

"What is that in thine hand?" Exodus 4:2. The third chapter deals with the burning bush, and the conversation God had there with Moses. After telling Moses how He had seen the afflictions of the people of Israel, and promising deliverance, God said, "come now therefore, and I will send thee unto Pharoah, that thou mayest bring forth my people, the children of Israel out of Egypt," Moses got scared. Oh! how many blessings we miss by being afraid. How terrible the penalty if we do not conquor fear. The right kind of fear is pleasing to God. The fear of God means that "reverance for God leads to obedience," this is a Godly fear. God said, we are told by Job 28:28, "And unto man he said, Behold, the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom." Prov. 1:7 tells us, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge." Prov. 9:10 says it is the beginning of wisdom. But the fear of the world, the wise man said, "The fear of man bringeth a snare" (or trap), Prov. 29:25. The Lord can give us victory over fear Isaiah tells us in 13:3.
