





And when 51 more years had passed, we arrived at 1952 A.D., and were notified that a revision of both the American Standard Version and the King James Version had been made, and they had a new book they were calling the Revised Standard Version.

The Revised Standard Version has an introductory they call a Preface. From this we read (to this effect), "The Revised Standard Version is a revision of the American Standard Version of 1901, which was a revision of the King James Version of 1611" But the fact is that the American Standard Version and the King James Version were both revised, especially the 1611 version.

According to this Preface, the King James Version was itself a revision rather than a translation. Then they peint to William Tyndale of 1525, the Great Bible of 1539, the Geneva Bible of 1560, the Bishop's Bible of 1568, and the Latin Vulgate by Roman Catholic scholars of 1582, and then affirmed that the translators of the King James Version "took into account all of these preceding versions."
