Tell'em About Jesus

Effective communication of the gospel must always center upon the person and work of Jesus Christ. Charles Spurgeon, England's foremost mid-nineteenth century, Protestant preacher, once said, "No matter what Scripture

I preach from, I always cut cross-country to Jesus Christ, and preach His saving grace."

A return to the heart of the Gospel will result in repentance and regeneration of the lost and renewal and reformation in the church...Whenever and wherever Christ is exalted, God will draw men unto Him. If anything is elevated above Christ in our presentation of God's Word. whether it be tradition or ritual, we dilute or deny the power of God unto salvation" (Romans 1:16).

The Ethiopian eunuch understood this and was saved when Phillip explained to him that what he was reading in (Isaiah 53) was about the good news about our Lord: "Then Phillip opened his mouth, and began at the same scriptures, and preached unto him Jesus" (Acts 8:35. KJV).

Ministers Can Return to Social Security

Congress has opened a two-year window for ministers who previously opted out of Social Security to re-enter the program. They can take advantage of this opportunity by making an irrevocable election effective this year or next. The form needed is Form 2031 which must be filed by April 15, 2002. If the election is made for tax year 2000 they will be liable for self-employment taxes this year. Form 2031 (with instructions) can be obtained online at <u>in the forms and publications</u> sections and either faxed or mailed to the IRS.

In 1880, Free Will Baptists met in New Durham for a centennial celebration of the Free Will Baptists of the North.

"The principal portion of this volume composed of papers to be read at the Centennial Conference in 1880, but with the probability that they would be preserved in their present shape. These include the conference sermon, the exercises at the meeting of aged ministers, and the historical sketches of the missionary, educational, anti-slavery, temperance

and Sunday-school works of the denomination. The engravings that appear in the volume are from original portraits of persons not now living, but who were among the esteemed and representative men of their generation. The volume may be reported as a denominational handbook, and as such it will revive memories of the past, be of practical use in the present, and transmit facts to the future student of denominational history."


