REPORT OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD

The State Education Board met with New Salem Church, Colquitt, Ga., Nov. 15, 1955. We want to thank and commend those who make the Ministers Institute possible and urge each church to send its pastor to the next session. We salute Woman's Auxiliary session held at the Camp and urge each church to send at least one member of the local Auxiliary to the next session at camp. The support of each Youth Session is urged. We must have your support if we are to continue hleping worthy students who are attending Bible College A motion was passed authorizing the Treasurer to revert funds from the general fund to the loan fund in order to offset any emergency.

Since Superannuation is in need of additional funds, this board recommends that our allocation be reduced to 22 percent and the other 3 percent be added to the Superannuation allocation, and that this board's allocation be distributed as follows: 18 percent to Bible College, Nashbille, Tenn. 4 percent be retained in board's

treasury. The By-laws governing the loan or receiving fund was discussed and since the Woman's Auxiliary is sponsoring a loan fund for the same purpose as this board, this board and the Auxiliary have voted that the two funds become one, since the Auxiliary funds will be larger, it is asked that they be given a voice in handling of these funds. Motion was passed that Section 13 be added to the Bylaws of this Board and shall read as follows:

Section 13. The Woman'x Auxiliary State Convention shall be given three members on the Loan Board whose election and time of service shall be left to the discretion of the Woman's Auxiliary Convention of Georgia.

REPORT OF CAMP MT. BETHEL BOARD

The Camp lit. Bethel Board net in session Tuesday, Nov. 15, 1955, at New Salem Church, Miller County, Georgia, with the following members present: G.C. King, Chmn; T. B. Mellette, Sec. Treas; Bro, J.W. Franks. Absent were: M. H. Hinson, T.B. Etheredge, and Edd Roberts.

The Board elected the following for the meeting. namely: Oscar Brunson for Edd Roberts, and E. J. Barker for T.B. Etheredge.

The members of the Board of Trustees of the Georgia State Association met jointly with the Camp Board. The Board recommended the follwoing report.

First, six sessions of Camp Activities were conducted at Camp Bethel during the summer of 1955, namely: a Bible Conference, fourth youth sessions, and a summer camp evangelistical meeting.

Second, the average attendance for the session was approximately 76 campers, making a total approximately of 450 campers for this summer.

The camp served approximately 8200 meals during the summer. The total receipts for the summer from all sources for camp activities were \$2442.18. Total expenditures were \$2357.59. Balance of \$84.59. Of this \$46.60 was spent for electric bills. In this fund at this session, the camp has on hand \$37.99.

Thirdly, The Camp Board secretary-treasurer reports all debts are liquidated. A balance on hand for current and expansive purposes---\$1402.28.

Considerable repairs and remodeling was done at the Camp this year. Also, a new conditioned piano was secured by the trading of the old one at a difference of \$125 plus the sales tax. The Camp Board jointly with the trustees recommend that the Board go forward as they are able to promote the building program of the buildings and expansion of same by enlarging the auditorium with class rooms, and reconditioning the dormitories for suitable winter accomplation for such session as might be deemed wise to hold at the camp.

The Board feels that with a concerted effort the camp can be made suitable for meetings such as are demandable by our people at any time, and the building need to be more attractive on the inside and more accomposation in every respect, even the seating of the auditorium.

\$5000 is needed for expansion for the coming year.

We pray that every one will volunteer in the work and continue as a colaborer until the work is completed, which will necessitate many more years of building.

REPORT OF THE PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY E. C. Morris

Diving grace and mercy permits this another annual report of promotional efforts for the cause we love.

First of all we want to express our gratitude for the wonderful blessings of the Lord and the splendid co-operation of everyone taking part in the futherance of the Gospel, however, it is with much regret that we cannot offer as flowing report as we would like.

The activities of your Promotional Secretary have been limited this year, owing to illness. Could this have had anything to do with the limited progress being rep ported? Even though illness prevented somewhat, we had some splendid assistance. Mrs. Morris stood by and rendered every assistance possible, while many of the brothern came to the rescue of the work, thus keeping the office open and going. Some mission revivals had been planned in all district associations. These plans were carried out with good success in most of the districts. We are greatly indebted to Rev. J. B. Lovering and others, who carried on these services with telling results and no doubt much good was accomplished. The helpers in the various associations were a great asset to the cause and more assistants have been appointed or elected for the ensuing year.

During the year, your Promotional Secretary visited 40 churches, preached 26 times, made 15 talks on Unified Program, showed mission pictures and lectured 14 times and taught 5 Sunday School classes. Other activities included the office work, attending 3 Union meetings, 6 district associations, the State Association, the State League and one district League Convention. Met with several State and National Committees and Boards. Assisted several churches in securing pastors and evangelists, besides many other minor items of service for the cause.

Certificates of honor were awarded to forty-three churches for having made donations to the Unified Program every month during the year. Seven in the Chattahoochee, five in the Georgia Union, three in the Little River, four in the Union, two in the Martin, ten in the South Georgia, and thirteen in the Midway. Bay Church in the Union Association sent in the most per capita member, \$5.75. Bainbridge in the Midway Association sent in \$4.67 per member which was second highest.

In addition to the above the following churches raised the per capita giving on the quotas through the Unified Program: Emmanuel and the First Columbus churches in the Chattahocchee; Antioch in the Ga. Union; Ozias, Orange Grove, and Valdesta in the Little River; Oak Grove, Harmony and Satilla in the S. Ga. and Harmock Springs in the Midway/ Other churches came within a few cents, but didn't quite make it.

The honor roll churches will be those sending in their per capita gifts on the quota for each association during the coming year and those sending in offerings every month will be awarded a certificate of honor.

Even though the total offerings for the year was some less than that of last year, the Unified offerings were 25% above last year. As the Unified offerings grow the designated offerings decrease. This is as it should be providing we raise the budget, but unless the Unified off rings are sufficient then drives and campaigns will have to be put on in order to meet the derands.

The Unified plan is not working 100% yet, however, it is encouraging to observe that there are improvements with each passing year. May we take courage and put forth every effort possible to raise the Unified Budget during the coming year with the Unified offerings. When we learn the true meaning of Christian stewardship and put it in to action we will realize then what the Lord car do with

and through, a group of people who will practice the true meaning of the Word.

CONSTITUTION

Preamble

We, the Original Free Will Baptists of the State of Georgia, do ordain this constitution for the purpose of advancing, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

Article I

Section 1. The assembly shall be known as the Georgia State Association of the Original Free Will Baptists.

Article II

Section 1. The Officers of this Association shall be Moderator, as Assistant Moderator, a Secretary, an assistant Secretary and a Promotional Secy-Treas.

Section 2. All regular officers and the Chairman of each standing board shall compose the Executive Board.

Section 3. This Association shall be composed of all active ministers who are members of an affiliated body, one delegate for every 500 members or fraction thereof of each affiliated union meeting, and one delegate for every 100 members or fraction thereof of every affiliated local Free Will Baptist Church. Any Union or local church shall have the privilege of affiliating with the State body independent of the District Association.

Section 5. Funds to meet current needs of the body shall be paid in on a voluntary basis to the treasurer of the Association, however, it is suggested that each association give as shall be allocated to them each year by a committee, and that each union meeting give five dollars and each local church give five cents per captia for their respective membership.

Article III

- Section 1. It shall be the privilege of each affiliate district Association to furnish a member for each standing board, with terms of office rotating which will necessitate one member of each board being elected annually, the number of each board shall not be less than five except the board of auditors which shall consist of two members who shall be elected at the same time of the general officers.
- Section 2. There shall be a board of missions composed of members who are noted for missionary zeal and they shall have the supervision of all mission interest sponsored by this body. All undesignated mission funds shall be equally divided between home and foreign.
- Section 3. There shall be a board of Christian Education whose duty it shall be to keep the body informed of all Christian Education spensored by the body and make such recommendations as they shall deem proper to the body from time to time.
- Section 4. There shall be a board of superannuation whose duty it shall be to make plans and rules which shall be in harmony with the National Superannuation Board. And shall be authorized to formulate plans whereby necessary funds for superannuation may be raised.
- Section 5. There shall be a board of trustees whose duty it shall be to hold titles of all property belonging to this body.
- Section 6. A Board of Auditors, whose duties it shall be to audit the books of the Association Treasurer and the Treasurers of all Boards.
- Section 7. There shall be a Camp Board composed of one member from each District Association affiliated with the State Association.

Article IV

Section 1. All officers except board members shall be elected to serve a term of two years.

Section 2. Any officers may be re-elected as the body shall see fit.

Section 3. When vacancies occur for any cause they shall be filled by the Executive Board, or by any of the standing boards, subject to the approval of the Executive Board, until the convening of the annual session of the body.

Section 4. Election years shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

Section 5. A member of any board who fails in the function of his or her duties without a reason, the board to which the delinquent member has been elected, shall declare the office vacant. Further, the body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with any officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian and business-like manner, according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the New Testament. Should such board fail to have a sufficient number of its members present to constitute a quorum, it shall ben become the duty of the Executive Board to deal with any delinquent member. Also, a charge against a member of this body and a member of a local church shall constitute a charge against said member in this body and the body shall abide accordingly.

Section 6. The duties of officers so defined shall be the same as those for any deliberative assembly.

Section 7. All boards may be called in session only by the Chairman of the Executive Board and any standing board may be called in session only by the Chairman of said board, unless said chairman becomes uncapacited in which case the assistant assumes the authority of said uncapacited chairman.

Amendments

This Constitution shall not be changed or altered except by a majority of all members present to regular session. All amendments shall lie on the table at main in least from the morning session until evening session or from evening session until morning prior to adoption and shall, during that time be read at least twice in a said open session. Additions of boards or officers may be added as there is need.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS for THE GEORGIA STATE LEAGUE CONVENTION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

We, the Leagues of the Origianl Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia, desiring to promote the cause of Jesus Christ as represented by our denomination, and to put the "Kingdom of God First", do establish and ordain the Constitution and By-Laws.

CONSTITUTION :

Article I

NAME: This organization shall be known as the Georgia State League Convention of the Original Free Will Baptist, of the State of Georgia.

Article II

PURPOSE: The purpose of this Convention shall be to promote the general welfare of the Free Will Baptist Leagues throughout the State of Georgia and to assist the pastors in enlisting the youth of their churches in active Christian Service.

Article III

OFFICERS: The officers of this Convention shall be President, Wice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Sword Drill Leader, who shall be elected annually at the close of each session.

Article IV

MEMBERSHIP: Section 1. Who shall be eligible: Any Free Will Baptist District League Convention and the general league of the local church in the state of Georgia.

Section 2. Delegates, now elected. Each District League and the General League of the Local Church shall elect its delegates from its own number.

Section 3. Delegates, number: Each District League Convention shall be entitled to ten(10) delegates, and the General League of each local Church one (1) delegate. All Ordained Ministers shall be members of the State League Convention.

Article V

MEETINGS: This Convention shall hold its regular annual meeting on the day following Thanksgiving at such a place as may be provided for by the Convention in session.

Article VI

COMMITTEES: Section 1. Executive: The Executive Committee of this convention shall be composed of the officers of this convention.

Section 2. Program: The executive Committee shall arrange the programs.

Section 3. Publicity: This shall be a committee of one (1), the corresponding secretary.

Section 4. Digest: The duty of the Digest Committee shall be composed of three (3) whose duty it shall be to receive the reports and finance from the District League Conventions and the general Leagues representing, and to furnish a digest of the reports to the Convention.

Section 5. Special: This Convention or its President may appoint a Digest and nominating Committee and as many special Committees as necessity may demand. Section 6. The Nominating Committee shall be composed of one member from each district League Convention, whose duty it shall be to furnish the convention with the names of nominees for the various officers of the State Inames Convention

Article VII

REPORTS: Each Bistrict League Convention shall be requested to make a written report to this Convention on a blank furnished by same.

Article VIII

FINANCE: Section 1. Each District League Convention holding membership in this convention shall make a semi-annual contribution of \$10.00 and each general League \$2.00 to be used to carry on the general work of the convention.

BY-LAWS

Article I

DUTIES OF OFFICERS: Section 1. President: It shall be the duty of the president to preside over each session, preserve order, govern the body according to established parliamentary usage and appoint all temporary committees. He shall have the power to declare any office vacant, temporarily, subject to the approval of either the Executive Committee or the Convention.

- Section 2. Vice-President: It shall be the duty of the Vice-President to serve in the full capacity of president when the president is absent.
- Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all transactions of the Executive Committee and the Convention and perserve the same, keep all valuable documents and surrend same to his successor in office.
- Secretary: The Corresponding Secretary: The Corresponding Secretary shall be a medium of contact between the Convention and all state and national officers, and shall handle all correspondence of the Convention.

Preamble

The Sunday Scholl of the Free Will Baptist Churches of Georgia, do hereby ordain this constitution for the purpose of advancing every phase of the Sunday School endeavors as set forth herein.

Article I. The name of this Convention shall be known as the State Sunday School Convention of Georgia Free Will Baptists,

Article II. The purpose of this Convention shall be to secure cooperation and unity of action and to promote every phase of the Sunday School work as represented by the Sunday School caase of the denomination.

Article III. The Convention shall be composed by delegates and ministers from the district and local Sunday Schools. Delegates to be worked out as may be provided for in the By laws which may be drafted by this body.

Article IV. The officers of this body shall be a president, vice-president, recording secretary and treasurer and such other officers as may be provided for from time to time. Standing, temporary or session committees may be considered officers of the body while serving.

Article V. The Executive Committee may consist of all the standing officers with the addition of others as the body may deem wise and proper.

Article VI. The Convention may be financed by means which may be worked out from time to time and included in the By-Laws.

Article IX. The program of the Convention will consist of items as may be arranged by a program committee, and the usual order of business as of any deliberative body.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1, DUTIES OF OFFICERS:

SECTION 1, PRESIDENT: It shall be the duty of the President to preside over each session, preserve order govern the Body according to established Parliamentary usuage, and appoint all temporary committees and substitute officers. The President shall also be a member of any Chairman of the Executive Committee.

SECTION 2, VICE-PRESIDENT: It shall be the duty of the Vice-President to serve in the full capacity of the President when the President is absent. The Vice-President shall be a member of the Executive Committees

SECTION 3, SECRETARY-TREASURER: It shall be the duty of the Secretary-Treasurer to take minutes of all proceedings and read them for approval and to record and to keep all money and pay for whatever the Convention elects to pay, also the Secretary-Treasurer shall deliver to his or her Successor all records and money. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be a member of the Executive Committee and shall serve as clerk of the Executive Committee.

SECTION 4, ASSISTANT SECRETARY-TREASURER: It shall be the duty of the Assistant Secretary-Treasurer to take the place of the Secretary-Treasurer when he or she is absent. The Assistant Secretary-Treasurer shall be a member of the Executive Committee.

SECTION, 5, EX-OFFICIO MEMBERS: The President shall be an Ex-Officio member of all committees of the Convention.

ARTICLE 2, VOTING:

SECTION 1: All questions coming before the Convention shall be decided by a majority vote, in case of a tie, the President shall vote.
