On Tuesday, June 5, 2001 24 Alumni of Free Will Baptist Bible College met at Ryan's Steakhouse and formed a State Alumni Association. Bible College representative, Mr. Tim Campbell, Director of Stewardship Development, was present to help organize the association. Rev. Gary Fry, chairman of the FWBBC board of trustees, led the group in establishing an Alumni President. Rev. Kenny Simpson was elected President. Other elected officers were Rev. Lynn Davenport, Vice President and Mr. Greg Smith, Secretary/Treasurer.

What's the purpose?

The purpose in forming this alumni association is to mobilized alumni to remain connected with our alma mater. All institutions of higher education depend on their alumni to help with development, recruitment and retention. This alumni association will provide an avenue by which lines of communication will be reestablished between alumni and FWBBC. In the future, we hope there will be interest in establishing local alumni chapters throughout the state.

What are our objectives?

The first objective we have is to build our alumni database. Currently, we have 176 names and addresses of alumni from Missouri. Greg Smith will enter these names into our database and keep accurate records of them. Second, to produce a newsletter containing alumni news from around the state as well as current events and needs of the college. The Mystery of Grace

An old man lies quietly on his bed, barely able to move, struggling for breath, surrounded by his four sons and daughters-in-law. Lifting his feeble hands, with raspy voice, he prays audibly asking God to protect and provide for his family as he senses his promotion to glory drawing near. At the beginning of his prayer is his praise to God for a life full of blessings and joys; the praise is lengthy and takes up most of his remaining strength. His prayer concludes with a urgent plea for the grace and mercy of God to touch all his children and their families; he wants them all in heaven with him in the future, and in no uncertain manner he beseeches God to do whatever is necessary to turn each of their hearts in faith toward Christ.

A pastor steps forward and takes the hand of the old man and softly agrees in prayer with him and thanks God for the life of a dear friend and faithful brother in Christ. Tears flow freely down the pastor's face as he embraces the old man and the look exchanged between them affirms a unity and oneness that only those who know Christ can see. The Word of God is read briefly aloud by the pastor and "more than conquerors" rings throughout the room, providing an unusual melody of sweet peace that only the voice of truth can sing.

The faces of the four sons, thought quite similar in outward appearance, are remarkably different in emotive expression. Three appear at ease, although they know their father is dying, smiles of contentment lie under the tears running down their cheeks. The other son frowns and fidgets, fighting back tears, frustrated and angry, thinking to himself, "Why is he praying for me at a time like this?" Four young wives cling to one another and watch as their husbands embrace their father for the last time. The scene becomes ugly as the old man begins to wrestle with the life-death moment and gasps for air as his lungs fill with fluid. Finally, stillness settles over the entire room as the old man's breathing stops. Not a word is spoken. The Spirit of God comforts as only He can do.

The lone son with no peace falls to his knees at his father's bedside, cries out to God and is restored to the glory of God's wonderful, merciful grace. Heaven's angels rejoice and as the gates of Paradise welcome a new resident, one is raised up to take his place on earth fulfilling the sovereign plan of Almighty God. The scene now becomes beautiful! And for many years hence, the once wayward son, will re-tell the story of how his own father gave His life for him, allowing him to see in the flesh in his life the reality of the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ.

NEW CAMP TABERNACLE DEDICATED

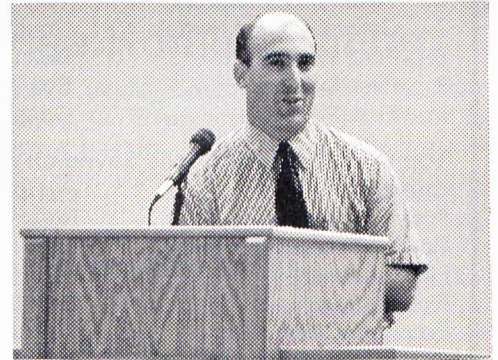

"The original meeting of the Licking Free Will Baptist Mission that was later to become the New Life Free Will Baptist Church in Licking was held in a café on November 11, 1972, with 16 people present.

We are honored today to have the owner of that café, who was also the person that put that organizational meeting together, with us here in the service. At that time she was known as Gladys Ward. After the death of her husband, Ed, and several years after that meeting, Gladys married Bill Sells and is now known to us as Gladys Sells...

This is Harold Price Sunday, a day that was set aside and named for one of the church fathers of this church, and one of the first charter members. On this day we honor one of our members that has been outstanding in their service and dedication to this church. Gladys, you are here today because you are that member we are honoring today.

First of all, I want to present you with one dozen roses to express our appreciation to you for your service to this church. We understand that you like flowers. We did our best to find out something we could give someone that has everything, and we came to the conclusion that we would just flood you with flowers. Please accept

Gladys has also been instrumental in the organization of another church. On December 8, 1946 she got together the group that became the Ellsworth Free Will Baptist Church on Piney River near Highway 32. Pastor Courtney then introduced Nathan Ruble, Missouri State Executive Secretary, to present a plaque to Sister Sells. He read the plaque and commended Gladys for her commitment to the church. Bro. FWBBC President to Become Chancellor



The Free Will Baptist Bible College Board of Trustees has announced that it is promoting FWBBC President Tom Malone to the office of Chancellor, effective January 2002, or as soon thereafter as a new president can be found.

In making the announcement, the trustees cited the urgent need to involve Dr. Malone more directly in relocating the college to Joelton. They said the move was being made "in order to best utilize the gifts and vision of President Malone and to expedite the relocation process."

A search committee composed of Board Chairman Gary Fry, Assistant Chairman Richard Bowers, and Secretary Larry Montgomery has been appointed to find a new president.

Dr. Malone has served as FWBBC president for 11 years. During his tenure, the college has made great strides forward. These include achieving regional accreditation and purchasing the property to which the college is moving in 2003. President Malone has been a driving force to advance the college.

"I have had three great loves in my life," he said: "The Lord Jesus Christ, my family, and Free Will Baptist Bible College. It is my heart's desire to continue serving the College in whatever way I can that we may see more young people entering the whitened fields of Christian service."

The administration, faculty, staff, students and trustees request the prayers of friends as the search is conducted and as the transition takes place.
