On June 20, 1965, she was united in marriage to Robert Keith and to this union two sons were born.




Good News from New Hope in Fredericktown

Our work here in Denver is nearing some new pathways we've never been through. In many cases, we have several options as to direction and all look good, but only one can be chosen. Our recent growth has continued into the spring season as yet another new family is joining us for worship. That is not to say we're "bursting at the seams" but we're not far away either. NOW is the time to act and begin to put into place plans to continue our forward momentum. If we don't, we'll certainly lag back in our progress and I don't want that. A very real option is the possibility of going to two worship services in the fall. Our leadership is exploring that option which would give us some additional breathing room. Our sanctuary is only about two to three families from being over 80 percent full and our limited parking gives us few options other than another service. I'll tell you, I'm so glad to be having these problems. It's obvious your prayers are being heard and I ask for you to continue to pray for us and for wisdom to make the right decisions as we grow. The wonderful thing about our growth is that we are adding "unchurched" families. That is, folks who were not going to church at all prior to attending Mile High. That's my goal. I tell our folks that I don't want to be a church that gathers sheep from other folks' flocks. With that emphasis though, comes the very real need for discipleship and leadership training so we can have believers mature and prepared for service in our work here. It's begin-ning to take shape gradually from where we were just a few months ago, but there is still much that needs to be done. All of this is good news for you, our faithful supporter. Jesus is building His church here in North Denver! People are being saved, baptized and serving in our fellow-ship. The beginnings of what I see as a strong, church planting fellowship of believers is taking shape each and every week. Continue to pray for us. I'll have some special news to share with you next month. I can't wait to let you know about it, but I'm making myself wait it out until warm weather permanently arrives! In the news business, this is called a teaser to get you to read the next issue. I'll visit with you then!

What's Happening With Our Account?

Glad you asked! If you have Internet access, you can go to the National Home Missions website "www.homemissions.net" and click on the prayer page and look under "burdens." The accounts are organized alphabetically, so I'm near the top. We are still several dollars in the red. Each dollar you give to our account goes so very far in this endeavor. 

He and his wife Linda have one daughter, Hanna.


















1st Annual Bass and Crappie Fishing Tournament FWBBC Fund Raiser

n May 22, 2004, the Missouri Alumni Association of Free Will Baptist Bible College, will be hosting a fishing tournament to be held on Truman Lake. The location will be the Long Shoal Marina (660-438-2841), located 8 ½ miles just west of Warsaw, MO on Hwy. 7. The entry fee is \$50.00 per boat, based on a two-man team. Cash prizes will be awarded for first, second, and third place winners for the largest stringer of Largemouth Bass and for the largest stringer of Crappie. We will also have drawings for free give-a-ways. Awards will be based on the total revenue from all entry fees. 1st place winners receive a 10 % payback per team. 2nd place winners receive a 5 % payback per team, and 3rd place winners receive a 2.5 % payback per team. The Angler with the largest Largemouth Bass will receive \$50. The Angler with the largest Crappie will also receive \$50. The proceeds after awards will go to the renovation of Ennis Hall – The National Alumni Project of Free Will Baptist Bible College. - 1. No Fishing within 50 yards of a public dock, marina, gas pumps, or another contestant that is anchored or tied up.
- 2. No iced fish will be weighed.
- 3. Crappie must be at least 9 inches long with a limit of 15
- 4. Bass must be at least 15 inches long with a limit of 5
- 5. Any bait or method of fishing may be used.
- 6. Dead fish being weighed will receive a .5 pound penalty.
- 7. Late penalty. Anglers not at designated check-in site (Long Shoal Marina) at 1 p.m. will be penalized ½ pound for every five minutes late.
- 8. All anglers must meet at 7:00 a.m. at the marina, but may drive to another location to put their boat in the water. (For example: Berry Bend Boat Dock). Anglers are reminded to return to Long Shoal Marina at 1:00 p.m. or be penalized for every 5 minutes late.

Free Will Baptist National Convention to Meet in Kansas City

he National Association of Free Will Baptists meets in Kansas City, Missouri, July 18-22, 2004, for its 68th annual session. Executive Secretary Keith Burden says he expects 6,000 delegates and visitors from 40 states at Kansas City Convention Center for the five-day meeting. For the seventh time, Missouri's 15,000 members and 186 churches will host the national convention. The National Association previously met in Missouri in 1944 (Flat River); 1958, 1969 (St. Louis); 1964, 1978, 1988 (Kansas City).

The National Association of Free Will Baptists includes 2,500 churches and 215,000 members. The denomination supports 106 missionaries in 13 foreign countries and 138 home missionaries in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico.

National convention delegates are expected to approve denominational budgets which will exceed \$22 million. Moderator Tim York will gavel the voting body through electing 31 board and commission members and general officers. Each national agency and commission will submit an annual report to delegates during the two-day convention business session on Wednesday and Thursday.

The 2004 convention theme is "Harvest Time." Five pastors will deliver major addresses: Glenn Murray (United FWB Church/West Plains, Missouri), Kerry Gandy (Rolling Oaks FWB Church/Maumelle, Arkansas), Randy Wright (Piney Grove FWB Church/Beaverton, Alabama), José Rodriguez (Ebenezer FWB Church/Miami, Florida) and Glen Johnson (Good News FWB Church/Chesterfield, Virginia). Missouri layman Bob Farwell, a science and math instructor as well as creation science lecturer, will teach the Adult Sunday School Class.

Meeting simultaneously with the National Association are the 37th annual National Youth Conference (NYC), with an expected 1,500 registrants and the 69th annual Women Nationally Active for Christ (WNAC) Convention with more than 700 women anticipated.

The four-day NYC which includes Bible competitive activities as well as a music and arts festival will rally around the theme, "Xtreme Cause, Xtreme Cost," from Matthew 10:38. NYC will conduct separate worship services for youth. Numerous seminars are scheduled for attendees. Several hundred teens will participate in "Reach That Guy" service and work projects within the Kansas City community. The youth will meet with adults Wednesday evening for a combined worship service at Kansas City Convention Center. The two-day WNAC theme is "Great Expectations." During

The two-day WNAC theme is "Great Expectations." During a two-hour Monday afternoon seminar, delegates will get a first look at "Show Me HGTV-WNAC Style" led by Debbie Burden. Tuesday's business session convenes at Kansas City

Convention Center. The WNAC keynote service will feature foreign missionaries to Japan, Don and Ruth McDonald. Missionary Lynette Morgan (on special assignment) will address the Fellowship Luncheon at noon Tuesday.



Tuesday morning's Preaching Conference meets in Kansas City Convention Center. Participants at the two-hour conference will hear Tulsa, Oklahoma, pastor David Archer and Burton, Michigan, pastor Allen West.

The Monday afternoon (3:00-5:00 p.m.) Missions Rally in Kansas City Convention Center will draw some 800 ministers and laymen for a two-hour session.

The Kansas City Marriott will serve as headquarters hotel for the national convention, National Youth Conference and WNAC. Worship services and plenary business sessions will meet at Kansas City Convention Center.


