### t was Thursday evening at the camp

and I was 14 years old. Thursday evenings back then had a special feel. That was the evening all the hard cases came forward in the service. At invitation time you could see them. They were the ones who had refused to make a move all week and now this was their last chance before we all went home the next morning. Sometimes their friends talked to them, sometimes it was a counselor. But here they would come, finally

ready to do business with the Lord.


I watched as they crowded around the altar at the front of the old tabernacle. Counselors were there to pray with them and record their decisions on a card to be sent to their pastors.

As I watched, I suddenly found myself moving with them to the front. Now I was not a hard case, I had already been to the altar twice that

week and was feeling pretty good. But something drew me forward and I soon found myself praying at the altar. I didn't know for sure why until I said "God, whatever you want me to do I will do it." And He said "OK, preach."

I don't have a testimony like a lot of preachers about the years they ran from God before He ran them to ground and they consented to preach. I didn't have any better sense than to say yes the first time He asked. Did that make the decision any less sure? I suspect that the struggle to submit to God's will is a constant reminder to those who go through that process. They remember what it took to submit and it is a confirmation of their decision. But I am convinced that I heard God's voice that night and I have never look back or doubted that He said "preach" and that I said "yes."

This obviously makes camp a unique place for me.




God spoke and He continues to speak today. Through

It was at the left end of the old altar in the tabernacle that it happened. I still walk over and look at that spot each time I am at camp. Is it holy ground? To me it is, but then I am sure there are spots of holy ground all over that hillside. Maybe one of them is yours.

It is a joy to share in this issue of the Gem about our ministry in Tokyo! During this current term. Ruth and I serve in the leadership role at the Good News Chapel in the greater Tokyo area. Much has happened since we began this term just two summers ago.

The Good News Chapel relocated to another store front location in the Spring of 2005 during our stateside ministry. Later, in the fall of 2005, heavy

water damage from a late season hurricane forced the church plant to move once again in the same year. After much prayer and research into rentable facilities, the small body of believers was led to rent a 3rd floor of a small professional building. Though the building was 3 years old, that floor had remained unused until our entrance. We felt as if we were getting a brand new church building for about the same rent as the previous older and limited storefront!

The facility is small, but we are conveniently located close to the local train station with new shopping centers and apartment buildings all around. God has given us a strategic location with hundreds walking in front of our building daily! Thousands of train commuters pass by the backside of our building during the course of each day. We have visibility! Just recently, an older building across the street from our church was demolished for area renovations. At the next church gathering, we

> realized we now have a clear view of the horizon 60 miles in the distance. That horizon includes Japan's most famous mountain: Mt. Fuii!

At Good News Chapel, we continue focusing our minis-

tries on impacting our immediate community for Christ. God has once again provided our work with a two year short term worker to teach our evangelistic English classes. Shirley Williams, from West Virginia, is

in her second year in this role and has been effective in meeting many of the students outside of the classroom for further contact. Fifteen to twenty students not only come to our church for English classes weekly, but also have a 30 minute opportunity to study God's

Later we had the eleven E-team members minister in one of our Sunday worship services with testimonies, songs, and a powerful pantomime. Our believers were moved with the special emphasis on the cross in that service. The Tokyo E-team also participated in our English classes and stayed overnight in Japanese homes, being able to bring more of the Gospel light into the very homes of a number of our contacts.

# God and Country 2007

Five years ago Pastor Joe Wilson and the folks at First Church in Lebanon decided to have a God and Country Day to celebrate our wonderful American heritage and the part God has played. They had food and music and fireworks and 300 people showed up. Not bad for a congregation of 100+.

Last year the event, held on a members shooting range just outside Lebanon had swelled to over 3000! As plans for this year's event on July 8th were being made, everyone thought Pastor Joe was being overly optimistic when he projected an attendance of 5-7 thousand.

Joe's faith was vindicated, however, when 12,000 people showed up for the afternoon and evening long event. The local newspaper reported on Monday that this is the largest event in the area of this type, noting that the city of Lebanon only has a population of just over 12,000.

The folks who came were treated to good gospel, bluegrass and contemporary gospel music along with great food and free watermelon. Area vendors brought a diverse selection of eats ranging from turkey legs to shaved ice and funnel cakes. The day's events included a monster truck, fire trucks from eight area towns, a Blackhawk helicopter from nearby Fort Leonard Wood, the Lifeline helicopter and displays from other area agencies. The kids could play on the inflatable games or ride the train or have their face painted or all three, all the while with a piece of watermelon in their hands.

Music for the day was provided by CMT from Branson, CrossWired, Refined by Fire and the First Church Praise Band and Praise Team.

The early evening activities featured the Free Fall Express parachute jump team landing with a flag from Iraq. On the main stage Pastor Joe interviewed Captain Chris Plekenpol, who shared his stirring testimony of God's goodness on the battlefield of Iraq.






The evening concluded with a fantastic fireworks display staged by Premier Pyrotechnics. Owner Matt Sutclif took the microphone before the fireworks and thanked Joe and First Church for their vision and hard work providing an event on a scale beyond what most will even attempt.

After it was all over, folks seemed not to be in a hurry to leave, many visiting with their neighbors and newfound acquaintances. The overwhelming topic was what a great time they had and how the fireworks display was one of the best they had ever seen! They had eaten, been entertained, and even received the gospel in a wholesome family atmosphere. They left looking forward to next year.

After the cleanup and teardown was done and the fantastic volunteer team from First Church was leaving, Pastor Joe was heard to say something about 20,000 next year. Who knows, it could happen, after all it was said often throughout the afternoon and evening, this is a "God thing!" As Joe drove away, there was a smile on his face as he patted the box on the seat beside him. A box that contained several thousand registration cards, many of which expressed someones interest in knowing more about First Free Will Baptist Church of Lebanon. Was all the hard work worth it? Absolutely. It was, after all a God thing!

# Turnbough Update

Dear Prayer Partners,

aribel called me very excited about some news Miconcerning a possible loan for the construction of the new building for the Villalba Church. Maribel is a believer from the new FWB work in Alpedrete, and as a real estate agent, we asked her to also check with her bank contacts to see if any of them would give the church a loan. At first, she thought that the bank she normally works with for her clients only gave loans to individuals, not to companies, and much less to Evangelical churches. Well, after a little investigation, she discovered that this bank has opened a new department to give precisely the kind of loan the church needs. She got in touch with the head person of that department, and when she mentioned my name, he immediately said, "I know him personally! Years ago I was the local bank officer who worked with Jeff and Susan to get their first home loan in Spain, and they impressed me very positively. It will be a pleasure for me to do this and to get the best conditions I can possibly offer!"

Okay, the point of praise here is not as much the fact that this bank administrator knows us or that we got along well (even though that is obviously a personal praise item). The point is, what are the chances of some guy from years gone by being promoted in a lending institution to a position of such magnitude, in a company that we personally haven't had any dealings with for years, and now a third person checks on this for our local church, and he is specifically the person who approves this type of operation? Even more outside the norm, what are the chances that he would remember two foreigners by their names after so many years (I wouldn't!), and that he would have had that kind of strong positive impression that would motivate him to do this kind of thing? Keep in mind that in this cultural context, it is very rare (if not unheard of) for an Evangelical church to get a loan. Some people would say this is just a coincidence. But, many believers would say that these kind of "coincidences" seem to happen much more often when God's people pray. YOU have been praying specifically for this! Regardless of what else happens, I can tell you of at least two people for whom this incident was a "goose bump experience" -- Maribel and me. And that's why I am sharing it with you.

THANK YOU for praying! As I mentioned in our last "loan update", the church not only needs a loan, it needs a loan with special conditions that will enable it to be able to make the monthly payments, and those details are still in the works. Please continue to pray!

# Jesus Walked on Water!

Violent storm. In the midst of a violent storm, with waves threatening their rowboat, Jesus' disciples saw a man walking toward them on the sea. They

were terrified! "But Jesus said to them, It is I; be not afraid!—I AM; stop being frightened!" (John 6:20, Amplified Bible). Undoubtedly they were greatly relieved for Jesus to come on board. With great effort, they had been rowing for three or four miles. Now, with Jesus on board, they were instantly at their designated shore.

How was Jesus qualified to walk on water, quiet the storm, and bring peace and calm to the hearts of His terrified disciples? He was walking on the water that He had created: *"All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made"* (John 1:3, NKJ). (Compare: Colossians 1:16, 17; and Hebrews 1:2).

Jesus made the same "I AM" claim in John 8:58: "Jesus said to them, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM"

(NKJ). Dr. Charles Ryrie wrote: "The 'I AM' denotes absolute eternal existence..." (Ryrie Study Bible).

Jesus Christ clearly demonstrated, many times, that He is our Creator/God—in "perfect unity" with the Father and the Holy Spirit (John 14:15-26). John wrote: *"He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him"* (John 1:10, NKJ). Sadly, many people did not recognize that He had come to "redeem" His own creation (Ephesians 1:7). But here is Good News! "But to as many as did receive and welcome Him, He gave the authority [power, privilege, right] to become the children of God, that is, to those who believe in—adhere to, trust in and rely on—His name" (John 1:12, Amplified Bible).

Violent wind. When I was a teenager someone brought us the tragic news that two of our relatives had been killed in a tornado. As soon as we finished milking our cows we drove the 15 miles or so to their farm.

It appeared that the tornado, like a giant vacuum

cleaner, had picked up the house, leaving the dirt beneath cleanly swept. Amazingly, not a stick of firewood which was stacked on the concrete front porch had been disturbed. A small wooden-framed structure, built over the door to the underground storm cellar, was about 12 feet from where the house had stood-not a board or shingle disturbed. About 50 feet on the other side, a chicken house had been leveled. Chickens had been scattered all over-some dead, some alive.

Following my dad as we traced the path of the storm, I didn't see a piece of the house that was any bigger than what a couple of grown men could have picked up and carried away. Alongside my dad, I peered cautiously at the spot where one body had been found. Several feet further along, another

body had been located. Were they awakened from their sleep? Were they aware of what was happening?

Violent storms (of various sorts) can unexpectedly crash in on your life or mine, bringing chaos, pain, and confusion. Invite Jesus into your boat. He will safely guide you in this life and on to heaven's shore.
