From The Editor

"Ice Storm." I have never cared for the sound of those two words. Now, I really can't stand them. When the weather man began to suggest that there could be a major winter storm set to move up the I-44 corridor, there was an ominous tone to his voice. Usually wrong, this time he proved to be right on target. Moving out of Texas and Oklahoma, the storm tracked right up the highway, devastating the trees and power lines in its path.

Before it had ended, hundreds of thousands of people in the mid-west were with out electricity. And with the power went heat and lights and water and often the ability to cook food. The sub-zero temperatures that followed only added to folks misery and quickly became life threatening. People began to scramble to locate generators to run the basic necessities of their homes. Fortunately the ice was mostly in the trees and on power lines. The streets and roads remained amazingly clear, aiding in the effort to get help to those in danger.

It was in this atmosphere that Free Will Baptist churches all across the state of Missouri began to shine. Many of them opened their facilities to shelter those in need. Generators were provided, showers, food and beds were offered free of

local relief effort and their church cooked meals not only for the hundreds who came to their shelter, but also for another shelter set up a few days later. It was several days before Pastor Earls and his people saw their own homes, they were busy sheltering and feeding those who had need. David also oversaw a volunteer crew of over 100 who aided in removing limbs and trees so the power restoration efforts could move faster. He was featured in news reports from more than one of the TV stations in Springfield.

Lebanon was also hit hard with a major portion of Laclede County without power. First Church and Pastor Joe Wilson were blessed that the church had power through most of the ordeal and were able to provide showers and food for many in the community. Under the direction of Ann Robinson, volunteers of the church cooked hundreds of meals for the Red Cross shelters of the

area. Joe arranged for crews from the Illinois Masters Men to bring in loads of generators and much needed kerosene and

charge. Sometimes the FWB church was the only relief effort underway in the community.

Buffalo was hit hard with the town suffering a 100% power loss. Pastor Doug Earls and the folks at Calvary were the first to open their doors and provide a warm place to sleep and eat. Member David Beltz headed up the

coleman fuel. Some of the men returned in the days following and aided greatly in the cleanup effort. There were even two women from the Donelson Fellowship in Nashville on hand the weekend after the storm to help with tree and limb removal along with many locals.

This scene was played out all across the state as FWB churches and people reached out to those who had need. They were able to feed and warm thousands, but they were also able to provide a strong witness for Christ in the process. Several who received help remarked that the churches were on the scene quicker and much more organized than some of the professional aid agencies.

This all shows that in a world where people are more concerned with their own comfort and care. there are still those who can hear the voice of Jesus talking about giving a cup of cold water or in this case, hot soup in his name. If you have done it to the least of these, you have done it unto me. That creates a feeling as warming as that cup of soup.





The Turnboughs in Spain

Dear Friends,

By now you have probably already heard our exciting news. After FIFTEEN YEARS of waiting, THIRTEEN YEARS of legal battles, the Free Will Baptist Church in Villalba, Spain has received permission to build! It was a landmark decision by the local city officials, because all the city councilmen of all political persuasions voted UNANIMOUSLY to grant the church the permit. In addition to that, they granted the permit without the church paying any additional taxes, which would have been over \$20,000 US dollars!

Constructing a new church building anywhere is exciting. However, when you realize this is the very first and only free-standing Protestant church building on the whole Western side of the Madrid Province, and there are over five million souls here, that makes it even more significant. This will be the VERY FIRST and the only free-standing Free Will Baptist church building in the entire nation of Spain. It is exciting to be a part of such a unique effort in God's Kingdom work.

From a financial perspective, the main damage the church has suffered as a result of having to wait fifteen years is that construction costs of the very same building has quadrupled. However, local believers and missionaries firmly believe that the God who has so miraculously worked to give the church permission will also provide the necessary funds to make this 15-year dream a reality. This is all for His honor and glory!

The cost of the construction, depending on fluctuating exchange rates, will be around \$500,000 US dollars. The church is doing its part. They purchased the land where they will construct the new building. Today, this land is debt free and worth approximately \$400,000.

In the past few years, in addition to paying regular expenses, legal fees, and giving significant amounts of money to missions, the church has saved the equivalent of \$72,000 to go towards the building. That money enabled the church to pay \$25,000 in cash in architectural fees during 2006.

In order to help make the dream become a reality, we missionaries in Spain have created "The 100 List." We are asking for at least 100 individuals to commit to give \$1,000 over the next five years (that's \$200 per year or less than \$17 per month), to encourage and to help our Spanish FWB brethren move forward with this unique opportunity God has given them.

We missionaries are not asking anyone to do what we ourselves are not willing to do. Our names are at the top of this list. From now on, until the building is completed, we will send out regular updates so that you will know how the construction is progressing.

This is a great opportunity to be a part of something significant, making history, by putting the first free-standing Protestant church building ever in this city in Spain. Will you pray and ask God if He would have you add your name to the list? Please let us know if we can count on you.

Please send your gifts through the state office earnmarked for the "Spain Building Fund."

Auxiliary Scholarship to be Awarded


April is World Missions Offering Month
