

In Memory of Rev. Kenneth Turner

Reverend Kenneth Turner, one of Missouri's most outstanding and versatile ministers, went to be with his Saviour on February 8, 1998. Rev. Turner was 90 years old when he passed away. He was an alumnus of Free Will Baptist Bible College and was a life time member of the Alumni Association. The school was in its infancy when he attended.

"Uncle Ken," as he was affectionately known by all those close to him, had a ministry that reached out and touched many lives. He answered the call to preach in 1932 and pastored churches in Missouri, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Kansas. Soon after the organization of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, Brother Ken assumed the task of promoting the fledgling Foreign Missions Department. He made three trips to Cuba during the early 1940's and used his gift of photography to document the mission work there. He used these motion pictures as he traveled throughout the United States sharing the burden of

reaching the lost. Not all of the churches shared his burden and often he was not allowed to show his pictures. Many times no offering was given. However, these obstacles did not deter him from the job that he knew the Lord wanted him to do.

In the 1950's, a new ministry of outreach opened to Rev. Turner. His talents and abilities seemed limitless. During that time, he performed on KODF channel 12 in Joplin, Missouri. He appeared on a weekly television show for children with "Ranger Rick." His stage name was the "The Great Ken Neto." Brother Ken performed for more than five years as a ventriloquist and Gospel Magician. It was estimated that between 100,000 and 200,000 children watched the show in the four state area.

Brother Turner was a faithful member of the First Free Will Baptist Church in Monett, Missouri, where he taught a Sunday night Bible study. He used many original drawings with an overhead projector to teach. He found satisfaction in doing all that he could do for the cause of Christ.

In addition to all of these things, "Uncle Ken" was my friend and mentor while I was his pastor during the last years of his life. The testimony of his life and ministry is that he loved his Saviour,

his family, and his denomination. He is survived by his wife Jewell, his companion of 69 years.

EDITOR'S NOTE: The Psalmist states that, "If the LORD delights in a man's way, he makes his steps firm." (NIV) Surely the Lord delighted in Brother Ken Turner's way, for Brother Ken's walk through life has left a well worn path of sacrifice and service to the Lord. He was a man of many talents, and he joyfully used them all for the Lord. As a pioneer among Free Will Baptists, he has left us a grand legacy. We will miss his sense of humor, spiritual acumen, and steadfast walk.

GENERAL CAMP RULES

Everyone using these campgrounds shall remember that all property and equipment has been dedicated to God. Please remember this as you use the equipment and facilities in general.

No water guns are allowed. No container or device shall be used to propel or project any substance upon another person or property. This includes shaving cream, water balloons, paint, etc. Anyone who violates the rule WILL PAY FOR ALL DAMAGES AND WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL CLEAN-UP!

There shall not be allowed, in the cabins, such things as: Radios, Stereos, Tape Player, Television or other instruments to receive or reproduce voice or musical communications. (Musical instruments may be accepted, but must first be approved by the Camp Board).

No mixed swimming will be allowed. Bathing suits will be worn INSIDE THE POOL AREA ONLY! Bathrobes must be worn to and from pool No one will be allowed in the swimming pool any time without a qualified life guard on duty. (THIS INCLUDES ALL CAMPERS, SPONSORS AND WORKERS)

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING INSURANCE STATEMENT:

No one shall leave the campgrounds, after being registered, WITHOUT FIRST NOTIFYING ONE OF THE CAMP BOARD MEMBERS, AND SIGNING A CAMP RELEASE FORM.

Missouri State Free Will Baptist Youth Camp, offers its services & facilities to all young people regardless of age, race, color, national origin, sex or handicap.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING

The Youth Campgrounds and the equipment thereon has been dedicated to the Lord for use in His service.

- (1) No one shall deface, destroy, or diversify any of the property or equipment. Anyone doing so will be required to pay for damages.
- (2) No one shall bring/use tobacco, narcotics, or alcoholic beverages on the campgrounds. Those who do, may be expelled from the camp and refused further privileges.
- (3) No profanity shall be tolerated BY ANYONE AT ANY TME!

(4) THE CAMPDRESS CODE IS AS FOLLOWS:

- A. CLASS & ACTIVITY TIME: Girls & women may wear dresses, skirts or split-skirts, that cover their knees or full-length jeans or slacks. Blouses, shirts or sweaters must be full length & cover the shoulder. No spaghetti strap, tank-fop etc.
- B. WORSHIP TIME: Girls & women may wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees. Blouses or sweaters must be full length & cover the shoulder. No spaghetti strap, tank-top etc.
- C. CLASS & ACTIVITY TIME: Boys & men may wear full length Slacks or jeans. Shirts are to be full length and cover the shoulder. NO FISH NET, MUSCLE SHIRTS, TANK-TOP, ETC.
- D. WORSHIP TIME: Boys & men may wear full length slacks or jeans. Shirts are to be full length and cover the shoulder. NO FISH NET, MUSCLE SHIRTS, TANK-TOPS, ETC.

IT IS STRONGLY SUGGESTED THAT EVERYONE SHOWER & WEAR CLEAN CLOTHES TO EACH WORSHIP SERVICE.

SWEAT PANTS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE FOR ANYONE TO WEAR AT CAMP.

ALL GARMENTS WORN AT CAMP MUST BE LOOSE FITTING AND MODEST.

Please come to the Tabernacle prepared to participate in worship!

SPECIAL REGULATIONS, PLEASE NOTE!

- (10). No special menus (diet, etc.) will be prepared by those working in food-service. (Please Don't Ask).

- (12). Pre-registration will be required by all campers. This year the registration forms and brochures are being published in the Gem. Also a copy of each is being sent to everyone attending camp in the last few years. Please make as many copies as necessary, so everyone from your church will have a registration form & brochure! (13). An EMERGENCY MEDICAL STATEMENT ON THE REGISTRATION FORM MUST BE SIGNED BY A PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN, BEFORE A CHILD CAN BE ADMITTED TO CAMP.

The Youth Camp Insurance Carrier is Church Mutual Insurance Company. The Insurance coverage provided by the camp is called Excess Insurance. The following is a brief description of coverages provided by Church Mutual.

- 1. Coverage is (ONLY) for accidents. There is no coverage for charges due to sickness
- 2. Should an accident occur, all charges must be submitted to the campers (PERSONAL-/PRIVATE) insurance carrier first.
- A. If the personal/private insurance carrier has a deductible, Camp insurance will pay the deductible, not exceeding its own limits.
- B. If a balance exists after the personal/private insurance carrier has paid to its limits, Camp Insurance will pay the unpaid balance, (not to exceed Church Mutual insurance limits).
- C. If there is (NO) personal/private insurance, Camp Insurance shall serve as primary carrier and pay up to its limits.
- 3. Please keep in mind, any coverage by Camp Insurance shall be for accidents only There is no benefits for any kind of sickness.


