istered for the Monday morning session in which Bro. Scott McNay brought a devotion and Bro. Dale Cochran spoke in the eleven o'clock service.

During the business session, the following four recommendations were approved:

IV. That all local Women Active for Christ be encouraged to participate in the WNAC August Emphasis Month.

Only one second year Women Active for Christ scholarship was awarded because of the lack of completed applications submitted. Megan Wilfong was awarded \$250.00 toward her second year tuition fee at FWBBC in Nashville, Tennessee. Megan represented our state well with a 4.0 GPA. Missouri WAC continues to urge young ladies to follow the guidelines and apply for the WAC scholarship. If a scholarship was not approved because the required letters of recommendation were not submitted, please re-submit the application for the next year.

Ralph Dingus, Director of Development, of Free Will Baptist Family Ministries of Greenville, Tennessee, informed Missouri WAC that Family Ministries is still collecting Campbell soup (and other Campbell products such as Pork & Beans) labels to purchase a van. Those attending the meeting were reminded of the state WAC Retreat to be held August 20-21. The Retreat project is the WNAC Provision Closet. Empty check-book boxes were distributed to be filled with \$25 Wal-Mart Cards, Phone Cards, or cash. These boxes will fill our mini-closet to be displayed at the retreat and then sent on to the WNAC Provision Closet. The Provision Closet is maintained for the use of our departing and returning missionaries.

Missouri WAC President Shirley Jackson gave a report about the progress of the plands for hosting the WNAC Convention in Kansas City in July. Funds have been raised, volunteers have been recruited, and the finishing touches are taking shape. Missouri Women are to be commended for the work they have done to make all of this possible. Their efforts through WAC have enhanced God's Kingdom. Missouri Women Active for Christ have had another great year!

2004 State Convention Report

The 91st session of the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists was hosted by the Greater Springfield District Association at the Clarion Hotel in Springfield, Missouri. The district churches provided ushers and registration personnel for the meeting. They are to be commended for helping make the convention a success.

392 people registered to hear Reverends Gene Crewse, Melvin Haas, Kenny Simpson, Steve Reeves, and Bill Evans develop the theme of the convention, "Founded, Faithful, Focused." Each of the worship services were anointed with great singing and powerful preaching.

Tuesday morning the Christian Education Board sponsored a seminar with Dr. Charles Shepson. Dr. Shepson spoke in two sessions on the subject of "The Eight Pitfalls of the Ministry." At the conclusion of the sessions he gave an invitation and a majority of those present responded to make commitments to the Lord concerning their ministry.

Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday morning were given over to conducting state business. Moderator Richard Robinson began the sessions with a timely Moderator's message. During the two sessions of business, the delegates heard and approved the reports and adopted the budgets of the Executive Department, the five standing boards, the Show-Me Committee, and the Lebanon Bible and Book Store. In other business, the delegates approved several changes in the Constitution and By-Laws, passed a resolution concerning same sex marriages, approved a \$5,000 gift to Free Will Baptist Bible College and an equal amount for Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, and voted to hold the 2005 convention at the United Free Will Baptist Church in West Plains.

The delegates heard of how God continues to bless Missouri Free Will Baptists in giving and in outreach ministries. The Executive Office reported an increase in Co-op with gifts totaling \$700, 394.96 for 2003. State Home Missions Director Dale Skiles reported increased designated giving to the Mission Board, and that the work in Jefferson City has its building nearly completed, and that the Raymore mission has purchased property and will soon be building. Show-Me Plan Chairman Alvin Hook reported increased giving to the Show-Me Plan and that the Committee and the Christian Education Board will be sponsoring a Culture Link Seminar (see the seminar application in this issue of the Gem). Each of the Board's reports were positive.

Rev. Jim Williams, pastor of the Carthage Free Will Baptist Church, was elected to serve as Moderator. The other officers are: Rick Dement, Assistant Moderator; Kenny Simpson, Clerk; Kenny Panduku, Assistant Clerk. Rev. Richard Robinson, out-going moderator, is to be commended for his years of service as an officer in leading the state association.



They began their first pastorate in 1953 in St. Louis, MO. Elmer was working full-time as production and personnel manager of the Purex Corporation, while also serving as full-time pastor. He and Gladys led the church from 1953 to 1960, and under their ministry, the church became self-supporting. At that time, Elmer left the Purex Corp. and devoted himself to full-time ministry. He has attended Brooks Bible Seminary, Florida Bible College, Free Will Baptist Bible College, the Wesleyan College of Chaplains in Kansas, the Wesley Medical Center of Wichita, KS and the University of Missouri at Columbia.

They have served as church planters and home missionaries in many of their churches. They have served as State and National Home missionaries. Elmer has conducted more than 300 revivals in nearly twenty states and preached in five foreign countries. They are currently pastoring the First Free Will Baptist Church in Waynesville, Missouri, where they have served these last six years. Although they are retiring from full-time pastoral duties, they will continue to minister in many other areas. Elmer will continue on as President of the Chaplain's ministry at the Phelps County Regional Medical Center.

Elmer and Gladys have influenced many lives over the past years. Several under their leadership have answered the call to the ministry and missions, both at home and abroad.

Culture Link Conference


