be concerned about what we can do for our denomination. We should strive to instill in our students loyalty to our denomination and our confession of faith. We must reaffirm our commitment to graduating, in large numbers, the best ministers and missionaries possible to serve Christ through our denomination.

Since 1994, he has pastored Colquitt Free Will Baptist Church, Colquitt, Georgia. But his activities have taken him far from the south Georgia community where he pastors. He has taught at Bainbridge College in Bainbridge, Georgia, and at Florida State University. He has also been a featured speaker on the FWBBC campus and at ministers retreats in Michigan, Missouri, and Georgia.

As a fifth-generation Free Will Baptist, his interests in theology and history, especially Free Will Baptist history, run deep. Those interests have opened doors for him to both speak and write. He was featured speaker at the Bible College's 1996 Heritage Week series where he spoke on "Free Will Baptists before 1776." He also held a seminar entitled "A Christian Response to Postmodernism" for the Commission for Theological Integrity at the 1998 National Association of Free Will Baptists. His many articles for Contact magazine include "America's First Free

Will Baptists," "Our Tradition of Feet Washing," and "Benjamin Laker: Layman for God." His published books are: A Free Will Baptist Handbook: Heritage, Beliefs, and Ministries (Randall House, 1998) and the forthcoming Four Views on Eternal Security (Zondervan, 2002).

When Rev. Pinson was pastoring in Alabama, he felt God calling him to bivocational ministry: to both pastor and teach. "Thus, I began preparing myself educationally for this dual role," he says. He will take his doctoral comprehensives in January or February, 2002, and plans to be at the college by the end of February. Matt will bring with him his wife, Melinda, and an 18-month-old daughter, Anna.

As he joins the college, he will be working near two former presidents, Dr. Charles Thigpen (the college's third president) and Dr. Tom Malone (its fourth president). Both maintain offices on the campus. Dr. Thigpen serves as promotional director of the Tennessee State Association of Free Will Baptists. Dr. Malone will continue to serve the college as chancellor. FWBBC's first president, Dr. L. C. Johnson, stops by frequently and can be counted on to keep his younger successors well aware of the college's roots.

Board chairman Gary Fry says, "We are grateful to the Lord for His provision for Free Will Baptist Bible College through the many years of its existence. It has been His hand that we have marked, especially in times of important decisions such as the selection of a new president. We are confident that His provision has continued our long line of able leadership at FWBBC with the selection of Matthew Pinson as our fifth president."

**O**n October 1, 2001, Rev. Gary Fry, chairman of the Free Will Baptist Bible College board of trustees, announced that the board has selected James Matthew Pinson to serve as the college's fifth president.

"The Board is certain that Matthew Pinson's dedication to the Lord, this college and our denomination will result in our continuing to produce the leaders and workers our denomination needs," he said.

Rev. Pinson attended the Bible College in 1985-86 and graduated in 1990 from the University of West Florida, pursuing an interest in law. He later received his M.A. at the University of West Florida (1993) and his M.A.R. at Yale University (1994). He is currently completing Ph.D. studies at Florida State University.

Rev. Pinson says: As president of Free Will Baptist Bible College, I am committed to service to our denomination. Our college must not only be interested in what the denomination can do for it. We must

## **OFTEN ASKED QUESTIONS ...**

### **What Is There To Boast About?**

Do religious or moral works make our salvation somehow meritorious? The question addressed centers upon the heart of redemptive theology. Should we take pride in our religious acts or moral uprightness?

"Where, then, is boasting? It is excluded. On what principle? On that of observing the law? No, but on that of faith. For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from observing the law. What does the Scripture say? Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness" (Romans 3:27-28; 4:3, NIV).

The central thrust of the Gospel message is that salvation comes by grace through faith in the work of Jesus Christ. It is very easy to twist or pervert this simple fact. This is what happens when men put heavy stress on works of any kind. Every emphasis within religion has within it the seeds of over-emphasis. The Apostle Paul clearly argues the fact that all men are saved by faith and not by their adherence to law of any kind.

If anyone had something to brag about, Abraham certainly did! He left his homeland at the command of God. He did not continually question the intent of God, although he did not perfectly understand it. He was even willing to give up his promised son, Isaac. Yet, we hear Paul saying: "It was not through the law that Abraham and his offspring received the promise; that he would be the heir of the world, but through the righteousness that comes by faith" (Romans 4:13, NIV).

Paul eloquently and persuasively demonstrates that it was not Abraham's act of submission to circumcision that made him righteous, but his "unwavering belief in God's promise." Abraham's obedience came as a result of his faith; it was his faith that justified him in God's sight just as our faith today is the only basis for our hope of salvation.

Our religion must be more than orthodox doctrine and correct behaviour, more than rules of religion and ritual and codes of conduct. A personal relationship with God is based upon more than outward acts. As believers in Christ, we are baptized, but is baptism anything to boast about? As part of the local church body, we unite with others in church membership, but is this something to brag about? As followers of God's Word, we strive to obey his moral precepts, but are any of us so perfect that we may boast of our good works? The answer is NO to all of these questions! No glory belongs to us!

Our God is the one to boast about; his works are the only ones worthy of emphatic praise. It is his work in Christ for us that we must learn to rely upon, not our own efforts at perfection. And, if such is the case, like King David, let us learn to say,

"I will extol the LORD at all times;  
His praise will always be on my lips.  
My soul will boast in the LORD,  
Let the afflicted hear and rejoice.

Glorify the LORD with me;  
Let us exalt His name together" (Psalm 34:1-3, NIV).

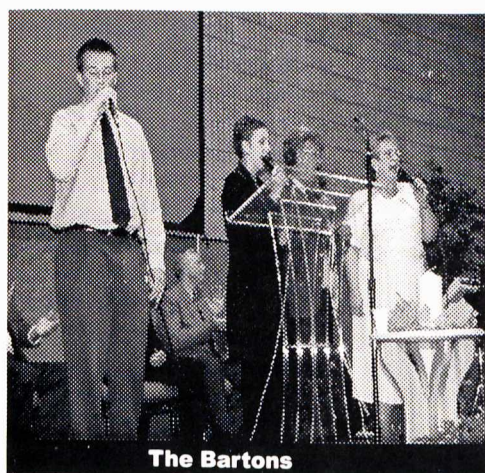
God has richly blessed the United Church and it is actively involved in local, state, and national ministries. May God bless the future labors of the church.

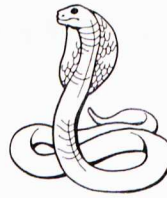




# THE SIN OF APOSTASY

**Apostasy Is A Dangerous Sin.** Hebrews 6:4-6 states, "For it is Impossible for those who were once enlightened, and have tasted of the heavenly gift, and were made partakers of the Holy Ghost, And have tasted the good word of God, and the powers of the world to come, If they shall fall away, to renew them again unto repentance; seeing they crucify to themselves the Son of God afresh, and put him to an open shame " Now here is another description of some folks who had committed apostasy. Notice again in this passage the condition of the persons described here. They were once enlightened, they had tasted the heavenly gift, they had been partakers of the Holy Ghost, they had tasted the powers of heaven and had tasted the good Word of God This is a description of folks who have been born again. This is a description of folks who have received Jesus Christ for salvation, the heavenly gift. This is a description of folks who have received the Holy Ghost. This is a description of folks who have digested the Word of God. This is a description of folks who have experienced the powers of heaven in their souls. These were saved folks who had turned away from these things that saved them!

We have here three factors to fulfill. If we get to heaven it will be only because we have fulfilled these three factors.

First, there is the purpose of the Father given in 2 Peter 3:9 "The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, as some men count slackness; but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance." That is God's purpose for us all! God doesn't want you to go to hell, He wants you to be saved and stay saved.

Secondly, we have the mediation of the Son of God. I Timothy 2:1-8 states, "I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, Intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time

Whereunto I am ordained a preacher, and an apostle, (I speak the truth in Christ, and lie not,-) a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and verity. I will therefore that men pray every where, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and doubting. " The intercessory work of Christ is there for everyone who finds themselves falling back into sin. He is constantly there if we will not walk upon Him, and count the blood of the covenant that saved us an unholy thing, and blaspheme the Holy Spirit of God Who lives in us to mediate between us and Jesus Christ,

And thirdly, there is the work of the Spirit. His purpose is to direct us to the good and away from the evil. We read in John 16:13 "Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come. " And we read in 1 John 4:6 "We are of God: he that knoweth God heareth us; he that is not of God heareth not us. Hereby know we the spirit of truth, and the spirit of error. " God is not going to draw away from us, but we can draw away from God. The Lord Jesus Christ is our Intercessor with God, and God's Holy Spirit is God's Intercessor with us.

Then, we have the fatal fall we must consider. Notice these here described are not those who are trying and make a mistake. These are those who are deliberately dabbling in sin! These are deliberately renouncing their faith and turning from God. These are apostates. You can't get saved accidentally and you can't commit apostasy accidentally. You didn't get saved by good works and you can't become an apostate by evil works. You became a child of God by accepting Jesus Christ as your Savior by faith and you become an apostate by renouncing that act of saving faith and turning back from the One who saved you.

Those Christians who sin accidentally, carelessly and foolishly are not stepping upon Jesus Christ, calling His blood an unholy thing, and blaspheming the Holy Spirit. We all make mistakes. But when we do, God has made a way for forgiveness. I John 2:1-2 states, "My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous: And he is the propitiation for our

sins: and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world. " Don't let the devil deceive you into thinking you have committed apostasy when you have only made a mistake. If you have not deliberately renounced your act of saving faith and profaned the One who saved you, you are not an apostate.

These we are reading about here are falling away deliberately. When we see something coming toward us, we have the option of receiving it or hurling ourselves away deliberately. When the Lord comes to these folks, they hurl themselves away from Him deliberately. They hurl themselves away from His blood. They hurl themselves away from the direction of His Spirit. They hurl themselves away from the warning of God's Word. This is not describing accidents, this is describing deliberate acts.

The impossibility here is not on God's part. Nothing is impossible with God! But the danger of this sin is that not only CAN-NOT these described here come back, THEY WILL NOT come back! How in the world can they come back when they have deliberately hurled themselves away from all that is holy and from every means God has devised to bring them back?

But we also have four failures. Notice them listed here in Hebrews 6:4-6. Verse 4, "They had been once enlightened and have turned back from it" They knew it to be the truth, yet they rejected it and turned from it. Verse 4, "They had tasted of the heavenly gift of salvation through Aesus Christ and had spit it out. " Verse 4, "They had been made partakers of the Holy Ghost and had rejected Him and turned Him out." Verse 5, "They had tasted of the good Word of God and even tasted of of the world to come and spit it out. " How in the world can they come back when they have rejected all that God has?

**Apostasy Is A Sin Of Doom.** Hebrews 10:31 states, "It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God. "

Notice the negative aspect. Hebrews 10:26 states, "For if we sin willfully after that we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins." What does God have left to sacrifice if we reject His only begotten Son?

Notice the positive annihilation. Hebrews 10:27, "But a certain fearful looking for of Judgement and fiery indignation, which shall devour the adversaries " God is saying here that their destruction is certain.

Notice the precluding of acceptance.

by Stephen Ministries faculty. Nearly 40,000 people from 8,000 congregations have attended Stephen Ministries training courses. Participants come from all 50 states, 9 Canadian provinces, and 20 other countries.

Kevin joins five others on the Pastoral Staff of Stephen Ministries. His current responsibilities include directing and teaching at training courses, coordinating Caring Ministry Workshops, writing and editing materials for training and publicity, and providing consultation for Stephen Ministry congregations.

Kevin is excited about working with the Pastoral Staff at Stephen Ministries: "I see this as a wonderful opportunity to use

Hebrews 6:9 warns us, "But beloved, we are persuaded better things of you, and things that accompany salvation though we thus speak "

God is warning us that dabbling in sin is a dangerous business with Him. It is a fearful thing. It brings certain judgment and destruction. It also leads to the sin of apostasy. When you commit that sin, you will not turn back to Him. God in His Omnipotence says you cannot. God in His Omniscience says you will not.

We have four women students (two single and two married). The other ten students are men; this is the finest group of ministerial students we have had since I have been with the semi-

Pray for the students and faculty of the seminary during this semester. We have many, different activities planned. November 15-16 we will have a World Missions Conference. This will give our students and faculty the opportunity to learn about what Christ is doing in many parts of the world and how they can be a part of it.
