




## THE 86TH SESSION OF THE MISSOURI STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

The Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists will meet June 7 - 9, 1999, at the Kenneth E. Cowan Civic Center in Lebanon. This 86<sup>th</sup> session will offer a time for great fellowship, great singing, and great preaching. The Missouri Women Active for Christ led by President Shirley Jackson will meet Monday.

The theme for this year's convention is "The Unchanging Word for A Changing World." Four speakers — Rev. Ken Dodson, Rev. Clarence Burton, Rev. Melvin Moon, and Rev. Trymon Messer — will develop the theme taken from Joshua 1:8-9.

The Monday evening message will be delivered by the Rev. Kenneth Dodson. Brother Dodson was born in Ironton, Missouri. Converted in 1959, he was ordained to preach in 1974, and graduated from Free Will Baptist Bible College in 1982. He has pastored Old Reyno FWB Church in Reyno, Arkansas ('73-'75); Fourth FWB Church in St. Louis, Missouri ('77-'80); Monett FWB Church in Monett, Missouri ('84-'87) and ('90-'96); Woodbine FWB Church, Nashville, Tennessee ('87-'90); and Park Hills FWB Church, Park Hills, Missouri ('96 - present). He also taught at the Christian Academy and served as Bus Director at First FWB Church in Farmington, Missouri ('80-'84). Ken has served as Moderator of the St. Louis District and the Missouri State Association, and has served on the Sunday school/CTS, and Youth Camp Boards for the Missouri State Association, as well as the Missions Coordinator for the Indian Creek Association. He has also served on the Presbytery Board in Nashville, Tennessee, and is presently serving on our National Home Missions Board.

Ken and his wife, Paula, have five children: Mrs. Scott (Dawn) Real, Darrin, Douglas, David, and Dennis.

The Christian Education Board will be sponsoring a Stewardship Seminar Tuesday morning. Mr. Al Taylor is the Director of Stewardship for the Church of God at their international offices in Cleveland, Tennessee. Among other titles, he also served as the chairman of the international Prayer Commission. An enthusiastic promoter of lay ministries, Taylor is a sought-after speaker for national and international conferences. He is the author of *Proving God*, a best-selling book on tithing.

A former Lee College student, Taylor was listed among the *Distinguished Leaders* of 1976 and nominated for Who's Who in Religion in 1977 and 1985, Who's Who in the South and Southwest in 1983 and 1985, and Who's Who in the World in 1991-92.

Born in Danville, Virginia, Taylor is a third generation member of the Church of God. He now lives in Cleveland, Tennessee, with his wife, Norma. They have five children.

Rev. Clarence Burton will fill the pulpit Tuesday evening. Brother Burton was born in Paragould, Arkansas, was converted in 1938 and ordained to preach in 1955. He graduated from Free Will Baptist Bible College and also attended Ouchita University, George Peabody College, and Arkansas State University. He has pastored three churches: Ballew's Chapel in Grubbs, Arkansas ('55-'59); First FWB Church in Fredericktown, Missouri ('60-'63); and First FWB Church in Berkeley, Missouri ('63-'75). He has served on the National Sunday

school/CTS Board as well as two terms on the Free Will Baptist Bible College Board. For the Missouri State Association, he has served on the Youth Camp and Home Mission Boards, and served as Moderator for the State Association ('70-'73) and as Executive Secretary ('75-'92). He presently serves as Associate Pastor at United FWB Church in West Plains, Missouri.

Clarence and his wife, Vivian, have two children, Steve and John.

Our Wednesday morning worship service will have the Rev. Melvin Moon delivering the message. Brother Moon was born in Searcy, Arkansas, converted in 1977, and ordained to preach in 1984. He is an alumnus of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. Melvin is presently pastor of Hartville FWB Church, Hartville, Missouri ('89 - present); and has pastored Mt. Carmel FWB Church in Vilonia, Arkansas ('85-'86); and Grace FWB Church in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma ('87-'89). He has served on the Executive Board for the Mission Association and on the Missouri State Christian Education Board.

Melvin and his wife, Clarissa, have four children: Caleb, twins Shanda and Seth, and Gillian.

Trymon Messer will be our speaker for the Wednesday evening service. Mr. Messer is Director of our National Home Missions Department in Antioch, Tennessee. He accepted that position in September, 1995, after having served as Home Missions' associate director since 1978. Known as a leader in evangelism and soul winning, he came to our national offices after 13 years as lay pastor of First FWB Church in Salina, Kansas, where he led a growth surge from two families to a record attendance of 964.

Prior to his years as associate director, Mr. Messer won two lay awards. Oklahoma Bible college (now Hillsdale FWB College) named him layman of the year in 1964. The Master's Men Department named him layman of the year in 1969. He has chaired the Kansas Home Missions Board and served on both the National Home Missions Board as well as the Hillsdale FWB College Board of Trustees. He is a veteran of the United States Marine Corps. Trymon and his wife, Opal, have three children.

The General Board will meet Monday afternoon at the state offices. The business sessions led by Moderator Rick Dablemont will begin Tuesday afternoon.



### **Rev. Charles Moyers Promoted to Glory**

Rev. Charles H. Moyers passed away at Maranatha Village Nursing Home in Springfield, Missouri, on March 9, 1999, at the age of 81.

He accepted the call to the ministry at the age of 17, and never faltered from his calling. He was used of God to start several churches—three of them local. He assisted Rev. Willard Darnell in starting the Farmington Free Will Baptist Church, and with the assistance of Rev. George Hibbits, started the Hurry-ville Free Will Baptist Church. Approximately 33 years later, he organized the DeSoto Free Will Baptist Church. He also pastored churches in Alabama and Oklahoma.

On March 21, 1999, the DeSoto church conducted a service honoring their former pastors, presenting plaques in recognition of their labors. Brother Moyers' plaque was accepted by his brother, Herusel. The family was very proud of the remembrance from the DeSoto church. Sister Moyers (Dean) is in Maranatha Village Nursing Home in Springfield, and is suffering from Alzheimer's Disease.

### **Ginger Harrison Update**

I arrived in Antwerp, Belgium, Wednesday morning, February 24th, at 11:30 AM after a 10 minute near-death experience during the first portion of my flight from Boston to Amsterdam. Being exhausted, I headed to the small airport's baggage claim to find there were no porters or considerate persons available to aid me with my 7 suitcases. After maneuvering them to the rental car counter and then down to the station wagon, I hoisted all 7 into the car with one seat left for me.

Tired and sore from lifting, my driving European driving skills slowly returned from the summer of being a missionary in Germany. Following the directions to my apartment and the institute, trying to read street names, follow the flow of traffic and keep from crying after an hour of driving in circles to find the correct street names took its toll. After asking directions again and still getting confused on the congested, small cobblestone street and passing another 45 minutes, I finally found the institute and my new apartment. The problem was I was supposed to meet the land-lord at his house. Determined to not lose the school, I stopped and called for him to meet me at the apartment.

The out-side was white, older, near the corner of 6 intersections with cable cars and a bus stop in front. Entering the dark building and ascending 8 flights of stairs to the top floor, my heart sank further to believe this was to be my home for the next 4 months. This huge, empty building was dark, smelly, and scary. I tried thinking positive and that I was just exhausted, but even though it was right across the street from the school, I did not have a peace about staying there one more minute when the land-lord left.

With your prayers and God's provision, I found another apartment and moved in by Saturday. It's right around the corner from the school and the lady and her husband who rent it are very helpful and kind. The apartment is still different for me, with a small kitchen and a bathroom in the hall, but it's clean and I feel comfortable.

Trusting the Lord has really been a step for me this week. I'm looking forward to starting my studies here, but also see how when we take steps in following God's direction in our lives how many obstacles can arise. I'm not discouraged today and know that God has placed me here to serve Him. I've already talked to my land-lady about the Lord and Antwerp is actually a very interesting place to see.

Pray for God's protection, peace, and perseverance in my life and ministry. Thanks for your prayers and encouragement. Those days that I was "disconnected" from the world without telephone and e-mail makes me realize how much I rely on updating you and keeping you in touch with prayer needs. "Maybe it is that the times you should pray the most, is when you know the least about the situation!" I believe you did that for me during this transition!

Wentzville, March 6, 1999



### God's House Redesigned A Church Standing United

There is a different feeling around First FWB Church in DeSoto, Missouri; a refreshing change. Give God the glory! Our church stands as a testimony that a church in these days needs reliable trustees, solid deacons, a faithful pastor, and every member of the congregation trusting in God in prayer to accomplish anything. That's just what happened.

During a Wednesday night business meeting last fall our church body voted to redesign our sanctuary and the children's church. We knew we were taking on a big task, but we knew with our prayers, with leadership in place, and the people standing united in the decision, it could and would be done.

Like the maestro of a symphony orchestra, our Pastor, Brother Bob Thebeau, conducted the business meeting, addressed all the questions, and kept the concerns down to a minimum—all with the faith needed to see it through.

"What color curtains should we get?" . . . "How will we pay for it?" . . . "How big should we make the stage?" . . . "Do we really need that?" . . . "I don't think we should do that." These were just a few of the many questions and comments that night. Brother Bob answered them as soon as they were raised. I'll have to admit that there were times that night when we didn't all see eye to eye, but we continued to discuss the particulars of what to do. After a while we settled on how the sanctuary needed to look. Then the question of "How do we pay for it?" came up. As quick as that question was asked, it was stifled by a senior member of the church. He stood up and said, "If we're going to do this, we need to take a step of faith and the Lord will provide the rest." Have faith . . . what a concept! Right then, the whole church came together, united

to take on the task and to trust God for the rest. The music of Brother Bob's orchestra was now playing a praising melody to God.



The work began. In an effort to save costs, our church body did the work. We had young and old, men and women, boys and girls, all helping in the project. There was no job too dirty or small for anybody—we all helped.
