

What a busy time of year. We have just finished with the State meeting, and before you know it, it's time to head to Louisville, KY for our National Convention. Our theme this year is "Pleasing God" and our theme verse is 2 Timothy 2:4. The convention will begin with registration on Saturday afternoon at 3:00 in the Kentucky International Convention Center. On Sunday morning Sunday school will begin at 10:00am in the KICC with Jonathan Yandell from Tennessee as teacher. The morning worship service will follow with Mike

Wade from Oklahoma as the speaker. At the same time the youth will be meeting in their own services. That evening we will hear Jeff Manning from North Carolina in the service.

Activities will begin Monday morning with the General Board Meeting at 8:00am and the National Youth Convention Competitive Activities at 8:30am. In the afternoon, the NYC Seminars and the Women National Active for Christ Seminar will begin at 1:00pm. This event will feature

Sandy Atwood. All these events will take place in the convention center. At 3:00 that afternoon the Missions Rally will take place at the Hyatt Regency, while the convention Exhibit Area will be opening at the same time. In the evening, the Children/Tweener/Family Banquet will happen from 5:00 til 6:30pm at the Convention Center. Tickets for this event as well as all others requiring a ticket are available online at www.nafwb.org.

At 7:00pm the evening Worship service for both the convention at large and the Youth will take place in the Convention Center. Millard Sasser from California will be the adult speaker. Following the service there will be a Youth Worker Reception from 9:00 til 10:00pm.

Tuesday will see the day begin with a Music Commission Seminar from 7:00 til 8:30am, followed closely by the resumption of NYC Competitive Activities. Also starting at 8:30 will be the Pastors/Layman Conference at the Convention Center along with the

WNAC Convention. Anthony and Lea Edgmon from Spain will be the featured speakers for the WNAC at 10:30. The Women will also hear Teri Peacock at their luncheon beginning at 12:00. The Theological Trends Seminar will commence at 10:00 and run until noon.

Tuesday afternoon will have the continuation of the NYC Competitive Activites as well as the NYC Seminars that started at 10:00am. The Convention

> business session will start at 1:30 and is scheduled to last until 4:00pm. The Evening services for both the convention and the youth will begin at 7:00 and feature James Kelly Caudill from Kentucky as the adult speaker. The service will be followed by the Hillsdale College Reception at 9:00pm and the Youth Banquet, beginning at the same time.


The Baileys in Japan

Several unsaved young mothers are bringing their children to the classes.






Due to increased monthly fees, The Good News Chapel decided to move to a different location in March. Our first service was held on


Hartville Church Has Family Day

Dr. LaVerne Miley Enters the Gate

In the last issue of Echo, Dr. LaVerne Miley told of a near-death experience, while hospitalized for chronic bleeding around the brain. He wrote of being "in another world" and seeing a gate, but he was not invited to enter. After Dr. Miley's three surgeries, he made wonderful progress and seemed to be fully

restored to health. But in the early hours of March 15th, he awakened his wife with the urgent request to be taken to the Emergency Room of Centennial Hospital in Nashville. Shortly after arriving, Dr. Miley passed through the" gate of death," about 1:30 a.m., March 15, 2005. Dr. Miley said in the article, "We who know the Lord believe that death is the doorway to heaven. Thank God that is true. We must pass through the experience of death to go to be with the Lord."

Dr. Miley is survived by his wife of more than 50 years, Lorene Norris Miley; two sons, Lynn and Larry; one daughter, Lynette Morgan; eleven grandchildren and four greatgrandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, Herman and

Lena Miley; a daughter, Lydia; and sister, Mildred Miley Miller.

Services were held at Cofer's Chapel FWB Church in Nashville with Brother Eugene Waddell and Dr. Robert Picirilli officiating. Many shared tributes to the life of Dr. Miley: Brother Eddie Payne, a fellow missionary in Ivory Coast; Dr. Robert Woodard, a Bible College faculty colleague; and a son, Lynn Miley. Free Will Baptist International Missions presented an engraved Bible to Mrs. Miley in memory of Dr. Miley.

Dr. Miley's life is one of great interest and outstanding achievement for the cause of Christ. He was born and reared in northeast Missouri to Godfearing parents. He was converted to Christ at 10 years of age. He graduated from high school at the age of 14 and graduated from NE Missouri State Teachers College at Kirksville, MO, at the age of 17. At this time he felt a definite calling from the Lord to full-time Christian service. In response to this, he enrolled at Free Will Baptist Bible College. It was at this college that he met the YO1mg lady, Lorene Norris, who was to become his wife. Further training included a Master's of Divinity degree from Northern Baptist Seminary, and M.D. degree from the University of Tennessee, and a Master's in Public Health from Columbia University School of Public Health.

Dr. and Mrs. Miley served as missionaries to

Ivory Coast from 1960-1979. During this time Dr. and Mrs. Mileywere instrumental in opening a hospital in Ivory Coast. Dr. Miley served from 195055 as an administrator and faculty member of Free Will Baptist Bible College, and again as a professor at FWBBC from 1979 to 1995. He served as Medical Consultant to the Foreign Missions Department from 1995 to 2004. Dr. and Mrs. Miley worked with the Navajo Native Americans in the western United States. He also counseled with Men of Valor Prison Ministry in Nashville.

The Mileys have been active members of Cofer's Chapel FWB Church for many years. Everyone who knew Dr. Miley could, no doubt, give a great testimony of his outstanding Christian character. Brother Eddie Payne

said, "How would you describe this great man of God? In reading Galatians 5, I found a true reflection of Dr. Miley's life. It is the fruit of the Holy Spirit-love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance. I know no one who more completely shows forth this fruit than Dr. Miley. He possessed all of the qualities that makes a great Christian missionary."

Brother Tim Campbell, Executive Secretary of Arkansas Free Will Baptists, said, "In 1986, Dr. Miley spoke at First FWB Church at Walnut Ridge, AR. In that service, I made a full and complete surrender of my life to Christ. I am in the ministry today because of this good man." Pastor Ronnie Mitchell of Limestone FWB Church in Limestone, TN said that



Dr. Miley participated in the church's Walk-a-Thon in September of 2004 (he actually walked most of the ten-mile course!). The next day (Sunday), he preached at the church on "Holiness." He said in the message, "Our human nature is no excuse for not pursuing holiness-being like Christ." On this occasion, the Limestone Church raised \$47,000 for International Missions!

Dr. Robert Woodard said that it was through Dr. Miley that God produced in him a complete yieldedness to Christ in July of 1965. He described Dr. Miley in this way: "He found favor with God and man. He had a single-minded purpose. I have never heard one negative comment about him. He was truly a man after God's own heart." Dr. Miley's son Lynn spoke of his father's deep convictions about all of the Christian life. "He was an outstanding steward of the Lord. To him, everything belonged to God-and we are accountable to Him." Dr. Picirilli spoke of the deep respect he had for Dr. Miley. He called him "a faithful witness, a quiet person, firm and unyielding in his convictions, a man of prayer (and fasting), a willing servant always at God's disposal. He was a true hero to many because of the gracious work of God within him."

Brother Eugene Waddell said of Dr. Miley, "I am not worthy to unloose the shoes of this good man." Dr. Milton Fields said, "Dr. Miley was one of the most pleasant and one of the most competent persons that I have ever known. He was determined to do everything the right way. In every way he was an outstanding man of God, a great Christian leader. " All of us who knew Dr. Miley could say with Mrs. Sara Steele, staff member at FWBBC, "Next to Jesus Christ, Dr. Miley was the holiest man on earth!"

Jess Young and wife Sybil, Pastor Keith Garrison, Donna & Doug Norris



Joplin First Welcomes New Pastor



FWBBC Graduates Fifty Three



NASHVILLE, TN-Free Will Baptist Bible College graduated 53 students in commencement exercises on campus, Friday, May 6. Graduates came from 16 states and four foreign countries.

Students completed seven programs ranging from two-year associate's programs to four-year bachelor's programs. Nearly 35 percent of the class graduated with honors, according to Dr. Milton Fields, academic dean.

Reverend Keith Burden, executive secretary for the National Association of Free Will Baptists, brought the commencement address on the subject, "What Is Life Really All About?"

The college honored Dr. Robert Woodard who retired after 27 years on the Bible and theology faculty, and recognized Director of Plant Operations Sandy Goodfellow for 25 years of service. Music professor Dr. Linda Shipley was named Academic Advisor of the Year.

Ohio executive secretary Edwin Hayes preached the baccalaureate sermon Thursday evening on the importance of commitment, which was followed by a reception for graduates hosted at the campus home of President Pinson.

Thursday activities began with an 8:00 a.m. senior breakfast for graduates and their guests. The college family then gathered for a 90-minute Awards Chapel featuring special recognition for academic excellence, Christian service, leadership, society and athletic awards, and the passing of the gavel from 2004-05 student body president Thomas Cook to 2005-06 student body president Gerald Turner.

During a post-commencement meeting with the faculty and staff, President J. Matthew Pinson announced that the Board of Trustees authorized the administration to begin reconsidering options to relocate the college.

Bob Woodard, FWBBC Teacher, Retires

NASHVILLE, TN-

Dr. Robert E. Woodard (66), Bible and theology instructor at Free Will Baptist Bible College for 27 years, announced his retirement effective May 6, according to President Matt Pinson.

Dr. Woodard said, "After 27 years of teaching, the time has come for me to retire from my ministry here at the college." Woodard's immediate plans remain uncertain. He has been encouraged to do some writing and may do that in the future.

During his tenure at FWBBC, Woodard taught a variety of courses from Bible doctrine to church growth strategies to theology. He also served 11 years as director of pastoral studies and taught three years in the Free Will Baptist Bible College Graduate School.

Reflecting on Woodard's service to the college, President Matt Pinson said, "When I was a student here, I found Dr. Woodard to be not only deep theologically but also warm-hearted, loving and encouraging. After returning to the college as president, I found that he embodies those same traits as a professional colleague. It will be hard to say goodbye to him as a full-time member of the faculty at FWBBC."


Ozark Annual Men's Rally



A FWB Foundation Moment

Becky, Treasurer at First Free Will Baptist Church, was dissatisfied with the earnings her church receives on the church savings account. She looked at moving some of the savings to a CD but doesn't like the idea of locking up



funds in case they are needed for an emergency. Plus, her local bank's money market and CD rates aren't that impressive.

She feels that, like the good steward of Matthew 25, she has an obligation to be wise with church funds. The rates banks offer on savings and money market accounts are often less than the inflation rate which means the church loses purchasing power by placing their funds in these accounts. This is like the foolish steward who buried his talent.

Becky understands that higher returns can also bring risk the church does not want to take with their excess funds. She wants to find a place to put the church funds in order to receive a reasonable rate of return without taking on risk.

Becky called Free Will Baptist Foundation and discovered they offer Money Management trusts for organizations and churches. The funds are conservatively invested in United States government agency bonds and long-term CDs. The rate is variable but through the years has exceeded the inflation rate by 2-3%.

The church can place any amount they wish with the Foundation and withdraw up to \$50,000 on seven days notice. Becky liked the concept of Money Management trusts and First Free Will decided this was the place for their savings.


