SEVEN WAYS A FATHER CAN IMPROVE LEADERSHIP IN THE FAMILY Hans and Donna Finzel

1. Pray! Above all, my dad is a man of prayer. He and Mom prayed for each of us and our future mates, even before our births. Every problem was prayed about, every need brought before God.

2. Listen! From the time your children are young, make time to give them your undivided attention. This should be on a regular basis so they feel you truly care. I still treasure the breakfasts out with Daddy when I had with him alone, and I continue to enjoy those rare occasions we can be together.

3. Put your family first. Learn how to

set aside your work - leave it at the office, and build a relationship with your family. That will establish important memories for each child.

4. Love them unconditionally. Encourage your children to be who God wants them to be. Ask the Lord to show you the special needs of each child, and then be creative in leading them to grow.

5. Live what you believe. That does not mean you have to be perfect. Just be willing to walk according to God's Word, and ask forgiveness from your kids or wife if you blow it by your words or actions. Then start over again.

6. Seize the moment. Make the time, and tune into those teachable moments with your kids. Share your heart. Be sure you tell your kids your own spiritual journey, and explain why you choose to do what you do (go to church, not go certain places, etc.). Be sure to pray together with your kids about their problem or situation. And ask them to pray for you, giving specific needs or requests you have as well.

7. Take time alone with each child to focus on him or her. Talk through withyour spouse each of your visions of theneeds and gifts of each child, and get alone with each one on a regular basis. If possible, schedule one or two of your business trips a year to include one of your children.

Relief Tips for Guilty Fathers:

Lower your expectations and do what you can do.

Think bite-size pieces: start with having family devotions, maybe just once or twice a week. Use a creative devotional book to help you, and pray together. Today's Christian bookstores are filled with great family devotional aids. Then come up with a list of annual minimal goals for what you would like to do with

DO IT SECRETLY!

esus said, "Be careful not to do your acts of righteousness before men, to be seen by them...do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing...your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you" (Matthew 6:1,3,4, NIV).

Jesus emphasized to his disciples by word and deed the "spiritual discipline of secrecy." God is always concerned primarily about the reason or motive behind our actions. As followers of Christ, we are to take notice of the example of Christ and apply it in every facet of life. The doing of good deeds and charitable acts are to be done for the glory of God and not for self-aggrandizement, personal advancement, nor even self-satisfaction. When we act in character with Christ, we unselfishly are to be motivated by love, compassion, kindness, generosity, and mercy.

Thinking of the welfare of others and acting on their behalf does not require the applause or approval of men. We are to be more concerned with pleasing God. We all enjoy a compliment, we all have a need for recognition, but the doing of what is good and right is a reward in itself. If our good deeds go unnoticed on earth, one thing for sure, they are never missed in heaven. "In the practice of secrecy, we experience a continuing relationship with God independent of the opinions of men." 1

We have learned the discipline of secrecy when we are content with what God knows we are and are not worried about what men think we are. This is easier said than done. Constant attention must be focused upon ourselves inwardly as we honestly examine our motives for our actions. Contrary to the example of Christ, our culture tells us today that we must be patted on the back for every good thing we do. The truth is we do not make ourselves better by doing good, nor are we made better by men telling us we have done good. Thomas a' Kempis said it this way: Thou are not holier though thou be praised nor the more vile though thou be blamed or dipraised. What thou art, that thou art, that God knoweth thee to be and thou canst be said to be no greater ... He that seeketh no outward witness for himself, it appeareth openly that he hath committed himself all wholly to God.²

The Apostle John wrote about walking in light, "But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin" (I John 1:7 NKJV).

First, one must personally know Jesus Christ in order to be walking in His "light". Jesus said, "If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our home with him"(John 14:23).

Second, as you abide in Jesus Christ and trust in Him you have true, unbroken fellowship with other believers. Worship regularly with other believers.

- the children to provide spiritual influence. Be honest with your children about your struggles, and ask them for their input. Confession is good for not only your soul, but theirs.
- Make this area a part of your accountability group.
- Beg, borrow, and steal any good ideas you can find from other fathers who seem to make this work.
- If you fail, just start over. The future is a blank check you can invest how you decide.

Support Tips for Wives and Mothers

- Learn to back off. Work at allowing your husband the freedom and room to lead.
- Learn to back up. Pray for your husband, for the Lord to help him lead spiritually, and remember to support him when he does take the initiative.
- When you both fail (not if you fail), get back up and give it another try. Don't feel defeated. Starting over is always better than giving up.

Because of that, the church's lawyer also agreed to attend. After a lengthy discussion, the city's lawyer agreed to withdraw their appeal to the Supreme Court and grant permission to build if the church would agree not to pursue legal recourse for economic remuneration. That means they realize they were wrong, and that the church could very possibly win a case seeking damages. However, they also emphasized the reality that their appeal could take years to resolve. Their reasoning for the church is that this will save the church time and allow it to build sooner. The church members will be meeting this Sunday to make a decision, and then return to give the mayor their answer this next week. The city's lawyer will have to write and present its proposal to the church, and the church will take the proposal to their lawyer, make a decision, and then return another time to the mayor with both lawyers present.

We believe this is very positive and therefore a praise item. At the same time, we ask you to please continue to pray for the process. We'll keep you updated.


As we have struggled with discouragement and delays we have reminded one another. This is Gcd's church. He has a Purpose; He has a Plan, and He is in Control.




VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR NATIONAL CONVENTION
