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
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PROCEEDINGS

The twelfth Annual Session of the Georgia State Association of the Original Free Will Baptist convened with Midway Church, Moultrie, Georgia, Monday evening, November 15, 1948 at 7:30 O'clock.

Several songs by congregation. Devotional by Rev. J. B. Lovering. Sermon by Rev. I. J. Blackwelder. After the sermon, arrangements were announced by C. J. Faison, and the Association was adjourned until 10:00 o'clock Tuesday A. M.

TUESDAY MORNING

The Association assembled at the appointed time, and after singing two songs, "I Am Resolved," and "Standing on the Promises," prayer was by Rev. C. J. Harvey. Moderator thanked the committee for the program that had been worked out. Devotional by Rev. B. W. Clenney, reading 13th and 14th verses from 3rd chapter of Philippians. Theme being, "Forgetting those things that are behind and press forward toward the mark of the prize."

Welcome address by C. J. Faison and respones by G. W. Cloud.

Appointment of Credential Committee by Moderator was as follows: A. D. Ivey, H. N. Baxter and C. A. Parker'

After singing, "Heavenly Sunlight," Moderator's message was from 1st Kings, 17th chapter, 4th verse. "And I have commanded the ravens to feed thee there." "Are we there where God wants us in our hearts?"

After song service, prayer was by Rev. S. T. Shutes. Sermon by Rev. H. L. Catrett, reading 1st verse of 23rd Psalm, "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want," which was a most inspirational sermon. Prayer by Rev. J. B. Lovering. Announcements by C. J. Faison. Dismissed for lunch.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON

At 3:30 o'clock the body assembled for the business-session. After song service, Moderator called for report of Credentials Committee. Report read. Motion carried to accept report, seat delegates and not to release committee. (See report.)

Report of Promotional Secretary was read, only giving totals of any item. Report discussed by several, including Rev. Henry Melvin, who stated that Georgia is the only state with a full-time Promotional worker. Motion carried to accept report. (See report.)

Appointment of Temperance Committee by Moderator was as follows: L. W. McKinney, R. B. Pyle, and W. R. Langford.

Motion carried that a Nominating Committee be appointed by Moderator which was as follows: G. C. King, C. J. Faison and W. B. Griffin.

Motion carried that Moderator appoint a Resolution Committee, which was as follows: G. W. Cloud, Oscar Irving and S. F. Boyd.

After singing, "What A Friend," dismissed until 7:30 o'clock

Tuesday night, by Rev. L. A. Norris.

TUESDAY NIGHT

Song service opened with the song, "The Nail Scarred Hand," prayer by H. L. Anthony. Rev. H. L. Knighton was in charge of the service. Several songs by the body. All enjoyed the solo, "Breathe On Me," by Rev. Henry Melvin. Devotional by Rev. E. C. Morris, reading verses 1-15 of the 10th chapter of Romans. No comments. This being Mission Rally service, report of Mission Secretary and Treasurer was read. (See report.) Our foreign Missionary to Cuba, Bro. Willy, gave a most vivid report of the missionary work being carried on. Also made a plea that we support the mission work with our prayers and finances. A picture of the conditions and of some of the mission work as they now exist in Cuba was shown the body. An offering for mission in the amount of \$58.56 was taken. Dismissed by Rev. W. B. Griffin.

WEDNESDAY MORNING

Song service conducted by Rev. H. L. Knighton. Devotional by Rev. L. A. Norris, reading 8th chapter of Matthew. Comments brief, but pointedly and forcefully.

Sections of the Constitution where the revisory committee had recommended changes were read before the body by Rev. F. B. Cherry, same to lie on the table until in the afternoon and be read again before any action being taken by body.

Report of National Programs by Executive Secretary, Rev. Henry Melvin.

Moderator called for report of various boards.

Motion and second carried that Mission report be adopted as read Tuesday night. (See report.)

Report of Board of Trustees read by Rev. E. C. Morris, and report accepted. (See report.)

Report of Superannuation Board read and accepted. (See report.)

Report of Nominating Committee read and accepted. (See report.)

Additional report of Credentials Committee read. On motion, report accepted and committee released. (See report.)

Rev. H. L. Knighton made report of the possibilities of holding National Association in Columbus, Georgia, in 1949. All the parking space needed was available and all buildings that would be needed except for the committee meetings, though this matter would be worked out. Motion carried, that this body accept the invitation from Columbus, Georgia, for the National Association to be held there in 1949.

Motion and second carried, that Moderator appoint a committee, with an amendment that the chairman be authorized to appoint a sub-committee, all of whom will work out pre-arrangements of the

National Association. (See Committee.)

Report of Temperance Committee read and accepted. (See report.)
Report of Executive Board read and accepted. (See report.)
Report of Treasurer read and accepted. (See report.)
On motion and second we adjoun business until afternoon.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

The body assembled for the afternoon session, which was opened by singing "Glory To His Name." Prayer by Rev. J. B. Lovering.

Report of Promotional Board of Education read and accepted. (See report.)

Report on Bible College by Rev. Henry Melvin. Present enrollment is 74. Bibical education is the only teaching at the college. More room is urgently needed, that more students might be enrolled. Georgia's goal for the college was \$7,500.00. At this time Georgia was short of the goal in the amount of \$562.12. An offering was taken in the amount of \$87.61 and the balance was pledged. The money pledged and the collection taken to be paid to Promotional Secretary.

Report of Resolution Committee. Motion carried to accept this as a partial report, with an amendment that the committee retire and make further recommendations. (See report.)

Upon recommendation of Resolutions Committee, the place for the next session was voted on by the body by a standing vote. The count was tied, and the Moderator settled the question by voting that the next session convene with Christian Hill Church, Rochelle, Wilcox County.

Motion carried, after second reading that the Constitution be adopted as read after changes had been made.

Motion carried that Moderator appoint delegates to the National Association which were as follows: G. C. King, R. B. Pyle, Counce Sheffield, Jr., C. J. Faison and Sam Parker.

On motion, above delegates approved by the body.

Motion carried that Moderator appoint arrangement Committee for National Association, which were as follows: Rev. H. L. Knighton, chairman; C. A. Parker, Sam Parker and Rev. E. C. Morris, with the additional members of the various Associations as follows: Rev. J. D. Little, Rev. S. T. Shutes, Rev. H. L. Catrett, C. J. Faison and Ernest J. Barker.

Motion carried that Moderator appoint an encampment building committee, which was as follows: Rev. J. D. Little, G. C. King and E. C. Fancher.

Motion carried that the balance due Rev. F. B. Cherry for securing incorporation and charter papers be paid by Treasurer of encampment fund.

Motion carried that \$120.00 be paid as balance due on land for encampment from Treasurer of General Fund.

Motion carried that the necessary funds needed for the general funds be diverted from other sources.

A rising vote of heartfelt thanks to Midway Church and community was given for the generous hospitality and kindness shown during this session.

A joint board meeting will be held in Columbus, Georgia, Saturday, December 18, at 10:00 A. M.

Motion carried that we adjourn to meet with Christian Hill Church, 6 miles North from Rochelle, Georgia, on November 14, 15, and 16, 1949.

Motion and second that F. B. Cherry select place for next general board meeting set for September 2, 1948. Carried.

April, 1948, at Midway Church.

Mation and second that E. C. Morris be given the privilege of supplying the pulpits at Alabama and Marietta the rest of the year. Carried.

There was a mutual agreement for E. C. Morris to remain promotional Secretary for 1949.

September, 1948, at Bellview Church.

Motion and second that E. C. Morris be employed as Promotional Secretary for 1949. Carried.

Motion and second that his salary be \$200.00 per month with 5c per necessary mile traveling expenses. Carried.

REPORT OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Trustees in their recent meeting agreed to submit our report to the Association with certain recommendations.

1st. The Trustees and Camp Committee met at the site proposed to be denated for State Camp purposes and decided to accept the plot of ground which was offered by Bro. G. C. King, consisting of about 11 acres and in addition we purchased a plot of about 17 acres lying east of the donated site. In this meeting pledges were made by the committee amounting to \$380.00, this to be applied to the purchasing price of \$500.00. This leaves a balance of \$120.00 to be paid. We recommend that the Association provide for this balance.

We also report \$1200.00 paid in as the building fund. We recommend that the Association endorse and urge all the people to raise all the building funds possible, and as early as possible, with the instruction to the Board that they proceed with the building program and endeavor to get the camp ready for use in our next summer encampment. We also recommend that the Association appoint Bro. G. C. King as chairman of the building committee. Motion, we reimburse Bro. Cherry for expenses incurred in securing Incorporation and deeds.

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In submitting this annual report of the Promotional Work to the State Association, we believe all have just reason to be happy for the splendid results of the promotional efforts. It's true, that the accomplishments have not been what we would like to have seen, nor what

they would have been had all the churches cooperated, however, we

are grateful for the interest of those which have responded. The total number of churches reported in all the district associations this year is 113 and out of this number 77 have responded to one or more of the promotional appeals, this of course, leaves 36 which made no response; but out of this number some have promised to cooperate during the coming year, at least, the pastors have promised and that means much. We could say much about the favorable and unfavorable conditions which has been observed during the year, however, after all said it would not change the situation, therefore, we are merely giving a summary of our activities and then leave the matter for your consideration that you may determine whether or not the results justify the efforts. We must keep in mind, however, that pioneer work can not be judged by the immediate effects, there is the future to be considered.

We have visited all the district associations, State and National Associations, Nation Wide League Conference, the National Bible Conference, six union meetings and four Sunday School Conventions. Visited 54 churches, supplied three churches part time as pastor, held nine revivals, taught in two weeks session of Youth Encampment, conducted 19 prayer services, taught 17 Sunday School classes, delivered 42 special messages and lectures and preached 224 sermons. Visited 267 homes and 32 sick. Wrote 58 subscriptions to the Baptist paper. Received 44 members and baptized 7. Mimeographed and mailed 3.000 copies of monthly bulletins, mimeographed and mailed out 980 circular letters and wrote approximately 400 letters and 300 cards to individuals and traveled 12,542 miles in interest of promotional work. Included in this report is the Mission work done in Tifton looking forward to the establishing of a Church.

In addition to the financial report which follows, Sunny Side Church in the Little River Association sent \$100.00 to the Alabama Children's Home through the Promotional Office and Alabama League sent \$5.00 to the building fund, the State Camp which is not credited in the table. The total amount sent to our State Treasurer is \$5,570.24, the balance of the report was sent direct to the various treasurers and only reported in the monthly bulletins.

CONSTITUTION

Preamble

We, the Original Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, do ordain this constitution for the purpose of advancing, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

Article I

Section 1. This assembly shall be known as the Georgia State Association of the Original Free Will Baptist.

Article II

Section I. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, an assistant Moderator, a Secretary, an assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer. The executive shall be composed of all regular officers of the Association and their assistants.

Section 2. This Association shall be composed of all active ministers who are members of an affiliated body, one delegate for every 500 members or fraction thereof of each affiliated Association, one delegate for every 1000 members or fraction thereof of each affiliated union Meeting, and one delegate for every 100 members or fraction thereof of every affiliated local Free Will Baptist church.

Section 3. All delegates from Associations, Union Meetings, and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the church.

Section 4. Funds to meet the current and benevolent allocations shall be paid in on a voluntary basis to the Treasurer of this Association; however, it is suggested that each affiliate body contribute as a minimum in the following order: Each district Association one-half of one percent per capita of their respective membership and \$5.00 in addition for the National Association dues, each Union Meeting one-fourth of one per cent per capita of their respective membership, and each local church according to their ability.

Article III

Section I. It shall be the privilege of each affiliated district Association to furnish a member for each of the standing boards, with the term of office being four years, approximately fifty percent of the boards being elected at each election, the number of each board however, shall not be less than four.

Section 2. There shall be a board of Missions composed of members who are noted for missionary zeal and they shall have the supervision of all mission interests sponsored by this body both home

and foreign. Undesignated funds sent to the general treasurer shall be allocated by the body, and undesignated mission funds shall be equally divided between home and foreign.

Section 3. There shall be a Board of Christian Education, whose duty it shall be to keep the body informed of all christian education sponsored by the body and make such recommendations as they shall deem proper to the body from time to time.

Section 4. There shall be a Board of Superannuation whose duty it shall be to make plans and rules which shall be in harmony with the National Superannuation Board and shall be authorized to formulate plans whereby necessary funds for superannuation may be raised.

Artivle IV

Section I. All officers except Board members shall be elected to serve a term of two years.

Section 2. Any officer may be re-elected as the body shall see fit.

Section 3. When vacancies occur for any cause they shall be filled by the Executive Board, or by any of the standing Boards, subject to the approval of the executive Board, until the time of the regular election of officers.

Section 4. Elections years shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

Section 5. Any members who fails in the function of his or her duties without a reason, the board to which the delinquent member has been elected, shall declare the office vacant. Further, the body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with any officer or Board member who does not conduct his or her office in a christian and business like manner according to the rules of christian conduct laid down in the New Testament. Thus the right to discipline in this body is confined to this body, but a charge against a member of this body and the members of a local church shall constitute a charge against said member in this body and the body shall abide accordingly.

Section 6. The duties of officers not defined shall be the same as those for any deliberative assembly.

AMENDMENTS

This Constitution shall not be changed or altered except by a majority vote of all members present in regular session. All amendments shall lie on the table at least from the morning session until evening session or from evening session to morning session prior to adoption and shall during that time be read at least twice in open session. Additions of boards or officers may be added as there is need.
