# SPEAKERS FOR THE 89TH SESSION OF THE MISSOURI STATE ASSOCIATION

he 89th session of the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists will be held June 3 - 5, 2002, at the Cowan Civic Center in Lebanon, Missouri. The theme of this year's convention is "Comprehending the Scope of His Love." Four speakers - Rev. Rick Dablemont, Rev. Lee Neill, Rev. Dale Cochran, and Rev. James Forlines - will develop the theme.

The Monday evening message will be delivered by former Moderator, Rev. Rick Dablemont. The Missouri native was born in Licking, Missouri. He has pastored two churches since answering the call to preach, the Big Creek Free Will Baptist Church, 1982 - 1983 the Cuba Free Will Baptist Church since 1984. Brother Rick has served as Assistant Clerk, Clerk, Assistant Moderator, Moderator, General Board member and Executive Committee member of the Missouri State Association. He presently serves as Director of the Missouri Bible Institute program and as a Trustee of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. He has also held a number of offices in the South Central District Associa-

Brother Dablemont holds a Bachelor of Arts decree in Psychology and Language Arts from the University of Missouri - Rolla, Missouri and a Master of Arts degree from Covenant Thological Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri.

Rick and his wife, Judy (J.J) have four children, Roderic, Rochelle, Jacob, and Jonathon.

The Christian Education Board will be sponsoring a workshop with Rev. Rob Morgan Tuesday morning. Rob Morgan pastors the Donelson Free Will Baptist Church in Nashville, Tennessee. He has written 12 books, including the *Preacher's Sourcebook*, an annual publication of sermon ideas and outlines for pastors and Christian workers.

Rev. Lee Neill will fill the pulpit Tuesday evening. He was born in Monett, Missouri, and was converted in 1950, and ordained to preach in 1978 at the Macedonia Free Will Baptist Church. He has pastored the Macedonia church since 1977. Lee has also served the Indian Creek Association in a number of leadership roles and as a member of the General Board of the state association.

Brother Neill received a Bachelor of Sci-

ence degree in Education from Southwest Missouri State University in 1961 and a Master of Science degree in Guidance and Counseling from the same school. He is presently working on a Doctor's degree at the American Seminary in Oklahoma.

He and his wife Darline have five children: Rick, Cindy, Mark, Russ, and Amy.

The Wednesday morning worship service will have Rev. Dale Cochran delivering the message. He was born in Waynesville, Missouri, converted in 1979, and ordained to preach in 1982. Dale attended Hannibal La Grange College in Hannibal and received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Biblical Studies from the Institute for Christian Workers Bible College. He pastored the First Free Will Baptist Church in Rolla (1981-1987). He served as a State Home Missionary and founded the Hannibal Free Will Baptist Church in Hannibal, Missouri and led the church to self-support status. (1987-present).

Brother Dale has served as a member of the Missouri State General Board, Moderator of the South Central and Mid-Rivers Associations, and on the Executive boards of those associations.

Dale and his wife Barbara have three daughters, Kimberly, Tonya, and Tina.

Rev. James Forlines, General Director of the Free Will Baptist Foreign Missions Department, will be our speaker for the Wednesday evening service. He was born in Nashville, Tennessee, and ordained to the ministry in 1980.

Brother. James is a 1980 graduate of Free Will Baptist Bible College, and he did graduate work at Free Will Baptist Bible College and the Anderson School of Theology. James served as Youth Pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church in Gastonia, North Carolina (1980-1982). He then pastored two churches: the First Free Will Baptist Church in Chesterfield, Indiana (1982-1986), and the Allen Chapel Free Will Baptist Church in Batesville, Arkansas (1986-1998). #### IT'S TIME TO FREAK OUT YOUR NEIGHBORS!

Sometimes the path of life is narrow and we bump head on into people who just don't like us. Some people in fact really dislike us, even hate us, and mistreat us. When we are hated, cursed or despitefully used, the normal human reaction is to lash out, to return the insult, to strike back, to seek revenge.

Jesus gives this advice:

"But I say unto you that hear, Love your enemies, do good to them who hate you, Bless them that curse you, and pray for them who despitefully use you." (Luke 6: 27-28, KJV)

Our culture cries out today, "If you want to survive, get tough, be bad, get in their face, get even!" It seems almost like we are in a continual contest for who can be the meanest, the baddest dude in town! But it never solves problems; it only adds fuel to the flames of hatred. Misunderstandings grow larger, violence increases, and the list of tragedies grows longer and longer!

Quite to the contrary, Jesus says, LOVE, DO GOOD, BLESS & PRAY FOR YOUR ENEMIES. He also says it PAYS to do this: "Love your enemies and do good...your reward shall be great...and ye shall be the sons of the Highest, for he is kind unto the unthankful and to the evil" (Luke 6:35, KJV).

As Christians, we are in the FREAKING OUT BUSINESS. God intends for us to STUN and SUR-PRISE people with repeated acts of undeserved charity, mercy, and kindness for this is precisely what Jesus Christ did for each of us. While we were His enemies, separated and alienated from Him, He still loved us and acted on our behalf. It is a sad comment on our society that although



### Free Will Baptist National Convention to Meet in Memphis

The National Association of Free Will Baptists meets in Memphis, Tennessee, July 21-25, 2002, for its 66th annual session. Executive Secretary Melvin Worthington says he expects 8,000 delegates and visitors from 40 states at Memphis Convention Center for the five-day meeting. For the eighth time, Tennessee's 22,000 members and 223 churches will host the national convention. The National Association first met in Tennessee in 1935 (Nashville), then returned to Nashville in 1938, 1943, 1951, 1662, 1971 and 1985.

The National Association of Free Will Baptists includes 2,500 churches and 215,000 members in 40 states. The denomination supports 114 missionaries in 10 foreign countries and 78 home missionaries in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico.

National convention delegates are expected to approve denominational budgets which will exceed \$22 million. Moderator Carl Cheshier (president of Hillsdale FWB College in Moore, Oklahoma) will gavel the voting body through electing 30 board and commission members and general officers. Each national agency and commission will submit an annual report to delegates during the two-day convention business session on Wednesday and Thursday.

One major business concern will be electing a new executive secretary to succeed Melvin Worthington who has held the post 23 years. Oklahoma pastor Keith Burden will be recommended to the General Board as Worthington's successor. The decision goes on to the voting delegates Wednesday morning as one of the first items of business in Memphis. The 2002 convention theme is "Obedience: Our Obligation." Four ministers, including a military chaplain, will deliver major addresses: Alton Loveless (Tennessee), Carl Cheshier (Oklahoma), Colonel Kerry Steedley (Chaplain), Melvin Worthington (Tennessee) and Curtis Linton (Oklahoma).

Meeting simultaneously with the National Association are the 35th annual National Youth Conference, with an expected 2,500 registrants and the 67th annual Women Nationally Active for Christ (WNAC) Convention with more than 1,000 women anticipated.

The four-day National Youth Conference (NYC) which includes Bible competitive activities as well as a music and arts festival will rally around the theme, "Jesus 24/7: All His Ways, All My Days." NYC will conduct separate worship services for youth at Memphis Convention Center. Numerous seminars are scheduled for attendees.
