The retreat began Friday afternoon with a warm welcome from state president Shirley Jackson and lively congregational singing lead by Debbie Beck. Special music was presented by four churches: First Free Will Baptist of Ozark, Crossroads Free Will Baptist of Lebanon, Mt. Zion Cuba, and Mt. Pisgah of Cabool. Reva Baker narrated a power point presentation explaining the mission of Women Active for Christ. This was followed by skit featuring Diana Anderson and Sandy Wright.

The theme of the Retreat was "Walking Worthy." Groups from across the state were challenged to buy a step to Kansas City for \$25 in order to raise the remaining \$1,500.00 needed to host the national WAC convention in July of 2004. As usual, Missouri women accepted the challenge, and over \$2,200 was pledged.

On Friday evening the ladies were introduced to Viney Mae from Kentucky. After a fun time of side-splitting comedy, Viney Mae introduced the group to her Savior in both story and song.

On Saturday another guest appeared. This time it was Mary, the mother of Jesus, as an elderly Jewish woman recalling special events in her life. Tears in abundance flowed as we shared this special woman's experience.

Terri Peacock was superb in both roles as she expertly assumed each personality. She used both music and dialogue to entertain, educate, and always to present Jesus as the Savior.

Rehkop, who lives in Clinton, MO, for the balance of the trip.

The President of the Indian Bible College is Richard Standley. He and his wife Barbara, and son Isaac, were away on itenary. They are originally from Madison, Ccnnty, MO.

The initial goal of this trip was to put up a chain link fence around the Bible College. Before this could be accomplished, an old wooden fence, built in 1956, had to be torn down, so there was plenty of work for the skilled and the unskilled. The new fence was erected and other work was also completed. This consisted of a fence around the married students residences, and a double door was put in at the back entrance of the college. This door was painted by Jennifer, Katie, and Melinda. A roof was placed Over an outside stairway entrance of the college, and one of the trailers received new underpinning.

Thelma Sikes and Gloria Sikes took advantage of the college kitchen and made nourishing meals for the group, three time a day. They also did the grocery shopping. Two ladies, Helen and Martha, who are employees of the college, fixed Navajo Tacos

for one of the meals. There were devotions for the morning and evening meals, led by various people.

Regular worship services were held during this journey. Brother Joe Pogue led a Bible Study. Rev. Darin Alvis held the Sunday night service and Elder Lindell Sikes led the Wednesday night Prayer Meeting. Rev. Alvis played the piano and Sister Sharon Pogue was the Song Leader. Services were held in the Bible College chapel.

The group went to the Grand Canyon on Wednesday. It was a new experience for most of the group. They took their lunch with them, but they ate at the Sizzler's steak house that evening to give the cooks a night off.

It was back to work on Thursday morning. They placed a porch and steps in front of one of the trailers and boxed around a chimney flue in tho college, giving it a neater appearance. That evening they drove around the country side trying to see deer and other wild life.

Friday morning the group left for home, all but the Sikes. They left on vacation to tour the western states. On the way home the group drove to the rim of the Arizona meteor crater, and drove through the painted desert and the petrified forest national parks.



Greetings to you our faithful supporter of God's work in the Mile High city. It's been a few months since you've heard from us, and we have several things to report.

We continue to add new families to our fellowship. Two more have committed to us over the summer months and while this is normally the season for a summer "slump", we've enjoyed a summer "surge". Our average attendance has increased since the spring!

We were blessed to have two youth groups visit us over the summer. Eastside FWB Church in Dothan, Alabama and Skyridge FWB Church in Noble, Oklahoma both made visits to Mile High and what a great blessing they were. We appreciate both groups for stopping by during their time in Colorado. We hope their youth saw the need for more Free Will Baptist Churches in states like Colorado and how Home Missions works.

We now have five additional candidates for baptism. Our baptism actually broke down after our first few baptisms since I don't think the machinery had been used in a while! That all has changed and we've since made the necessary repairs to baptize the remainder of our candidates.

We've been blessed to have some great guest preachers like Revs. Richard Adams and Larry Powell from Home Missions and Rev. Wesley Rider from Wentzville, Missouri. What a blessing they were to our fellowship!

There's still much to be done for sure but all in all, the summer months have been great. God is building his church here in Denver and we need your prayer and financial support to keep it going. Thanks so much for all you do for us!

Nevada Mission News

We want to say a big thank you to those of you who are and will be praying and helping to support our ministry here in Nevada. I know that you would like a report of what is going on here. We have been averaging between 28-34 for the last couple of months. Our services have been wonderful and exciting. During July we had our first Bible School. We averaged around 43 kids with 28 on Monday and 58 on Friday. We truly were blessed as each day the children responded to the Gospel. By the end of the week we had 32 professions of faith. Please pray for us as we continue to follow-up on those children. Some of them are now coming to church on a regular basis. Praise the Lord!

We need your help, we and our people need your prayers and if possible your financial support. I spend 4-5 days a week working in Arkansas. This has been a hindrance to the growth of our church. I believe that if I could spend more time at home we might be able to keep some of those who have come and gone, as well as bring more people in. I need very much to be here in Nevada more but as it stands, I have not been able to find adequate work to allow me to be here full-time. So much of the work has been left to my family as I am forced to go on the road to work. I ask you, the people of Missouri, to pray to the Lord about helping the Free Will Baptist Church in Nevada, Missouri, get on its feet. Thanks again for your faithful prayers and support.

2003 All Boards

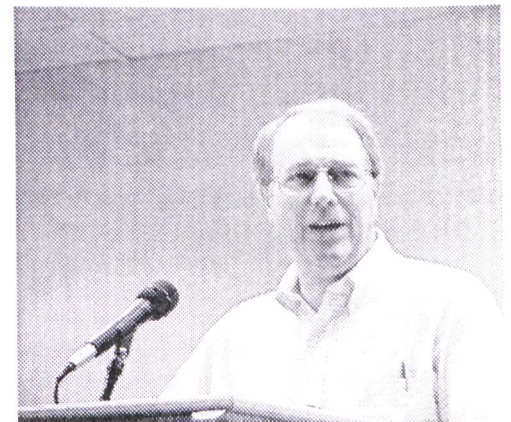

Bivens Update

Dear Friends and Prayer Warriors,

How we thank the Lord for your faithfulness. Each day we are deeply aware of our own need of consistent prayer and realize again and again how your prayer encourages and sustains us.

In early June, Ruth had the honor of speaking at the Missouri State WAC meeting in their 11 o'clock service and also at the Kansas State WAC annual banquet. Then we were honored at the Westside Checotah Free Will Baptist Church VBS as their missionaries. These appointments were in three different directions but we managed to make them all. These opportunities opened new doors for us to make new friends and renew acquaintances with some from years past. We had a ball!

Back home at the church, June was a month of ups and downs attendance-wise, but we had some very good services. After our being away during the latter part of May, attendance was down. The good news is that for the last three Sundays of June, we had 45, 51 and 72 in attendance. That really sounds good, but the fact is the last Sunday we had help. Twenty-two were from Jones Chapel Free Will Baptist Church. They came to visit us and practice their drama and skits and sing in Spanish before they left on a mission trip to Mexico. We really enjoyed having the group. I had been wondering how many people we could seat. With 12 pews and 6 people per pew, I had figured on seventy-two. However, we still had room for more. Our next goal is one hundred. . .

July 3rd Brother Lynn Wood and his wife Joanne came to deliver a van for the church. Their son Scott bought a shuttle van for us, seats about 15, with seat belts, air, and very low mileage. God continues to provide even before we ask. We had just been considering what we would use to pick up children if we started a bus route. The answer came right on time!

There is a large Fourth of July Festival here every year in the city park. Lots of people come. We reserved a booth and handed out literature about our church and visited with a lot of new people. Many local natives were glad to learn about our work with the Hispanics.

July 6th we hosted the first Mexican Mission Trip to the USA. Brother Victor Escobar, his wife Elvia, and son Israel arrived with three young people from their church in Tampico, Mexico, to present Vacation Bible School for our children. They were with us through Thursday morning. We had three days of VBS with attendance going from 8 the first day to 23 children the third day. Several adults also attended classes taught by Bro. Victor. We had a sweet time with them and enjoyed the opportunity of hosting these dear folks in our home. They later traveled to Springdale, Arkansas, where they worked with Brother Ramon Zuniga, and then on to Moore, Oklahoma,

where they worked with Brother David Arteaga, assisting with VBS in each place. We hope that this will be only the beginning of a ministry to the Hispanics in the US from the churches in Mexico.

In our unique congregation here, Ruth and I act as the father, mother, sister, and brother to many of our people. Being far from home and family, and unable to speak English, they are confronted by difficult situations on a regular basis. We make up their "support group." When we began to talk about our trip to Tampa, Florida, for the national association, several of them expressed concern about our being gone and so far away. We made arrangements for one brother to speak on the Sunday morning that we would be away and felt sure that they would be fine. On the road we received several calls from different ones, just confirming where we were and that we were okay.

On Sunday the 20th, a rather frantic call came from Brother Rigoberto, our speaker. On their way to church that morning a cow stepped up out of a ditch directly in front of their car, killing the cow and totaling the car. They were not injured and managed to contact others who were already at the church. They helped one another that morning, getting the police to the scene, and one of the women who speaks English helped with the accident report. Although they were all late, they went ahead and had service and Rigoberto preached. He told us in a later call that his wife had lost her job on the Thursday that we left, and he lost his job on the Monday following the accident.

Then Thursday the 24th, as we were heading back home another frantic call came. Our dear brother Ismael called to say that his wife had been taken from their apartment by Immigration officials and was going to be deported. Ismael is the very first contact we made when we came to Monett for a mission conference in November. I had prayed that the first man I met would be someone the Lord would raise up to be a leader in the church.

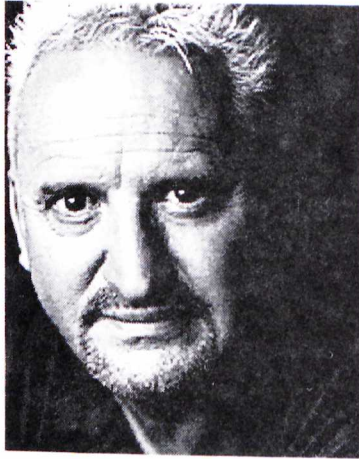
His wife has been here since 1992, working with a legal work permit, renewed every year. When she became ill and was unable to work during her last pregnancy, Immigration refused to renew it. She was ordered to leave the country. When she appealed, her appeal was denied. She had not received a departure deadline, so we hoped that Immigration officials were not going to pursue the case since Ismael and Margarita have two small children who were born here. When officials removed her from her home in handcuffs, we were all devastated. She is currently in a county jail in Texas awaiting deportation. Please pray with us about this situation. We may be called upon to take the children to their mother in Guatemala. All of the legal papers are in place for us to transport the children. Our hearts are broken over this situation. Please pray with us that the Lord will accomplish His purpose in all of it.

Meanwhile, we have a good rapport with our people. We help them in any way we can. Our days are filled with translating, going to the hospital, doctor appointments, the Department of the Family, getting car tags, inspections, etc. We have been personally involved in three deliveries so far. Ruth went through a C-section; I went through a delivery, and then I gave the job back to her for the next one. We presently have six

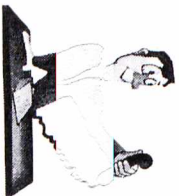

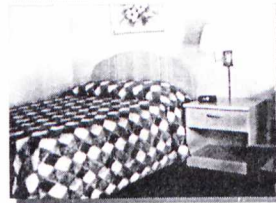

We have just completed a year of stateside assignment (Furlough). This past year has been one of transition for our family in the areas of edu-

cation, ministry, residence, and adaptation back to the U.S.

We have been involved with teaching, campus ministries at Free Will Baptist Bible College as Missionary in Residence, and traveling. I've worked on my Masters and Curt is also continuing his education.

Due to these major transitions that are occurring, we will need an extended time in the United States. I will be doing my final year of my Masters Degree requirements, which will require many hours. Amber is doing her final year of high school and has begun the search for a college to meet her educational needs. Curt needs to pursue leadership/mission training to enhance our ministry in Brazil. He is also teaching at the Free Will Baptist Bible College and is the Missionary in Residence this school year.

Because of these pending needs, our return to Brazil will be delayed. We have taken a leave of absence for one year. (This means we will not be drawing salary from our mission account, but our account will remain open.) Our prayer for this time is that God would give us clear direction of our target ministry and that we'll be preparing for what opportunities lie ahead.

It is still our desire to be in Brazil. There is still a lot to be done in Brazil. We are in desperate need of developing leaders and training church planters and pastors. However, for our family at this time, to return to Brazil would be neglecting our own preparation and training that we need to be effective for our phase of ministry there. We also want to be available to Amber as she makes the transition into college.

As college students some years back (too many years to mention), Curt and I answered the call to "world evangelism" not knowing at the time where that meant. That call will never change. However, "our world" is not overseas at this time. God has not called us from Brazil. We know that we will go back. But we do not know the "when" at this time.

We know that it is important to be faithful in the preparation and upgrading of ourselves for future work in Brazil. Neglecting this area would only short change our ministry later. We also feel the necessity to raise up and send our children on their way into adulthood.

It is an honor to serve Free Will Baptists in Brazil. It is a privilege to be called **Missouri Show Me Missionaries**, a state that values missions as a responsibility and not an option. Even though we are remaining in the States for the near future, we would ask for your prayers; for a fruitful year of training and preparation here, and your continued financial support when we return to Brazil.

We want to express our deep appreciation to the members of the New Life FWB Church in St. Peters. Our ministry account has benefited from a trust fund that you established for our ministry. Since we are unable to reach most of you, please accept this THANK YOU via the GEM.

babies: one week old, 3 weeks old, 6 weeks old, 2 months old, 4 months old, 8 months old, and one more on the way. They see the doctor in Neosho and Joplin and we often are called on to take them to their appointments. We need a nursery!!

Working with our people has some side benefits, too. Our land lord has 40 acres of corn planted around our little country house. I asked him if our Guatemalan ladies could have some leaves from the corn plants. (They use them to make tamales). He said: "I have 40 acres and 25,000 plants per acre. That's one million plants. Each plant has seven leaves, so that means seven million (7,000,000) leaves. Yes, they can take all they want." We have someone here almost daily picking corn leaves. I sometimes pick 50 or 60 and take them to someone on visitation. By the way, the tamales are delicious. When the roasting ears were ready he also generously offered all we wanted. That brought us "pan de elote" roasting ear bread. Mmmmm, good!

In spite of the sad things that do come up, God is blessing us and we are having the time of our lives. We are staying busier than we have ever been. Please keep us in your prayers.

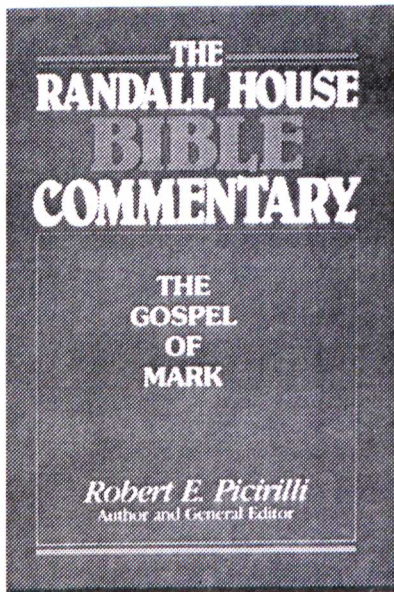

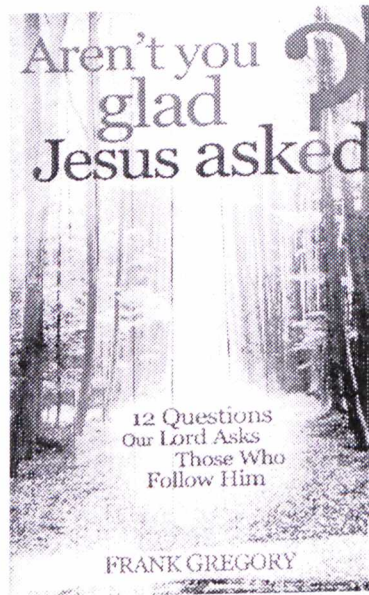
