Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt item two.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt item three.

Bro. Huckaby read a proposed Constitution for the Board of Trustees.

Motioned, seconded and carried to adopt the proposed Constitution.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to give the Board of Trustees authority to make necessary changes to conform to the incorporation of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists which states that all state properties should be deeded to some in lieu of the Board of Trustees.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to receive the Promotional Secretary report.

Offering taken for cooperative plan. Thanks returned by Rev. I. J. Blackwelder.

Special music offered by Bro. Jack Faison and his daughter, Juanita. Vice-Moderator, Rev. Louis Moulton, introduces the speaker for the worship hour. Rev. Homer Willis, General Director of National Home Mission. 2 Cor. 11:28. The local church is the backbone of the work of God, finance personell etc. Free Will Baptists need to step out and start churches. Church furnishes the Bible preacher, the Bible teaching Sunday School, and the worshipping of God in music.

WEDNESDAY EVENING

A special choir of the ministers joined the congregation in singing, "Christ Receiveth Sinful Men". Prayer offered by Rev. I. J. Blackwellder. Special music by Bro. Blackwellder and Sister Janice Clark.

Call for reports.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to receive the report of the State Mission Board as given by Rev. J. E. Blanton.

Moderator welcomes unrecognized visitors. Special music by Mrs. Shirley Kimbrell.

Rev. Harris Nix introduced Dr. Leverne Miley as the speaker for the evening. After a most enlightening message, Dr. Miley showed slides of some of the Ivory Coast and the work going on there. Rev. Louis Moulton gave the invitation and several dozen people responded, pastors, laymen, women and children. Truly, God in very Spirit was in the meeting. An offering was taken for Missions. Benediction by Bro. G. C. King.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to receive the report of the Board of Auditors as given by Bro. Earl Tabb.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to receive the report of Christian Education Board financial condition as given by Bro. Frank Newberry.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to receive the report of the Camp Board as given by Bro. J.. W. Franks.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to vote on each recommendation separately.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt item one as amended to substitute "a good steel chair" for Pew as in the recommendation, and to

institute a fund for chairs for the chapel at Camp Mt. Bethel.

Motioned, seconded, and carried for the Camp Board to ascertain the need and to work with the Promotional Secretary in notifying each pastor and church.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to addpt the remaining part of the Camp Board report as in the original report.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to receive and adopt the report of the Budgeting Committe.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to raise our Promotional Secretary's salary by \$100.00 (amended).

Motioned, seconded, and carried to accept the report of the Resolution committee as given by Rev. George C. Lee.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt the first item. Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt the second item. Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt the fourth item. Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt the fifth item. Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt the fifth item. Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt the ninth item.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to offer the Little River Association and the camp for hospitality for this session.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt the date suggested by the super-annuation board concerning the super-annuation giving.

Motioned, seconded, and carried for the original move concerning the mortgage of the State Property to stand authorized. One dissent.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt resolution number seven.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to table the resolution concerning the creation of a new Board of Budgeting.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to receive the report of Nominating Committee and adopt item by item.

Call for nominations from the floor. Motioned, seconded, and carried to select the committee nominations.. General Officers.

Motioned, seconded, and carried to adopt the rest of the report and to fill in the names from other associations to the budgeting committee.

Special music by a quartet of our ministers, Vernon Maggert, Jackie Creech, Kenneth Faison, and Henry Van Kluyve.

Rising vote of appreciation given to the out going general officers.

Moderator introduces the speaker for the worship hours, Rev. C. R. Houston. He used I Peter 2:15, a very timely message and one that will bear living in our community.

Motion to adjourn by Rev. King. Benediction by Rev. Joe Esther.

The Moderator appoints various ones to proxy on each board. Each board was assigned a place to work on the various items and problems. The Executive Board met in the Camp assembly hall. Prayer offered by Rev. A. C. Truluck.

A discusion was held relative to the carrying in our minutes the complete report of the work at the Alabama Children's Home.

A discussion was held on two other items of importance, an allocation of funds to the Board of Trustees and the program committee for the meeting in November 1965.

After a discussion, a motion was carried for the Promotional Secretary to present to the joint board a rundown on the equipment needed to bring the equipment up to office standards.

Franks makes report for Board of Superannuation; Bro. Kenneth Murphy reported for Camp Board; Bro. Curtis Gay reported for Board of Trustees.

The joint board will reconvene at the Camp on November 13, 1965.

Motioned, seconded, and carried the reports of these Boards be received as information to be carried in the annual minutes.

The joint board of the Georgia State Association met at Camp Mt. Bethel on November 13, 1965. Called to order by moderator, Rev. Charles Clark. The following boards were in attendance: Christian Education, Trustee, Superannuation, Camp Board and the Mission Board. Several men were appointed to proxy in the various board meetings. Chair appointed places for the boards to meet.

Moderator called for board reports. Bro. Leron Clower reports for the Superannuation Board. They recommend the State Association adopt June as superannuation month. Bro. Jack Faison reports for the Christian Education Board. Reports that there will be several Institutes and a Ministers retreat are planned for the coming year. Bro. Curtis Gay reports for the Trustee Board. Rev. Chester Huckaby read the recommendations. Rev. J. E. Blanton reports for the State Mission Board.

Motioned, seconded, and carried that the Joint Board has heard the reports of the various boards namely: Christian Education, Superannuation, Trustee, Home Mission and whole heartedly endorse their objectives for the coming year and recommends that they be adopted.

The Joint Board Meeting adjourned by a properly seconded motion.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the Original Free Will Baptists of the State of Georgia, do ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advancing, promoting and increasing all phases of the cause of Christ.

ARTICLE I

Section 1. The assembly shall be known as the Georgia State Association of the Original Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Secretary, an assistant Secretary and a Promotional Secretary-Treasurer.

Section 2. All regular officers and the chairman of each standing board shall compose the Executive Board.

Section 3. This Association shall be composed of all active Ministers, Deacons, and Missionaries who are members of any affiliated bodies. One delegate for every 500 members, or a fraction thereof, of each district Association or Union Meeting, and one delegate for every 100 members or a fraction thereof of all local affiliated churches.

Section 4. All delegates from Associations, Union Meetings, and local churches shall be elected from the laity of the body sending them.

Section 5. Funds to meet current needs of the body shall be paid in on a voluntary basis to the Treasurer of the Association, however, it is suggested that each Association give as shall be allocated to them each year by a committee, and that each Union meeting give five dollars and each local church give five cents per capita for their respective membership.

ARTICLE III

Section 1. It shall be the privilege of each affiliated Association to furnish a member of each standing board with terms of office rotating which will necessitate the election of four members every two years giving each member a term of office of four years each. The exception will be the board of auditors which shall consist of two members who shall be elected at the same time as the general officers.

Section 2. There shall be a board of missions composed of members who are noted for missoinary zeal and they shall have the supervision of

all mission interest sponsored by this body. All undesignated mission funds shall be equally divided between home and foreign.

Section 3. There shall be a board of Christian Education whose duty it shall be to keep the body informed of all Christian Education sponsored by the body and make such recommendations as they shall deem proper to the body from time to time.

Section 4. There shall be a board of superannuation whose duty it shall be to make plans and rules which shall be in harmony with the National Superannuation Board and shall be authorized to formulate plans whereby necessary funds for superannuation may be raised.

Section 5. There shall be a board of trustees whose duty it shall be to hold titles of all property belonging to this body.

Section 6. A board of auditors, whose duties it shall be to audit the books of the Association Treasurer and the Treasurers of all boards.

Section 7. There shall be a camp board arranging the time of sessions, electing all faculty members, forming all the study courses, especially those leading to a completion with the issue of certificates.

ARTICLE IV

Section 1. All officers, except board members, shall be elected to serve a term of two years.

Section 2. Any officer may be re-elected as the body shall see fit.

Section 3. When vacancies occur for any cause they shall be filled by the Executive Board, or by any of the standing boards, subject to the approval of the Executive Board, until the convening of the annual session of the body.

Section 4. Election years shall take place on the odd years of the calendar.

Section 5. A member of any board who fails in the function of his or her duties without a reason, the board to which the delinquent members has been elected, shall declare the office vacant. Further, the body shall have and does reserve the right to deal with any officer or board member who does not conduct his or her office in a Christian and businesslike manner according to the rules of Christian conduct laid down in the New Testament. Should such board fail to have sufficient number of its members present to constitute a quorum, it shall become the duty of the Executive Board to deal with any delinquent member. Also, a charge against a member of this body and a member of a local church shall constitute a charge against said member in this body and the body abide accordingly.

Section 6. The duties of officers defined shall be the same as these for any deliberative assembly.

Section 7. All boards may be called in session only by the chairman of the Executive Board and any standing board may be called in session only by the chairman of said board, unless said chairman becomes incapacitated, in which case the assistant assumes the authority of said incapacitated chairman.

AMENDMENTS

This Constitution shall not be changed or altered except by a majority

of all members present to regular session. All amendments shall lie on the table from the morning session until evening session or from evening session until morning prior to adoption and shall during the time be read at least twice in open session. Additions of board or officers may be added as there is need.

CAMP BOARD REPORT

The Camp Board met three times during the Associational year. We sponsored three Youth camp sessions with 198 attending. The Sunday School and CTS Conventions were held at the camp this year, with the camp board making the arrangements for entertaining.

We entertained the Bible study course sponsored by the Board of Education.

In improvements to the camp, we installed ten showers in the dormitories. We installed a new wall around the ladies rest room and enlarged it for showers. We bought and installed a new and larger sink in the kitchen.

We recommend that provisions be made for buying and installing new pews (good steel chairs) in the chapel.

We recommend that provisions be made for drilling a new well (a four inch) for a sufficient water supply. After careful study and investigation we find it will cost approximately \$3,000.00 for chairs and pews.

Inasmuch as the camp is still in the stage of development and that there is still need of additional facilities as well as the maintenance of the present ones and inasmuch as the allocation received by the camp board is used for this purpose and the sponsoring of the youth camp sessions, we ask that the host, board or otherwise, bear the expense of that particular meeting.

GEORGIA STATE AUXILIARY CONVENTION REPORT

The 1965 year was a successful one for the Women's Auxiliary. Our State Convention was well attended with over 140 delegates, vistors, and ministers registering.

In the past year the membership reported has gained 22 new members and we now have 512 members reporting to our State Convention.

Our State project last year was the raising of the Wilkinson passage fund to Brazil. The goal was \$1500.00 and \$1471.00 was raised.

The project adopted for the coming year will be even more giving. It will take the help of all pastors and those interested in missions as well as our women to complete the job.

Mrs. Laverne Miley, missionary to Ivory Coast Africa, brought to our convention a very inspiring message. We were challenged by the personal experiences of the missionaries to be better prayer warriors and to give more of our financial means.

TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

The tendency in general among our Citizenry from a moral, social and spiritual point of view being definitely slanted toward looseness, despite the fact that the apostle Paul says, "Therefore, if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: Old things are passed away; behold all things are become new." We feel that a confession is in order in view of the fact that our constituency in Georgia is being seriously affected by a

compromising attitude toward these conditions. Therefore we wish to recommend to our ministers, teachers, and leaders that a Stronger Standard of Christian ethics be established to constantly remind our youth and children of the fact that we are covenanted together to refrain from conduct that could be judged by the public to be of worldly nature, and that our workers constantly remind our church members of the fact that it is our Christian privilege and duty to live in all walks of life as to reveal to observers that we have been with Jesus.

Someone has defined temperance to be a moderate use of all good things and totally abstain from all things that are questionable. With this in view, we recommend that a Soul-watch be set up by all members of our fellowships, since we are faced with a strong wave of alcoholism and drug addiction, along with a high tide of moral looseness. Herein we recommend a program of education concerning these things in our homes and churches, that we may be able to create a strong current to intercept these waves and tides.

Finally we urge that our church members, in our State, refrain from staying home to watch TV programs on such convenient times as Sunday and Prayer meeting nights, and that this time be spent in those regular worship services as are provided by our churches, and that our people be temperate in literature readings, that the Bible be placed on our reading lists as a "Must". We recognize that the cost of soft drinks and such other items amount to more than our gifts to Missions do, so we urge that some of that money be given to Missions.

THE BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION ANNUAL REPORT

The Board of Christian Education has met for two regular meetings during the year. Plans were prayerfully made for carrying on the ministry of our Board in a way of being the most possible service to our constituents in the field of Christian Education.

Last January we sponsored an Institute in connection with the Extension Department of Free Will Baptist Bible College. This Institute was held at Camp Mt. Nienteen students received certificates for having completed the requirements in the studies of the Book of Galatians, Bible Doctrine and Evangelism. REPORT OF THE PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

"... prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it." Malachi 3:10b.

This past year our churches have invested as never before in the ministries of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists. As a result, this has been one of the best years in our short history. As you hear the reports from the various boards you will note that progress is evident in the ministry of each board. We thank God for each ministry of our State Association, for your support and for His blessings upon us. I trust that we will be encouraged in our total effort by these accomplishments and that we will make even a greater investment in the Cause of Christ through our denomination in the coming year.

PROMOTION: Again this year, I have traveled many miles in the interest of our State Association. Several churches were visited with preaching assignments filled, attended all State meetings except CTS Convention. As much as possible, I attended the various meetings of each of the district associations. It is an encouragement to see the progress being made in each of the district associations. In addition I attended the Christian Camp and Conference Association that was held at Green Lake, Wisconsin and the National Association which met in Raleigh, N. C.

Other areas of promotion included itinerates for both home and foreign missionaries, with services held in each of the district associations. Such services always prove to be a real challenge to our churches in extending our witness for Christ here at home and into all the world. During the year, three weeks were spent as an instructor in youth camp work. Several workshops were conducted in which every ministry of the State Association was represented in a very specific way. Also a considerable amount of supply work was done due to pastors being ill and for churches without pastors. Our State Publication, The Promotional Bulletin, is now going into about eight hundred homes each month.

OUR STEWARDSHIP: Denominational giving for the year 1964-65 was \$57,176.93 for all State and National Causes. No doubt this is an all time record for a one year period. A three year comparison follows: 1961—62, \$30,117.19. 1962—63, \$33,595.36. 1963—64, \$49,229.25. Of the total denominational giving, \$13,902.07 was given through the Cooperative Plan of Support. We are grateful for this increase in Cooperative receipts. Here is our Cooperative giving for the past three years: 1961—62, \$12,356.81; 1962—63, \$12,171.92; 1963—64, \$12,872.68.

Of the 120 churches affiliated with the State Association, 101 gave support to a world-wide ministry through the Cooperative Plan. Beginning with this associational year six additional churches have included the Cooperative Plan in their church budget this year and some others have increased their giving.

APPRECIATION: Our report would not be complete without an acknowledgement of God's faithfulness through the year. To Him be all the glory, great things He hath done. My sincere appreciation is express-

ed to every individual, pastor, and church who has shared with us in this ministry; God bless each of you for your prayers and support this year. May God help us in the days which are ahead to be faithful in that task which is above every task, the proclamation of the gospel throughout the world.
