Give So She Can Live....Forever!

I have gazed into her big, brown eyes a hundred times since the first time I saw her. She was peeking shyly at me from behind the safety of her father that first time. When I lifted my camera to take her picture she quickly ducked out of my sight. I waited for her to look at me again and raised the camera only to get the same reaction. Finally I just held the camera in position and when she looked around her father's head, I caught her curiLater that morning as we sat in the final service of the Indian National Association of Free Will Baptists I looked out at over 3,500 people from all parts of India, Nepal and Bhutan. I felt a swell of thankfulness to realize that these people had travelled many hours, most by train or truck or bus or even bicycle to be with their brothers and sisters in Christ. I thrilled to know that these people could not only attend this conference but would some-

ous look on film. Later, as I looked back at the photos I had taken that day, I was arrested by her gaze.

We had been standing just inside the gate of a Muslim school in Sonapurhut, West Bengal, India. We were returning from a baptism down the road and across the field from our mission compound. We had baptized 71 that morning and were returning with great rejoicing in our hearts that

rejoicing in our hearts that God was working in such a wonderful way in India. As we passed the Muslim school we saw over a hundred small children sitting on their mats with the Quran in front of them on the ground. Their teacher sat under a nearby tree, calling out passages for their memory. The children would with one voice begin to quote the passages from the Quran as they rocked back and forth on their mats. Many of them were too young to read yet they quoted right along with their older classmates.

As we stopped and watched, someone suggested that we get permission to go inside the wall and film their activities. To our surprise we were welcomed in, doubtless they did not know who we were. As we entered, there was a palatable feeling of darkness inside those walls. Even though the sun was shining brightly and the children were all dressed colorfully, there was something dismal permeating the scene. To think that these children would grow up believing the lies contained in the teaching they were receiving that day brought sadness to my heart. We had just celebrated the deliverance of 71 precious souls from this very kind of darkness and yet here was a graphic reminder that the work was great and multiplied millions in India needed Jesus.



day be in heaven because folks back home had a burden for them. That burden had prompted Carlisle and Marie Hanna and the Cronks and others to journey to India for these very people. The burden had prompted churches and individuals to give funds to provide their needs and pray for their success.

I thrilled as I saw the large group of Pastors and Evangelists and Church Planters gathered for the convention and realized that the burden extended to these men as

well. They are the ones responsible for all the people at the convention knowing Christ as their savior. Taught and trained by Bro. Carlisle through the years, they are a might army for the Lord moving across north India, Nepal and Bhutan. I could just envision them being cheered on by the great cloud of witnesses as they preach and teach in such a darkened land.

I can still hear the sounds of the children in the Muslim school chanting the Quran. But somehow I can hear over them the sound of the children singing about Jesus at the Free Will Baptist church just yards down the road. As I look at the brown eyes of that little girl, I feel better about the whole thing. She lives just down the road from a group of Free Will Baptists who have as the great desire of their hearts telling everyone about what Christ has done. They chances are good that this little girl will hear about Jesus and take him as her savior because Carlisle Hanna and the Free Will Baptists live in her village.

Aren't you glad you have a part in sending missionaries around the world? What's that you say, you really have not been a part of this effort? Don't you think it is about time you started. Support the Show-Me Plan and give to the World Missions Offering this month in your church.

Jerry is 5 hours up the road at a Pastor's Retreat now. He should be back home in a couple of days..



News From Spain

Dear Show-Me Plan Supporters,

We are thankful that in the last month 108 persons and/or entities have committed to give \$1,000 to the Villalba building project over the next 5 years! This is a real encouragement to local leaders and believers. They see these names and thank the Lord for each of them. The 100 List is on the website of the church in Villalba. (http:// www.iglesiadevillalba.org/The100List.dsp) Although we have dubbed this The 100 List, we certainly welcome more people who want to help make this 15-year dream become a reality. We are waiting for bids from construction companies and researching construction loans. As soon as we have more news, we'll update you. Thank you for your prayers.

My responsibility as Regional Director for Europe and Russia means we are traveling outside Spain on occasion. We spent 10 days in January with our FWBIM missionaries in France, as well as with local leaders and believers. We are very encouraged after seeing the work our missionaries are doing there, as well as after seeing how God is working in our local churches there. We are especially thankful to see how French leaders are working together to plan the next church plant and how they have accepted the challenge to host the 2008 International Fellowship of FWB in the month of October. Please pray for our work in France, especially for the leaders of local churches.

Leaders of the Saint Sébastien Church in France have invited the youth from the Villalba Church to visit them in August of this year. Last year the youth from France visited the church in Villalba. Susan is working with the

young people here to make plans for this trip. Yesterday the youth group met to discuss this trip, as well as other things they would like to do. They have very creative ideas. Pray for the youth in our local churches, both in Spain and in France.

Our commitment to ITA and LMC has us leaving Spain tomorrow (February 22) to travel to Bangkok, Thailand for advanced trainer's training. We have received training in the past, but this is a higher level of training, one that will prepare us to begin to train Spanish-speaking leaders to carry on the course in Spanish. Our National Ministries Team (McVays/Turnboughs) are sponsoring our first mini-LMC in Madrid in May of this year. We already have the commitment of a 9-member team of trainers, and every couple and individual with whom we have spoken about the course has enthusiastically agreed to attend. As you can imagine, we are excited about it. Please pray for our 7 days in the Bangkok training session, as well as our preparations for the very first mini-LMC for Spain May 4-6, 2007.

Toward the end of 2006, our mission account sank into the red. But, generous gifts in the month of January pulled the account back into the black. THANK YOU so very much for your generosity. We realize that we could not be in Spain without your faithful gifts.

It now includes buttons, banners, posters, figurines, bubble gum cigars, pens, and a host of other objects. Almost anything related to Presidential history has become a part of a collection that totals over 10,000 pieces. In pursuit of his hobby, Keith has met Presidents Ford, Carter, Reagan, George H.W. Bush, Clinton and current President George W. Bush. He has met our current President three times. Included in his collection are Christmas cards he has received from the Reagans, Clintons and Bushes.

Those cards along with 1500 other items of his collection will be on display at the Lebanon Public Library on April 26th from 9 am till 7 pm. Included in the display will be such unique items as a bill signer used by President Lyndon Johnson in 1966 at the White House, a tie bar given to him by President Bush, a coffee cup from Lady Bird Johnson's whistle stop train in 1964 and M&M's from Air Force One during the Clinton years. Several autographed items will be on display along with a unique section of artifacts dealing with President Kennedy's assassination in 1963.

Keith's collection includes a good selection of audio/visual items and over 1000 books on presidential history. Keith says, "A portion of my collection will be donated to the George W. Bush Presidential Library and Museum when it is erected in Texas. It will be donated in memory of my mother who loved history. She had met President George W. Bush on three occasions with me and admired the President. It will be given to his library and museum when he leaves the White House. "

A breathless, university student with a quart jar in his hand came rushing into the dairy barn. "I have to take a quart of warm milk back to my fraternity," he explained. Having just removed the milking machine from a cow, I said, "Hold out your jar". He ran out into the darkness with his jar full of warm milk.

Through the years I have often chuckled to myself as I thought of that student's fraternity brothers thinking that they had sent their "pledge" on a difficult mission. In fact, the prospect of entering a dark barn and finding a cow that would be willing to allow a stranger to milk a quart of milk would have been quite challenging. (The university's dairy cows were accustomed to being fed a gallon or more of succulent grain several minutes prior to milking time.) Moreover, the fraternity brothers probably didn't realize that their young member would encounter a fellow student during the 2:30 a.m. milking time.

Lwonder if God smiles when He fills our "jars" in times of need. "Call to Me, and I will answer you, and show you great and mighty things, which you do not know." (Jeremiah 33:3, NKJ)

While serving as pastor of our first church, my wife required major surgery and a long hospitalization. (It was a miracle that her life was spared.) We didn't have sufficient money to pay her hospital bills. At her insistence, we withdrew her teacher's retirement. A several hundred dollar balance still remained.

One day a young widow, mother of several children, pressed a roll of money into my hand. That amount was enough to finish paying the hospital bill.

Hold out your jar.

At a later time, in a different city, the congregation of our beginning church was seeking funds with which to build. (Meanwhile, the church was making payments on five acres of property.) For several years we had conducted services in a temporary chapel.

One day I heard the crunch of car tires on our gravel driveway. As Sister Alta sat in our living room, she asked, "How much money do you need to build your church?" Soon afterward she made our church a low-interest loan that was, in time, paid in full.

Hold out your jar.





Dr. Charles Hampton, Former FWBBC Registrar, Dies

Free Will Baptist

NASHVILLE, TN—Dr. Charles Hampton, who served 25 years at Free Will Baptist Bible College (1974-2000), 20 years as registrar, died March 5 at age 68. He retired in 2000 after being diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease.

President Matt Pinson said, "When Dr. Hampton joined the FWBBC faculty in 1974, he was unique with his Ph.D. in mathematics and his warm heart for the work of God. He chaired the General Education Department before being named registrar.

Pinson continued, "But more important, he was a godly man, a loving husband and father, and a man who chose to invest his life in the mission of Free Will Baptist Bible College. He had such an impact on so many of our lives. Thank God for his spiritual and educational legacy."

After graduating from FWBBC with a B.S. degree in 1960, Dr. Hampton went on to earn three more degrees—B.S. (Oklahoma Baptist University, 1963), M.N.S. (University of Oklahoma, 1966), and Ph.D. (University of Texas, 1970).

During a "Charles Hampton Day" at FWBBC in September 2000, Dr. Robert Picirilli (longtime friend and professional colleague) said, "With his credentials and love for teaching, Dr. Hampton could have been on the faculty of almost any university in this country or anywhere, making multiples of the money he's made here and earning considerably more prestige. Instead, he has chosen to make higher Christian education his ministry, his service to the Lord and the Church."

Dr. Hampton was one of four sons of the late Rev. Ralph Hampton, Sr., three of whom became Free Will Baptist ministers. His older brother Ralph chairs the Bibli-



cal and Ministry Studies Department at FWBBC; younger brother Larry is an adjunct faculty member at FWBBC and an editor at Randall House Publications. The fourth son (James) is deceased.

Charles was converted at age 10 in 1948 and ordained to preach in 1964. He is listed in American Men and Women of Science and in Who's Who in America. He taught in a number of different settings—Oklahoma public schools, Army Dependent School in Germany, University of Texas, Oklahoma Baptist University, and Hillsdale FWB College.

In broader denominational work, Dr. Hampton served as moderator of Oklahoma's First Mission Association (1968-70) and chaired the association's Mission Board (1972-74). He was elected president of the Free Will Baptist Music Ministries organization in 1977 and wrote articles for Contact stirring interest in the music fellowship. He pastored in Oklahoma and Texas, and served as minister of music in several churches.

Dr. Hampton is survived by his wife Peggy; two sons, Brian Hampton and Joel Hampton; three daughters, Mrs. Shari Windom, Mrs. Jennifer Bowen, and Mrs. Leslie Hester; and 15 grandchildren
