The Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptist Churches convened with the Blakely Church on Monday evening, Nov. 10, 1952, in her 16th annual session. After singing led by Rev. S. T. Shutes, Rev. C. R. Houston gave a very timely devotional service from 3 John 3-8. The message for the evening was delivered by Rev. P. E. Knighton using for a lesson Neh. 4:4-6. Bro. Knighton gave some great thoughts for the beginning of the Association.

The Moderator then declared the body in order for business. Motion to adopt the program with the necessary changes. Carried. Appointment of committee; Credentials, Revs.J. N. Barnes, Coy Watson and K. V. Shutes. Committee on committees, Revs. S. T. Shutes, I. J. Blackwelder and T. B. Mellette.

Revs. F. B. Cherry and R. N. Hinnent were visiting from N. C. and were given words of welcome by the Moderator. When the committee on arrangements had assigned homes to the delegates and visitors we were dismissed by Rev. F. B. Cherry.

#### TUESDAY MORNING

Coming together Tuesday AM with singing led by Rev. I. J. Black-welder we were inspired in the morning meditations by Rev. Mance Cason. His remarks, taken from Matt. 7;24-29, were few but very impressive.

Other visitors were greeted at this time. They were Rev. G. H. Jordon and wife, Rev. G. W. Nobles and wife, and Bro. Jones and wife, all of Alabama.

Instead of the Moderator's Message as usual, Dr. F. B. Cherry was invited to speak at this time. He gave a very gratifying report of the service being rendered by the publishing house at Ayden, N. C. The welcome address was given in brief statements by the host pastor, Rev. E. C. Morris, the moderator of the Midway Association Rev. T. B. Mellette, pastor of the Baptist Church, Rev. W. E. Storey, and the Mayor of the city of Blakely.

The Credential Committee gave a partial report. Accepted.

Tuesday PM was given over to the Woman's Auxiliary Convention.

#### TUESDAY EVENING

Rev. S. T. Shutes led the assembly in singing to open the service for the evening. Then the girls' quartette from Bellview Church rendered special music. Rev. T. G. Hamilton gave a wonderful devotional service from Num. 13:30, and Josh. 14:11. After special music arranged by Rev. S. T. Shutes, Rev. I. J. Blackwelder introduced the speaker for the evening, Congressman W. M. Wheeler, of Alma, Ga. Calling our attention to II Chron. 7:14, this Honorable Statesman reminded us that to solve our national problems this text must be applied in a practical way in Washington. Then, if we are to have more Christians in Congress there must be more Christians over the nation to elect them to go. The message was followed by prayer for God to bless America and the rest of the world. After an offering we were dismissed by Rev. McDuffie.

#### WEDNESDAY MORNING

When Rev. R. N. Hinnent had led the congregation in a lively song service, Rev. K. V. Shutes conducted a service of praise and prayer

that prepared us for the business of the day.

Rev. T. G. Hamilton gave the mid-day message from Mark 2:1-1. The Association was led to a very fitting climax while the speaker did his part to send us home with a greater evangelistic fervor.

We were dsmissed for lunch by Rev. Durwood Long.

#### WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

After a short song service Rev. B. W. Clenney conducted a very worthy devotional service, and then we proceeded with business.

The final report of the credential committee was accepted.

Motion to accept the report of the Committee on Temperance. See report.

Motion to change our date of meeting to Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday after the second Sunday in November; the Womans Auxiliary Convention and the joint board meetings to be held on Tuesday, then the state association to follow on Wednesday and Thursday.

The report of the auditing committee was read and accepted. The report of the Superannuation Board was adopted. Motion to adopt the report of the camp committee without an itemized statement. Motion made and carried to adopt the report of the Executive Board.

Delegates to the National Association were appointed as follows: B. Houston, G. C. King, Edgar Smith, S. W. Mercer, Mrs. B. B. Edwards, Mrs. K. V. Shutes, Mrs. S. T. Shutes, and Mrs. T. B. Mellette. Sam Parker was appointed as alternate.

By motion the Association was adjourned with praise and prayer. Benediction by Rev. H. J. Kelly.

Christian Education. The Board of Christian Education met with the Church at Blakely on Nov. 11, 1952. The meeting was called to order by the chairman. Rev. S. T. Shutes. Members present were as follows: S. T. Shutes, C. J. Fason, G. C. King, W. R. Barber, and Emmitt McDuffie.

As a Promotional Board for the educational activities of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists we propose the following: That each church promote Christian Education. This is very practcal to the growth of Christian thinking and character development. The youth of our church are our "diamonds in the rough." We recommend that our budget (local board) be the same as in 1951-52.

We propose that uniform course of study for camp Mt. Bethel be worked out, for reasons that prove to us the necessity of these courses. We have consulted with the camp committee, also with the promotional secretary as to the advisability of such an undertaking at this time. In our humble opinion the time is come for such an undertaking. We further ask that this State Association go all out to encourage each association to group her churches and have these courses taught for the benefit of those who can't attend the camp.

Being responsible for the promotion of the educational activities of our church, we earnestly and most sincerely urge the full support of our Bible College at Nashville, Tennessee with both mony and prayer. We further urge our people as a whole to encourage more Christian teaching in the public schools, and more especially in the home.

Motion to appoint a committee to work out the unified course to be taught in the youth camp and in the churches. The committee was appointed as follows: Rev. T. B. Mellette, chairman; Rev. S. T. Shutes, and Mrs. K. V. Hhutes. Rev. E. C. Morris as ex-officio member.

We recommend that \$81.00 be retained to defray the expense of preparing the course named above. Moved and carried that the treasurer pay the above named bill when work is done.

The Mission Board met in an organizing capacity at Glenville, Ga., on Nov. 15th, 1952, and elected Elder C. J. Harvey as chairman and G. W. Cloud as secretary to the Board.

The matter of purchasing the tent now owned by Elder Ralph Lightsey came up and after discussion we decided to buy the tent in the manner here shown: Fifty dollars as down payment and then as funds come into the treasury till the full price of three hundred dollars

shall be paid which includes the seats, etc.

Also a few urgent requests came to our attention at this time and after consideration we decided by unanimous vote to give from our treasury the following amounts to the causes as here shown. The church of Cairo, Ga., to receive fifty dollars; Pelham, Ga., church the sum of fifty dollars, and the First F. W. B. church of Jax, Fla., the sum of fifty dollars. When we as the Board have been satisfied that the titles are clear to their property. Motion that we donate to the youth camp of Ga. the sum of one hundred dollars, and also a request from the Ladies Auxiliary of Ga. for a gift of fifty dollars was granted by vote of body when the funds are in treasury. This meeting adjourned by prayer till call or state Asso. meeting.

At Patmos Church the body met on Dec. eight. Upon call of Chairman Harvey for the purpose of attending some matters to

come before this body.

We recinded the action of the Nov. meeting in regards to the one hundred dollar gift, and instead donated the two hundred and fifty dollars loaned them in a previous meeting. Also voted to give to the First Baptist Church of Valdosta, Ga., fifty dollars and to pay up to sixty dollars on the radio broadcast at Waycross, Ga., now being conducted by Bro.K. V. Shutes. Also allowed twenty dollars as expense for Bro. Morris to attend the missionary meeting Nashville, Tennessee. Also voted to allow eight cents per mile for travel expense for board members to this meeting. (One way.)

On July 21st the board met on call at the youth camp for the matter concerning the tent which was in need of repairs and voted to pay up to seventy-five dollars for its repair.

## REPORT OF PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY E. C. Morris

Another year is now history with the Promotional Program of the State Association of Georgia, and a wonderful year it has been The Cause is still on the march with good progress and advancement in most every line of endeavor. We should all be humbly grateful for the wonderful blessings of our Christ.

The Promotional work has grown to the extent that it requires the full time of one person and at the present rate of growth it will not be long before extra help will be imperative. Some of the brethern, with a vision of the needs, while attending the State Ministerial Association at Camp Mt. Bethel last June, drew up suitable resolutions for the consideration of the Executive Board calling for a full time Promotoinal Secretary. The Board soon met and after some discussion on the matter, the action was adopted. Your present promotional secretary was employed for full time, beginning the first of November.

While the Executive Board still in session, a move was made to raise the Unified Budget to \$18,000.00 in order to meet the increased cost of operating the Promotional Office without impairing the funds for the other causes.

While speaking of the Budget, it is very gratifying to be able to report the greatest increase of funds of any previous year. It will be remembered that the budget was increased a third higher last year and many feared that it would not be raised, however, it has not only been raised but with a much greater increase than that of last year. Quotas were given each district association which were accepted as a challange and every one proceeded to meet it. This they did. The Chattahoochee raised theirs in eight months and exceeded it by 25 per cent before the end of the year. The South Georgia was the next to go over and exceeded it by about 20 per cent and all the others reached theirs and went some over. Surely every body is happy with the accomplishments. The entire budget was oversubscribed by over two thousand dollars.

The churches sending in an offering every month on the Unified Program and thus earning a place on the Grand Honor Roll follows:

The First Church of Columbus stands at the head of the list again by giving the most per capita member and Harmony is a close second again. Revs. H. J. Kelly and J. O. Fort are pastors respectively. Other churches on this Roll are; St. James, Double Branch, New Ebenezer, Ozias, Midway, Bellview, Unity, Corinth (So. Ga.), Alabaha, Glennville, Memorial, Patmos, Travelers Rest, Blakely, White Pond, Cedar Springs. Sixteen in all. This is two above last year. There were some that sent in an offering every month but not on the Unified Program.

The Junior Honor Roll Churches are those which sent in from six to eleven offerings on the Unified Program, they are: Colquitt, Satilla, and First of Jacksonville which sent in eleven times, then comes, First of Valdosta, Ebenezer, Little Bethel (Chatt.), Marietta, Macedonia, Christian Hill, Mother's Home, Liberty Chapel and New Salem.

One Church sent in five times, three sent in four, three sent in two and twenty-five sent in one. The number of churches contributing to the Unified Program is three above that of last year. The umber of all the churches contributing to any of the causes is one hundred three which is twenty three above that of last year.

The gains have not been confined to finances alone, but in most every phase of the work. The spirit of unity seems to have prevailed in all the district associations. The fellowship was great and a spirt of optimism is on every hand. Good revivals have been reported and a healthy increase in membership. Two new churches have been established, one in Bainbridge and one in Thomaston. The number of Sunday schools is four less than last year but the membership is higher. There are eight more leagues than one year ago. There are two Woman's Auxiliaries less but the enrollment more. There are five more prayer meetings reported this year. The Georgia union reports a Sunday in every church. The South Georgia and Midway associations are planning for some teachers' courses during the ensuing year. Three more churches have gone on full time and tourteen churches have gone on half time. The signs of time are evidently pointing to a new era for the Free Will Baptist of Ga. "We are looking to hills from whence cometh our help." Sleeping giants are being aroused, slumbering ones are waking up, fainting hearts are pulsating with new life and our fellowship is growing stronger with each passing day. May we raise our voices in praise so loud that the echos will fall upon every ear, while we may sing, "Praise God From Whom All Blessings Flow."

#### CONSTITUTION

#### Preamble

We, the Original Free Will Baptists of the state of Georgia, do ordain this constitution for the purpose of advancing, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

#### Article I

Section 1. The assembly shall be known as the Georgia State Association of the Original Free Will Baptists.

#### Article II

Section1. The Officers of this Association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, A Secretary, an Assistant Secretary and a Pro-

motional Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2. All regular officers and the Chairman of each standing board shall compose the Executive Board.

Section 3. This Association shall be composed of all active ministers who are members of an affiliated body, one delegate for every 500 members or fraction thereof of each affiliated union meeting, and one delegate for every 100 members or fraction thereof of every affiliated local Free Will Baptist Church. Any Union or local church shall have the privilege of affiliating with the State body independent of the District Association.

Section 4. All delegates from associations, union meetings and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.

Section 5. Funds to meet the current and benevolent of allocations shall be paid in on a voluntary basis to the Treasurer of this Association; however, it is suggested that each affiliated body contribute as minimum in the following order; Each district association three-fourths of one per cent per capita of their respective membership and \$5.00 in addition for the National Association dues; each union meet ing one-half of one per cent per capita of their respective membership, and each local church five cents per capita of their respective membership.

#### Article III

Section 1. It shall be the privilege of each affiliate district association to furnish a member for each standing board, with terms of office rotating which will necessitate one member of each board being elected annually, the number of each board shall not be less than five except the board of auditors which shall consist of two members who shall be elected at the same time of the general officers.

Section 2. There shall be a board of missions composed of members who are noted for missionary zeal and they shall have the supervision of all mission interest sponsored by this body. All undesignated mission funds shall be equally divided between home and foreign.

Section 3. There shall be a board of Christian Education whose duty it shall be to keep the body informed of all christian education sponsored by the body and make such recommendations as they shall deem proper to the body from time to time.

Section 4. There shall be a board of superannuation whose duty it shall be to make plans and rules which shall be in harmony with the National Superannuation Board. And shall be authorized to formulate plans whereby necessary funds for superannuation may be raised.

Section 5. There shall be a board of trustees whose duty it shall be to hold titles of all property belonging to this body.

Section 6. A Board of Auditors, whose duties it shall be to audit the books of the Associational Treasurer and the Treasurers of all Boards.

#### Article IV

Section 1. All officers except board members shall be elected to serve a term of two years.

Section 2. Any officers may be reelected as the body shall see fit. Section 3. When vacancies occur for any cause they shall be filled

by the Executive Board, or by any of the standing boards, subject to the approval of the Executive Board, until the convening of the annual session of the body.

4. Election years shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

Section 5. Any member who fail in the function of his or her duties without a reason, the board to which the delinquent member has been elected, shall declare the office vacant. Further, the body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with any officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian and business like manner acording to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the New Testament. Thus the right to discipline in this body is confined to this body, but a charge against a member of this body and the member of a local Church shall constitute a charge against said member in this body and the body shall abide accordingly.

Section 6. The duties of officers so defined shall be the same as those for any deliberative assembly.

Section 7. All boards may be called in session only by the Chairman of the Executive Board and any standing board may be called in session only by the Chairman of said board, unless said chairman becomes uncapacited in which case the assistant assumes the authority of said uncapacited chairman.

#### **AMENDMENTS**

This Constitution shall not be changed or altered except by a majority vote of all members present to regular session. All amendments shall lie on the table at least from the morning session until evening session or from evening session until morning prior to adoption and shall during that time be read at least twice in open session. Additions of boards or officers may be added as there is need.
