreme example of this, now fully unmasked, its future is dark indeed.

Let us now come nearer home, to an alarming phenomenon in our very midst less terrible in its present manifestations, but not less dangerous in its ultimate possibilities. The spiritual unconsciousness of the great mass of our people.

Some claim to see signs of coming a-wakening. There may be such, in isolated places, or under special circumstances. But probably, to most thoughtful observers, it appears that five years of appalling dangers and amazing deliverances have left the nation, as a whole, unshaken from its spiritual indifference either by warnings or by mercies. A generation or more of growing heedlessness to spiritual things, neglect of the Word of God and the means of grace, and worldly absorption, have inevitably led to mass spiritual insensibility.

Examples may be found everywhere. Here is a quite recent one, from a parish close to London. Early in the period of the return of prisoners of war, it was found that seven had come back to this country who have either their homes or near relatives in the place. Arrangements were made to give thanks for their return at a Sunday evening service. The families were in-

formed and invited, by personal calls or by letter and some expressions of appreciation were received. But, when the time came, it is believed that, with one doubtful exception, the only representatives of those especially concerned were a married couple who are attached members of the congregation. Would such a thing have been possible, even at the end of the last war?

Our nation thank God, retains its sense of horror at atrocities in the moral sphere; and so do many other nations. But to be lulled into a condition of spiritual unconsciousness, so as to be seemingly incapable of responding to spiritual appeals, is to be in deadly spiritual and moral peril. Spiritual coma is the natural precuror of spiritual death. Our present retention of the moral sense, in most matters, as a nation (with alarming exceptions, even so) may be traced to the presence amongst us of a large number of devoted Christian authority and power-and to the influence of earlier Christian traditions. But what people-including many in positions of will become of the rising generation, who for the most part are receiving no such Christian training and encouragement as their fathers often had?

But now we must draw the net still closer. Are the consciences of even Christian people in no danger of being lulled to sleep?

One who occupies a position of responsibility and leadership of Christian opinion made the following remark in a private letter recently: "I have often been struck with the fact," he says, "that there are "blind spots" in the lives of individual Christians. Sometimes the blind spot is in regard to money and the exercise of stewardship. In other cases it may involve a lack of conscience in business methods, and in other cases lack of consideration for members of the family, and such like."

We are ready, to condemn Germany's abondment of moral standards. We deplore, with doubtless equal sincerity, the spiritual unresponsiveness of our own people. What of ourselves? Are our consciences lulled—even "scared"—in any of the matters referred to in the letter quoted above, or in others which may apply mere specially to our own cases? Are we fully alive, as we should be, to the effect of our behavior in our homes, our business circles, our Church connections, our civic relations? And do we give as we should of our money, and our time, and our energy in Christian service?

The world has had enough to wake it up, in the events of the last few years, if its prolonged sleep has not already led to death. The Church has had enough to arouse it from the spiritual coma which has paralyzed, in so many directions, its activity effectiveness. Shall we not add that we ourselves, whoever we may be, have had enough to lead us to "examine our own selves" for any "blind spots" in our estimates and outlook, any moral or spiritual paralysis resulting from consciences not fully awake?

Building Babel Again

The tenth chapter of Genesis tells of the rise of a great empire builder by the name of Nimrod. The eleventh chapter tells of the city and tower he built by the name of Babel. Nimrod did not name the city Babel, but it was called by that name after the Lord interfered with his plans by confusing the language of the people.

Imitators of Nimrod have risen since his day from time to time. Nebuchadnezzar, in the same locality, established a great central city and set out to conquer the world. His city and empire was called Babylon,

which is the Greek for Babel, as the margin of Genesis 10:10 indicates. One day he surveyed the city from the roof of his palace and in self-exaltation exclaimed, "Is not this great Babylon that I have built?" Then, just as the prophet Daniel had warned him a year before, a voice from heaven said, "The kingdom is departed from thee." In due time, under the rule of one of his successors, Babylon was ruined and passed into history as one of the kingdoms of the past.

Alexander, called "the great," also set

out to conquer the world and bring it all under one rule. But he, too, died at the height of his human glory and history records the falling of his empire into four parts, while he died in the neighborhood of the same historic spot known as Babylon.

Another man who coveted the world as his empire was Napoleon, who disturbed the peace of Europe for some years. It is suggested by some that he planned eventually to plant the seat of his empire in the same locality as Babel and Babylon. But he came to his end and saw his empire fall to pieces.

A generation ago the Kaiser of Germany planned world conquest, but his empire It will further facititate the plan for the same idea in his head. Mussolini had similar ambitions, and Hirohito of Japan; and possibly Russia is not altogether free from similar ambitions.

The military conquest of the world seems in every case to have failed. It has taken ambitious rulers a long time to learn the lesson. Perhaps a new way of building Babel is on the way. The characteristics of Babel were one language, one speech, one purpose, and general oneness in all things. The people of that day said, "Let us make brick . . Let us build us a city and a tower. . . Let us make us a name."

If we understand the purpose of the conference of leaders in San Francisco it is to formulate a plan by which the world may become practically a unit: be governed by the same principles In another way from that of Nimrod and his successors the plan, if successful will make the world practically one kingdom. It will facilitate this plan for the same language to be spoken, or at least understood, by all nations, especially those in political positions. It will further facilitate the plan for the world to have one system of money. Eventually, as we can see from prophecy, the plan will involve the bringing of all people under one religion. And we may be sure it will not be the Christian religion, though it may bear that name. The only religion will be what may be called an "electric" religion, that is a religion that is made up by selecting certain things from all religions and attempting to harmonize them. into one system. Observe now how often we read of groups of Protestants, Catholics, and Jews conferring together. Eventually

Mohammedans will be invited to such gatherings, then will come other religious systems. Over such a conglomeration no one but a false prophet can consistently preside, and the Bible tells of a false prophet to rise in the last days.

Over the political system that will e' ventually take over the rule of the federated world will be an individual that the book of Revelation calls "the beast." He and the false prophet, also mentioned in the book of Revelation, will, work in unison to regiment the world into one system. In fact between them they will regulate all business transactions, so that, unless a man receives a certain mark he cannot buy nor sell. But to receive the mark means to worship the false system, and the Bible plainly says that those who receive the mark will have their doom with the beast and false prophet in the lake of fire. Read the book of Revelation and beinformed, especially chapters 12, 13, 14, 19, and 20. Look about you and see how things are shaping toward that condition.

But there is a way of escape for the devout and faithful Christian, Read Luke, chapter 21, especially verses 34 to 36. Can you measure up to the conditions there stated of what will characterize the persen who will be eligible to escape the things that are coming upon the earth? It is plain that no easy-going, world-conforming Christians will escape in the ranture that will mark the coming of the Lord to take away His saints. A look about us today at what are called the people of God is appalling. Scarcely one in a hundred can be distinguished from the worldling by their dress, conversation, and general deportment. Walk down a crowded street and try to pick out the people that have some appearance of being genuine Christians and see how few have any expression on their faces that indicate they might be Christiens. On the other hand see how blatantly many sinners are in their worldliness. It is passing strange that the worldlings are not ashamed of their worldliness, but its seems sometimes that professing Christians are ashamed of dress and manners that might distinguish them as Christians. It sometimes looks as though the multitude of Christians purposely disguise their identity under worldly forms. To be ashamed of Christ in this world means that He will be ashamed of us later on.

The word of Revelation concerning the

people of God and Babylon is, "Come out of her. My people." (Rev. 18:4).

The Voice of Experience

Ecclesiastes 12:13, "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God and keep his commandments; for this is the whole duty of man."

I have taken this subject from the name of a popular radio program because 1 feel that it is a message or a subject that was fulfilled in the life of a man presented in the Book of Ecclesiastes. The purpose of the "Preacher" in this book is perhaps the same as "The Voice of Experience" thats heard over the radio, which endeavors to help solve the problems that bring heartaches, strife, and separation to thousands and thousands of people.

The older we get, the wiser we become. EXPERIENCE IS THE BEST TEACHER We learn many things through experience that parents, schools or books will never teach us. We can have a good theory on paper, but is it practical? A farmer will tell you that years of experience has taught him many things that books and schools never mentioned. The mechanic, the storeclerk, the driver, the Christian and even the preacher, will tell you the same thing.

I heard my father tell one time of a tady that was just learning to drive. On a certain day in a down-town section of a targe city, she became involved in a serious traffic jam. The traffic cop, who was in charge of that intersection, approached her car and said., "Lady, why don't you use your noodle?" Frantically she looked the dash board over and said. "I didn't know there was one on here." The brief experience this lady had with a car displayed her ignorance.

EXPERIENCE SPEAKS

It tells us that foolishness does not pay. Experience tells us that crime and disobedience does not pay. It shows us that lost opportunities are lost forever. "Oh, if I had known then what I know now!" There-

fore experience speaks; it tells the truth. We cannot slight nor laugh at the best teacher in the world, outside of God.

THE MESSAGE

In the Book of Ecclesiastes we have the written experience; the living experience of one of the greatest men that ever lived. Outside of Christ, Solomon was the wisest man that ever lived. His voice we must listen to, His experience we must note.

A. Why should we listen to him? First of all we will notice who he was..

- 1. He was a man of goodly heritage. The Son of David. It must have been a great honor to have been the son of a man that was called 'The man after God's own heart.'. We think of the good education, the prayers, the instructions that his father gave him. 1 K, 2:1.
- 2. Solomon was a man of unusal wisdom and riches. Lavid his father had said, "Thou art a wise man" because of the wish that Solomon made. God gave him a wise and understanding heart, so that there was none like him before or after. Also blessed him with great riches and honour.
- 3. He was a man of Supreme Importance. King of Jerusalem, successor to his father's throne. In that position he had dignity and power.
- B. This man is "The Voice of Experience." Was once the man of God, then became the man of the world. Chose a heathen king's daughter for his wife, introduced the worship of false gods, loved many strange women. All of this lead to his down-fall, the bitterness and disappointment that he reaped. He is qualified to give advice, instructions, and warnings. He experienced and has tried the World. Here is what life in all of its fullness. Has tried God, he says, "Behold All is Vanity." Ecc. 1-2.

SOLOMON'S EXPERIENCE

In chapter one and two, he gives us the search of the natural or worldly man for satisfaction and happiness in the world.

A. First of all in chapter 1:13, he sought for happiness in WISDOM. Because of being king, his opportunity was great. He sought for it with all of his heart-everything that was done under the sun. It might have been philosophy, mathematics, husbandry or trade. But this will never give the peace and joy that Christ can give. Wisdom will bring grief and increased Spirituality. It cannot be done for the Bible tells us that its "By My Spirit." We can gain all the knowledge in the world and still be foolish in God's sight. Solomon said, "All is vanity, even wisdom for it will not satisfy.

B. Next he sought for happiness in PLEASURE, chapter 2:1. He became a pheasure-seeker. THE WORLD is full of them today, Running to the Movie houses, taverns, dances, always trying to find a little enjoyment. But listen friends, this will only lead to ruin, blasted hopes, heart aches, broken homes, and death. You may enjoy the "pleasures of sin" but they only hast for "a season." Again Solomon said, "it is vanity."

C. Then he went a step further and gave himself to DRINK. How often this is the case. Sin is progressive for it spreads, communicates, always leaves its mark "Eat, drink, and it merry for tomorrow we die." Yes, you will die but it will be ETERNAL FEATH.

D. After that he made great works, built houses, planted vineyards, as chapter 2, vs. 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 tell us. Yet with all this he tells us that "All is vanity." Can you enjoy your wisdom, your pleasures, your drinks, your material things? Is the 8 still an aching void in your heart? Remember, you can find happiness only in Christ Jesus.

THE VOICE

Now we come to the Voice that warns us to "Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth, while the evil days come not, nor the years draw nigh, when thou shalt say, I have no pleasure in them." chapter 12:1.

A. The Youth to Remember: We as young people usually flatter ourselves with great expectations of things in the future. The common saying is, "I want to have my fling while I am still young" But let me exhort you to believe those that have tried that very thing and now are trying to tell others of the bitter fruits of a life of sin and districtionee to God. Young people urge for the lave of mirth, the indulgence of sensual pieasures, but be not deceived by this vanity.

B. Evil days are coming; are already with us, sickness and death. Old age comes, strong men become weak, teeth disappear, eyes grow dim. When our bodies become leaded with infirmities we "shall have no pleasures in the things of God." The Voice warns us that the time to seek the Lord is in our youth.

C. The Sum of it all, After Solomon had reviewed his life from beginning to end, he summed up his message with these words, "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter." Examine your life. Weigh your so-called good times, parties, friends. Are they worth more than your own soul? Matt. 16:26 (R. V.) "For what shall a man be profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and forfeit his life? or what shall a man give in exchange for his life?" Rom. 6:23, "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."

1. Fear God and keep his commandments."
2. "For he shall bring everything into judgment, every secret thing, whether it be good or whether it be evil."

"There's a great day coming, a great day coming. There's a great day coming by and by; When the saints and the sinners shall be parted right and left, Are you ready for that day to come?

There's a bright day coming, a bright day coming by and by, but its brightness shall only come to them that love the Lord.

There's a sad day coming, a sad day coming,

There's a sad day coming by and by; When the sinner shall hear his doom, "depart, I know ye not" Are you ready for that day to come? Ready for the Judgenent Pay?"

"A GIRL whose sense of God is dulled by indifferent parents; a youth frustrated by a disordered, abnormal age; a home imperiled by too much quick money and parents working on odd and disrupting shifts: these are wounds that threaten people here at home as certainly as German shells and Japanese bullets threatened our boys," says Bishop Paul B. Kern of Nashville Tenn.

HITLER has never yet been found dead or alive. If never found he is likely to become the hero in a myth to inspire the younger generation of Germans, trained to worship him, to another attempt to rule the world, it is feared.

NEGLECTED CHILDREN—Three children aged 1, 2 and 5 were found in a Chicago home by police while their parents were away on a drinking spree. The police took them to an orphanage and the parents went before the judge to give account of their doings.

A STRANGE MUDDLE—A dairy farmer recently applied for work in a defense industry. He was tentatively accepted for the position, but later was rejected, when it was found that he had sixteen cows "dependent on him." He was told to go back to the farm and take care of the cows. A few hours after his dismissal, a middleaged mother was given the position. It seemed not to matter that she had six children at home "dependent on her." I am certain that our people will rejoice to know of the completion of a deal for a nice piece of property, only a half block from the administration building, which is very adaptable to the service of an institution like ours. The approach to the acquiring of this property was made last winter when Mrs. Thomas F. Swords granted an option to the college, without financial consideration, to buy her home for the sum of \$12,287. A contingency was revealed, however, which would not allow the Board of Education of the National Association to invest in additional property in excess of the original purchase; at which time Mrs. Swords graviously continued the option on a gratis basis.

Total \$1,347.74

On September 18, 1945, the Board of Education and the Board of incorporators of the college were called into joint session, at which time the authorized transferral of all assets was completed, and the full responsibility of the direction of the institution was accepted by the Board of Trustees; namely: Henry Melvin, James F. Miller, Melvin Bingham, J. L. Welch, R. B. Spencer, F. B. Cherry, K. V. Shutes, Ralph Lightsey, and J. R. Davidson. In this first session of the Board of Trustees of the College an offer was made to Mrs. Swords for her property in the amount of \$10,000. The responsibility of approaching Mrs. Swords with the proposition was left in the hands of the Business Manager; and the following day, accompanied by the President of the school, Reverand L. R. Ennis, the proposal was presented in proper written form. But Mrs. Swords outright refused the offer of \$10,000 and returned the proposal to me. After further discussion, however, Mrs. Swords agreed that she would sell for \$11,000; but the Board had only authorized the offer of \$10,000-no more, no less. Consultations between Brother Ennis and me together with other interested friends gave rise to the suggestion that Mrs. Swords might compromise her offer further by accepting the sum of \$500 in cash from outside individuals, and with the further consideration of free rental on the property until January 1, 1946. It was agreed that this offer be submitted to Mrs. Swords, with the understanding that the Board of Trustees should be called upon by correspondence to certify to their individual approval of the proposed plan by which the contingency might be removed. Being desirous that nothing be done without full authority from the Board, the following communication was mailed to each member, was duly signed by each member, and returned to the office:

"I understand that the amount of \$500 will be paid by interested friends of the college, and that none of the amount exclusive of the purchase price of \$10,000 will be paid out of the treasury of the Bible College."

Upon a one hundred per cent approval of the proposed procedure, negotiations were completed, and at this time the deed and guarantee of title are in the safe in the college office.

The acquiring of this most desirable piece of property for the use of the institution in its expansion was made possible by the generosity of Reverand J. P. Barrow, Dean of the Institution, who donated \$100 of the extra \$500 offered as inducement to the owner to sell for \$10,000; and Reverand L. R. Ennis, who donated the additional \$400 by drawing on the treasury of the college and having the account charged against his salary.

It should be of interest to our people to have the facts brought to them of the generosity of these two men who are laboring for your institution in their gifts of the past. It was hardly a year ago when Brother Barrow made a gift of \$200 to the treasury, and has systesatically given as much as \$10 each month since his services began with the college. It will be remembered, I am sure, the contribution which Brother Ennis made even before the opening of the Association in directing the Board of Education of the National Association in a campaign for the raising of the foundation money with which to pay for the property which was acquired September 24, 1941, All indebtedness having been retired and the school officially opened in the fall of 1942, Brother Ennis began donating systematically to the school in monthly gifts and has continued throughout the history of the college.

Surely, the hearts of our people will be tuned to thanksgiving to our God for these who have turned aside from their normal courses of life to dedicate themselves to the sercice of this institution. Our people should know that Brother Ennis came to the school at considerable sacrifice in the amount of money received each month, saying nothing of the sacrifice he has been called upon to make relative to the leaving of his family behind.

I feel that the acquiring of this additional piece of property together with the liberal gifts of these brethern should challenge our people to imsediately get into action in the raising of the \$100,000 for the expansion of this institution. It should be remembered that there will be some additional expenses in arranging and improving the additional property acquired for use by the institution; therefore, immediate response from every direction py the different states in raising their quota of the proposed \$100,00 is in order. Any information or materials needed for executing the will of the National Association in raising these quotas will be promptly mailed to anyone who will write for the same.

A GREAT TASK FOR A GREAT GROUP

Stewardship Department Plans, Mrs. J. E. Frazier, fourth vice president for 1945.

Sometimes as I had tried to pray for them I thought of what a great group they are— all the stewardship chairman, state, district, and local. I fancied what it would be like if we all could come together for one meeting. And then, on one morning of wishful thinking in the Land of Vision, it came to pass. There they were, not one state massing. My heart was thrilled! Then the Chairman of that Committee that made our Plan of work for 1946 said to me: "You may speak to them four minutes. Give them helpful suggestions." Carefully and prayerfully were the words chosen. God make them helpful!

My Co-Laborers, you are a great group—great not only in number, but great because of the exceeding great re-ponsibility that is yours to help to cultivate. "The grace of giving in our churches." Now this "grace of giving" is of vital importance for two reasons: First, for the soul-welfare of our own people; and second, because, according to His own plan the progress of His Kingdom depends on the tithes and offerings of God's people. Thus directly by teaching and indirectly through the resultant increase in gifts, you are helping to carry out the "Great Commission," doing immortal work.

We soon discover that this task of stewardship education requires superhuman help. Therefore, prayer is our first necessity. The second necessity is study if we expect to be "approved workman" in God's sight and workman who will be equipped to attempt for God what He has commanded all His people to do-go, preach, TEACHthat all the kingdoms of the earth may know that He is the Lord, and even He only. (Isa. 37:20.) Let no stewardship chairman say that she does not know what are her duties. The W. N. A. C. has anticipated our need and provided an invaluable helper-the Year Book of Programs which contains a plan of work for our department explained in detail and also suggestions and ideas galore for our information and inspiration. But most of all for our working. See pages 11, 16, 19, 22, 31, 36, 39-42, 44-48, in the 1945 Year Book, Read the entire book to be sure but STUDY until you really know that part which pertains to your own task. Turn first to the Convention Plan of Work. Under these 'Plans' (Part IV, page II) please note prayerfully and learn every suggested way by which we seek to promote stewardship. Helping to carry out these plans constitute your duty. For this purpose were you chosen as chairman. When you have done that, then your plans may be worked in harmony with these adopted plans. We need to catch a new the meaning of cooperation in God's program for world redemptin.

In our Year Book not only are stewardship plans outlined but also the most important ones are discussed each on a full page (19, 21, 22-24, 31-36, 39-42, 44-48). The material on these pages could be used for some excelent short speeches before Sunday School assemblies, Leagues, and Auxiliary meetings, or for stewardship programs on days that your church does not have regular church services. In addition special helps may be had from your National Stewardship Department. Therefore, we are without excuse we remain unifromed.

But to know and to pray will avail little unless we put in a third most important thing— HARD WORK. So, call together your Auxiliary President, the mission chairman, and the second Vice President who has the responsibility of leading the young people of your church. Discuss these plans with them. Decide definitely which of the plans you will undertake for the year. Never leave out plans "F" (Stewardship cducation of our Young People), and plan "J" (Annual Church Stewardship Night).

"The cause I knew not I searched out" (Job 29:16), wrote the patriarch Job as he recommended the motives which had governed his service for God. We must study humanity. We must study God's financial plan. What people believe shapes their actions. In the hard school of suffering and sorrow being conducted in almost every land on the globe today except our dear land, we are learning deep lessons of responsibility for a world without Christ and His peace. How long (oh, how long, Dear Jesus, will you permit this beautiful homeland of ours to rob Thee and sin against Thee in stewardship, is my almost daily exclamation of amazement as I talk to returning soldier boys, and to mothers of already sacrificed sons and daughters whose minds are, it seems on everything but sending the only Gospel that will save this world and bring real lasting peace. What, I ask over and over as I look at these boys and their wives and children, is America gaining if she defeats all the "isms" of the earth, yet loses her own soul and fails to be faithful in her stewardship of the Gospel which is solely responsible for her own

security and safety amid all the troubled and torn up countries of the earth?

We hear and read much about the postwar world. To lead the world after the war into peace, we must prepare our hearts and minds for that leadership. Are we preparing ours? Preparation is hard workstudying, praying, working long hours tirelessly, regularly, systematically at assigned plans. Today as no other member of our auxiliary, the stewardship chairman is a kry person in world affairs. Do you believe this with me? Then do all in your power to lead those of your church auxiliary in a wider search beyond the stewardship class study by circulating many more books from the Reading Course (See the suggested books page 125). In this list is not sufficient, write your national stewardship chairman for more. AND YE SHALL FIND."

An Interrogation mark is not half so dangerous in your thinking as a period. Perhaps the greatest contribution which study classes can make to the people who attend them, is to start them on a splendid spiritual quest-to injuct an interrogation mark into their thinking. Such teaching will lead to the practice of stewardship among our people. And CHRISTIAN STE-WARDSHIP UNDERSTOOD and practiced will save our people from the deadly sin of covetousness. The individual who pratices Christian stewardship will have the right attitude toward his money, his fellowman, and above all the right attitude toward God and His program of world redemption.

Christian stewardship should be taught all the year in every department of the church. The stewardship teachings and application in the Sunday School Lessons and League Programs should be constantly pointed out and enforced. This should be done not only for Jesus' sake, but also for the good of our people themselves.

The happiest and most useful Christians accept acknowledge, and administer their stewardship. They set apart for the Lord's work at least a tenth of their income-little or much as an expression of their stewardship. Most of these people were taught to do this when they were children. We can't begin too soon to stress this important Bible Doctrine. If then the state stewardship chairman for 1946 will work tirelessly

at our shared task, planning excellently their work, they in turn will lead district and local chairman to work tirelessly these stewardship plans. Surely together laboring in His strength to provide stewardship enthusiasm and information, our people, and especially our young people, will feel a passion to create a world in His likeness and will find in the business of the King a dominant ideal, a cause to which to give themselves with unlimited loyalty.

An outline of Stewardship Plans which you are prayerfully urged to attempt for 1946 will be found in the Guide Book for Auxiliary Workers. This book is to be on sale sometime in September. Watch our church papers for announcements relative to our literature needs for 1946. Due to lack of space these plans can not be printed here.

All of the suggested plans may appear to be perfectly obvious and at first glance, unimportant. However, have we not found that attention to details is often the secret of major altainments? Someone said: "Trifles make perfection, but perfection is no trifle,!"

Christ calls, "FOLLOW ME," and leads cn. Surely as mothers and stewardship chairman we must not fail Christ in giving Christian Stewardship Education to our people and most especially to our Young People.

And I said: "NEITHER WILL I OFFER ... UNTO THE LORD MY GOD ... THAT WHICH DOTH COST ME NOTHING." (II Samuel 24:24).

The safety of our nation is now as always in obedience to God's will in all things so we do well to assure our growing tomorrow that the "LOVE OF MONEY" is still "THE ROOT OF ALL EVIL" and that honest tithing and straight-forward stewardship turn individual and thereby nations from wickedness toward right-cousness and that "THE FRUIT CIVE OF RIGHTEOUSNESS SHALL BE PLACE."
