From the Editor

In 1995, the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists had the foresight to appoint a special missions study committee. The pressing need was obvious to all. Our missionaries were spending larger amounts of time and money to raise the necessary funds to stay on their fields of service. Some kind of relief had to be provided. The next year, the committee proposed a new way of supporting missions in Missouri. Called the Show-Me Plan it was seen as a way we could share in the burden of fundraising with our Missionaries. Based on a plan Arkansas had recently instituted, the plan called for all our people to buy "shares" as an investment in God's great work abroad. We immediately began raising more money for foreign missions that ever before. And while the plan worked well, it fell short of fully funding the promises we had made to our missionaries.

In 2005 the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists had the foresight to appoint another special missions study committee. This committee was charged with the task of broadening our program to include International Missions, State Home Missions and National Home Missions. Their charge was to find a way to finance all our missions efforts in the most productive way possible. After meeting for a year, the committee presented their recommendation to the body at our recent state meeting.

It included:

-----That a new nine-member Missouri Missions Board be formed giving preference to the members of the State Home Missions Board and the Show-Me Committee.

-----That our support for International Missions and State Home Missions be combined under this one board and that National Home Missions be added to the plan. This plan will be called "the Show-Me Missions Plan."

-----That a full-time Missions Director be hired to oversee all our missions operations.

The body accepted the proposal from the committee and voted into action the three points. The new Missouri Missions Board was elected to include:

Their responsibilities began immediately after the state meeting. Their great task is to oversee the operation of all our missions efforts and to select, in conjunction with the Executive Committee, the new Missions Director.

His duties would include daily oversight of the plan, promotion in our associations and individual churches, planning missions conferences and assisting churches and associations in securing missionaries for services, producing materials and tools for church and pastors to use to promote missions, encouragement and assistance to our missionaries, and many other possible areas.

Our State Home Missions and International Missions plans will continue to operate as they have in the past. There will be no co-mingling of money. All designated funds will continue to go to their specified area.

The National Home Missions facet of the plan must be developed. Eventually we would like to have National Home Missions supported as is International Missions with the same criteria for missionary participation. (Ties to the state of Missouri.) This will be developed as the plan continues.

The overarching goal of the Study Committee was to see all our missions efforts whether, International, State Home or National Home supported equally. After all, it was Jesus who said to do all these areas at once!

Please pray for our new MMB (Missouri Missions Board.) They have a large task ahead of them, but they are capable. More importantly, God is more than capable.

Pray as they search for the man God has for us as Missions Director.

Pray that we will all catch the vision Christ left for the church.....*"go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature..."*



Over 440 people registered for the 92nd annual State Association of Missouri Free Will Baptists. The crowd was lively and in a visiting mood as they gathered in the Conference Center of the Clarion Hotel in Springfield. They were able to visit with those they see infrequently as well as a number of missionaries and visiting representatives from our national agencies.

Monday saw the activities of the Missouri Women Active for Christ. Their eleven o'clock service featured Dana Booth, Home missionary to Rochester, New York.



Monday evening was our opening service and featured the music of New Mercy Trio from Free Will Baptist Bible College and Tim York from the International Missions

Department brought a great message and challenged our hearts about our personal involvement in the great commission.

Tuesday morning the Christian Education Board sponsored Glenn Johnson, who pastors in Chesterfield, VA, in both a seminar setting and our morning

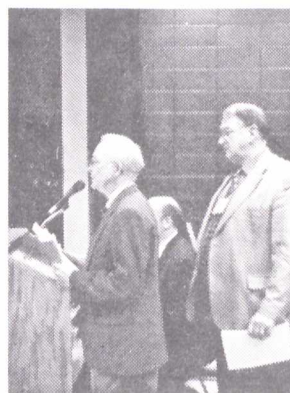
worship service. Bro. Johnson has been greatly used of the Lord in Prayer Revivals across the nation and he really spoke to us.

Tuesday afternoon we began our annual business session hearing from all our state boards and committees and our national agencies as well. God has blessed Missouri this year and it was evident as we listened to our board chairmen tell of the efforts of their men.



The Lebanon Bible and Bookstore reported a record

sales year with total sales of over \$509,000. This is up by over \$21,000 over last year.



The Youth Camp Board thrilled us with reports of 1,397 in our camping sessions last year. They told of 55 first time decisions for Christ, 75 rededications and one call to special service. Bruce Moore is the new

Camp Superintendent and is busy at work on preparations for this years sessions. Included is the anticipated beginning of construction on the new boy's dorm after this years camps are over.

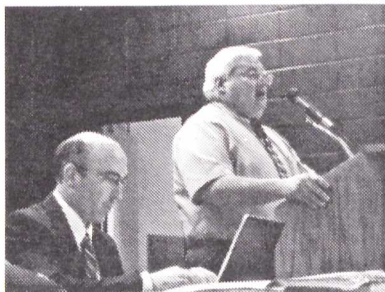


Our CE Board reported on the nine areas of responsibility they oversee. Among those were hosting Ron Owens in both last years State meeting and the ministers retreat, continuing to

provide scholarships to our Bible Colleges, sponsoring Palmer Leadership Institute with Dr. Doug Earls, and proposed sponsorship of the upcoming Couples retreat in November.

The Senior Adult Ministries Board told of their successful Senior's Retreat in 2005 with 200 people gathering to hear Connie Carriker preach and the "Promised Land" group sing. Their 2006 event has already taken place at the Clarion Hotel in Springfield where 199 listened to Fred Warner.

The Youth Ministries Board reported a successful slate of Competitive activities in 2005 with 160 participants at the Boy's and Girl's Club in Springfield. The 2006 competition was held at United FWB Church in West Plains and



148 entries were logged. They also told of their very successful State Youth Retreat. Mark Cahill was the guest speaker and thrilled our youth and adults with a challenge to be a personal witness for Christ

where ever you are. The November 2006 event will feature Allan Pointer.

The Show Me- Committee's report was approved to add Matthew and Brooke Turnbough to our plan. They are on deputation to go to Spain.

The Missouri Home Missions report found our board giving information on missions in Jefferson City,



Jackson, Columbia, Belton and our new work in Troy. Our Missionaries were commended for their hard work and prayers solicited for their continued strength and guidance. The board reported that the parsonage at the work in Kirksville as been sold and the money used to pay off the property debt on the Jackson work.



In business that day, we were presented with the final report of the Special Missions Study Committee appointed at the State meeting last year. Their commission was to bring back a recommendation to help us raise more money for missions in Missouri.

The proposal was explained and discussed and tabled until Wednesday.

Tuesday found us gathering in the Grand Ballroom of the Clarion Hotel for an inspiring service as Richard Atwood with our National Home Missions Department spoke to us.

Wednesday morning our day was started right with a devotion ably delivered by Jerry Scott, pastor from Marshal, Mo. Our morning service included a further explanation of the study committee's recommendation and a

vote was taken to approve the plan. *(for a full explanation of the plan, see the editors article on page 3)*

Wednesday evening we returned after an afternoon of relaxation or shopping or whatever. Bob Thebeau, pastor at Desoto, MO brought a challenging message on following the voice of God to be able to get done what He has asked us to do.



Wednesday Evening also featured a Youth Service planned and executed by Jeff Myers and Travis Watkins. Kenny Myers was the speaker and music was provided by the Hartville Praise Band along with New Mercy Trio. This was the first year service at the State in about 30 years and we did not know what to expect. Our room was set up for 100 and 190 showed

Meet Your Missionaries

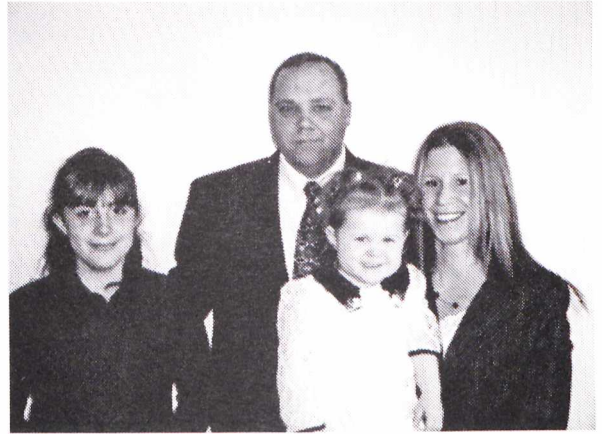
The Burkes in Troy

30 May, 2006 Abidjan

It's a beautiful day here-but already hot. Jerry and I walked earlier than usual this morning, but still came home wet .. We just walk around in our neighborhood for about 20 minutes 6 times a week. It's a good time to see folks.

Bible Study last night was really good. We're going through the book of Romans. Pastor Samuel is using the study guide Jerry did years ago for the students at the Bible Institute.

Pastor Samuel has been running his head off trying to get the needed papers so we (not including this writer) can begin to make the blocks for the outer wall around the property. They told him when he paid for the water meter that it could be installed in two days .. but when he paid they said a stamp was needed from the mayor's office-but the mayor couldn't stamp it for two days .. then, the computer wasn't working so nothing could be done-come back next week.. if/when that gets done, they say the water meter will be installed within two weeks ... hassle, hassle ... and we're just starting ...

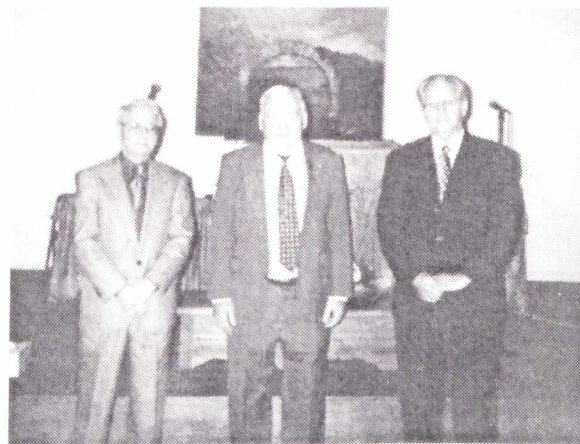

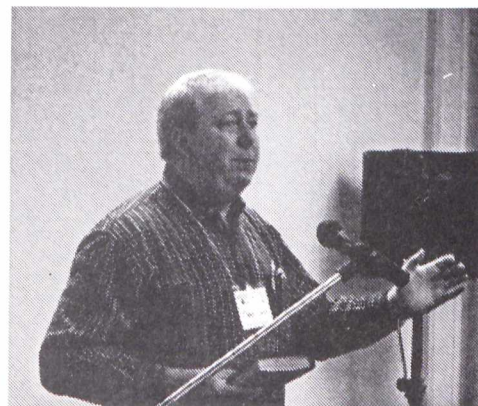

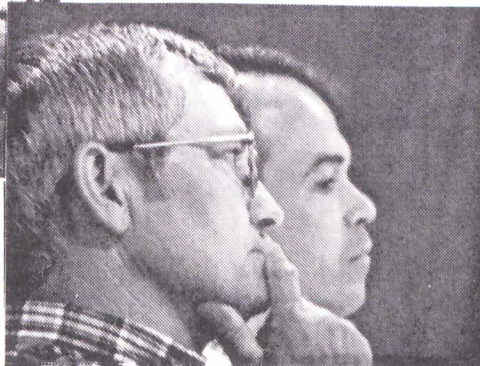

State of Tennessee Honors Retiring FWBBC Employee

NASHVILLE, TN – The Tennessee House of Representatives adopted House Joint Resolution No.1019 on April 19, 2006, recognizing retiring Free Will Baptist Bible College employee Sara Steele for 37 years of service as secretary to the academic dean.

The joint resolution signed by Governor Phil Bredesen, Speaker of the Senate John Wilder, Speaker of the House of Representatives Jimmy Naifeh, and Representative Charles Curtiss cites Mrs. Steele's distinctive service under four college presidents and two academic deans.

Specifying that "it is appropriate that the members of this legislative body...honor those citizens who have performed with uncommon devotion and enthusiasm throughout their years of industry," the resolution commends Mrs. Steele for her sense of humor, her active role in community outreach, and her volunteer work in her church.

The resolution concludes with: "Whereas, throughout her estimable career, Mrs. Steele has demonstrated the utmost professionalism, ability, and integrity, winning the unbridled respect and admiration of her colleagues; now, therefore,

"Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the One Hundred Fourth General Assembly of the State of Tennessee, the Senate concurring, that we extend to Sara C. Steele our heartfelt wishes for a happy and fulfilling retirement and every contin-

Mrs. Steele retires on June 30, 2006, after completing nearly four decades of faithful service at FWBBC. Her husband of 46 years, Wayne Steele, retired from the Tennessee Highway Patrol and now works security detail at the State Legislature. The Steeles are members of Cofer's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church in Nashville.

Hillsdale Alumni Film Nominated for Best Family Picture

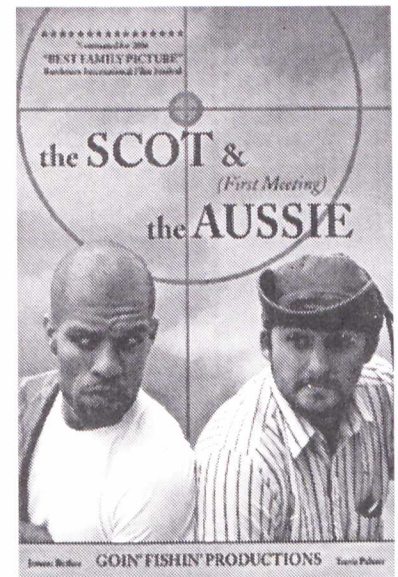
The Scot & The Aussie: First Meeting, a comedic short film produced by and starring Norman resident Travis Palmer (2004 Hillsdale alumnus) and Lawton resident Jerome Bethea of Goin' Fishin' Productions. The film was shot on location at Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, and has been accepted to the Barebones International Film Festival, where it has also been nominated for Best Family Picture. The film premiered at the festival Friday, April 21, at the Roxy Theatre in Muskogee, OK.

"I was delightfully surprised to hear we were nominated for 'Best Family Picture,'" says Palmer, who not only starred but also served as director of photography and sound composer for the film. "It was very encouraging to know that the festival sees what we're trying to do with *The Scot & The*

Aussie. It explores the themes of brotherhood and communication in an exciting adventure of survival... who wouldn't want to watch it!"

Palmer's long-term vision to create his own production company came to fruition in the fall of 2005 after he met partner Bethea in a film direction class. The two, united by their faith and love for film, founded Goin' Fishin' Productions and shot *The Scot & Aussie* as their first film collaboration.

Palmer is the founder of ImproVision, a video ministry through which he serves missionaries by creating promotional videos of their mission field for them to use to raise awareness and support in churches. He has created videos for missionaries to China, Vietnam, and Romania and will be going on a short mission trip to Romania this summer. He plans to pursue his degree in foreign missions at Hillsdale upon completion of his film degree at Oklahoma City Community College.



Palmer and Bethea share the vision to bring Light to the movies through the Goin' Fishin' Productions with films that are uplifting, inspirational, thought-provoking, and entertaining. The "Best Family Picture" award was presented Sunday, April 23 at the Barebones Awards Gala in Muskogee.

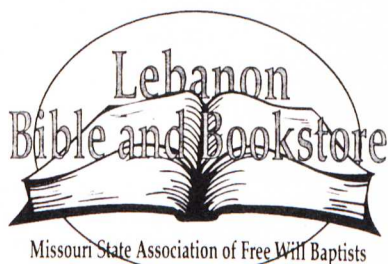
