Pre-Register For Camp

The past several years has seem some major changes made at Camp Niangua, such as the tabernacle building and a new ball field. This past year a new well and pump system that is capable of suppling all the water the camp needs during the hot summer months was added. A new play ground system will be in place by camp time this year. A big thanks goes out from the camp to all our churches and our state leaders who have helped so much financially and prayerfully in keeping our youth camp up to date.

The Camp Board has been focusing on two major issues for the future; one being some new dorms for the boys and girls that could be used year round and the other is

pre-registration. Those who attend camp know that sometimes there is confusion on Sunday afternoon when hundreds of campers arrive within a three hour period, all waiting for a place to stay. Sister Shirley Jackson has done a great job of registering our campers over the years, but the time has come for pre-registration. This will help in the following ways:

- 1. The superintendent of the camp can better plan the meals when they have exact numbers.
- 2. It will cut down on the long registration waiting lines. (tempers can flare on hot days).
- 3. It will make it easier to plan activities and better utilize the classroom space when the camp has the age and the number of males and females who will be attending.

The pre-registration fee will be \$55.00 per camper this year with a deadline of May 25th for Teens and a deadline of July 5th for pre-teens (registrations must be received at camp by these dates). A \$10.00 fee will be added to a camper's registration after this date. It would be a good idea to mail the registration forms at least a week early to ensure they arrive by the above dates. However, this fee will be waived this year in order to give everyone a chance to get acquainted with pre-registering, but will be effective for the 2005 camp sessions. We need everyone's cooperation in this change. Pre-registration forms may be downloaded from the camp website (http://www.campniangua.com), or you may request one be mailed to you from the Youth Camp. 

Who Will Build The Fire?

According to reports, the 2004 cold wave in New England has set records. This brings up memories. During the summer of 1960 Louise and I helped Free Will Baptist home missionaries. Mack and Jackie

Owens, conduct a Vacation Bible School in a closed church. It was located in Twin Mountain, New Hampshire—the only protestant church in the community. About a half dozen people had faithfully maintained the church that had been established as a FWB church in 1881. (At one time they had recorded 150 in Sunday School.) After the VBS program some of the community people expressed interest in conducting Sunday Services. Question? Who would build the fire? I volunteered.

Heating an un-insulated New England church building proved to be a serious wintertime challenge. My routine included driving nine miles from our house to the church on Saturday night to build a fire in the wood furnace. I let the fire burn for about an hour. During this time I studied my sermon and Sunday School lesson while sitting on a stick of wood beside the furnace. (Due to working a construction job 5 or 6 days per week I had to study when I could grab a few minutes.) Then I would load the furnace full of wood and close down the dampers for the night. That same process was repeated at 5:00 a. m. Sunday morning.

After Sunday School I would disappear behind a door that led down to the furnace pit. There I would take a few minutes to collect my thoughts, pray, and throw three-foot sticks of firewood into the furnace. One Sunday my few minutes of solitude was interrupted by teen-age, Gary. After some hesitation he asked me if I could show him how to be saved. I led him in confessing his sins to God and inviting Jesus Christ into his heart. Later Gary married a dedicated Christian girl.

Some community people kept me supplied with firewood. And eventually some of the men volunteered to help me fire the furnace-what a blessing that was. One Sunday morning, my wife Louise, baby Andy, and I provided transportation for 80-year retired artist, Marian K. Zane. (Marian had produced color paintings for National Geographic.) We noticed as we walked into the church that it was -20 below zero inside as well as -20 below outside. One man had failed to fulfill his promise to build the fire. Miss Zane would not let us take her back home. She stood on the furnace grate, wrapped from head to toe in many layers of warm clothing, while I built a hot fire.

About three years ago, while on a business trip to Boston, Andy rented a car and visited the church at Twin Mountain. He found the current Baptist pastor at the church (probably studying for his Sunday sermon). The church had improved their building, sponsored a Christian school, and provided their pastor a salary. I think they now have a gas furnace.

News From Free Will Baptist Family Ministries

Special thanks to all those who gave so generously, our children at Free Will Baptist Family Ministries, enjoyed a great Christmas. We are so grateful for everything you've done in years past, and once again, this year you came through with showers of gifts, creating a memorable Christmas for each one.

On another note, you may remember in August of 2001, we experienced a great deal of damage caused by a devastating flood. At that time, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) offered little financial assistance, due in part to our faith based, non-profit status. Just recently, however, President Bush passed the Faith Based Initiative, making us eligible for a \$600,000.00 grant, providing we raise an additional \$200,000.00. The funds will be used in our restoration efforts at the OAKS camp; the clean up of logs and debris as a result of the flood, reconstruction of two flood damaged bridges, a strengthening wall and fireplace added to our tabernacle, as well as constructing a new activities building to replace the structure lost in the flood. This funding will also allow us to include additional recreational areas to the camp.

We are praising God for such a tremendous blessing and the incredible opportunity He has presented us. Youth camps and retreats are a vital part of our ministry. We are asking you to consider helping us in our efforts to raise the additional funding needed to restore and rebuild. This project will allow us to take this ministry to a new level. 

LOCAL FOLKS HELP DELIVER SHOE BOX GIFTS TO MEXICO

Dec. 27th, a group of 42 Free Will Baptists from Missouri and Oklahoma made a run for the border. Under the guidance of missionary builder Mark Cole of Blanchard OK, they took 1261 decorated shoe box gifts to several orphanages and churches in Mexico to be distributed among the children. Boxes went to Altamira, Reynosa, Tampico, and Piedras Negras Mexico, and although there was a trailer load, there were not enough to go around.

Area churches participating in the shoe box program include: Chapel of the Ozarks Free Will Baptist Church of Rocky Comfort; Bethlehem FWB Church in Rocky Comfort; First FWB Church of Neosho; and the Hispanic Free Will Baptist Church of Monett. The Purdy High School student's club "Youth Alive" participated in the project preparing 27 shoe box gifts. A group from Church of the Ozarks and two young ladies from Neosho made the trip.

Those making the trip were gripped by the grinding poverty of the "homes" along an irrigation canal in Reynosa and shacks down a railroad track behind the orphanage in Piedras Negras. Along with the colorful boxes of goodies they distributed bags of rice and beans to each house. They came away with a greater appreciation of their American citizenship, and the abundance of blessings we enjoy in our daily lives here at home. Comments ranged from "It was unable to speak about it because of the overwhelming emotion that the memories of the experience bring.

John Bivens, House Parent at the children's home "Casa Hogar Niños de Piedras Negras" in Piedras Negras, Mexico said, "It was a great group of people. We had a wonderful time and the kids loved them."

Cole has plans to repeat the trip next summer with a special project called "Christmas in July".
