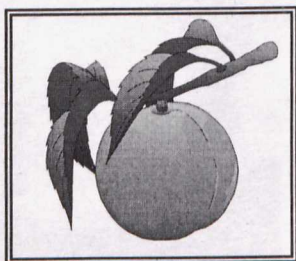

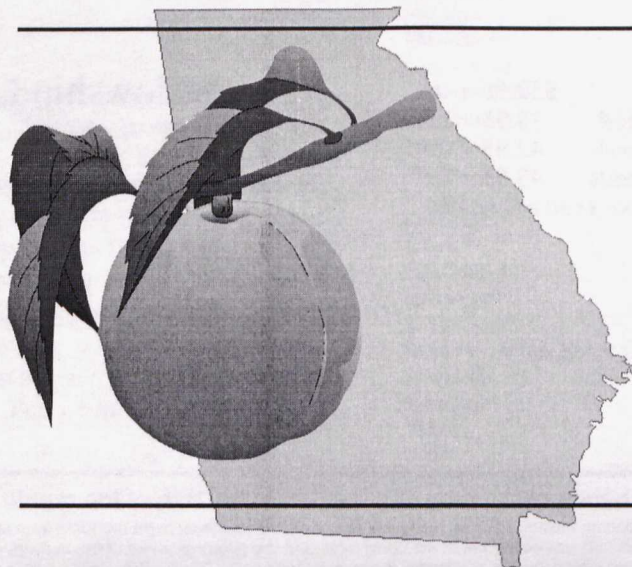

FWB FAMILY MINISTRIES OPENS SHELTER

Free Will Baptist Family Ministries in Greeneville, TN, announces the opening of a brand new emergency shelter for boys, known as a P.A.T.H. Shelter (Protecting Adolescents and Teaching Hope). This home has been under construction since May 1998. With the help of literally dozens of volunteers, under the direction of Buddy Arnold (Plant & Operations Manager), the construction has been completed. There is not room to thank all the churches, individuals, and women's groups who helped build and furnish this home.

A ribbon cutting ceremony was held on February 11, with over 130 people in attendance. Visitors included pastors, lay leaders, social workers, and local judicial leaders.

This new facility is the product of a successful 5-year Capital Campaign which ended in 1998. It comprises 4,000 square feet which breaks down into 6 bedrooms for 12 young men (including one which is handicap accessible). The staff area consists of 2 bedrooms, private bath and living room, and an office. The large main room will provide ample space for both the living and dining room.

This new shelter was a dream that started 5 years ago. With God's help and blessings FWBFM hopes to see this facility serve several hundred children in the years to come. A recent report on national TV announced that child abuse has doubled in the last decade! It's sad that a ministry like this must exist, but FWBFM is glad for the opportunity to serve the Lord in this mission field.

Please continue to pray for, and support this vital ministry to abused children.

PASTORS' TRIP BIG SUCCESS

The Missions Awareness Trip for five Free Will Baptist pastors to Brazil last October/November was a resounding success. Marvis and I left Nashville on October 26 and flew to Atlanta, where we met up with five pastors from all parts of the country—from California, Michigan, West Virginia, North Carolina and Missouri. After all arrived at Atlanta, there was just a brief time for some orientation for the rest of our trip.

We boarded a Brazilian airliner, Varig, for a nine-hour non-stop flight to Sao Paulo, Brazil. After clearing customs we boarded another airplane to complete our trip. During the 16 days we spent traveling by plane, van, and public buses, we visited and participated in services in 15 Free Will Baptist churches, conducted services in a factory owned by a Free Will Baptist business man, and visited the New Life Children's Home in Araras.

The purpose of the trip was to give the participating pastors first-hand experience of Free Will Baptist Mission work in Brazil. The pastors expressed their pleasant surprise at just how much mission work has been done there. Each pastor raised his own support for the expenses of the trip.

STATEMENT FROM THE BOARD — We look forward to serving you, to the best of our ability. We want to provide a safe, Christian atmosphere for all who attend the Missouri State Free Will Baptist Youth Camp. To do this, we must have the full cooperation of everyone. We pray souls will be saved, and every saved soul will grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ, WHOSE CAMP THIS IS!

"SPECIAL INSURANCE NOTICE, PLEASE READ WITH CAUTION"

The Youth Camp Insurance Carrier is Church Mutual Insurance Company. The Insurance coverage provided by the camp is called Excess Insurance. The following is a brief description of coverages provided by Church Mutual.

1. Coverage is (ONLY) for accidents. There is no coverage for charges due to sickness.

2. Should an accident occur, all charges must be submitted to the campers (PERSONAL/PRIVATE) insurance carrier first.

A. If the personal/private insurance carrier has a deductible, Camp insurance will pay the deductible, not exceeding its own limits.

B. If a balance exists after the personal/private insurance carrier has paid to its limits, Camp Insurance will pay the unpaid balance, (not to exceed Church Mutual insurance limits).

C. If there is (NO) personal/private insurance, Camp Insurance shall serve as primary carrier and pay up to its limits.

3. Please keep in mind, any coverage by Camp Insurance shall be for accidents only. There are no benefits for any kind of sickness.

PLEASE NOTE — THE INSURANCE COVERAGE PROVIDED BY MISSOURI STATE F.W.B. YOUTH CAMP IS VERY EXPENSIVE AND LIKE MOST INSURANCE CARRIERS, THEY ARE VERY STRICT REGARDING INFORMATION SUBMITTED TO THEM. THEREFORE [FAILURE OR REFUSAL] ON YOUR PART TO SUPPLY ANY NEEDED INFORMATION, WILL AUTOMATICALLY MAKE YOU RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY & ALL OF THE UNPAID BALANCE.

The Youth Campgrounds and the equipment thereon has been dedicated to the Lord for use in His service.

(1) No one shall deface, destroy, or diversify any of the property or equipment. Anyone doing so will be required to pay for damages.

(2) No one shall bring/use tobacco, narcotics, or alcoholic beverages on the campgrounds. Those who do, may be expelled from the camp and refused further privileges.

(3) No profanity shall be tolerated BY ANYONE AT ANY-TIME!

(4) THE CAMP DRESS CODE IS AS FOLLOWS:

D. WORSHIP TIME: Boys & men may wear full length slacks or jeans. Shirts are to be full length and cover the shoulder. NO FISH NET, MUSCLE SHIRTS, TANK-TOPS, ETC.

IT IS STRONGLY SUGGESTED THAT EVERYONE SHOWER & WEAR CLEAN CLOTHES TO EACH WORSHIP SERVICE.

SWEAT PANTS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE FOR ANYONE TO WEAR AT CAMP.

ALL GARMENTS WORN AT CAMP MUST BE LOOSE FITTING AND MODEST.

Please come to the Tabernacle prepared to participate in worship!

SPECIAL REGULATIONS, PLEASE NOTE!

(1). All workers at the camp will work under the supervision & control of Youth Camp Board.

(2). The list of safety rules given by playground supervisor must be observed.

(3). Attendance at all classes WILL BE REQUIRED, unless excused by the General Camp Director.

(4). No one will be on the playground until the call for PLEDGE TO THE FLAG (7:30 except to go to the restrooms.

(5). Everyone is required to sign the agreement on the registration form that they will fully obey all rules governing the camp. EVERYONE WILL BE EXPECTED TO ABIDE BY THEIR PROMISE!

(6). No teenager shall serve as a sponsor.

(7). Each church sending campers shall have, at least, one sponsor for the boys and one sponsor for the girls. No campers shall be registered or assigned to a cabin, by the registrar, without a sponsor!

(8). All campers and workers and sponsors are required to attend the Evening Worship Service, unless excused by the Camp Director, Due To Sickness. (THIS MEANS EVERYONE!)

(9). Due to State Health Regulations, no unauthorized people will be allowed in kitchen area.

(10). No special menus (diet, etc.) will be prepared by those working in food-service. (Please Don't Ask.)

(11). The First Aid Center will be closed from 9:00 - 12:00 each morning. In case of emergency, contact the General Director or one of the Board Members present.

(12). Pre-registration will be required by all campers. This year the registration forms and brochures are being published in the Gem. Also a copy of each is being sent to everyone attending camp in the last few years. Please make as many copies as necessary, so everyone from your church will have a registration form & brochure!

(13). AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL STATEMENT ON THE REGISTRATION FORM MUST BE SIGNED BY A PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN, BEFORE A CHILD CAN BE ADMITTED TO CAMP.

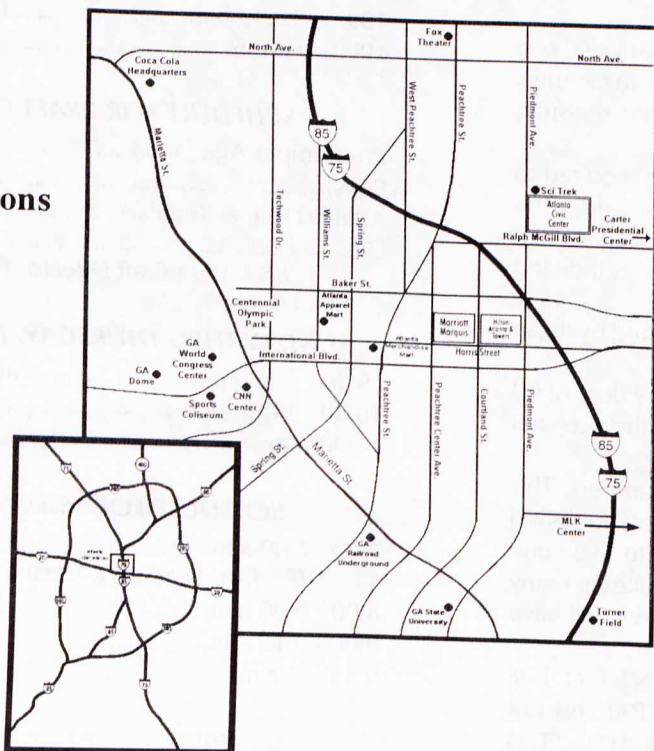
