The statement is in perfect harmony with Genesis 1: 26, 27; 2:7, and 5:1, 2. The objection is raised by eighth day teachers that there had to be other people on the earth for Cain to find a wife and the Scripture quoted for proof of this statement as follows: "And Cain went out from the presence of the Lord and dwelt in the land of Nod, on the East of Eden. And Cain knew his wife and she conceived and bare Enoch." Gen. 4:16, 17.
