



know that in that service something in me was born that said missionaries are special people. I was sitting on the back row that evening by special permission. Normally I was made to sit up front. But that evening was different because I had a real desire to be near such a great person.

Skip forward with me many years to a small living Froom in an apartment on the campus of Free Will Baptist Bible College. I was sitting again in the presence of greatness. I held a notebook on my knees and was struggling to write everything I was hearing. It was difficult because my attention was continually drawn to the face of the woman sitting across from me. As she spoke, I watched her eyes and saw there a compassion beyond any I had ever seen. As she spoke of her beloved India it was easy to tell that while she was in Tennessee, her heart was elsewhere. Oh, she loved teaching young men and women, but her devotion was divided.

This meeting had come about when as a young freshman in Miss Wisehart's English class, I had decided to write a paper on demonism. Professor Wiseheart shared an office with Miss Barnard and told her about my choice of topics. Miss Barnard called me to the shared office and told me that my choice was not a wise one and suggested that I choose another. Being young and dumb, that was all I needed to insist that this was the only choice of topics for me. Miss Barnard then said that it was dangerous to even dabble in researching for such a paper, but if I insisted, she would help me. She invited me over to her apartment to tell me her experiences in India with demons. So there I sat, missing much of what she said for what I could see in my imagination as I heard stories from a lady who had confronted demons personally. Courage, dedication, greatness. These all ran through my mind as my respect for missionaries was renewed.

I have since come to realize that there were numbers of people just like Pop and Mabel Wiley and Laura Belle Barnard. People who have given their lives for the sake of carrying the gospel to the lost of the world. It did not matter what kind of opposition Satan mounted, they were capable of the task with the power of the Spirit of God moving them and the call of God ringing in their ears.

We still have people like that today. People we as Free Will Baptists have sent places we cannot go. Our part in this great enterprise it to pray for them so they can stay spiritually and give so they can stay physically. They depend on us. Let us never get so busy or occupied that we forget those we have sent and said " you go tell them about Him and we will make sure that you can do your job as we pray and give."

Never let it be said that we have fallen down on the job. If we fail, we let down the missionary we have sent. We let down the Lord who has called them and us to go (if we do not choose to go then we have to send.) We also let down those who are waiting to hear. The Bunchs in Panama

January 7th marked a special day for Free Will Baptists. It was the dedication of a new Free Will Baptist Church in Chitre, Panama. This was an especially exciting time for Missouri Free Will Baptists because four of Missouri's churches (Calvary Chapel, Hannon, Verdella, and First Church of Lebanon) supplied the finances and work crews for its construction. For missionaries Stan and Brenda Bunch this was an answer to over ten years of prayer.

The Good News Free Will Baptist Church of Chitre is located across the street from the University of Panama. A new four lane highway has just been built in front of the facility and a transportation center is on the corner opposite the church. The church is a beautiful facility that will hold 300 for worship. It is also equipped with classrooms and a modern kitchen.

The dedication service filled the church to overflowing as approximately 450 people came together for it's dedication to God. Dr. Doug Earls gave the dedication address and challenged the congregation to always remember that the church belongs to Jesus. He further challenged them that the facility has been build and dedicated to God.... now start building lives for Jesus. Three adults accepted Jesus during this service. Missionary Stan Bunch has witnessed to these adults for several years. One man shared that he has struggled with alcoholism for years and now that he has Jesus he will have victory. What a wonderful testimony, Jesus gives victory all over the world.

Dr. Earls and Missouri State Executive Director Gary Fry also attended and spoke at the Panamanian National FWB Convention held at the University of Panama. Eight teens were saved and five young men answered the call to full time christian service in the concluding Sunday morning service.

The Pinkertons in Ivory Coast

The Hanna Project team arrived in Ivory Coast on Feb 13 and we headed upcountry on the 14th to vaccinate over 12,000 Ivorians against



spinal meningitis. We arrived at Doropo 14 hours later. Every day was filled with excitement and ministry.

The 16th, Carol became very sick and remained so until we left a day early (21st) headed for Abidjan. Later, a nurse told us that she was afraid that Carol would not survive the trip, but she did.

We planned to fly out on the 22nd. However, we were put off the plane and went directly to the hospital, Carol being in a diabetic coma. (She was given sugar water at the airport by a doctor) Tests revealed that she had cerebral malaria, the most dangerous kind. She remembers only bits and pieces from the 16th through the 26th.

It was also during this time that a cat scan was done to determine if the malaria had done any damage to the brain and if there was any kidney infection. She reacted to the dye in the scan and stopped breathing. We were just a few doors from the intensive care unit. Praise the Lord, she was wheeled in there immediately.

A fter 45 minutes, I was informed that she was still alive. She completed the treatment for the malaria and it is completely gone from her system with no adverse effects. Also, there appears to be no damage remaining from the cat scan experience.

March 1, we again boarded the plane for the states. All doctor exams have been negative and we are planning on a soon return to Ivory Coast where Carol will probably be a little more careful of the mosquitoes (malaria carriers) she associates with in the future.

We both thank each one of you that prayed for us during this time of learning from the Lord. I trust we have learned what He wanted to teach so that a repeat lesson will not be needed.



Colorado Firm to Direct FWBBC Capital Campaign

NASHVILLE, TN — Free Will Baptist Bible College selected Colorado-based Clark Dickerson and Associates to provide consulting services in the college's ongoing feasibility study to determine if the 64-year-old institution will sell its Nashville campus, build a new campus, and relocate by the summer of 2008.

Mark Johnson, who is leading FWBBC's feasibility study, said, "Dickerson and Associates' first task is to complete a feasibility study to determine the support for relocation and the amount of funds we could expect to raise. If the Board of Trustees and President Pinson determine that the capital campaign and other aspects of the relocation are feasible and give approval, then Dickerson will use the information obtained to help the college customdesign a capital campaign."

Clark Dickerson and Associates, founded in 1985 in Littleton, Colorado, with regional offices in five states, provides fund-raising counsel for colleges, schools, camps, organizations, and churches. Using biblically-based principles, Dickerson and Associates helps clients advance the cause of Christ through successful financial campaigns.

FWBBC President J. Matthew Pinson said, "One of the most pleasing aspects of working with Dickerson and Associates is their extensive experience in capital fundraising for small Christian colleges, especially those tied to churches and denominations. They craft a capital campaign to fit the personality of the college. They respect what we are doing as an educational institution, and they honor the work of Free Will Baptists."

Founder Clark Dickerson told FWBBC's Feasibility Sub-Committee, "We are not only committed to helping raise funds, but we are also committed to advancing the cause of Christ through your college. Our number one goal is to assist each client to become the best it can be within God's plan."

Mr. Johnson said, "We believe we have the right firm to guide us through the capital campaign process. This company was founded on biblical principles. They understand who we are and what we want to accomplish. The insight provided by Dickerson has already proven beneficial in making our development program more effective."

Statement from the Camp Board – We are looking forward to this camp session and to the best of our ability, we will seek to provide a safe Christian atmosphere for all who attend. It is our prayer that many young people will come to the Lord and go forth to serve in their local churches and regions beyond.

SPECIAL NOTE ABOUT CAMP INSURANCE

The Youth Camp insurance carrier is Church Mutual Insurance Company. The insurance coverage provided by the camp is called Excess Insurance. Here is a brief description of coverage:

- 1. Coverage is ONLY for accidents. There is no coverage for sickness.
 - Should an accident occur, all charges must first be submitted to the camper's personal/private insurance carrier.
 - a. If the personal/private insurance carrier has a deductible, Camp Insurance will pay this deductible, not to exceed its limits.
 - b. If a balance exists after the personal private insurance carrier has paid to its limit, Camp Insurance will pay unpaid balance, not to exceed limits set by Church Mutual.
 - c. If there is no personal/private insurance, Camp Insurance shall serve as primary carrier and pay up to its limits.
 - d. Church Mutual will not pay unless all necessary information is provided. Failure to do so will result in personal responsibility for unpaid balance.

CAMP RULES

- 1. Anyone who spends the night at camp must first register.
- 2. Anyone who damages camp equipment of property shall pay for those damages.
- 3. No one shall bring/use tobacco, narcotics or alcoholic beverages on campgrounds. Those who do so may be expelled from the camp and lose further privileges.
- 4. Profanity will not be tolerated by anyone on the campgrounds.
- 5. No one shall move camp items from one place to another without permission from the camp board. Items that are moved must be returned before camp is over.
- 6. No container or device shall be used to propel or project any substance on another person or property. This includes shaving cream, paint, water balloons, etc. Any damages will be paid for by those responsible. Some water games may be played under the supervision of the Camp Board.
- 7. The following items are not allowed in the cabins: televisions, radios, CD players, tape players or any other device that shall receive or reproduce voice or music. Musical instruments may be accepted, but first must be approved by the Camp Board.
- 8. A person must be at least 20 years old before serving as a sponsor.
- 9. Each church sending toys and girls to camp must provide sponsors for them.
- 10. Campers are required to attend all assemblies, classes and worship service. All sponsors and workers are expected to attend evening worship services.
- 11. No mixed swimming will be allowed. When going to and from the pool, be fully clothed or wear a long bathrobe. A towel draped around the body is not acceptable.
- 12. No one will be allowed in the swimming pool without a qualified lifeguard.
- 13. After registering, no one shall leave the campgrounds without notifying the camp director or board member and signing the checkout list.
- 14. Health regulations require that no unauthorized persons shall be in the kitchen area. No unauthorized person shall take ice from the icemaker in the dining hall.

DRESS CODE

CLASS AND ACTIVITY TIME FOR GIRLS AND WOMEN: They may wear dresses, skirts or split skirts that cover the knees or full-length jeans or slacks. Blouses, shirts or sweaters must be full length covering the shoulder and midriff. No spaghetti straps, tank tops, etc.

WORSHIP TIME FOR GIRLS AND WOMEN: They will be expected to wear dresses or skirts that cover the knees. Blouses, shirts or sweaters must be full-length covering the shoulder and midriff. No spaghetti straps or tank tops.

CLASS, ACTIVITY AND WORSHIP TIME FOR BOYS AND MEN: They may wear full-length jeans or slacks. Shirts are to be full length and cover the shoulders and midriff. No fishnet, tank tops, or muscle shirts.

EVERONE IS ENCOURAGED TO LOOK HIS/HER BEST FOR WORSHIP.

SPECIAL NOTE – Sweat pants are not acceptable for anyone attending camp. All garments should be loose fitting.


