Committee on Temperance.

We the committee on Temperance, beg leave to

report the following:

Believing as we do that intemperance is at this time the most gigantic evil in the United States, that it is bankrupting more characters, sowing more poisons, blasting with mildew more families, wasting more money, filling more prisons occupying the time of more courts, entailing more insanity, suicides and murders, and drawing more souls into perdition than any other sin. It curses all it touches, and is always the prolific source of crime and sorrow.

Knowing that all this is true, we consider this work of temperance a momentous work, a work of infinite importance, and every christian should put himself on the side of prohibition and be a bold soldier in this battle between drunkenness and sobriety, between heaven and hell, between the church and the devil. He should plead with his voice, his pen, with his prayer and with his vote, for the downfall of the old dragon, and for the enthronement of universal prohibition. We therefore make the following recommendation:

1. That every pastor and minister of our de nomination, be earnestly requested to

keep before their churches and people the awful

evil of this great sin of intemperance.

2. That we exhort our churches to exercise New Testament discipline against drunkenness and moderate drinking among their members, cutting off such as will not heel the church and reform their lives.

3. That it is unbecoming in any of our members to make, guage, keep store or sell, buy or drink spirits as a beverage, and for any and all these things they should be disciplined.
