# Secendiquity

ast week my husband and I were invited to attend the Missouri State Missionary Retreat. What a treat! We had the opportunity to travel up to Lebanon, Missouri; spend the night in a nice hotel; visit the Free Will Baptist Book Store; and spend part of a couple of days visiting and learning from our Missouri State Mission Board and other missionaries who are at work in Missouri. Trips like that are one of the blessings of doing the kind of work we do, and always seem to come at times just when we need to retreat a little. But, this trip had another wonderful surprise in store, something that took us back several years.

In early 1989, in the bitter winter time, we received a call from a Lutheran church in Tulsa, asking if we could help them with some translation for family that had just arrived from Honduras. This church maintained a little "safe house" to receive refugees who were waiting for disposition of their status in the country. The family had been referred to them from the Texas border



but, no one at the church could communicate with them.

In Tegucigalpa, Honduras, several men broke into their house, tied up the lady, her mother and daughter, dragged her brother away and threatened them. They never heard from the young man again and believe that he must have been killed. They never knew why, nor who the men were, but feared that they would come back again since the three of them had been witnesses.

With increasing fear for their safety, the mother left three of her children with relatives and ran away with the oldest daughter, her nephew and youngest son. Afraid they would be seen leaving, they climbed out a back window of their house, with only the clothing on their backs and what little money they could scrape together quickly.

The trip across Guatemala and Mexico had been difficult. They slept on the ground and under bridges, finding a bit of work where they could so they could eat, and then moving on. For several months the lady and the children walked and worked their way from Honduras. Once they reached the US border they were immediately seized by US Immigration officials. Afraid they would be returned to Tegucigalpa and more danger, they requested political asylum.

Since the government of Honduras is a Democracy, their case would have to be reviewed. Those reviews take time, and there is quite a waiting period before they can even begin. So the family was turned over to an Shelter organization that provided housing for folks in just this situation.



# MONETT WELCOMES NEW CHURCH AND NEW PASTOR

The Monett community is pleased to welcome a new place of worship that opened recently for the Hispanic public. Iglesia Bautista de Libre Albedrio, the Free Will Baptist Church, is located on Hwy BB, 1/2 mile east of Midway between Monett and Purdy, and began with their first service on Sunday morning, January 19, at 10 a.m.

Pastor Bud Bivens is a former high school teacher and counselor, speaker, and retired State Farm Insurance agent who along with his wife Ruth, a retired registered nurse, both pictured above, has traveled extensively in Central and South America and Mexico.

As one of President John F. Kennedy's first Peace Corps recruits in 1963, Pastor Bevins spent a lot of time in Bolivia where he became interested in the Hispanic people, language, and culture, and accepted many more missions there.

Between 1987 and 1993, the Bivens'made 19 medical mission trips to Honduras and Nicaragua, and during 1994-95 made 34 trips to Mexico. They returned to Mexico, 1995—98, to build churches including one in Reynosa, Mexico. Both of the Bivens'sons married Hispanic women, and his son John and daughter-in-law Paulina run an orphanage in Piedras, Negras, Mexico, that cares for 28 children.

In preparing their new ministry here, the Bivens' gained the help of the Indian Creek Association of Free Will Baptists who provided practical help with the church building and financial assistance for the ministry.

Several visitors braved the snow to share in the afternoon dedication service.



# NATIONAL HOME MISSIONS NEEDING HELP

Excerpt from an e-mail sent by Home Missions Director Larry Powell

"These are perilous times in our country with the treat of terrorism and war looming on the horizon. These uncertainties are having a negative impact on our economy as well as Home Missions. Since September 11 our income has steadily declined. Our income in 2001 was 4.9 million and last year in 2002 it was 4.1 million, an 800 thousand difference. (However, our spending decreased some with all the drastic cuts I made.) Our Benjamin Randall offering was near \$50,000 short this year. Missionary accounts during January were in deficit \$94,273.95 with a total deficit for the month of \$136,305.00 for the month."

I am informing our people that the Home Missions Board has frozen salaries and that we have trimmed and trimmed and made some deep cuts here in the office to do our part. Our staff will be working hard to help change this picture. Thank you very much for your prayers and support. I appreciate you so very much. Thanks for your partnership and concern!



The women were also included in the friendly competition. They were encouraged to bring a decorated dish of food to be judged not on the basis of


taste or eve appeal but rather on the amount of votes they received at twenty-five cents a vote. Leona Livingston won the prize for the prettiest



# FREE WILL BAPTIST BIBLE COLLEGE APPROVES NEW DEGREE PROGRAM

NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE—Free Will Baptist Bible College's board of trustees have approved a new degree completion program to be offered by the college. The program will target adults with at least two years of college training who want to complete requirements for graduation. It will be offered in 5-week, 4-hour evening modules that will enable students to earn a bachelor's degree in 19-24 months. The college expects to have the program in place by the fall of 2003.

The board additionally approved two new programs in Teacher Education. The two-year Associates Degree in Early Childhood includes a paraprofessional certification program in early childhood for individuals interested in becoming professional childcare providers. The four-year Bachelor of Science program in Early Childhood includes a PreK-4 licensure for students desiring to teach younger children in grades preschool through fourth and qualifies graduates to direct preschool childcare programs.

Trustees authorized a major renovation of Welch Library. The \$150,000 face-lift is due to begin next summer and could take a year or more. It will include a new roof, a wiring upgrade, new carpet and more.

The college's trustees met on campus December 4-5. Members of the board are Rev. Gary Fry (chairman), Rev. Richard Barnes, Mr. Greg Ketteman, Rev. Archie Ratliff, Mr. A.C. Allen, Rev. Billy Hanna, Rev. Terry Pierce, Dr. Steve Ashby, and Rev. Gene Outland. **6**

When my husband went to the house he found the mother, her 14 year old daughter, her 12 year old nephew and her 5 year old son. huddled together in the cold, and scared to death. He helped them get the groceries they needed to eat, and assisted the group from the church in providing them with the basic things they needed to live. He took the children to their different schools and helped them get enrolled and made sure they knew how to get there and back and had the supplies they needed. Once he was sure they were okay, he left them, promising to check back in on them. The next day he went back and took me along.

We saw them frequently, and made ourselves available if they needed help in any way. Every cold snap their pipes froze and my husband ran over to thaw out pipes or make repairs. I remember one day when we dropped in to find that the kitchen sink was stopped up. Not knowing that grease would solidify in the cold pipes, they had poured lard down the sink drain.

As the winter ended, we planned family outings with them, trips to the zoo, picnics, even a trip to swim in Saline Creek. Evelyn, the daughter, found a special place in our hearts. She came to the house for weekends, and loved calling us her Grand-parents.

When time for their hearing came, my husband drove them to Oklahoma City. He listened as they told their story, and as they received the verdict. Their asylum was denied. They had thirty days to leave the country. They appealed the decision, and then before the next hearing date, they disappeared.

In time we heard from them again. Evelyn, at age 15, had married a man who claimed to be a preacher. She had a baby boy with Down's Syndrome and her mother had also married and had a little girl. The babies were two or three months old the last time I saw them, in an apartment in Tulsa. That was in late 1990.

Over the next few years Evelyn called my husband's office occasionally. We knew that Evelyn's family had **8**  moved to Houston and the nephew had been adopted by a man in Tulsa. When we left Tulsa for the mission field in 1995 all contact with them ended.

Last Monday, in Lebanon Missouri, to begin our missionary retreat, the Mission Board invited us all to lunch. We drove a few blocks from the Missouri Free Will Baptist State Offices to a Western Sizzler Restaurant. As we all stood around waiting a turn at the buffet table, I saw my husband make a little side trip. He is always on the lookout for some Hispanic and will go and strike up a conversation with them. I had just picked up my salad plate when I heard him call my name. Over by the coffee pots in the corner of the dining room he was waving frantically for me to come. I set the dish down and walked over. There he was, smiling from ear to ear, his hands on the shoulders of a stocky little Hispanic lady. "Look,!" he exclaimed. "It's Evelyn!"

I could not believe my eyes nor ears. There she stood. The little girl who had been so close to us, and disappeared from our lives so quickly. We all three laughed and hugged and laughed and hugged again.

When my husband saw a Hispanic lady filling water glasses he immediately went over and spoke to her in Spanish. "Buenos Dias" he said. "Hello" she answered in English. Then, in Spanish, he asked her, "Do you speak Spanish?" She looked up at him, stepped back, looked him over again, and asked, "Are you Bud?"

Evelyn waited on the tables for our group in a private dining room, and Bud was proud to get up and tell everyone who she is and how we know her. The folks in the room applauded, and Evelyn smiled proudly. As we got ready to leave we made sure that we had one another's telephone number, and directions to each other's homes.

On Tuesday as soon as the meeting ended we headed out to visit Evelyn. It happened to be her day off and she greeted us at the door of her mobile home out in the country west of Lebanon. We played with her two youngest boys while she brought us up to date on her family. Her first husband certainly did not display the life style one expects of a preacher, and after several escapades, she divorced him. She and her present husband are members of a large Pentecostal church in Lebanon, where she sings in the choir. They are both involved in the work and enjoy attending the annual retreats for the men's and women's groups. Evelyn has five children. The three oldest are in school, and her oldest son Jason, 12, has learned to write his name!

After a short visit we headed out for Springfield where we looked for a particular Mexican restaurant. There we asked for one special waiter, the five year old boy. He is a fine young man now, 19 years old, working to support his mother. He was delighted to see us, and had some time between customers to visit with us and share


