REPORT OF THE SPANISH MINISTRY OF THE CARTHAGE CHURCH

About one year ago the Free Will Baptist Church of Carthage launched into a whole new type of ministry as they began the first Spanish speaking Free Will Baptist Church is Missouri. Under the leadership of Rev. Jim Williams, the church gained a vision for this needed ministry. The Carthage area has experienced significant growth in Spanish speaking people.



The church averages between 15 and 30 in attendances each week. 18 people have been saved, baptized, and united with the Church. In fact, our Church just this year has brought a man from our Spanish Church into leadership by asking him to serve on our Church Trustee Board.

It is truly rewarding, exciting and sometimes challenging to be involved in such an undertaking. When we have a fellowship dinner or a special service, our Spanish speaking Church is a part of it. Although the language is a barrier when we meet together, we have a lot of fun with it. When we had our Christmas 'Fun For All Gift Exchange' which allows a person to take a gift someone else has, all of our folks began calling out "robar" which means 'steal' in Spanish. A great time was had by all!







I appreciate the opportunity to share a few challenging thoughts about missions with you in the GEM. Since returning from Brazil last summer, many people have asked about the Sao Jose church that was planted during our last term. The Sao Jose church, in Campinas, Brazil is under Brazilian leadership. Please continue to remember Pastor Osmir in your prayers. For the next few months I want to share some things that will hopefully enlighten, strengthen and increase our vision and participation in Missouri missions and around the globe!

This month I would like to share some introductory thoughts. My wife hates it when I throw out a project or an idea to her and then expect a quick response and decision from her about it. Maybe your are like that too. Unfortunately, many times when it comes to our missions, we feel like we need more time or more information before we make a DECISION.

I remember my first Mission Conference as a student at Hillsdale FWB College. Missionary Robert Bryan preached from Acts 1:8 and asked the student body these questions. If not you, then who? If not now, then when? If not here, then where? He called upon us to make a DECISION that night.

We need to make a DECISION. When I say we, I mean each of us as individual Christians, as FWB Churches, as associations in the SHOW-ME State.This is the DECISION that we need to make. What will we do with our sons (and daughters), our shares and our society?

When I say sons, I mean our children and grandchildren who will be the future leaders in our churches, our denomination and our world. Where will we encourage them to receive their college education? What experiences will we expose them to? What will make them think and act like World Christians (not worldly Christians!)? What challenges will we set before them as they consider their responsibility in impacting their world?

When I say our shares, I am referring to the SHOW-ME plan in MO, and your part in global evangelization taking place in Brazil, Cuba, Panama, France, Spain, Ivory Coast, India, Japan, Uruguay and the regions beyond. When was the last time you wrote a letter to a SHOW-ME missionary? The SHOW-ME missionaries need your financial support through your shares, but they need you to SHARE with them from your heart and share encouragement for their ministries also.

When I say society, we must ask ourselves some serious questions. Do we have relevant, cross-cultural ministries? Do we work at developing the relationships that need to be nurtured with the people we are trying to reach? Do we have a plan to reach the WORLD that has moved in next door to us? Do we see these people as our new cross-cultural friends or foes?

All of these questions should lead us to ask more questions. What is our responsibility to the world around us? To the world next door? To the millions that have yet to hear the gospel? What DECISION will you make as an individual, as a church or as an association to reach the lost, disciple the saved and send the called? If not you, then who? If not now, then when? If not here, then where?

Free Will Baptist Bible College And Relocation

Have you heard? Enrollment is up at Free Will Baptist Bible College! The college registered a 13% increase in student enrollment this year as compared to 2001-2002. We are grateful that God is sending students to our school, and we are grateful for a corresponding increase in general fund gifts. Both are factors that relate to the eventual relocation of the college.

Some are wondering where we are in the relocation process. Because of a declining enrollment in several previous years and the withdrawal last year of Watkins Institute's offer to buy the campus, the Board of Trustees of the college voted to put relocation plans on hold. President Matt Pinson reported to the National Association of Free Will Baptists (July 2002):

"Money given for relocation has been well invested. The progress and work that has occurred up to this point will enable us, when the time is right, to proceed with relocation. Funds received for relocation will continue to be wisely invested. We are poised for growth, and relocation is still a part of our long-range plan."

So, what is being done at the college in the meantime? If you were to step on campus today, you would see significant changes from a few years ago. Buildings have been and are being renovated. Extensive paving has been done. The grounds are the best they have been in years. But none of this is being done at the expense of relocation. *Relocation* gifts will continue to be held until conditions are right for the move. *Renovation* funds have come from alumni and friends of the college and from money borrowed for this purpose. Is renovation a good investment? A recent appraisal of one newly renovated building shows that its value has increased \$2 for every \$1 invested in renovation!

When will the college move? We will keep tracking enrollment, since that is the most powerful force driving relocation. The need for more space will tell us it is time to move. The marketing of the present campus will also play an important role, since funds from its sale will be needed to pay for construction. In addition, general fund and relocation giving will have to be adequate for the transition to a new campus. Those three factors—enrollment, the campus sale, and financial support—will tell us when it is time to move.

As of the end of 2002, the college has received \$1.2 million in relocation gifts. Nearly all of this went into architectural drawings and engineering fees, which are currently assets of the college. The expenses of the campaign were also paid from relocation gifts. By the way, thanks to Missionary TECH Team, architectural plans were drawn at about half the cost of most projects of this magnitude.

We are grateful for the support of our Free Will Baptist people. Pray for us as we determine God's timetable for resuming the campus relocation.


FWBBC APPROVES NEW DEGREE PROGRAM

NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE—Free Will Baptist Bible College's board of trustees have approved a new degree completion program to be offered by the college. The program will target adults with at least two years of college training who want to complete requirements for graduation. It will be offered in 5-week, 4-hour evening modules that will enable students to earn a bachelor's degree in 19-24 months. The college expects to have the program in place by the fall of 2003.

The board additionally approved two new programs in Teacher Education. The two-year Associates Degree in Early Childhood includes a paraprofessional certification program in early childhood for individuals interested in becoming professional childcare providers. The four-year Bachelor of Science program in Early Childhood includes a PreK-4 licensure for students desiring to teach younger children in grades preschool through fourth and qualifies graduates to direct preschool childcare programs.

Trustees authorized a major renovation of Welch Library. The \$150,000 face-lift is due to begin next summer and could take a year or more. It will include a new roof, a wiring upgrade, new carpet and more.

The college's trustees met on campus December 4-5. Members of the board are Rev. Gary Fry (chairman), Rev. Richard Barnes, Mr. Greg Ketteman, Rev. Archie Ratliff, Mr. A.C. Allen, Rev. Billy Hanna, Rev. Terry Pierce, Dr. Steve Ashby, and Rev. Gene Outland

- 7. A change in size, color or complexion when asked, "Are you an active, participating member of your church?"
