Make The Grade Campaign

A STATE-WIDE CAMPAIGN FOR COLLEGE EXPANSION!!



All teen groups in Missouri are encouraged to participate in the **MAKE-THE-GRADE CAMPAIGN** for Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College in Moore, OK and Free Will Baptist Bible College in Nashville, TN. These two Free Will Baptist Colleges are strategically important for the development of future leaders for our churches. Both schools are currently in major expansion programs as they seek to enlarge their facilities and programs to meet the growing educational needs of our young people.

The Missouri Youth Ministries Board is sponsoring this project. The group which raises the most funds in each division will receive free registration to the MO FREE WILL BAPTISTS YOUTH CONFERENCE at Windermere in 2002, Division 1 :Teen Groups with 10 or more participants, Division 2 :Teen Groups with 9 or less participants. In addition to this, the two top individuals who raise the most funds will be awarded a plaque and a portable CD player. Group and individual winners will be recognized at the Missouri State Free Will Baptists Convention in June of 2002 and checks will be presented to college officials.

At the Youth Conference this past November, Pastor Rick Dablemont, Administrator/Instructor of the Missouri Bible Institute, affiliated with Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, under the direction of the Missouri Christian Education Board, presented the project to over sixty youth workers. He also spoke briefly to over 500 Missouri Free Will Baptists teens asking for their prayer and participation in this campaign.

The goal is to average \$300 per teen group from the 184 Missouri churches. If accomplished, it will raise over \$50,000.00 which will be split equally between the two colleges. Pastors and Youth Ministers will have received an informational packet explaining this project by the time you receive this. Pastors, parents, and youth workers are asked to encourage their teens to participate in this project.

Committee Recommends Keith Burden for Executive Secretary

The Executive Committee voted to recommend 48-year-old Oklahoma moderator Keith Burden as executive secretary for the National Association of Free Will Baptists. Reverend Burden pastors First Free Will Baptist Church in Locust Grove, Oklahoma, and serves as National Association clerk.

Burden was one of three candidates interviewed during the Executive Committee's December 5-6 meeting after the Leadership Conference in Nashville. The four-step procedure to elect the executive secretary now moves to step three as the Executive Committee prepares to recommend the Oklahoma pastor to the General Board at the July 2002 national convention in Memphis.

If the General Board concurs with the Executive Committee's decision, that board will then recommend Burden to convention delegates. The executive secretary will be elected by a majority vote of National Association delegates.

Brother Burden is a 1976 graduate of Hillsdale FVVB College. He began pastoring in 1975 and has served six churches (five in Oklahoma, one in California).

He was elected moderator of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists in October 2000. He previously served 15 years as clerk of the Oklahoma State Association and 18 years as assistant clerk of the National Association.

Keith and Debbie Burden have two children, Jennie (24) and Katie (17). Debbie, daughter of the late Reverend Jerry Dudley, also graduated from Hillsdale. She is a church pianist and children's choir director. Debbie served seven years on the Hillsdale College Board of Trustees and is a leader in Oklahoma Women Active for Christ.

The night was filled with a packed house, great old fanny stories, and a fun reunion of former members. Also on the program was one of the members new group called "New Creation" from Melbourne, Arkansas.

Curt and Linda Barton started this group in Salem, Arkansas, thirty years ago. They named the group "Gospel Generation Singers". They both had been raised in gospel music and had even met through this great music.

Down through the years, many members came and went. Many will remember Ada Faye (Edmonson)Bozeman, Dwight Hickman, Eddie Hickman, Ronnie Barton, Jan (Reeves)Johnson, Loren Barton, Dan Wrenfrow, Dave Whitby (who enjoyed the night from heaven's streets), Gary, Joyce, & Matthew Smith, and Randall Lovelace. Almost all of them were there for this event. What a fun night.

Twelve years ago their daughter Andrea, who was eleven at that time, stepped in to take on the job of lead singer. Their son, Adam, who was seven at the time, found home with the drums. Since that day, Gospel Generation has been made a legal name, they have performed two years in the Branson theaters, made four recording projects, hosted many concerts themselves as well as sang with endless number of other groups, featured at the Baxter County-Arkansas fair-Gospel night for five years and on and on.

Since it's now a family group many folks just like to call Gospel Generation - the Bartons. " It really doesn't matter what we are called," says Curtis, "as long as you know WHO we are singing about." So the Bartons of Gospel Generation Ministries keep on singing, writing, and performing gospel music where the Lord may lead and open doors.

In January 2002, the Bartons will have their first national radio single that will be introduced by "New City Talent". The song

Many folks know about the health problems Linda has had over the past two years. In May of 2000, she had an inner ear tumor removed leaving her deaf in her left ear. In August of 2000 she had more health problems with a combination of diseases working against her immune system, leaving her having to have much daily rest. But the Bartons say "We are not defeated." "God is not finished with us yet." The song writing, the determination, the harmony, and the excitement is better than ever. Andrea now a college graduate of 2000, starting her own Karate school as well as working with her dad's business, Adam now a freshman in college, Curtis now owning two businesses in town, where the children help, says that we're all expecting something good to come out of this. This is where the title of the latest recording comes from-"Come Out Singing."

The Bartons attend the United Free Will Baptist Church in West Plains, Mo. For the past three years they have helped with a mini-concert/praise & worship service at the 8:15 morning service. Starting with sixty-one wonderful folks almost four years ago, the early service has grown to over two hundred every Sunday. This service has just enhanced the Sunday services at United Free Will. Pastor Glenn Murray, Assoc. Pastor Clarence Burton, and the whole congregation have been great supporters of this early morning service, the Bartons annual November concerts, as well as all the great services at the church.

What does the future hold for The Bartons of Gospel Generation Ministries? "Only God knows that answer," says Linda. "We want to be ready for whatever door should open. That means we have to study and write better meaningful songs, stay healthy, listen better, and be a Christian witness wherever we go." Wherever you see and hear the Bartons you will know it is not just fun and games, they're very serious about the work they've been given. "But we have learned one thing..we have to "Stand Back" and let the Lord take over." "We hope folks will call their radio stations in January and request this great song."

At the Winter 2002 Teacher Training Seminar, you will learn how to:

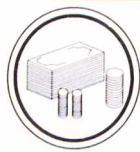
- set achievable goals for your class
