State Meeting 2008

One of the best yet!" "Great meeting!" Those are some of the comments overheard as folks left the convention center at the Clarion Hotel in Springfield on a recent Wednesday evening. The State Meeting has just ended and Missouri Free Will Baptists were about to make their way back to their homes. Most were going with enthusiasm and renewed vigor after a few days with their brothers and sisters from across the state. Some they see only at meetings like this one.

It had all started a few days earlier as Youth from all parts of the State had gathered for their annual Music and Arts Festival. This was the first year to combine this event with the State meeting and many were anxious to see how it would work. We began on Sunday evening with a mass youth service with the praise band from the Hartville Church providing music and a challenging sermon with Rev. Joe Wilson from the First Church in Lebanon. Joe did everything he could to challenge the over 350 youth and adults there from brandishing a feather duster to walking on and then clinging to a balance beam. Competition began after the evening service and continued far into the night, continuing on Monday morning. With about 115 competitors from 20 different churches, the competition was stiff, but the awards ceremony on Monday afternoon saw well over 60 achieving a sufficiently high score to advance on to the National Competition at Charleston, West Virginia in July.

The opening service of the 95th Annual Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists began Monday evening with Clerk Kenny Panduku calling session to order. Moderator Rick Dement, pastor at O'Fallon First presided and Greg Smith from Ozark First Church lead the worship. Special music was provided by the Ozark Trio. Rev. Kenny Simpson, Pastor of Beacon Church in Raytown began to develop our theme of "It's all about Him..." with his sermon on the Glory of Christ. Our hearts were blessed and we were off to a great start.

Tuesday was the day for our Missouri Women Active for Christ to have their meeting. They began in Ball Room One in the morning with a Devotion by Brenda Johnson and music lead by Cindy Thompson. Their following business session featured reports from several missionaries and other agencies. The Morning worship service was led by Cindy Thompson with special music by Amy Dodson and Jodi Simpson. Recently returned missionary Carol Pinkerton was the featured speaker using the theme of "Spiritual Amber Alert" from Joel 2:1.

The afternoon business session followed lunch and included reports from the Credentials, Financial, Registration, Appreciation and Executive committees. The 2009 project was approved as: Missouri "Show-Me Plan",

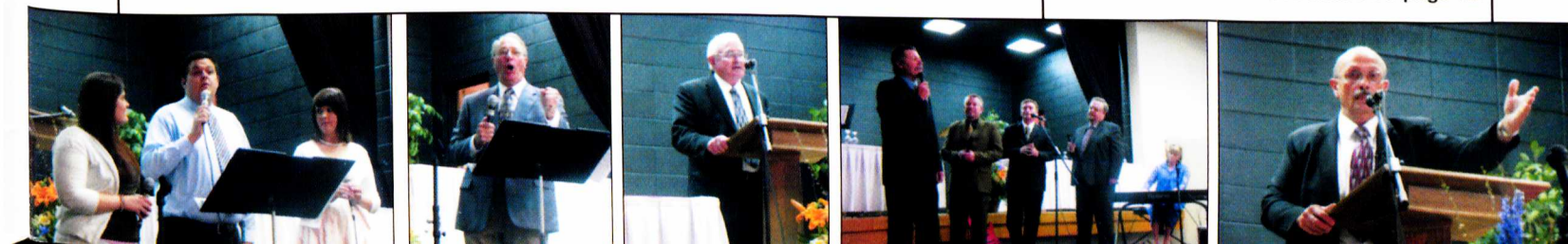

Also on Tuesday, the Executive Committee met in a morning meeting in preparation for the afternoon annual session of the General Board. The Board received and approved the reports and budgets of all our Standing boards and committees and recommended them for presentation to the body.

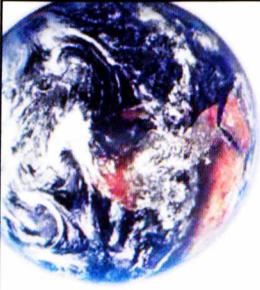

Pastor Richard Robinson of Thayer Church presided and Pastor Eddie Vincent of Parkview Church in Desloge led us in worship. Special music was presented by the Hillsdale Trio. Rev. Russell Johnson of Waynesville First challenged us with his sermon on the Body of Christ. The service also included the presentation of diplomas to the 41 Pastors and Associates who completed all six sessions of the Palmer Leadership Institute.

Wednesday was a day for business. We were well prepared by Rev. Andy Raines, Associate at Thayer Church as he brought our morning devotion. Moderator Rick Dement conducted our business as we heard reports from the General Board and all our Standing Boards as well as the Executive office and the Gem.

Missouri Show-Me Missions



Turnbough's News/Spain

Dear Friends in Missouri,

Greetings from Spain! It is great to be able to say "from Spain"! Over the last two months we have worked in Leadership Matters Courses (LMC) in Thailand and Costa Rica, as well as attended an Regional Director/Field Chairmen's Meeting in Nashville. It is great to be home! It is wonderful to be in our home church in Villalba! The new building is growing higher each day, in spite of the much-needed rain that has fallen over the last month.

We hit the ground running. We arrived Friday and Saturday we had an all-day training session with five local leaders, preparing them to give a three-day LMC short course later this year. We meet again next Saturday to continue the training, and will have at least two more weekends of intense training. The training we have received in LMC we now giving to others. Our (and ITA's) goal is to eventually offer the entire course to Spanish-speaking leaders around the world. The more time-consuming part of this process is not the translation of the materials, but rather finding and training qualified leaders. This will take several years.

Things are changing in our world. By now most of you have heard that our mission board asked Jeff to assume the role of Deputy Director for International Field Operations, to begin July 1, 2008. (See

article on the mission's website: <http://www.fwbgo.com/happenings.cgi?t=2&id=798>) This is part of the streamlining and restructuring of our mission administration. We will continue to live and work in Madrid to carry out this new international ministry, rather than moving to Nashville. We understand that many Evangelical missions consider their director of field operations to be a field rather than Stateside role. We agree with that idea and therefore will tackle this new ministry opportunity in that light, by fulfilling this responsibility from Spain. We will continue to be involved in Leadership Matters Course (and training leaders). We will continue to need your prayers and support! If you have any questions or comments, we'd love to hear from you!

In April our mission board also voted to begin the transition of changing our overall funding system from exclusively an individualized system of missionary support to a general fund to support all our missionaries (the Great Commission Fund). This will officially begin January 1, 2010. Our board has been praying about and investigating this change for the past three years, and as a part of a five year strategy, is giving another two years for the transition. We will continue to need your prayers and support! Your financial support will continue to support our particular ministry until 2010, and after that date your gifts will continue to support us plus EVERY FWBIM missionary around the world! We are very thankful for the vision of our lead-

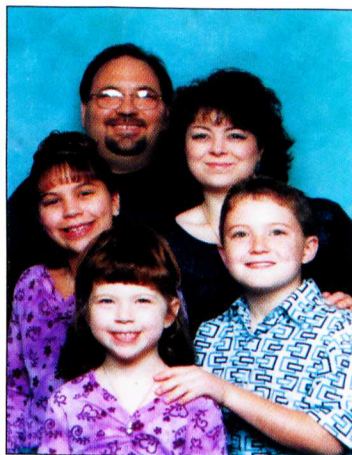

Hello! -- It's been a bit since I've been able to sit down and write an update for you. I thought I'd give you the latest since so many of you are praying for us.

We have secured our final drawings for the new location from our architect. This was an adventure in itself since we had to go back and revise the plans twice. Once the plans were paid for, we were told by the city of Thornton (less than 15 minutes from downtown Denver) that we needed a commercial contractor to pull our permit. They had not told us this previously so the time I could have spent during the makeup of the drawings to secure a contractor I've had to use now. It's taken me a week but I think I've found someone who will work with us as a church and allow us to do much of the work ourselves. There are some things we have to pay for as per the city's demands. We needed a master electrician (which we found and he graciously donated his services!) for some wiring for the stage area. Our FWB church in Wyoming is volunteering some manpower and one of the men has offered to construct a beautiful wood cross for our entryway which we will accent with lighting so that when the building's not being used, the cross will be lit and seen by all who drive by! The Lord is just putting the pieces together but keeps us yielded to his timing. I'm learning more and more about patience in this venture. After several years here paying off an old debt, investing money, moving temporarily, and going through the growing pains we've went through in the past two years since our re-launch, I'm anxious to move into this location and develop our vision to its fullest.

In short, once we get this permit pulled and approved, it's full steam ahead and we still have



September as a launch date for our new location. I'm excited and hope you will pray with me about this. We need support more now than ever before. I just received the giving statement for May from Home Missions and our giving was short by about \$1,000 last month. We are still in the black thanks to the great efforts by so many but I want to keep us above water as much as I can. If you can help us out here, please let us know!

Should any of you wish to contact me about the building...I'd love to answer your questions. Call my cell phone at 720.296.1719 and if I can't talk to you right then, leave me a voicemail and I'll get back with you within the day!

We love you and thank you for your continued support of the work here. Because of the intense nature of our plans, work, and move, I'll not be attending the National Convention this year. This will be the first one I've missed since moving to Denver but I feel it's best that I stay here to oversee this most important part of the work so many of you are invested in. Lives are being changed! People are being saved and disciplined. You are making this possible!

A New Beginning For Fourth Church

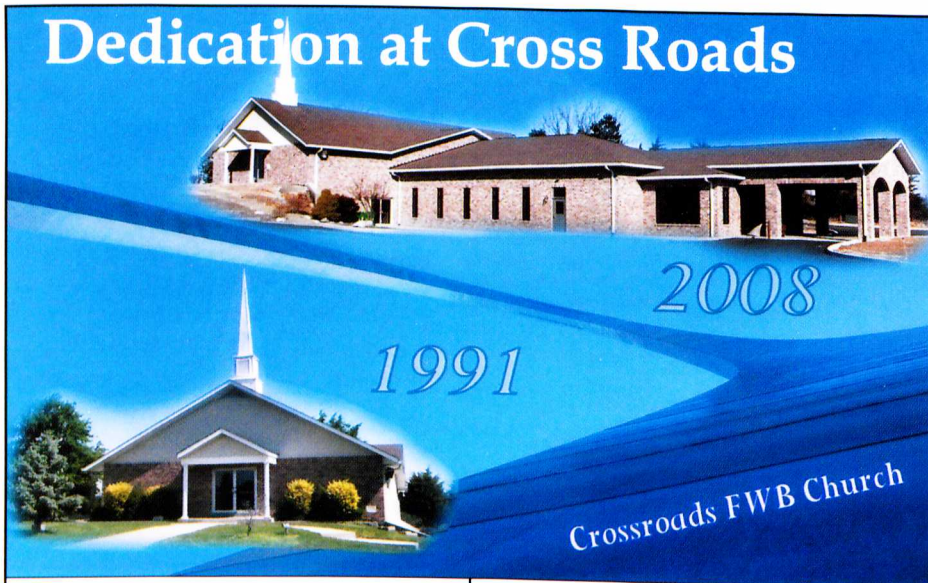

We thank you for making this possible with your gifts and prayer. We could never do it without you.

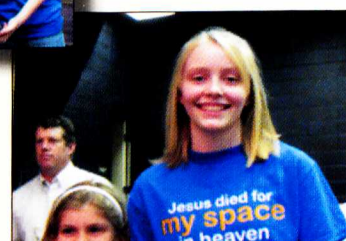

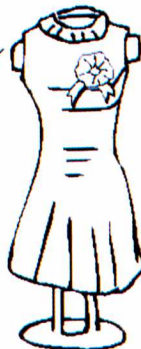
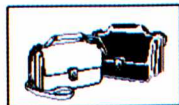

Lord's work through both these opportunities.

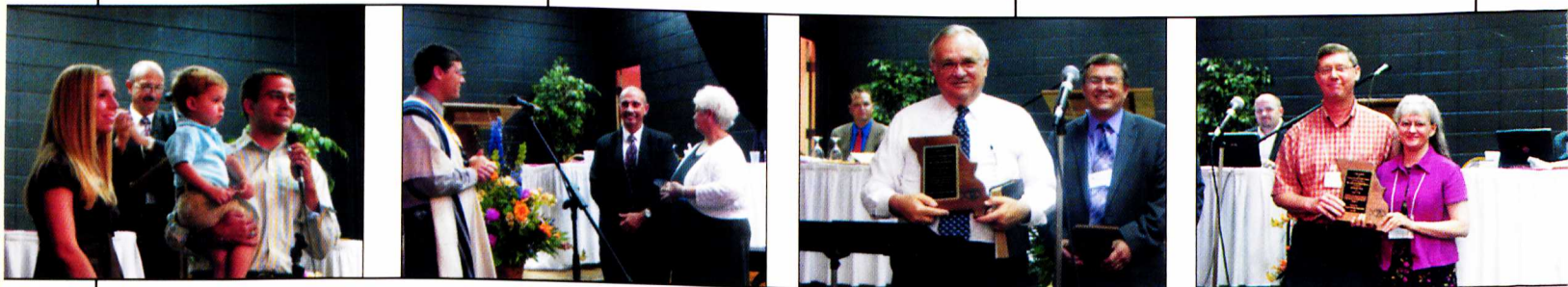
Our business session closed with the report of the Placement Committee that we would meet again next year at the Clarion Hotel in Springfield on May 31-June 3.
