# **Editorial**

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# AN OPEN LETTER TO LAYMEN

Our pastor recently preached on the passage of scripture found in Galations 1: 6-24 and exhorted us as to our responsibility as laymen in keeping the preaching of the Word pure. This message has caused me to look at our own demonination and its lay members and it prompted me to write this article. Is it possible that our ministers would preach a gospel other than that which is in the Word of God? I say it is possible! This is where our responsibility as laymen comes in, as found in Gal. 1: 8, and the Apostle Paul thought it was important enough to repeat it again in verse 9.

Do we as Free Will Baptists have any ties with the liberal churches of our day? Sorry to say, I feel in some areas we do. What about co-operative evangelism? What about Ministerial Alliances which are composed mostly of liberal ministers and usually are under their control? What about some of the so-called evangelical movements, which are becoming more liberal from day to day? The Apostle Paul made it rather plain in II Cor. 6: 14-18 what he thought about such things as this and we as Free Will Baptists don't exclude this passage of Scripture from our Bibles, so I don't think we should exclude it from our practices. In our Free Will Baptist Treatise we accept the Word of God as the only sufficient rule of faith and practice, so I think we should do as the Word

Concerning the preaching of the Gospel, the danger of our ministers not proclaiming the true Word from the pulpits is of grave importance in keeping our demonination fundamental. Does your pastor preach a social gospel that pleases men? If he does, Paul tells us in Gal. 1: 10 that he's not a servant of Christ. Your pastor is not to compromise and allow unholy living among the flock, over which the Holy Ghost hath made him overseer. Does your minister base his message on God's Word or by quoting some liberal religious leader of our day? Does his message consist of what he has heard some radio speaker such as Herbert W. Armstrong say, what he has read in

some commentary or magazine published by liberals under the name of Christianity, or does his message consist of Biblical truths which he has received by prayer and Bible study and by the revelation of Jesus Christ? (Gal. 1: 12; II Tim. 2: 15) I hope you don't get the idea that I think radio programs and commentaries are all bad, as I think there are some very good ones, with the exception of the above type, and I think the good programs and literature deserve our prayer and cooperation.

I read a book recently by J. Gresham entitled "Christianity Machen, Liberalism," a book which I think all laymen and ministers of our Free Will Baptist denomination should read. It said the following concerning liberalism and what our attitude should be toward Christian education: "Modern liberalism in the church, whatever judgement may be passed upon it, is at any rate no longer an academic matter. It is no longer a matter merely of theological seminaries or universities. On the contrary its attack upon the fundamentals of Christian faith is being carried on vigorously by Sunday School 'lesson helps', by the pulpit, and by the religious press. If such an attack be unjustified, the remedy is not to be found, as some devout persons have suggested, in the abolition of theological seminaries, or the abandonment of scientific theology, but rather a more earnest search after truth and a more loyal devotion ot it when once it is found." I might add here that the danger of a lack of education is very real to the laymen as well as the ministers concerning the fundamentals of Christianity, in that we might guard against being brain-washed into liberalism without realizing it.

I will say in closing, if you love your denomination you will not allow us to drift into liberalism. Some of the present liberal churches a decade agowere Biblebelieving churches. Who is responsible for them being liberal today, the ministers or laymen? Read Gal. 1: 6-24 again and you'll see who is to blame.

The past few months have been very busy for us, as usual. November 20 is a holiday here, so the banks were closed. On this night the Tampico mission was robbed. Since the money could not be deposited in the bank, everything was lost. The league money, the church tithes, and the money that Arthur had left on November 19 to pay the lawyer to fix the deed on the property. Besides this, all the personal things of our pastor and family were stolen. We do not know what was done to the pastor and family, but they did not wake up until amost noon the next day, and then to find everything gone. The money alone was a little over \$100.00 American dollars. Therefore, Arthur has had to make several trips there, in fact he is gone now to take them some food, clothing and etc., that has been given them. Remember them in prayer, they were barely getting started and this was quite a shock,

My mother is here visiting us, it is the first time in four years. She will only be here about two weeks, so the children are really enjoying Grandma.

Now I come to the part of the letter where words seem so useless. It seems that the right words just don't come. I cannot tell you how we felt this month when we received our account sheet from the office in Nashville. I looked at it and could not hold back the tears of joy. You are indeed a wonderful people. Your response to our need was a real answer to prayer. For the past months our monthly income had been an average of about \$600.00, and it takes \$800.00 to cover present expenses. But we

felt you did not know the need, and once you did, God would speak to your hearts and you would respond. With so many needs we feel sure it was a real sacrifice to give. The work here belongs to God and I know you truly love Him and want to see the work continue. Many of you have been faithful all through the years. We have begun our tenth year of ministry here in Mexico. The task has just begun. It is not the amount that counts, but the faithfulness. May He repay you a hundred fold. We cannot repay you. We can only say "THANKS" and try in our weak way to be a good and faithful servant to God, and your Free Will Baptist representative in Mexico.

I have a very special praise item this month. I have just undergone another series of tests, and for the first time since August 1963, all tests came out negative. This is truly a miracle. My doctor had told me I had a cronic case of amibas. So we do truly praise God for these results. We want you to join with us in praising God for this. After being sick so long, even I, sometimes feel it cannot be true that I feel so well and can do all that I have to do.

Please accept our thanks for your prayers, and your financial support during this past year. There is much to be done and so little time to work. Remember the prayer requests that we have given from time to time. God bless you is our prayer.

### Purpose Of Current Issue

To erect new Oklahoma Bible College campus buildings: two dormitories including space for residence for  $60\ \text{men}$  and  $60\ \text{women}$  students.

### Security

These are first mortgage bonds. The land, new construction, and equipment will be valued at \$450,000.00. Besides the assets listed in the mortgage, the school also has other assets of an estimated value near \$250,000.00.

### Description Of Bonds

Bearer bonds with interest payable at six per cent every six months by coupon. Denominations are \$250, \$500, and \$1,000.

### **Available Maturities**

Bonds are available in the various denominations to mature annually from one to four-teen years. The first bonds mature in January, 1969; the last in July, 1982.

### What Is An Investment Program?

\*\*\*Oklahoma Bible College investment bonds are interest bearing certificates issued by the College as a corporation, which binds it to pay a stated sum of money on or before the appointed time.

\*\*\*They are bearer bonds, which means that the depository agent will pay to the person who presents the certificate at its appointed time the stated amount. No name or names appear on the bond to show its ownership. However, registration can be secured.

\*\*\*The investment bonds are negotiable instruments and may be sold, traded, given away or deposited as collateral by the possessor without permission or consent of the College.

\*\*\*The College will repay the face value of the bond in its stated maturity. However, it reserves the right to repay the face value of the bond at any prior interest-paying period regardless of the stated date of maturity. Interest will be paid to the bondholder until the interest date on which the bond has been called in for payment.

### Financing Of Bonds

Those who have banking arrangements and bank credit already established may borrow from their own bank. Those who wish to avail themselves of the lending arrangements made with the Capitol Hill State Bank of Oklahoma City may contact one of our agents. Below is a loan pay-back schedule applicable to borrowing for the purchase of your College bond at Capitol Hill State Bank.

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# ONE THING I DO

Phillipians 3: 13-14

Introduction: There are three parts to consider about this One Thing:

1. I forget the ground I have covered in the race: (I Cor. 9: 24-27). We need to forget about the mistakes we have made in the past. Every man that has ever lived, including the great evangelist Paul, has looked back over his life at one point or another, and wished for the opportunity to live his life over again. There are mistakes and fallacies in our lives we wish we could change. If it were possible for us, with our limited knowledge and power, to be able to undo all the wrongful things we have done, or recall all the hateful words we have spoken, I'm sure that all of us would be glad to set these things straight.

There is implanted within the heart of every child of God that ability to be sorry for our past acts of disobedience unto God, and our sinful attitudes one toward another. This quality in man is admirable in the sight of God. It is a necessity that we look back over our lives and recognize where we have failed God. Because, in recognizing our weaknesses, we can more thoroughly realize our total dependence upon God.

The Text in question does not imply that we should not take inventory of our past lives. On the contrary, in verses 4-7 of this same chapter, Paul reflects back over his own life, and dwells upon those things that once were of great importance to him. He points out, he has been victorious over these things through his relationship with Christ. Paul's past life was the greatest, positive, proof of his personal experience with Jesus Christ. A man who once had been a proud, stiffnecked Pharisee was now an humble Apostle of the Lord.

The Lesson that must be learned here is: Even though we realize we have failed God in the past, we should not allow those failures to impair the work that we are presently doing for Him.

We all have made mistakes, but God forbid that those same mistakes should hamper us from being a successful Christian in the future.

2. I reach forth to that which is before me in the race: I think here it might be well for us to remember one of "Aesop's Fables" concerning the race between the "Tortoise and the Hare". The Hare was overconfident. He spent too much of his time thinking back on the many races that he had already won, and how easily it would be to win this one also. Because of his overconfidence, he went to sleep on the job. The Tortoise, on the other hand, was interested only in the race he was running at this particular time. He didn't worry that he was "Four Miles" behind. He just kept plodding onward one step at a time. And eventually, this perseverance won for him the race.

We are running a race of great importance. It is a matter of life or death. The most important moment of our lives is not past or present, but "Now". May God help us to realize the importance of this race we are running, and may He give us the courage and conviction to run it with confidence and assurance. (Hebrews 12: 1-2)

Perhaps sometimes, we feel we are running a little behind, as we observe the World with all its pomp, glitter, and glory. But remember, when Jesus comes, they like the Hare are going to be found sleeping; we shall pass them by, and receive our reward in the presence of God and his Holy Angels. This alone should encourage us to keep plodding onward.

3. I press toward the mark for the Prize: That is, I pursue the white line in the Stadium upon which all runners must keep their eyes fixed, lest I be disqualified for the prize. "Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain." (I Cor. 9: 24)

The main thought suggested here is:

no one receives a prize until they have first competed in the race. The fastest runner in the world cannot stand on the sidelines, refuse to run, and then expect the judge to award him a prize. He must prove himself qualified to have the prize by his ability in the race itself.

Unfortunately, we have too many Christians???? who are only spectators. They have no desire, or make no effort to get into the race, yet they expect God to award them the prize of eternal life, right along with those who have run faithfully in the race. Beloved, eternal life doesn't come that easily. It takes some concentrated effort on our part to get into the kingdom of God. (Matt. 7: 21-23) (Luke 13: 24). I am not suggesting that we can work our way into the Kingdom of Heaven. However, I am advocating complete surrender, obedience, and loyalty to His Word. "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross DAILY, and follow me."

The prize is within easy reach of all of us. The race has been going on for nearly 2,000 years. It's not too late for you to get in if you really want to. Soon the race is going to be over for most of us. So, while we have the opportunity, let us run it to the best of our ability, and through our running, may we glorify the name of Jesus Christ.

The prize is worth having. It's worth more than anything else in the world. An eternal prize that grows sweeter and more precious as each lap of the race is completed. And someday, when we break the tape at the end of this great race, and the Judge awards us our Trophy, our hearts will thrill with pride, because we have been a part of the greatest team that ever competed. And most of all, we will give eternal priase to our Coach, the Lord Jesus Christ, Who gave us the ability and the incentive to be a winner.

### MOURNING THAT **BRINGS HAPPINESS**

"Blessed are they that mourn, for they shall be comforted." Matt. 5: 4.

The world laughs at this idea. The world has an entirely different philosophy—have a good time, forget your troubles, enjoy yourself, it's later than you think, wear a smile, take a tranquilizer, have a ball, get drunk, anything to forget the mess we're in. Jesus said, "Blessed are they that mourn ... " Other theorys have come and gone but the Bible still says "Blessed are they that mourn." Now this doesn't mean that Christians are not to laugh, you have seen those seemingly pious people who never smile and have a knack for making people miserable. The Christian is to be happy, after all, Jesus said, "Blessed (happy) are they that mourn."

One of the great reasons for the weakness of the church today is a defective sense of sin, and a defective doctrine of sin. Because of this defect we fail to have the proper attitude toward sin. We don't see sin in the same light that God sees it. Notice that we must look at these beatitudes in a negative way before looking at them from a positive view; we must be poor in spirit before we can be filled with the Holy Spirit; we must be convicted before we can be converted.

I am told that there are three kinds of mourning.

1. Sinful mourning: This is an enemy to blessedness. The sorrow of the world over, their conditions, both spiritual and temperal, yet an unwillingness to turn to God. We hear this kind of mourning all around us, "What is this world coming to?"

2. Natural mourning: A state of mourning over our personal, physical, or financial condition. We are all prone to do this and I suppose there is nothing sinfully wrong with it, although it doesn't

3. Gracious mourning: Penitential mourning for our sins. This is Godly sorrow. This also involves sympathetic mourning

for the affliction of others.

Now this gracious mourning is the type Jesus was talking about. Many people look at some happy Christian and say "I want to be like that," but when you begin to talk about their sins and the need to repent they rebel. They want to be blessed or happy, but they don't want to give up their sins or be convicted of them. This is the reason that many spend thousands of dollars to confer with psychiatrist, attempting to rid themselves of the guilt they have, in order to be able to enjoy life. But we are sinners, and we must be convicted of sin and weep and mourn for them before we can be converted from them.

We are to be like Paul when he said, "We that are in this tabernacle do groan, being burdened." II Cor. 5: 4.

1. We must mourn because we are so unworthy, so weak, so wretched.

2. We must mourn for our sin. Self examinations are good Page 10

Pause at the end of the day and examine yourself. for us. What have you done, said, thought?

3. We must mourn because of the sins of others. Jerimiah was known as the weeping prophet. He wept because of the sins of his people. He preached to them and they paid no attention. In Jerimiah 18: 18 we find that they even agreed among themselves to "not give heed to any of his words." It is such a heartbreaking thing to preach and admonish and still see people harboring sins, using foul language, continuing bad habits, failing to obey God's word, rebelling against God's plan of stewardship.


Look around you today and see this sick world. Full of sin and vice. Sick even unto death. Just this last month a young man was murdered near Metropolitan College here in Kansas City because he tried to rescue a young school teacher from the hands of hoodlums. A young man in Nebraska, in the top ten percent of his college class, a good athelete, well-liked by everyone, suddenly went bad and killed three people and robbed a bank. A young man killed six young ladies in a beauty shop in order to get publicity. Sin caused the murderer of President Kennedy to pull the trigger. It was sin that brought about the murder of 6 million Jews in World War II. The Christian sees all this sickness and mourns because he has the answer if people would only listen. This is gracious mourning.

When Jesus looked down on Jerusalem from the mount he saw what sin had done to it. Jerusalem had once been the Hill of Zion, the home of David, God's annointed place, a paradise among nations, but sin had brought ruin, desertion, destruction, chaos and sorrow. They were slaves now, captives to every wind of political change. Jesus wept and cried, "O Jerusalem, how oft would I have gathered you together as a hen gathers her chicks, but you would not."

The sinner looks at all this sadness, war, sickness and death, and says, "Give me another beer, show me a funny picture, tell me a funny joke, let us forget the world and its condition."

Jesus said, "Blessed is the man that mourns." He is sorrowful for his condition and is repenting. He is happy because his sins are forgiven. The man who mourns because of sin is going to be armed against the many temptations that come with vain laughter and pleasure. 'They shall be comforted.' Maybe not here, but in heaven all tears shall be wiped from our eyes. The scripture says that "he that goeth forth weeping bearing precious seed shall doubtless come again rejoicing bringing his sheaves with him." This is something to be happy about. The Christian looks at the world and is sad, but immediately he becomes happy because he remembers that there is a better day coming. This is a man who is serious about sin, but has a joy unspeakable and full of glory. "He shall be comforted."

We are to have a study course the 13th and 14th of January.



The prophets of old had a very prominent place in the Word of God, their messages were pointed and powerful; preached without fear or favour. And the Word of God reveals the tragedy of a great and powerful nation that refused to heed the voice of God through his prophets.

ISRAEL AS A NATION: . . . . failed to heed the message of God's prophets and after the long suffering and patience Page 12

of a just and merciful God, judgment and captivity came.

My humble prayer is that our beloved America will learn a lesson by observation rather than by experience.

The Bible says, in Rom. 15: 4: "For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope."

GOD'S CHOSEN PEOPLE - Israel forgot God after a great deliverance and God did not spare his judgment. The Bible says in Rom. 11: 21 "For if God spared not the natural branches, take heed lest he also spare not thee."

ISRAEL'S DELIVERANCE - God's chosen people experienced a great and miraculous deliverance by the hand of God while down in Egypt.

But notice that deliverance did not come until God's people cried out by reason of their bondage . . .(Ex. 2: 23-25) "And it came to pass in process of time, that the king of Egypt died: and the children of Israel sighed by reason of the bondage, and they cried, and their cry came up unto God by reason of the bondage. And God heard their groaning, and God remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob. And God looked upon the children of Israel, and God had respect unto them." Thank God, our heavenly Father, is always listening for his people to call to Him. This is a most comforting assurance in a day of trouble such as is upon us as a nation.

BURDEN PRAYING - The lack of agonizing prayer among the people of God leaves many in bondage to Satan and his forces. This is one of the main reasons why revival tarries. Christian friend, how long has it been since you wrestled with the Lord in prayer? How long has it been since you stole away somewhere and had your eyes washed with tears because of a lost loved one? How long has it been since you poured out your heart in prayer to God for revival in your own heart and in your church? How long has it been since you held your pastor up to the throne of God in prayer and prayed that God would make him a flame of fire in the pulpit and that conviction would fall on saint and sinner alike?

BURDEN PREACHING - We're watching our nation die spiritually today for the lack of fire in the pulpit. Pastor, how long has it been since you laid hold of the horns of the alter in prayer and ask God to fill you afresh with the Holy Spirit and anoint you to preach His Word with power?

God wants to give America Holy Spiritrevival. He is pleading with our nation

just as he did with Israel. The prophet Jeremiah, with tears in his eyes, preached and pleaded for his people to turn back to God before it was too late. In IJer. 5: 21, he says, "They have eyes, and see not; which have ears, and hear not:... "And when the people would not hear God's Word, he did not quit, but with God's message still burning in his bones, he approached the great men, those in places of authority. Jer. 5: 5 - "I will get me unto the great men, and will speak unto them; for they have known the way of the Lord, and the judgment of their God: but these have altogether broken the yoke, and burst the bonds."

What did the prophet find among the great men? He found the same thing he would find in our land today, among many of our (supposedly) spiritual leaders. He would find men who once had the power of God upon them and the Holy Spirit within them, who had broken the yoke and burst the bonds. He would find men who once believed in the Virgin birth of Christ, His shed blood, His bodily resurrection and His coming again, but now has declared these Bible facts to be a myth. This is a sad commentary, but a true one, and we are watching our nation die spiritually because of spiritually dead leaders.

CHURCH MEMBERS ARE MANY HAPPY WITH DEAD THINGS. They were in Jeremiah's day . . . notice Jer. 5: 30 -"A wonderful and horrible thing is committed in the Land (V-31) The prophets prophesy falsely, and the priest bear rule by their means; and my people love to have it so: and what will ye do in the end thereof?" This verse of scripture carries a real slap. It was a horrible thing that was being committed in the land during the prophet's day, and it is no less a sin today. If God brought judgment to his chosen people for these things, he will bring judgment to America, also. The Apostle Paul warned that "the time would come when they will not endure sound doctrine; . . . and that they would turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables." II Tim. 4:

Not only did the prophets prophesy falsely, but the people loved to have it so. Jesus said, "Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."

There seems to be fewer and fewer churches that want a spirit-anointed preacher. The most hypocrital thing that I can think of is for a segment of a local church to band together in a long-range program to get rid of a God-sent servant, and when they finally accomplish their goal, someone will get up in a service and have the gall to call a alter of prayer for God to send them a pastor. It's not the fast rise of hippies in our land that is destroying, it's spiritual land that is destroying it's spiritual power, but the "hippiecrits".

OUR NATION'S DELIVERANCE - I believe America is the greatest nation in the world; and I also believe the reason

she is is because it was founded upon the Word of God.

Our nation has gone through some bitter and bloody wars and we have won. Not because we were superior in military might, but because God was on our side and brought deliverance.

I fought in Europe in World War II, and at that time I was not a Christian, but I know of many people who were praying for me every day, and I am confident in my heart it was those prayers that brought me home safely.

PRAYER WAS MADE IN SCHOOL during World War II. I know of many schools and class rooms that took time out every day to pray for peace, and God heard and answered those prayers, and as the nation Israel, we experienced deliverances. But America in many ways as Israel, has forgotten God.

AMERICA'S SIN - If there was ever spiritual wickedness committed in high places, then the Supreme Court of our nation has committed it by declaring it unconstitutional for prayer and Bible reading in public schools. WHAT HAVE WE DONE? In essence, we as a nation have said, "God, we don't need you anymore; we can make it on our own." God have mercy on us. Could it be that the Word of God has become a reproach to America, as it did to Israel? Notice what God said about that nation, in Jer. 6: 10 - "Behold, the word of the Lord is unto them a "RE-PROACH"; they have no delight in it."

THE RESULTS OF THIS SIN - America is producing a generation of juvenile delinquents because the foundation has been pulled out from under them while we poke our heads in the sand and say, "What's the matter with our young people today?" I think it is high time we begin to see things as they really are, and not as we hope them to be.

I believe we are watching the greatest nation in the world die a slow but sure death; any nation that sows the same seed as Israel did will reap the same harvest, God is no respecter of persons.

ISRAEL'S TWO-FOLD SIN - Jer. 2: 13 "For my people have committed two evils; they have forsaken me the fountain of living waters, and hewed them out cisterns, broken cisterns, that can hold no water." It would seem to be a foolhearted thing for a thirsty people to turn their backs on a spring of living water, freely flowing from the rock, to drink from a stagnated cistern. Spiritually speaking, this is exactly what happened to the nation Israel and is happening in America when God's people forsake His way and turn to man's way.

As a small boy, I lived on a farm and had to use water out of a cistern and it seemed to me that the water bucket was always dry. There was a saying around our house that if it ever got on fire the water bucket would be the first thing to burn. In the fiery judgments of God, these man-made items of hay and stubble will burn up. Well, back to the story.... sometimes this cistern would get wiggle-

tails in it and was muddy most of the time. This was a blessing in disguise because then you couldn't see the wiggletails, and when the rains failed, we would hitch the mules to the wagon and fill it full of barrels, buckets, and anything else that would hold water, and head for the spring which was about six miles away. Boy, oh boy, what a time we would have. When we got to the spring, wagons would be lined up to get water and when all the wagons were full of water, that spring was still full. No mud, no wiggletails. You know something, that's just like Salvation which Jesus gives. It never runs out-plenty for all. Jesus said, "Whosoever will may come and drink of the water of life freely."

JESUS AND THE CISTERN - Our Lord sat on the curb of a cistern one day and said to the Samaritan woman who came to draw water, "Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again; But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life." John 4: 13-14. Dear reader, may I ask you a very important question? From which place are you drinking? Are you drinking from the fountain of God's living water of everlasting life which is in Christ Jesus the Lord, or are you trying to find satisfaction in the devil's substitute cistern with its wiggle-tails, mud and disappointment?

You will never quench that spiritual thirst until you come to the fountain of living water, the Lord Jesus Christ, and repent of your sins, and receive Him as your personal Saviour. Then that living water shall be in you as Jesus said, "Springing up into everlasting life."

I challenge you to come today and drink; don't forsake God and his living water, which is able to save your soul. Just remember, nations and individuals die when they forsake God. (Ps. 9: 17) "The wicked shall be turned into hell, and all the nations that forget God."

HEWING OUT CISTERNS - Let's remember the devil has a substitute for everything that God has and he delights in deceiving the people of God into believing that it is all right. But in order for the devil to do this, he must first of all get God's people to forsake God's way.

Notice the people of Israel did not stop going to the temple after they had forsaken Him, but they stopped worshiping God as he had directed. Because of this God sent the prophet Jeremiah down to the gate of the temple to preach His word to those who were going in.

Notice: Jer. 7: 1-2 - "The word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord, saying, stand in the gate of the Lord's house, and proclaim there this word, and say, hear the word of the Lord, all ye of Judah, that enter in at these gates to worship the Lord."

There are two things that I want us to see in this scripture. First: Where God sent the Prophet - down to the gate of the Lord's house. Did you ever wonder why the gate? Well, I have, and I don't know why, unless God knew that they wouldn't let him in. After all, don't forget that this prophet had a fire in his bones and a message from God instead of one from a dollar sermon book. This might have been the reason the people had turned from God's Word.

Second: His message. (V-3) "Thus saith the Lord of host, the God of Israel, Amend your ways and your doings, and I will cause you to dwell in this place."

God's message was a recipe for a spiritual revival. For the nation Israel, it was a message to the people to turn back to God and His Word. "Thus sayeth the Lord" must be heeded, if our nation is ever to have a spiritual revival, and judgment must began at the house of God.

IS THE CHURCH GUILTY OF HEWING OUT CISTERNS? Many Christian people are asking the question, "What's the matter with our services? They are not spiritual like they once were. Why is the Spirit of God not present in most churches, like He once was?" These are some of the questions that pastors and laymen alike are asking. I think we need to be quite frank in dealing with these questions.

First: Many pastors and church members don't believe in any emotion at all nowadays in the service. I wonder why? Now I am not putting emotions above everything else, but I am still firmly convinced that emotion goes along with Salvation. I also know that we are not saved by our feelings. The Bible plan is facts, faith, and feelings, in that order.

I believe that when a sinner comes to Christ, in true repentance, and the burden of sin is lifted and his life transformed, his sins put under the blood of Jesus Christ, and you tell me that there is no feeling? (Bah-Humbug)

But before this can happen to a sinner, the Holy Spirit must convict him of his sin. How does the Holy Spirit convict sinners? Through the preaching of God's Word by a Holy Spirit anointed preacher or teacher.

What our churches need today is not better and bigger buildings, not more machinery, but men whom the Holy Ghost can use. The Holy Spirit does not flow through methods, but men. He does not come upon machinery, but men. He does not anoint plans; but men; men of prayer.

Our nation is dying spiritually and our churches is to blame. We need a revival in our Free Will Baptist denomination and it must start with the preachers. I pray God that it will start in my own heart.

And when this revival happens it will change our dead, cold, formal, cut and dried services to Holy Ghost fire, tears, conviction and repentance and lost souls will be saved, and the church will be out of that old broken cistern, and back to the Father's business of winning souls to the fountain of living water. "Preacher, in all thy getting, get anointed; we have

too many man-made devices and not enough God-made men." I know that this is not popular preaching today, but it is the answer to the question, "What's the matter with our services?"

These are the last days, and the form of Godliness, without the power, is a real danger.

WHAT IS THE POWER OF GOD? -Rom. 1: 16 - Paul says, "For I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ; for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth; to the Jew first and also to the Greek." This is one of my favorite passages of scripture, and I want you to notice the terminology of the verse. Paul says, "I am not ashamed of the "gospel of Christ"....and Christ, is the Gospel." But the R.S.V. book, which some people call the Bible, leaves out the word "CHRIST" in this verse. Someone will say, "Oh well, that's not much difference." and that is just what the devil likes to hear you say. Personally, I believe that the difference is the difference between Heaven and Hell. I believe that it is the difference between a nation dying and one living.

If I understand the meaning of the word "gospel" it means "Good News", and if you omit the word "Christ" it could mean good news about anything or nothing. Now, I'm not against all translations other than the King James, but I say with-

out hesitation that I am firmly against any translation that tries to eliminate or minimize the Lord Jesus Christ, which includes His virgin birth, His shed blood, His bodily resurrection, and His coming again. I would like to ask a question: "What's wrong with the King James version"? It was good enough for the foundation of the greatest nation in the world, America, preaching from it's truths by men of God, under the Power of the Holy Spirit, through the centuries has brought revival time and time again and will continue to do so for those who believe it. However, the devil is out in full force today to rid our nation of the King James Bible.

"WHAT'S HAPPENING?" - Our nation as Israel, is busy hewing out broken cisterns that can hold no water. This is a trick of the devil in his diabolical scheme of substitution he is so cunningly conveying to the people of God in these last days.

I believe that Free Will Baptists have the message for these dangerous times, but in order for it to be effective in men's lives, we must have the power of the Holy Spirit upon it; for without Him even though the message be fundamental, it becomes "as sounding brass, a tinkling cymbal."

The word of the Lord that came to Zerubbabel saying, "not by might nor by power, but by my spirit saith the Lord of host." Zech. 4: 6, is still the word of the Lord.

REVIVAL FOR SURVIVAL - I believe that every student of the Word of God knows we are in the midst of a perishing civilization; that we are advancing rapidly toward the consumation of the age and the coming of the Lord.

Science can offer no hope for the future blessings and security of humanity. I see no bright prospects through the efforts of man for our nation. But there is a ray of light shining through the darkness, and it is found in the Word of God. (John 14: 6) "Jesus said, 'I am the way, the truth, and the life:"......

TODAY IS THE DAY FOR REVIVAL—We are still this side of judgment, the Holy Spirit is still here on earth, there can be revival if the people of God will pay the price.

The crying need for revival in our land today is very evident. If our souls are barren, if tears are absent from our eyes, if converts are absent from our alters, then let us take no comfort in our numbers or our popularity. But let us invite the Holy Spirit to plague our hearts with grief because we are spiritually unable to bring to birth those who are dead in trespasses and sin. The Holy Spirit has no delight in our padded pews, carpeted floors, stained glass windows, if the crib is empty.

My prayer is that this year of 1968 will be a year of revival, throughout our demonination and America.

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
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### GOD NEEDS MEN WHO READ AND BELIEVE THE HOLY BIBLE

Believe God will do what He says. He says He will forgive you of all sin and "cleanse you from all unrighteousness." God led David, the little shepherd boy, in the paths of righteousness and so will He you. He says that He will give us richly all things to enjoy. Ask, believing, and it shall be given you.

Start reading and believing the Holy Bible right now. Let the world see God in your every act, word, and deed. You are the only Bible some people will ever read. They are measuring the Holy Bible by your life. Make your life look worthwhile to them and show them the way.

"Study to show thyself approved unto God." Thank Him for everything up to now, refuse to have an average spiritual life, and keep climbing as high as possible while living on earth. Taste every mystery of God, from forgiveness of sin to the day when you hear Jesus say, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant, enter thou into the joy of the Lord."

#### MISSOURI STATE HOME MISSION BOARD OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

### DECEMBER REPORT:

ST. JOSEPH: We averaged 24 in Sunday School for the month of December; however, during the past two weeks, snow, ice and extremely cold weather have hampered our work here. Our attendance has been down because some of our people were unable to get to church. We recognize the remaining few weeks of winter are vital ones for our mission here. We sincerely ask you to pray for us, that in the weeks ahead, we might recognize our tremendous responsibility unto God and His work.
